#### [8] Linda Noskova (CZE #13) vs. [Q] Diane Parry (FRA #60)

Tied 2-2

##### *Noskova:*

- Making 2nd appearance at Berlin, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (l. Jabeur)
- Holds a 13-7 Tour-level record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 20
- Best career result on grass is semifinal run at Bad Homburg in 2025 (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Owns 19-4 career Tour-level record against qualifiers, with a record in 2026 standing at 2-1
- Career-best result at a WTA 500 event was winning the title at 2024 Monterrey (d. Sun in F) – her one career WTA singles title thus far
- Best result this season so far is reaching SF at Indian Wells (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)

##### *Parry:*

- Making tournament debut at Berlin
- Best career result on grass is semifinal run at Nottingham in 2024 (l. eventual R-Up Ka. Pliskova)
- Owns 3 career Tour-level wins over Top 20 players, most recently No.6 Amanda Anisimova in Parry's prior event, 2026 Roland Garros
- She also reached her first career Grand Slam R16 at 2026 Roland Garros (l. eventual R-Up Chwalinska)
- Parry's best tournament finish of 2026 season at Tour-level is SF run at Ostrava (l. eventual R-Up Korpatsch)
- Best result by a qualifier at this tournament was Champion run by Liudmila Samsonova in 2021 (d. Bencic in F)
- Winner of this match will face wild card Paula Badosa in QF

#### [6] Elina Svitolina (UKR #8) vs. [WC] Eva Lys (GER #80)

Svitolina leads 1-0

##### *Svitolina:*

- Making 2nd appearance at Berlin, where her previous result was 2r in 2021 (after 1r bye, l. Alexandrova)
- Best career Tour-level results on grass are two Wimbledon SFs, in 2019 (l. eventual champion Halep) and 2023 (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- Has won 33 matches so far in 2026; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match-wins this year, behind Mirra Andreeva (36)
- Already collected 2 titles this year at WTA 1000 Rome (d. Gauff in F) and Auckland (d. Wang Xinyu in F)
- Has won two WTA 500 titles in her career, 2018 Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F) and 2018 Dubai (d. Kasatkina in F)
- Returned to the Top 10 of the PIF WTA Rankings this February – her first appearance in the Top 10 since October 2021
- Defeated today's opponent Lys in their only prior meeting at 2026 Stuttgart, losing just one game in that match

##### *Lys:*

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Berlin; her previous main draw tournament result was a first-round loss in 2025 (l. Badosa)
- Bidding for her first QF showing of the 2026 season – her only prior R16 this year was a loss to Svitolina at Stuttgart
- Owns one career win over a Top 10 player, having defeated No.10 Elena Rybakina at Beijing 2025
- Playing in her sixth career grass-court match at the Tour-level today (2-3 record, with the two wins coming over Frech in this week's 1r and Yuan Yue in 2025 Wimbledon 1r)
- Best results by wild cards at this tournament are QF runs by Veronika Kudermetova in 2023 and Marketa Vondrousova in 2023
- Seeking to become the first German to make QF here since the inception of this grass-court event in 2021

### Madison Keys (USA #28) vs. [7] Karolina Muchova (CZE #10)

Keys leads 2-0

#### *Keys:*

- Making 3rd appearance at Berlin, where her best tournament result is reaching QF in 2021 (l. eventual champion Samsonova)
- Defeated last year's Berlin runner-up Wang Xinyu in this week's 1r
- Owns 34 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.9 Victoria Mboko at 2026 Roland Garros
- Has won 3 grass-court titles on Tour: 2014 Eastbourne (d. Kerber in F), 2016 Birmingham (d. Strycova in F) and 2023 Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F)
- 7 of her 10 career WTA singles titles have come at WTA 500 events; her most recent WTA 500 title is 2025 Adelaide (d. Pegula in F)
- Her best Tour-level result of 2026 season so far is SF run at Charleston (l. eventual R-Up Starodubtseva)

#### *Muchova:*

- Making 3rd appearance at Berlin, where she lost her opening matches in 2021 (l. V. Kudermetova) and 2022 (l. eventual champion Jabeur)
- Defeated Zhang Shuai in this week's 1r for her first career match-win at this event
- Career-best Tour-level results on grass are QFs at 2019 Wimbledon (l. Svitolina), 2021 Wimbledon (l. Kerber) and 2024 Eastbourne (gave walkover to today's opponent Keys – does not count as a win for Keys or a loss for Muchova)
- Has won 25 matches so far in 2026, her fourth straight season with 20+ main draw match-wins at Tour-level; her season with the most Tour-level wins was 2023 (36-13 record)
- Best result of 2026 season is winning her 2nd career WTA singles title at WTA 1000 Doha (d. Mboko in F)
- Winner of this match will face No.3 seed Jessica Pegula in QF

### [WC] Alexandra Eala (PHI #35) vs. [2] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2)

Rybakina leads 1-0

#### *Eala:*

- Making her Berlin tournament debut
- Defeated last week's Queen's Club champion Donna Vekic in 1r
- Started her 2026 grass-court swing by winning the WTA 125 title in Birmingham (d. Bartunkova in F), then made 2r at Queen's Club (l. Jovic)
- Went 10-5 on grass last year (spanning all tournament levels and qualifying), including her first career WTA Tour singles final at Eastbourne (l. Joint in F in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- Owns 4 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.4 Coco Gauff at 2026 Indian Wells (via retirement)
- Holds a 1-2 record vs. Top 2 players at the time of their meeting - the win was over No.2 Swiatek at 2025 Miami
- Best tournament finish at Tour-level so far this year is SF at Auckland (l. eventual R-Up Wang Xinyu)

#### *Rybakina:*

- Making 5th appearance at Berlin, where her best tournament results are QFs in 2024 (l. Azarenka via retirement) and 2025 (l. Sabalenka in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- A win today would be Rybakina's 300th career victory at Tour-level
- Contesting her 2nd grass-court event of the season - last week she reached Queen's Club QF (l. Boulter)
- Owns 1 singles title on grass - her first Grand Slam title at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F)
- She is a 6-time titlist at WTA 500-level, most recently Stuttgart this year (d. Muchova in F)
- Has won 2 titles this year: her 2nd career Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F) and Stuttgart
- Is currently ranked at a career-high World No.2 (reached for the first time in March of this year)
- Defeated today's opponent Eala in their only previous meeting at Rome earlier this year

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached three Tour finals in 2025, including her first career WTA 1000 final at Beijing (l. Anisimova), as well as runner-up showings at Prague and Tokyo; made her Top 20 debut and finished at a career-high No.13 in the year-end rankings
- In 2024, achieved first Grand Slam singles quarterfinal at the Australian Open (l. Yastremska), where she also defeated then-World No.1 Iga Swiatek in the 3r; won her first singles title at Monterrey (d. Sun in F); reached SF at Prague (l. eventual champion Linette) and Brisbane (l. eventual champion Rybakina); earned a new career-high ranking of No.25 on August 26, 2024
- Breakthrough year in 2023, achieving runner-up twice; Adelaide 1 (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Prague (l. Hibino). Also reached quarterfinals at Lyon (l. Osorio) and 3r at Indian Wells (l. Gauff) and Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Gauff). Broke into Top 40 on October 9, 2023.
- Made Top 100 debut on August 1, 2022, following SF run at Prague (l. eventual champion Bouzkova); overtook Gauff at the youngest player in Top 100
- Also reached 2r at Tallinn (as qualifier, l. Haddad Maia) and fell 1r at both Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Raducanu) and US Open (as qualifier, l. Bouzkova). On ITF Circuit, lifted fifth and sixth titles at this level, winning W60 tournament in Croissy-Beaubourg, France and W100 event in Versmold, Germany
- Finished 2021 campaign with 38-9 win-loss record, winning four ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 event in Prerov, Czech Republic
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2020 Prague
- On ITF Circuit, owns six titles in singles and one in doubles
- As a junior, won 2021 girls' singles at Roland Garros
- Highlights in 2025 included 3r runs at Wimbledon (as a qualifier) and US Open, also reached R16 at Strasbourg, Hamburg and Chennai
- 2024 season highlight was posting best result at a WTA 1000 by reaching R16 at Indian Wells and first time reaching 3r at Australian Open and 2r at US Open. Also made three SF runs at Osaka, Palermo, and Nottingham. Broke into the Top 50 for the first time and achieved new career-high ranking of No.48 in October
- The 2023 Grand Slam season included two 2r runs at Roland Garros (l. Andreeva) and Wimbledon (l. Martic); fell in 1r at Australian Open (l. Townsend) and US Open (l. Boulter)
- Best Tour level showing in 2023 was a SF run at Lausanne (l. Burel)
- In 2022, lifted the WTA 125 Paris title (d. McNally via W/O) and further reached another WTA 125 final at Colina (l. Bejlek)
- Broke into Top 100 on February 28, 2022 and continued steady progress for remainder of season
- First notable 2022 performance was 3r run at Roland Garros (l. Stephens) beating defending champion Krejčíková in 1r
- In the 2022 grass season, made SF at Gaiba 125 and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Jabeur)
- Series of impressive performances in 2022 started from QF at Palermo (l. Camelia Begu) followed by SF at Granby (l. Kasatkina), QF at Portoroz (l. Lena Friedsam), and QF at Monastir before 1r exits at Cluj Napoca, Rouen 125, and W80 Poitiers
- Finished 2021 in fine form, winning 18 of last 20 matches, highlighted by two WTA 125K Series finals, winning title in Montevideo, Uruguay and finishing R-Up at Buenos Aires, Argentina
- Overall, compiled 50-23 win-loss record last year, lifting three ITF Circuit titles and rising nearly 200 places in the rankings during second half of campaign. Also fell 1r at Roland Garros (as WC, l. Sasnovich) and Strasbourg (as qualifier, l. Niemeier)
- Lifted first ITF Circuit title in 2020, at W15 tournament in Antalya, Turkey
- Reached 2r on WTA main-draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros (as WC, d. Lapko, l. Mertens)
- First contested WTA qualifying at 2018 Roland Garros
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit

- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event in Le Havre in 2017
