[3] Jessica Pegula (USA #4) vs. Madison Keys (USA #28)

Tied 2-2

Pegula:

- Making 4th appearance at Berlin, where she was the 2024 champion (d. Kalinskaya in F in 3rd-set TB, saving 5 championship points)
- Holds a 6-0 record vs. her fellow American players in 2026, including a win over today's opponent Keys at 2026 Australian Open (Keys was the defending champion at that Grand Slam event)
- Two of her 11 career WTA singles titles have come on grass: along with her 2024 title here, she also won the 2025 Bad Homburg title (d. Swiatek in F)
- Has won two WTA singles titles this year at WTA 1000 Dubai (d. Svitolina in F) and WTA 500 Charleston (d. Starodubtseva in F)
- Since this event started on grass in 2021, Pegula is the only American to have reached the final here

Keys:

- Making 3rd appearance at Berlin, and she has equaled her best tournament result – she also reached QF here in 2021 (l. eventual champion Samsonova)
- Owns 35 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.10 Karolina Muchova in this week's 2r
- Has won 3 grass-court titles on Tour: 2014 Eastbourne (d. Kerber in F), 2016 Birmingham (d. Strycova in F) and 2023 Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F)
- 7 of her 10 career WTA singles titles have come at WTA 500 events; her most recent WTA 500 title is 2025 Adelaide (d. today's opponent Pegula in F)
- Her best Tour-level result of 2026 season so far is SF run at Charleston (l. eventual R-Up Starodubtseva)

[8] Linda Noskova (CZE #13) vs. [WC] Paula Badosa (ESP #142)

Noskova leads 1-0

Noskova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Berlin, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (l. Jabeur)
- Has won her last 12 matches vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 – her most recent loss to a player ranked outside the Top 100 was to No.176 Bianca Andreescu in 2024 Wimbledon 2r
- Best career result on grass is semifinal run at Bad Homburg in 2025 (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Went 8-3 on grass in 2025 (SF at Bad Homburg, QF at Nottingham and 4r at Wimbledon)
- Career-best result at a WTA 500 event was winning the title at 2024 Monterrey (d. Sun in F) – her one career WTA singles title thus far
- Best result this season so far is reaching SF at Indian Wells (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)

Badosa:

- Making 2nd appearance at Berlin; she reached the QF last year in her tournament debut (l. eventual R-Up Wang Xinyu via retirement)
- Beat Lamens in this week's 1r, earning her first match-win since Charleston in April (ended a 5-match losing streak)
- In the 2r, notched her 16th career Top 10 win by defeating Coco Gauff, and is now into her first Tour-level QF since she made the QF here last year
- Owns 31 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently Gauff in the previous round
- Started her 2026 grass-court swing last week in 's-Hertogenbosch (as wild card, l. Snigur in 1r)
- 2 of her 4 career WTA singles titles have come at WTA 500-level: 2022 Sydney (d. Krejčíková in F) and 2024 Washington DC (d. Bouzková in F)

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. [WC] Nikola Bartunkova (CZE #62)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Making 6th appearance at Berlin, where her best tournament result is SF last year (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- Her 2r victory this week over Alexandrova was her 400th career match-win at Tour level
- Holds an 8-0 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- Career-best results on grass are R-Up finishes at 2018 Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki in F) and 2022 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova in F)
- Went 7-2 during last year's grass swing, reaching SF here and SF at Wimbledon (l. eventual R-Up Anisimova)
- Has won 32 Tour-level matches this year, trailing only Andreeva (36) and Svitolina (34) – tied with Rybakina (32)
- Has won 3 titles this year (Brisbane, Indian Wells and Miami), tied with Andreeva for the most Tour singles titles won this year
- She has spent 95 total weeks holding the World No.1 ranking (including the last 87 consecutively)

Bartunkova:

- Making her Berlin tournament debut
- This is her 3rd career Tour-level QF, and she is seeking her 2nd career Tour-level SF after 2025 Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Jovic in SF)
- Her two wins this week (both vs. Top 25 players) were the first two Tour-level grass-court wins of her career
- She opened this year's grass swing by finishing R-Up at WTA 125 Birmingham (l. Eala in F), then fell 1r at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Vandewinkel)
- Owns 1 win in career over Top 10 players, having defeated No.10 Belinda Bencic at 2026 Australian Open
- Today's match will be her first career meeting vs. a reigning World No.1
- Currently ranked No.62 – one spot shy of her career-high ranking of No.61, which she reached last week

[6] Elina Svitolina (UKR #8) vs. [WC] Alexandra Eala (PHI #35)

First meeting

Svitolina:

- Making 2nd appearance at Berlin, where her previous result was 2r in 2021 (after 1r bye, l. Alexandrova)
- Best career results on grass are two Wimbledon SFs, in 2019 (l. eventual champion Halep) and 2023 (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- Has won 34 matches so far in 2026; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match-wins this year, behind Mirra Andreeva (36)
- Claimed 2 titles so far this year at WTA 1000 Rome (d. Gauff in F) and Auckland (d. Wang Xinyu in F)
- Has won two WTA 500 titles in her career, 2018 Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F) and 2018 Dubai (d. Kasatkina in F)
- Returned to the Top 10 of the PIF WTA Rankings this February – her first appearance in the Top 10 since October 2021
- Has become the first player from Ukraine to reach QF at this tournament since its inception in 2021

Eala:

- Making her Berlin tournament debut
- Defeated last week's Queen's Club champion Donna Vekic in 1r, then notched her 5th career Top 10 win in the 2r by ousting No.2 seed Elena Rybakina
- Attempting to defeat multiple Top 10 players at a single event for the second time in her career (d. No.2 Swiatek and No.5 Keys at 2025 Miami)
- Started her 2026 grass-court swing by winning the WTA 125 title in Birmingham (d. Bartunkova in F), then made 2r at Queen's Club (l. Jovic)
- Went 10-5 on grass last year (spanning all tournament levels and qualifying), including her first career WTA Tour singles final at Eastbourne (l. Joint in F in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- Best tournament finish at Tour-level so far this year is SF at Auckland (l. eventual R-Up Wang Xinyu)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won three singles titles in 2025 across all three surfaces - Bad Homburg (grass), Charleston (clay) and Austin (hard); also had runner-up finishes at Wuhan, Miami and Adelaide
- Qualified for the 2025 WTA Finals for a fourth consecutive year and reached the semifinals for the second time after 2023
- In 2024, won two singles titles - Toronto (WTA 1000) and Berlin - en route to year-end ranking of No.7, her third-straight year-end Top 10 finish; two-time runner-up at Cincinnati and US Open; joined Rosie Casals (1970), Evonne Goolagong Cawley (1973) and Serena Williams (2013) as the only women in the Open Era to make the final at the Canadian Open, Cincinnati Open and US Open in the same season
- Also qualified for the 2024 WTA Finals (withdrew during round-robin play due to left knee injury)
- Won two titles in 2023, her second WTA 1000 tournament at Montreal and also WTA 250 Seoul. Also finished R-Up at Doha, Tokyo and at the WTA Finals in Cancun
- In doubles ascended to No.1 ranking (co-ranked with Coco Gauff) after 2023 US Open
- Achieved career-high No.3 in October 2022 after defeating four Grand Slam champions at Guadalajara, en route to ending three-year wait for second WTA title (d. Sakkari in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals in both singles and doubles (w/Gauff), thus becoming the first Americans to debut in singles and doubles at the season-ending showpiece since Davenport in 1994
- Reached QF at three of the four majors in 2022, breaking into Top 10 after doing so at Roland Garros (June 6, 2022)
- One of seven players to win 40 or more matches in 2022, alongside Swiatek, Jabeur, Garcia, Sakkari, Kasatkina and Bencic
- In 2021, reached the QF or better on seven occasions, including at the Australian Open
- Broke into Top 20 on November 1, 2021
- Began 2020 with runner-up finish at Auckland (l. S.Williams), other standout results were a QF at Western & Southern Open (as qualifier, l. Mertens) and a 3r showing at US Open (l. Kvitova)
- On the doubles court in 2020, reached QFs of Roland Garros (w/Muhammad) and Cincinnati (w/Rogers)
- Won her first WTA title at 2019 Washington DC (d. Giorgi in F)
- Won two singles titles in 2025, including maiden Grand Slam title at Australian Open becoming the oldest first-time Australian Open champion at 29 years old, and the player with the longest gap between their first two major finals in the Open Era (US Open 2017). Returned to a career-high ranking of No.7, then broke into the Top 5 for the first time in February
- In 2025 also qualified for the WTA Finals for the second time in her career after 2016
- In 2024, won eighth career title at Strasbourg (d. Collins in F dropping only three games). Reached SF at Madrid (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Eastbourne (l. Fernandez), and another QF at Rome (l. eventual champion Swiatek). At Grand Slams, reached 4r at Wimbledon (l. Paolini, retired in 3r set due to left thigh injury), made 3r at Roland Garros (l. Navarro) and US Open (l. Mertens)
- In 2023, won seventh career title at Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F), reached SF at US Open and reached four QFs including Wimbledon; also qualified for WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai (0-2 in group play)
- At 2022 Adelaide, won first title in over two years (d. Riske in F), followed by SF run at Australian Open - best Slam showing since 2018
- Other highlights in 2022 were SF at Cincinnati and two further QF runs, including at Indian Wells
- In Grand Slam play, 2021 season was highlighted by R16 run at Wimbledon (l. Golubic). Finished campaign inside Top 100 for ninth successive year, but outside Top 20 for first time since 2014
- Ended 2020 ranked No.16, with best result being R-Up finish at Brisbane (l. Ka. Pliskova)
- Lifted biggest title of career during 2019 season at WTA 1000 Cincinnati (d. Kuznetsova in F); afterwards returned to Top 10 for first time since week of June 25, 2018
- Also won title at Charleston (d. Wozniacki) and reached QF at 2019 Roland Garros (l. Barty), one of three Americans to make last eight (also Anisimova and Stephens) - the first time since 2004 (Capriati, S.Williams and V.Williams) Reached three SFs in 2018 at Charleston, Roland Garros and US Open
- Reached first Grand Slam final in 2017 at US Open, losing to Sloane Stephens in 10th all-American final in the Open Era. At 22, became the youngest Flushing Meadows finalist since 19-year-old Caroline Wozniacki lost to Kim

- Also in 2019, fell in 1r on main draw debut at Roland-Garros (l. eventual champion Barty) and Wimbledon (l. Buzarnescu) and Miami (as a qualifier, l. Konta)
- Broke into Top 100 for the first time on February 4, 2019 following back-to-back R-Up finishes at WTA 125K Series event at Newport Beach and W100 ITF Circuit tournament in Midland-MI, USA
- Highlights of 2018 included finishing R-Up as a qualifier at Quebec City (l. Parmentier in F), recording SF finish at Houston WTA 125K Series tournament (l. S.Peng) and reaching QF or better at 10 ITF events

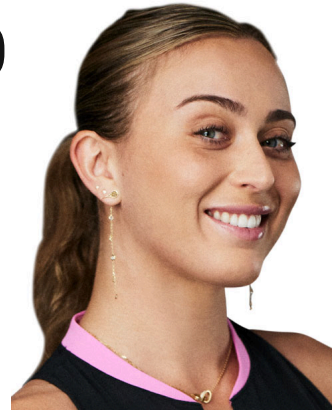

- In 2018, won 13th - and most prestigious - career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Enjoyed standout 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60). Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)
- Breakout 2025 season saw her break into the Top 100 after SF run at WTA 1000 Miami; as a wild card she registered back-to-back Top 10 wins over No.5 Keys and No.2 Swiatek. Went on to reach maiden Tour final at Eastbourne and then won her first WTA 125 title Guadalajara. Her year-end ranking was a career high No.50
- Following her Miami 2025 result, she made history by becoming the first player from the Philippines to reach a WTA 1000 semifinal and the first to enter the WTA World Top 100 ranking
- In 2024 made 2r at WTA 1000 Madrid (l. Cirstea) as well as playing main draw at Abu Dhabi, Guadalajara, Wuhan, Guangzhou and Jiujiang. Earned fourth ITF career title at W100 Vitoria-Gasteiz and reached a career high ranking of No.143 in July
- Entered first Grand Slam in 2023 at Australian Open qualifying (l. Doi in Q1). As a qualifier reached main draw at Hua Hin (l. Maria), Osaka (l. Sakatsume), Guangzhou (l. Maria) and Monastir (l. Mertens) taking her ranking into Top 200 for first time
- Claimed first ITF title in 2022 at Chiang Rai \$25K and also played WTA Miami opening main draw match (l. Brengle) and qualifying at Madrid (l. Bondar).
- In 2021 played first Tour level match at Miami qualifying (l. Kuzmova) and reached 2r at Cluj Napoca on clay (l. Sheriff).
- Best result of 2021 was reaching QF at Grenoble \$25K
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2020 at the age of 14

- In 2017, became first player to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season (Dubai, Rome, Toronto), since such tournaments were introduced in 2009
- One of five players to make Top 10 debut in 2017, after winning Dubai in February (also Ostapenko, Garcia, Mladenovic and Vandeweghe). Peaked in rankings at No.3 on September 11, 2017
- On four occasions could have reached World No.1 - at 2017 US Open, then needed to win 2017 Beijing (fell QF), then needed to triumph at 2017 WTA Finals (fell in group stage), or reach final at 2018 Australian Open (fell in QF)
- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska). Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)
- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova). Another 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)
