**[3] Mirra Andreeva (#8) vs. [8] Victoria Mboko (CAN #17)**

**First meeting**

### **Andreeva:**

- Making her tournament debut this week
- After 1r bye, defeated Marie Bouzkova, Maya Joint and No.9 seed Diana Shnaider to reach her first singles final since she won the Indian Wells title last March (d. Sabalenka in 2025 Indian Wells final)
- Has not lost more than 3 games in any set this week
- Seeking her 4th career WTA singles title, and her first at WTA 500-level; she previously finished as runner-up at WTA 500 Ningbo in 2024 (I. Kasatkina in final)
- Owns 21 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.12 Linda Noskova last week at Brisbane
- Two of her three career WTA singles titles have come on hard court: back-to-back WTA 1000 events at 2025 Dubai and 2025 Indian Wells
- Made her Top 10 debut last year and peaked at a career-high ranking of World No.5 in July of 2025

### **Mboko:**

- Making her tournament debut this week at a career-high ranking of World No.17 (this time last year was ranked No.337)
- Defeated Beatriz Haddad Maia, Anna Kalinskaya, defending champion Madison Keys and Kimberly Birrell so far this week (saved 2 match points vs. Kalinskaya in R16)
- Has reached her first singles final since she won the Hong Kong title to end her 2025 season
- Attempting to win her 3rd career WTA singles title; she is 2-0 in WTA singles finals, claiming titles at Montreal (on home soil) and Hong Kong last year
- Seeking her first WTA 500 title; previous career-best WTA 500 result was 2025 Tokyo QF (I. Rybakina)
- Has a 2-3 career record vs. Top 10 players, with wins over No.2 Gauff at 2025 Montreal (en route to title) and No.9 Keys this week
- Mboko is the first Canadian woman to reach the quarterfinals and beyond at this event

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025 won two WTA 1000 titles back-to-back at Dubai and Indian Wells - becoming the youngest WTA 1000 champion since the tournament tier began in 2009 at 17-years-old. Made her Top 10 debut in February before breaking into the Top 5 for the first time in July
- Won maiden WTA doubles title in 2025 with Diana Shnaider at Brisbane, followed by a second title at Miami and finished the 2025 season making her WTA Finals debut in doubles with Shnaider
- Reached first two WTA finals of career in 2024 winning the title at Iasi and finishing runner-up at Ningbo
- Made first Grand Slam semifinal at 2024 Roland Garros beating World No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in the quarterfinals
- Made Top 20 debut on October 8, 2024 finishing the year at World No.16; also won 2024 Paris Olympic silver medal in women's doubles with Diana Shnaider
- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 3r), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Keys in R16) and US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff in 2r)
- Also in 2023 reached R16 at Beijing (l. Rybakina), leading to Top 50 debut (started season just inside Top 300); voted WTA Newcomer of the Year
- In 2022, posted 39-9 win-loss record on ITF Circuit, winning first four titles at this level
- Fell in 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2022 Monastir (as WC, l. Potapova)
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event at Sharm El-Sheikh in February 2022
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- As a junior, finished R-Up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Korneeva)
- A breakthrough season in 2025 saw her lift her first WTA title during a fairytale run on home soil at Montreal as an 18-year-old wild card, registering her first Top 10 win over No.2 Gauff along the way. Three months later she was crowned champion of WTA 250 Hong Kong.
- Started 2025 ranked outside the Top 300 and closed the season with a year-end career high ranking of No.18
- Played only at ITF level in 2024 earning a further title at W35 Darmstadt (Germany) and broke into the Top 300 for the first time
- In 2023 secured her second ITF career title at W60 Saskatoon
- In 2022 played qualifying at WTA 1000 Toronto and main draw at WTA 250 Granby in her first WTA Tour level appearances
- Claimed her first ITF title in 2022 at W25 Saskatoon (Canada)
- Played first ITF tournament at W15 Prokuplje (Serbia) in 2021 at the age of 14
