MAIN DRAW QUICK HITS

- The grass-court swing on the WTA Tour continues with the Bad Homburg Open powered by Solarwatt. It is the second straight WTA 500 grass-court event in Germany, following the previous week's Vanda Pharmaceuticals Berlin Tennis Open. It runs concurrently with the WTA 250 Lexus Eastbourne Open in Great Britain.
- Four Top 10 players are in the main draw, with No.1 seed Iga Swiatek leading the field. Like she did last year, Swiatek is making her 2026 grass-court season debut in Bad Homburg. Swiatek finished runner-up to Jessica Pegula here last year, which was the former World No.1's first Tour-level grass-court final. Two weeks later, Swiatek won her first grass-court title – and sixth Grand Slam title – by prevailing at Wimbledon. Swiatek was 10-1 on grass last year.
- Seeded No.2 is Mirra Andreeva, who is playing her first event since she won her first Grand Slam title at 2026 Roland Garros. Andreeva made the quarterfinals here last year, and would go on to reach the same round at 2025 Wimbledon. Andreeva has won three WTA singles titles already this year (tied for the Tour lead in singles titles with Aryna Sabalenka) and the 19-year-old exited Roland Garros in the No.1 position in the Race to the WTA Finals.
- Elina Svitolina is the No.3 seed here this week, and she is coming off a quarterfinal finish on the grass of Berlin. She has won 34 Tour-level matches so far this season, second only to Andreeva's 36 (as of the Berlin semifinals on Saturday). As for her career-best grass-court results, Svitolina has made two Wimbledon semifinals in 2019 and 2023, losing to the eventual champion on both occasions (Simona Halep and Marketa Vondrousova respectively).
- Karolina Muchova rounds out the quartet of Top 10 players here this week, and she is making her Bad Homburg tournament debut as the No.4 seed. Muchova is a three-time Tour-level quarterfinalist on grass (two of those quarterfinals coming at Wimbledon) but has yet to reach the semifinals or better of a Tour-level grass-court event.
- Former World No.1 Venus Williams is one of this week's main draw wild cards, as she makes her first appearance at Bad Homburg. Williams, who turned 46 last week, is a 5-time Grand Slam singles champion on grass, winning the Wimbledon singles title in 2000, 2001, 2005, 2007 and 2008. This week's other main draw wild cards are former Top 5 player Zheng Qinwen, two-time WTA grass-court titlist Katie Boulter, and Germany's Eva Lys.
- No.6 seed Naomi Osaka joins Swiatek, Andreeva and Williams as the Grand Slam singles champions in the main draw. Former World No.1 Osaka, a four-time Grand Slam singles champion on hard court, is contesting her first grass-court event of 2026. Osaka went 3-3 on grass last year, including a second-round showing at Bad Homburg.
- Former Bad Homburg champions in the main draw are 2023 titlist Katerina Siniakova and 2024 victor Diana Shnaider. No.7 seed Shnaider reached her first Grand Slam semifinal earlier this month at 2026 Roland Garros, defeating World No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in the quarterfinals en route. As for Siniakova, she was also the 2021 Bad Homburg singles runner-up. Additionally, Siniakova is spending her 188th week ranked WTA Doubles World No.1.
