- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Hamburg, where she has surpassed her previous best result of reaching 1r in 2025 (l. Louisa Chirico) and 2023 (l. Eva Lys)
- Has beaten Simona Waltert so far this week to reach her first 2r since winning the title last week at Iasi 2026 (d. Paula Badosa in F)
- Her 1r match against Waltert lasted 3 hours and 17 minutes, which is the longest match of her Tour-level career; had previously played a 3 hour 15 minute match versus Lauren Davis in 1r at Rome 2024
- Faces No.104 Elsa Jacquemot in 2r today; holds a Tour-level record of 3-1 in 2026 versus opponents ranked outside the Top 100 (all three wins have come on clay)
- Owns 4-1 career Tour-level record against players from France (l. No.5 Caroline Garcia in QF at Monterrey 2023)
- Her two career Tour-level titles have both come on clay: Iasi in 2026 (d. Badosa in F) and Parma in 2022 (d. No.7 Maria Sakkari in F)
- Only player ever from Egypt to appear in the main draw at this event
- Is currently ranked No.55; this time last year was ranked No.98
- During last year's clay-court swing reached 1r at Hamburg, 1r at Roland Garros, 1r at Rome and 1r at Madrid
- Is currently on a six-match winning streak, which is the longest such streak of her Tour-level career (had previously won five straight during her title run at Parma in 2022)
- Has won seven Tour-level matches so far in 2026 (all on clay)

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won WTA 125 title at Parma and finished R-Up at WTA 125 Tucuman; captured second career WTA Tour doubles title at Merida (w/Piter); and won a pair of ITF/W100 singles titles at Madrid and Biarritz
- During 2024, finished R-Up at WTA 250 Rabat (l. Stearns in F) and won her first WTA Tour doubles title at Monastir (w/Blinkova); also reached a further four WTA 125 finals, all on clay: Lleida, Parma, Makarska and Contrexeville
- In 2023, enjoyed SF run at Palermo (l. Q. Zheng) and was a quarterfinalist at Monterrey (l. Garcia) and Madrid, where she became the first Egyptian player to reach QF at a WTA 1000 event (l. Sabalenka in 3s)
- Also in 2023, won back-to-back WTA 125 titles at Makarska (saving six championship points against Paolini in F) and Valencia (d. Bassols Ribera in F), afterwards attaining new career-high ranking of No.31 (week of June 19); best Grand Slam result came at Roland Garros (2r, l. Potapova)
- Broke new ground in 2022 by winning her first career WTA Tour singles title at Parma, becoming the first Egyptian player to win a WTA Tour title; she defeated No.7 Sakkari in the Parma final for her first career Top 10 win
- Also in 2022, reached 2r on three further occasions on Tour (including Roland Garros) and won WTA 125 titles at Marbella, Karlsruhe and Colina
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 9, 2021 - highest-ranked Egyptian woman ever
- In 2021, reached first Tour-level finals at Cluj-Napoca, finishing R-Up in singles (l. Petkovic) and doubles (w/Piter); also won first career WTA 125 title at Karlsruhe and reached 2r on three further occasions on Tour (including at Australian Open and Indian Wells)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2020 Prague, and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2020 Roland Garros, falling 1r as qualifier on both occasions; became the first woman representing Egypt to contest the main draw of a Grand Slam event
- Fell in qualifying at 2020 Australian Open (l. Li in 1r), her first time contesting qualifying at Tour level
- Ended 2019 at No.212 after winning six ITF titles, including a 26-match winning streak, and finishing the year with a win-loss record of 68-17 (at all levels); cracked Top 200 for the first time on November 11, 2019 at No.189
- In 2025 posted stand-out results at WTA 500 Guadalajara with SF (l. Arango) and QF at WTA 250 Cleveland (l. Li). Notched her strongest career Slam result with 3r at Roland Garros and earned her first main draw wins at Wimbledon and US Open. Reached the final at two WTA 125 events at Contrexeville and Limoges and broke into Top 100 for first time
- Highlight of 2024 season was making main draw debut at Wimbledon (l. Stephens). Made R16 runs at Merida and Prague. Achieved new career high ranking of No.137 in August
- Played qualifying at Australian Open, Roland Garros and Australian in 2023, with best run made at US Open reaching 1r (l. Tsurenko). Also reached main draw at Hamburg (as qualifier, l. Putintseva in 1r) and first final at WTA 125 Limoges (l. Bucsa).
- In 2022, posted highest GS result with 2r at Roland Garros (l. Kerber) and broke into Top 200. Closed the season winning \$100k Dubai and reached a career best of No. 143 on December 12
- Played mainly ITF tournaments in 2021 achieving R-Up at Perigueux \$25k on clay
- Began 2020 with another run through qualifying to QF, this time at \$25k Grenoble-FRA
- Ended 2019 season by coming through qualifying to reach maiden ITF Circuit QF at \$25k St. Etienne-FRA
- On Grand Slam qualifying debut at 2019 Roland Garros, made Q2 (l. Lottner)
- Fell at the first hurdle in qualifying on professional debut at \$60k ITF/Andrezieux-Boutheon-FRA in January 2018
- Won girls' singles at 2020 Roland Garros (d. Charaeva in F) - was first home player to win in Paris since Mladenovic in 2009

- Won the 2019 African Games to earn a place at Tokyo Olympics in 2021
- Owns 11 singles and six doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Won first ITF Circuit title in 2013 at \$10K Sharm El-Sheik
- Made ITF Circuit debut in 2010, at a \$10K event in Ain Alsoukhna-Suiz in Egypt

- Earned first ITF titles in 2021 at W15 Cairo (2)
- Played first ITF tournaments in 2017 and 2018

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, reached first Grand Slam SF at Australian Open (l. No.1 Sabalenka), which sent her into the Top 10 for the first time since October 2022; made 3 more QFs (Merida, Strasbourg and Berlin) but was affected by injuries, contesting only one event after Wimbledon (Beijing 3r)
- Voted 2024 WTA Comeback Player of the Year after finishing the year at No.12 (after finishing 2023 at No.66); won 4th career title at Washington DC and also reached SF at Cincinnati, Beijing and Ningbo; also advanced to QF at US Open
- In 2023, made SF at Adelaide #2, reached back-to-back QF at Charleston and Stuttgart and an additional QF at Rome, but withdrew from Roland Garros with a back injury. Her last match of the year was at Wimbledon, where she fell in R64 then ended her season due to continuing injury
- In 2022, Badosa rose to career-high ranking of No.2 (April 25), won the title at Sydney, and advanced to SF at Indian Wells, Stuttgart and San Jose
- Captured the first two WTA singles titles of her career in 2021 at Belgrade (d. Konjuh in F) and Indian Wells (d. Azarenka in F); qualified for 2021 WTA Finals in Guadalajara, where she advanced to the SF stage
- Broke into the WTA Top 20 on October 18, 2021 after winning the Indian Wells title and reached the Top 10 on November 8, 2021; nominated for 2021 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year (won by Krejčíková), as voted on by members of the media
- At 2020 Roland Garros, upset former finalist Stephens and 2017 champion Ostapenko en route to reaching R16 for the first time at a major. That year also reached SF at Istanbul (l. Bouchard)
- Campaign in 2019 highlighted by SF run at Palermo (l. Bertens) and QF showing at Seoul (l. Y.Wang); also fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Birrell)
- Finished 2018 inside Top 200 for the first time (at No.143); picked up three ITF titles at \$25k ITF/Glasgow-UK, ITF/\$25k Les Franqueses del Valles-FRA and ITF/\$60k Valencia-ESP
- Claimed third title on ITF Circuit in 2017 at ITF/\$25k El Espinar; fell 1r at Miami and in qualifying at Madrid
- In 2016, fell 1r at Miami, Madrid and Mallorca and in qualifying at Rio de Janeiro
- In 2025 reached two QFs at Iasi (l. Cristian) and Budapest (l. Kalinina) and won first WTA 125 title at Buenos Aires. In doubles won first Tour level title at Iasi (w/Erjavec)
- Enjoyed WTA 125 success in 2024 reaching the final at Bari and semifinals at Santa Cruz and Cali
- Notched first Top 50 win at 2023 Osaka over Tatjana Maria. Also in 2023 was R-Up at WTA 125 Le Bisbal D'Emporda, Spain (l. Rus in F)
- Claimed first WTA 125 title at 2022 Buenos Aires (d. Kovinic in F)
- In 2022, won three ITF titles, W60 Cordenons, W60 Barranquilla, and Buenos Aires 125, and made F at Iasi 125 and W60 Macon GA
- Most successful WTA Tour run came at Wimbledon with 2r advancement; with the biggest win of the season against No.60 Tamara Zidansek in 1r
- Also made six other ITF quarter-finals, at Marbella 125, Karlsruhe 125, W60 Poertschach, Bastad 125, Bari 125, and Bucharest 125
- Broke into Top 100 on November 29, 2021, rising from No.107 to No.96 after winning W60 clay-court event in Brasilia
- Lifted four other titles on ITF Circuit last year, all on clay, and was R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Montevideo
- Reached maiden Tour-level QF at 2021 Budapest (as WC, l. Kalinina)
- Last year, also fell 1r at Cluj-Napoca and in qualifying on four occasions (including Wimbledon and US Open)
- Competed mainly on ITF Circuit in 2020; fell in qualifying at Hua Hin
