- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Hamburg, where her previous result was R-Up in 2025 (l. Lois Boisson in F)
- Has beaten Moyuka Uchijima and Noma Noha Akugue so far this week to reach her first QF since QF at Rabat 2026 (l. finalist Anhelina Kalinina)
- Faces No.117 Alina Charaeva in QF today; since the start of the 2025 season, holds a Tour-level record of 15-3 versus opponents ranked outside the Top 100 (11-1 on clay in such matches)
- First career Tour-level match against a player from Armenia
- Record in Tour-level QF matches stands at 4-9 (all four wins have come on clay)
- Best career Tour-level result on clay is Runner-Up which she has reached once: Hamburg in 2025 (l. Boisson in F)
- Only player from Hungary to reach QF (Panna Udvardy fell in 2r against Paula Badosa)
- Bondar (2026, 2025) and Dalma Galfi (2025) are the only players from Hungary to appear in QF at Hamburg
- Her run to the finals in 2025 is the best result by a player from Hungary at this event
- Is currently ranked No.97; this time last year was ranked No.59
- During last year's clay-court swing was R-Up at Hamburg (l. Boisson), 2r at Roland Garros (l. No.14 Elina Svitolina) and 1r at Rome (l. Aslyn Krueger)
- Has won 17 Tour-level matches so far in 2026 (12 on clay); with a win, would equal her most Tour-level victories in a calendar year (had 18 wins in 2022)

- Making tournament debut at Hamburg; overall, this is her fifth main draw appearance at a Tour-level event
- Has beaten Sara Sorribes Tormo and Sinja Kraus so far this week to reach her first career Tour-level QF
- Her matches against Sorribes Tormo (3 hours) and Kraus (2 hours 57 minutes) were the longest in her Tour-level career
- Faces No.97 Anna Bondar in QF today; looking for her second career Tour-level victory versus a Top 100 opponent (first such win came in 2r against No.80 Kraus)
- First career Tour-level match against a player from Hungary
- Owns 1-2 career Tour-level record against seeds (d. Kraus at Hamburg)
- Prior to her current run, her best career Tour-level result on clay was a Round of 16 appearance last week at Iasi
- One of two players from Armenia to reach QF, joining Elina Avanesyan (first time a player from Armenia has reached the QF at this event)
- Is currently ranked a career-high No.117; this time last year was ranked No.174
- Seeking to win three straight matches for the first time her Tour-level career; prior to this event, had never won consecutive Tour-level matches
- Has won three Tour-level matches so far in 2026 (all on clay)

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CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025 reached first Tour final of her career at Hamburg (l. Boisson), defeating No.1 seed and world No.16 Alexandrova en route to the final. Competed in the main draw at all four Slams winning 1r matches at Roland Garros and US Open (d. No.15 Svitolina in 1r)
- In 2024, won second career WTA 125 title at Hamburg (first came at 2021 Buenos Aires). In doubles reached the final at Bogota w/Khromacheva and earned WTA 125 titles at Hamburg and San Luis Potosi (both with Zimmerman)
- In 2023 won first Grand Slam main draw match defeating Bogdan in 1r at Australian Open; also reached semifinal at Lausanne (l. Cocciaretto) and made 3r at Rome (as qualifier, l. Zheng)
- Highlights of 2022 were SF at Rabat (withdrew w/right shoulder injury before match versus Liu) and QF at Lyon (l. Cirstea), Istanbul (l. Kudermetova) and Palermo (l. Sorribes Tormo)
- Won first career title on Tour in doubles at Palermo (w/Zimmermann)
- Made Top 100 debut on November 15, 2021, following title run at W60 ITF Circuit event in Santiago, Chile
- Ended 2021 in fine form, winning 27 matches after US Open, lifting titles at WTA 125K Series event at Buenos Aires and two ITF Circuit tournaments
- In 2020, reached two QFs on ITF Circuit and made 2r at WTA 125K Series event at Prague
- Suffered 1r defeat on WTA main draw debut at 2019 Budapest (l. Cirstea). Also that year, fell 1r at Bucharest (as qualifier, l. Tig) and in qualifying on three occasions
- Contested Grand Slam qualifying for the first time at 2019 Wimbledon
- Won the most recent of her 10 ITF Circuit singles titles in January 2019, at \$25k Daytona Beach, FL-USA
- Fell at first hurdle on debut in WTA qualifying at 2018 Budapest
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2014, winning a title in only her second event, at \$10k Antalya-TUR
- In 2025, made Tour-level debut at WTA 500 Tokyo as a qualifier (l. Cristian in 1r); also played main draw at Chennai. Reached the final at WTA 125 Huzhou and posted a career high ranking of No.142 in September
- During 2024, won ITF/W50 title at Ourense; made Top 200 debut at No.199 on October 28
- Picked up two ITF singles titles in 2022 and two more in 2023
- In 2021, contested first WTA qualifying matches at St. Petersburg and won 2nd career ITF Circuit singles title
- Won first ITF Circuit singles title in 2018 at Vinaros \$15K
- Junior Roland Garros singles R-Up in 2020 (l. Jacquemot in F) and Junior Roland Garros doubles R-Up in 2019 (w/Tikhonova; l. Beck/Navarro in F)

PLAYER NOTES

- Making 3rd appearance at this event; she previously fell 1r in 2023 (l. Lys) and 2025 (l. Chirico)
- Defeated No.6 seed Simona Waltert and Elsa Jacquemot, and has now won 7 consecutive matches at Tour-level (12 consecutive wins when including WTA 125 events - all on clay)
- Last week, Sherif won her 2nd career WTA Tour title at Iasi, defeating today's opponent Badosa in the final (Badosa retired in 2nd set due to right thigh injury)
- In the week prior to Iasi, Sherif won the WTA 125 Contrexeville title (d. Vandromme in F)
- Faces No.93 Paula Badosa in QF today; Sherif is 4-2 at Tour-level this year vs. Top 100 players
- Owns 4-3 career Tour-level record against players from Spain (2-0 in 2026, d. Badosa and Quevedo last week in Iasi)
- This is her 8th career WTA Tour QF, and she is seeking her 6th career WTA Tour SF
- Her 2 career Tour-level titles have both come on clay: 2026 Iasi (d. Badosa in F) and 2022 Parma (d. Sakkari in F)
- Only player ever from Egypt to appear in the main draw at this event
- Is currently ranked No.55; this time last year was ranked No.98. Reached career-high ranking of No.31 in June 2023
- Her current 7-match winning streak at WTA Tour events is the longest such Tour-level streak of her career (had previously won 5 straight during her title run at 2022 Parma)
- All 8 of her Tour-level wins this year have been on clay
- In career, at WTA 125 level events and higher, has won 160 matches with 149 coming on clay

- Making her tournament debut
- Defeated Katarzyna Kawa and No.3 seed Panna Udvardy so far this week; Badosa also defeated Udvardy last week in run to Iasi final
- Last week, finished R-Up at Iasi on clay (l. today's opponent Sherif in final; Badosa retired due to right thigh injury) - that was Badosa's first WTA Tour final since 2024
- Including WTA 125 events, she has won 11 of her last 12 matches (all on clay) - the week prior to Iasi, she won the WTA 125 event in Bastad (d. Waltert in F)
- Faces No.55 Mayar Sherif in QF today; Badosa is 7-7 at Tour-level this year vs. Top 75 players
- Owns 1-1 career Tour-level record against players from Egypt, both of those WTA Tour matches vs. Sherif
- Also lost to Sherif at a World Tennis/ITF 10K event in 2013 (Badosa was ranked No.916 and Sherif was ranked No.686)
- One of her 4 WTA titles has come on clay - her first career title at 2021 Belgrade (d. Konjuh in F via ret.)
- One of 4 players from Spain in this week's main draw (also Quevedo, Romero Gormaz and Sorribes Tormo) and the only one to reach QF
- Has equaled the best result by Spain at this tournament, which was QF run by Romero Gormaz in 2025 (l. Juvan)
- Is currently ranked No.93; this time last year was ranked No.10. Reached career-high ranking of No.2 in April 2022

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CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won WTA 125 title at Parma and finished R-Up at WTA 125 Tucuman; captured second career WTA Tour doubles title at Merida (w/Piter); and won a pair of ITF/W100 singles titles at Madrid and Biarritz
- During 2024, finished R-Up at WTA 250 Rabat (L. Stearns in F) and won her first WTA Tour doubles title at Monastir (w/Blinkova); also reached a further four WTA 125 finals, all on clay: Lleida, Parma, Makarska and Contrexeville
- In 2023, enjoyed SF run at Palermo (L. Q. Zheng) and was a quarterfinalist at Monterrey (L. Garcia) and Madrid, where she became the first Egyptian player to reach QF at a WTA 1000 event (L. Sabalenka in 3s)
- Also in 2023, won back-to-back WTA 125 titles at Makarska (saving six championship points against Paolini in F) and Valencia (d. Bassols Ribera in F), afterwards attaining new career-high ranking of No.31 (week of June 19); best Grand Slam result came at Roland Garros (2r, L. Potapova)
- Broke new ground in 2022 by winning her first career WTA Tour singles title at Parma, becoming the first Egyptian player to win a WTA Tour title; she defeated No.7 Sakkari in the Parma final for her first career Top 10 win
- Also in 2022, reached 2r on three further occasions on Tour (including Roland Garros) and won WTA 125 titles at Marbella, Karlsruhe and Colina
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 9, 2021 - highest-ranked Egyptian woman ever
- In 2021, reached first Tour-level finals at Cluj-Napoca, finishing R-Up in singles (L. Petkovic) and doubles (w/Piter); also won first career WTA 125 title at Karlsruhe and reached 2r on three further occasions on Tour (including at Australian Open and Indian Wells)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2020 Prague, and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2020 Roland Garros, falling 1r as qualifier on both occasions; became the first woman representing Egypt to contest the main draw of a Grand Slam event
- Fell in qualifying at 2020 Australian Open (L. Li in 1r), her first time contesting qualifying at Tour level
- Ended 2019 at No.212 after winning six ITF titles, including a 26-match winning streak, and finishing the year with a win-loss record of 68-17 (at all levels); cracked Top 200 for the first time on November 11, 2019 at No.189
- In 2025, reached first Grand Slam SF at Australian Open (L. No.1 Sabalenka), which sent her into the Top 10 for the first time since October 2022; made 3 more QFs (Merida, Strasbourg and Berlin) but was affected by injuries, contesting only one event after Wimbledon (Beijing 3r)
- Voted 2024 WTA Comeback Player of the Year after finishing the year at No.12 (after finishing 2023 at No.66); won 4th career title at Washington DC and also reached SF at Cincinnati, Beijing and Ningbo; also advanced to QF at US Open
- In 2023, made SF at Adelaide #2, reached back-to-back QF at Charleston and Stuttgart and an additional QF at Rome, but withdrew from Roland Garros with a back injury. Her last match of the year was at Wimbledon, where she fell in R64 then ended her season due to continuing injury
- In 2022, Badosa rose to career-high ranking of No.2 (April 25), won the title at Sydney, and advanced to SF at Indian Wells, Stuttgart and San Jose
- Captured the first two WTA singles titles of her career in 2021 at Belgrade (d. Konjuh in F) and Indian Wells (d. Azarenka in F); qualified for 2021 WTA Finals in Guadalajara, where she advanced to the SF stage
- Broke into the WTA Top 20 on October 18, 2021 after winning the Indian Wells title and reached the Top 10 on November 8, 2021; nominated for 2021 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year (won by Krejčíková), as voted on by members of the media
- At 2020 Roland Garros, upset former finalist Stephens and 2017 champion Ostapenko en route to reaching R16 for the first time at a major. That year also reached SF at Istanbul (L. Bouchard)
- Campaign in 2019 highlighted by SF run at Palermo (L. Bertens) and QF showing at Seoul (L. Y.Wang); also fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open (as qualifier, L. Birrell)
- Finished 2018 inside Top 200 for the first time (at No.143); picked up three ITF titles at \$25k ITF/Glasgow-UK, ITF/\$25k Les Franqueses del Valles-FRA and ITF/\$60k Valencia-ESP

- In 2023, won first WTA Tour singles title at Cluj-Napoca (d. Ruse in F); also reached SF at Prague (l. Noskova) and WTA 125 Valencia (l. Bassols Ribera) and hit a career-high ranking of No.71 on October 23
- Top results in 2022 include first WTA 125 title at Budapest (made Top 100 debut afterwards on September 26), WTA 125 R-Up at Marbella, and ITF/W25 title at Le Havre-FRA; best Tour-level results were 2r at Lyon and Stuttgart
