- This is her 4th career WTA Tour SF, and her first since SF finish at 2025 Merida (l. eventual champion Navarro)
- Seeking her 2nd career WTA Tour final; she finished R-Up at 2024 Iasi (l. M.Andreeva in F via ret.)
- Faces No.97 Anna Bondar in SF today; Avanesyan is 2-2 at Tour-level this year vs. Top 100 players
- Owns 1-1 career Tour-level record against players from Hungary, both of those matches vs. today's opponent Bondar
- Career-best Tour-level result on clay is her 2024 Iasi R-Up showing
- 1 of 2 players from Armenia in this week's main draw (Charaeva lost in QF) - first time players from Armenia reached QF or better at this event
- Best result by a qualifier at this event was the title run by Elena-Gabriela Ruse in 2021 (d. Petkovic in F)
- Has won 4 Tour-level matches this year, 3 of which have come in the last two weeks (made Iasi R16 last week as a qualifier)
- Is currently ranked No.208; this time last year was ranked No.54. Reached career-high ranking of No.36 in March 2025

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2025 highlights include SF showings at Hobart and Merida, reached a career-high ranking of No.36 on March 17
- Posted first Top 50 season finish in 2024, after reaching first WTA final at Iasi (ret. vs. M.Andreeva in F); in Grand Slam play, recorded career-first Top 10 win over Sakkari at Australian Open, and reached R16 at Roland Garros for second year in a row
- During a breakthrough 2023 season, reached a new career-high ranking of No.63 and was nominated for the WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Advanced to the R16 at Roland Garros 2023 (L. Muchova), her best Grand Slam performance to date. Also reached three Tour-level quarterfinals at Berlin (L. Vekic), Budapest (L. Podoroska), and Lausanne (L. eventual champion Cocciaretto)
- Reached maiden WTA QF at 2022 Bogota (L. Osorio). In 2022, also reached 2r at Palermo (L. Bronzetti) and fell 1r on four occasions (including US Open)
- In 2021, posted 47-19 win-loss record, reaching seven finals on ITF Circuit
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at a W25 event in Shymkent, Kazakhstan in September 2019
- Owns five titles in singles and nine in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Russia in 2017
- In 2025 reached first Tour final of her career at Hamburg (L. Boisson), defeating No.1 seed and world No.16 Alexandrova en route to the final. Competed in the main draw at all four Slams winning 1r matches at Roland Garros and US Open (d. No.15 Svitolina in 1r)
- In 2024, won second career WTA 125 title at Hamburg (first came at 2021 Buenos Aires). In doubles reached the final at Bogota w/Khromacheva and earned WTA 125 titles at Hamburg and San Luis Potosi (both with Zimmermann)
- In 2023 won first Grand Slam main draw match defeating Bogdan in 1r at Australian Open; also reached semifinal at Lausanne (L. Cocciaretto) and made 3r at Rome (as qualifier, L. Zheng)
- Highlights of 2022 were SF at Rabat (withdrew w/right shoulder injury before match versus Liu) and QF at Lyon (L. Cirstea), Istanbul (L. Kudermetova) and Palermo (L. Sorribes Tormo)
- Won first career title on Tour in doubles at Palermo (w/Zimmermann)
- Made Top 100 debut on November 15, 2021, following title run at W60 ITF Circuit event in Santiago, Chile
- Ended 2021 in fine form, winning 27 matches after US Open, lifting titles at WTA 125K Series event at Buenos Aires and two ITF Circuit tournaments
- In 2020, reached two QFs on ITF Circuit and made 2r at WTA 125K Series event at Prague
- Suffered 1r defeat on WTA main draw debut at 2019 Budapest (L. Cirstea). Also that year, fell 1r at Bucharest (as qualifier, L. Tig) and in qualifying on three occasions
- Contested Grand Slam qualifying for the first time at 2019 Wimbledon
- Won the most recent of her 10 ITF Circuit singles titles in January 2019, at \$25k Daytona Beach, FL-USA
- Fell at first hurdle on debut in WTA qualifying at 2018 Budapest
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2014, winning a title in only her second event, at \$10k Antalya-TUR

- Last week, Sherif won her 2nd career WTA Tour title at Iasi, defeating Badosa in the final (Badosa retired in 2nd set due to right thigh injury)
- In the week prior to Iasi, Sherif won the WTA 125 Contrexeville title (d. Vandromme in F)
- This is her 6th career WTA Tour SF and she is seeking her 5th career WTA Tour final (4-1 career record in WTA Tour SF matches)
- Faces No.81 Tamara Korpatsch in SF today; Sherif is 5-2 at Tour-level this year vs. Top 100 players
- Owns 1-4 career Tour-level record against players from Germany (her 1 win over today's opponent Korpatsch occurred at WTA 125-level)
- Her 2 career Tour-level titles have both come on clay: 2026 Iasi (d. Badosa in F) and 2022 Parma (d. Sakkari in F)
- Only player ever from Egypt to appear in the main draw at this event
- Her current 8-match winning streak at WTA Tour events is the longest such Tour-level streak of her career (had previously won 5 straight during her title run at 2022 Parma)
- All 9 of her Tour-level wins this year have been on clay
- Is currently ranked No.55; this time last year was ranked No.98. Reached career-high ranking of No.31 in June 2023

- Her prior SF showing this year was during her R-Up finish at Ostrava in February on hard court (l. Boulter in F)
- This is her 6th career WTA Tour SF, and she is seeking her 3rd career WTA Tour final, after winning the 2023 Cluj-Napoca title (d. Ruse in F) and finishing R-Up at 2026 Ostrava
- Faces No.55 Mayar Sherif in SF today; Korpatsch is 7-4 at Tour-level this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- First Tour-level meeting vs. a player from Egypt (her previous wins over Sherif occurred at WTA 125 San Sebastian in 2025, and Rome qualifying in 2026)
- Career-best Tour-level results on clay are 3 SFs at 2019 Lausanne (l. eventual R-Up Cornet), 2021 Gdynia (l. eventual R-Up Kucova) and this week
- 1 of 8 players from Germany to start this week's main draw, and the only one to reach QF and beyond
- Best results by Germany at this tournament were R-Up finishes by Noma Noha Akugue in 2023 (l. Arantxa Rus in F) and Andrea Petkovic in 2021 (l. Elena-Gabriela Ruse in F)
- Has won 10 Tour-level matches so far in 2026 (6 on clay); 2023 is the only season in which she has won more than 10 Tour-level matches (13)
- Is currently ranked No.81; this time last year was ranked No.156. Reached career-high ranking of No.71 in October 2023

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won WTA 125 title at Parma and finished R-Up at WTA 125 Tucuman; captured second career WTA Tour doubles title at Merida (w/Piter); and won a pair of ITF/W100 singles titles at Madrid and Biarritz
- During 2024, finished R-Up at WTA 250 Rabat (l. Stearns in F) and won her first WTA Tour doubles title at Monastir (w/Blinkova); also reached a further four WTA 125 finals, all on clay: Lleida, Parma, Makarska and Contrexeville
- In 2023, enjoyed SF run at Palermo (l. Q. Zheng) and was a quarterfinalist at Monterrey (l. Garcia) and Madrid, where she became the first Egyptian player to reach QF at a WTA 1000 event (l. Sabalenka in 3s)
- Also in 2023, won back-to-back WTA 125 titles at Makarska (saving six championship points against Paolini in F) and Valencia (d. Bassols Ribera in F), afterwards attaining new career-high ranking of No.31 (week of June 19); best Grand Slam result came at Roland Garros (2r, l. Potapova)
- Broke new ground in 2022 by winning her first career WTA Tour singles title at Parma, becoming the first Egyptian player to win a WTA Tour title; she defeated No.7 Sakkari in the Parma final for her first career Top 10 win
- Also in 2022, reached 2r on three further occasions on Tour (including Roland Garros) and won WTA 125 titles at Marbella, Karlsruhe and Colina
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 9, 2021 - highest-ranked Egyptian woman ever
- In 2021, reached first Tour-level finals at Cluj-Napoca, finishing R-Up in singles (l. Petkovic) and doubles (w/Piter); also won first career WTA 125 title at Karlsruhe and reached 2r on three further occasions on Tour (including at Australian Open and Indian Wells)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2020 Prague, and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2020 Roland Garros, falling 1r as qualifier on both occasions; became the first woman representing Egypt to contest the main draw of a Grand Slam event
- Fell in qualifying at 2020 Australian Open (l. Li in 1r), her first time contesting qualifying at Tour level
