2026 UNITED CUP – TALKING POINTS

- The **ATP Tour** and **WTA Tour** are launching the tennis season with the **United Cup** team event for the fourth consecutive year with Team USA winning the inaugural edition in 2023 and looking to defend their 2025 title after defeating Poland in the final last year.
- Combined 7 Top 10 players will be in action at the 2026 **United Cup** with three Top 10 players from the PIF WTA Rankings and four Top 10 players from the PIF ATP Rankings look to begin their season playing for their country. Team USA is the only nation in this year's competition with both No. 1 players inside Top 10.

- Eighteen national teams will compete across six groups of three teams competing in a round-robin format. Each team can have up to six members – a maximum of three ATP players and three WTA players. Perth's RAC Arena and Sydney's Ken Rosewall Arena will host three groups with the competition taking place from January 2-11. Each tie will consist of two singles matches followed by one mixed doubles match.
- WTA No. 3 **Coco Gauff** and ATP No. 6 **Taylor Fritz** headline the competition as the No. 1 seeds. Both Gauff and Fritz were part of the 2025 winning United Cup Team, while Fritz makes his fourth appearance (9-3 singles record) after also winning the title in 2023. Playing in Perth, they'll face off against Team Spain and Team Argentina in Group A.
- Team Poland reached the final in the last two editions of the United Cup with WTA No. 2 **Iga Swiatek** and ATP World No. 72 **Hubert Hurkacz**, leading the team on both occasions. Swiatek owns a 12-2 singles record at the event and Hurkacz is 7-7 at the event in singles. They face 2024 champions Team Germany and Team Netherlands in Group F as they aim to reach the semifinals for a third year (2023 SF, 2024 final).
- Captain **Lleyton Hewitt** will lead the home Australian team that includes ATP No. 7 **Alex de Minaur** and 19-year-old WTA No. 32 **Maya Joint**. Australians will be playing in Group D in Sydney against Team Czechia, that includes ATP No. 19 **Jakub Mensik** and WTA No. 65 **Barbora Krejcikova**, and Team Norway, led by ATP No. 12 **Casper Ruud**. Australia will face both teams for the first time at the United Cup.
- Team Canada enters as No. 2 seeds and looking to progress out of the group stage for the first time in their third United Cup appearance. ATP No. 5 **Felix Auger-Aliassime** and WTA No. 18 **Victoria Mboko** head the team who will face Team Belgium and Team China in Group B.
- 2024 United Cup champions Team Germany again features ATP No. 3 **Alexander Zverev**, while WTA No. 40 **Eva Lys** makes her United Cup debut. Team Germany will face Team Poland for a second time after defeating them in the 2024 final to capture the title.
- No. 3 seed Team Italy reached the final in 2023 and this year includes WTA No. 8 **Jasmine Paolini** and ATP No. 22 **Flavio Cobolli**. Team Japan will make its United Cup debut led by former World No.1 **Naomi Osaka** (current ranking No. 16) and ATP No. 99 **Shintaro Mochizuki**.

UNITED STATES – GROUP A

Taylor Fritz | Age: 28 | ATP World No. 6 | Career-High No. 4 | 2025: 53-23 (2 Titles) | Career: 337-213 (10 Titles)
> Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 4 in November 2024 after becoming 1st American since Blake in 2006 to play in Nitto ATP Finals championship match and finish in Top 5 of year-end rankings.
> At 2024 US Open, became 1st American man to play in a Grand Slam final since 2009 after earning wins over former finalists Ruud and Zverev and defeating countryman Tiafoe in all-American semi-final.
> Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.
> Went on a 13-2 run on grass in 2025, capturing titles in Stuttgart and Eastbourne and advancing to Wimbledon SF.
> Clinched United Cup titles for Team USA in 2023 and 2025, helped Team World capture Laver Cup in 2022, 2023 and 2025 and earned bronze medal at 2024 Paris Olympics in men's doubles w/Paul.

Coco Gauff | Age: 21 | WTA World No. 3 | Career-High No. 2 (June 2024) | 2025: 48-16 (2 singles titles) | Career: 243-99 (11 singles titles)
> At her United Cup debut in 2025, went 5-0 in singles and 2-0 in doubles, leading United States to the title
> Winner of 11 WTA Tour singles titles (including a 9-0 career record in WTA Tour hard court finals)
> Two-time Grand Slam singles champion, hoisting the trophy at 2023 US Open and 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in both finals)
> Other notable 2025 results included earning her third career WTA 1000 title at Wuhan and WTA 1000 finals at Madrid and Rome, becoming the first American to reach three WTA 1000 finals in a calendar year since Serena Williams in 2014
> Has won 10 WTA Tour doubles titles, including a Grand Slam title at 2024 Roland Garros (w/Siniakova)
> Reached World No.1 in doubles rankings on August 15, 2022

> Defeated countryman Alcaraz before falling to countryman Carreno Busta in 1st ATP Tour final at 2021 Marbella.
> Captured 2 Top-5 wins over No. 3 Zverev at 2019 Marrakech 2R and No. 3 Ruud at 2022 Tokyo 1R.
> Earned personal-best 31 wins in 2025, highlighted by semi-finals in Hong Kong, Dallas and Basel, and reaching Wimbledon 3R and US Open 4R after 0-11 start to career in Grand Slam 2Rs.

> Hit career-high ranking of No.40 on August 18, 2025, and posted year-end singles ranking of No.42 in 2025 (first Top 50 finish of career)
> At 2023 United Cup, went 1-0 in singles (d. Gadecki) and 0-2 in doubles; returned for 2025 United Cup and went 1-1 in singles (d. Sakkari, l. Rybakina)
> Biggest career title came at WTA 125 Antalya in 2024 (d. Begu in final)

Sebastian Baez | Age: 25 | ATP World No. 45 | Career-High No. 18 | 2025: 17-24 (Rio Title) | Career: 108-111 (7 Titles)
> Broke inside Top 20 in March 2024 after winning back-to-back ATP Tour titles in Rio de Janeiro and Santiago, then earned career-high No. 18 in June 2025.

> During 2023 season, went on a career-best 12-match winning streak, lifting titles in Kitzbuhel and Winston-Salem and reached 1st Grand Slam 3R at US Open.

> Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2022 Estoril, then earned 2nd title on home soil at 2023 Cordoba after entering tournament with 6 straight losses and 17 losses in previous 18 matches.

> Broke into Top 300, 200 and 100 in 2021, posting 6-3 record in Challenger finals tied for 2nd-most titles in a season behind Griekspoor's 8 in 2021.

> Became World No. 1 junior in March 2018 and went on to reach Roland Garros boys' singles final and win boys' doubles gold medal at Youth Olympics w/Diaz Acosta in his hometown of Buenos Aires.

Solana Sierra | Age: 21 | WTA World No. 66 | Career-High No. 64 (July 2025) | 2025: 6-6 (QF Sao Paolo) | Career: 6-7 (0 titles)

> Broke through at Grand Slam level by reaching 2025 Wimbledon R16 as lucky loser (l. Siegemund); became the first LL to reach the R16 at Wimbledon in the Open Era, and the first Argentine woman to reach the R16 at Wimbledon since Paola Suarez in 2004

Felix Auger-Aliassime | Age: 25 | ATP World No. 5 (Career-High) | 2025: 50-24 (3 Titles) | Career: 265-171 (8 Titles)
> Finished 2025 season at career-high No. 5 after winning titles in Adelaide, Montpellier and Brussels and advancing to US Open SF, Nitto ATP Finals SF and ATP Masters 1000 Paris final during the season.

> Earned personal-best 60 wins during breakout 2022 season, including career-long 16-match win streak with 3 titles in as many weeks at Florence, Antwerp and Basel.

> Also in 2022, won Rotterdam title to snap 0-8 start to career in singles finals, swept team titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup and recorded victories over No. 1 Alcaraz and former No. 1s Djokovic, Murray and Nadal.

> Competing in her first year on Tour in 2025, she lifted her first title at WTA 1000 Montreal – a fairytale run on home soil as an 18-year-old wildcard, registering her first career Top 10 win over No.2 Gauff along the way

> Went on to claim a second title in 2025 at WTA 250 Hong Kong

> Started the 2025 season ranked outside Top 300 and ended the season at a career-high ranking of No.18

> Won her first WTA main draw match in 2025 as a wild card at Miami (d. Osorio)

> Best career Tour-level doubles result is QF run at Tokyo 2025 (w/Andreescu)

> Voted 2025 WTA Newcomer of the Year

BELGIUM – GROUP B

Zizou Bergs | Age: 26 | World No. 42 | Career-High No. 39 | 2025: 31-27 (2 Finals) | Career: 54-64 (2 Finals)

> Former World No. 12 junior broke into Top 200 in July 2021, Top 100 in June 2024 and achieved career-high No. 39 in October 2025 after reaching 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF in Shanghai.

> Advanced to 2024 Roland Garros 3R as Q, 2025 US Open 3R, and upset No. 9 Rublev for biggest win of career to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R at 2025 Miami.

> Defeated Ramos-Vinolas for 1st ATP Tour win at 2020 Antwerp as 528th-ranked WC and advanced to ATP Tour finals at 2025 Auckland and 2025 's-Hertogenbosch.

> Earned 2022 Wimbledon WC after defeating former World No. 8 Sock for 2022 Ilkley Challenger title as Q.

> Also won Challenger titles at 2021 St. Petersburg-1 as Q, 2021 Lille as Q, 2021 Almaty, 2023 & 2024 Tallahassee, 2023 Drummondville and 2023 Yokkaichi.

Elise Mertens | Age: 30 | WTA World No. 20 | Career-High No. 12 (Nov 2018) | 2025: 36-20 (2 titles) | Career: 291-188 (10 titles)

> Won two titles in 2025 at Singapore and 's-Hertogenbosch to mark ninth and tenth career singles WTA titles; also reached the final at Hobart for second consecutive year

> Finished the 2025 season ranked inside the singles Top 20 for a fourth year after 2018, 2019 and 2020

> Career best Grand Slam result is semifinal at 2018 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Wozniacki)

> The former doubles World No.1 (May 2021) ended the 2025 season with a doubles ranking of No.5

> Lifted a fifth Grand Slam doubles trophy in 2025 at Wimbledon with Veronika Kudermetova; the pair then went on to win the year-end WTA Finals title for a second time together after 2022

> Owns 23 doubles titles including five Grand Slams and two WTA Finals

Zhang Zhizhen | Age: 29 | ATP World No. 410 | Career-High No. 31 | 2025: 5-12 (Marseille QF) | Career: 60-71 (1 Final)
> Became the first Chinese player in PIF ATP Rankings history to break into Top 100 in October 2022 and Top 50 in January 2024, achieving career-high No. 31 in July 2024.

> Also in 2024, defeated countryman Buyunchaokete in 1st all-Chinese ATP Tour SF to reach 1st final in Hangzhou and earned silver medal in mixed doubles at 2024 Paris Olympics with Wang Xinyu.

> Won 3 consecutive matches in deciding set tie-breaks to become the 1st Chinese player in ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2023 Madrid and reached 2nd ATP Masters 1000 QF at 2024 Rome.

> Qualified at 2021 Wimbledon and joined fellow qualifier Wu at 2022 US Open as 1st Chinese man to compete in main draw of both events in Open Era.

> First Chinese man in Open Era to reach ATP Tour SFs on clay and grass and earn Top 10 win at a Grand Slam event, defeating No. 5 Ruud for biggest win of career to reach US Open 3R in 2023.

Zhu Lin | Age: 31 | WTA World No. 168 | Career-High No. 31 (Sept 2023) | 2025: 7-10 (QF Ningbo) | Career: 88-115 (1 title)

> Owns one WTA singles title at Hua Hin 2023 and has reached a further two finals: Hua Hin 2024 and Osaka 2023

> Reached a career-high singles ranking of No.31 in September 2023 after reaching the final at Osaka

> Has played in the main draw at a Grand Slam on 22 occasions with her best result achieved at 2023 Australian Open with R16 (l. Azarenka)

> Notched first Top 20 win of career over No.17 Kvitova at Tianjin 2017; now owns nine career wins over Top 20 players and 3 wins over Top 10 players (No.6 M.Andreeva at Ningbo 2025, No.7 Garcia at Cleveland 2023 and No.6 Sakkari at Australian Open 2023)

> Owns one career WTA doubles title at Nanchang 2019 (w/Wang Xinyu)

AUSTRALIA – GROUP D

Alex de Minaur | Age: 26 | ATP World No. 7 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 56-24 (Washington Title) | Career: 305-179 (10 Titles)

> Two-time Next Gen ATP Finals runner-up achieved career-high No. 6 in July 2024 before becoming 1st Australian to qualify for Nitto ATP Finals in singles since Hewitt in 2004.

> Earned personal-best 56 victories in 2025 and captured 10 ATP Tour titles, including ATP 500 championships at 2023 and 2024 Acapulco and 2025 Washington, where he saved 3 championship points vs. Davidovich Fokina.

> Reached 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open immediately after winning 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati w/Carreno Busta in team debut and at same venue.

> Six-time Grand Slam quarter-finalist, including at four consecutive events from 2024 Roland Garros to 2025 Australian Open and advanced to 1st ATP Masters 1000 QF, SF and final at 2023 Toronto.

> Playing for Australia, he went 6-1 in Davis Cup play during the 2022 season, leading Australia to its 1st final since 2003 and defeated No. 2 Nadal in 2023 and No. 1 Djokovic in 2024 at United Cup.

> Son to a Uruguayan father and Spanish mother, splits time between Australia and Spain, and speaks English, Spanish and French.

Maya Joint | Age: 19 | WTA World No. 32 | Career-High No. 32 (Oct 2025) | 2025: 32-20 (2 titles) | Career: 33-22 (2 titles)

> Won first two WTA Tour titles in 2025, at Rabat on clay (d. Cristian in final) and at Eastbourne on grass (d. Eala in final); also reached two additional semifinals at Hobart and Hong Kong

> In 2025 broke into the Top 100 in March, followed by the Top 50 in June and finished season at career high ranking of No.32

> Registered first Top 20 career win in 2025 at Merida (as a qualifier, d. No.20 Vekic) and now owns three Top 20 wins (d. No.12 Tauson at Seoul; d. No.17 Shnaider at Beijing)

> Claimed first Tour doubles title at Rabat 2025 (w/Kalashnikova)

> Made Tour-level main draw debut as a qualifier at US Open 2024 (d. Siegemund for first career main draw win before falling to No.14 seed Keys); also played at Merida 2024 (lost in opening round); finished the 2024 season ranked No.119

CZECHIA – GROUP D

Jakub Mensik | Age: 20 | ATP World No. 19 | Career-High No. 16 | 2025: 33-20 (Miami Title) | Career: 61-41 (1 Title)
 > Former World No. 2 junior broke into Top 100 in February 2025 and earned career-high No. 16 in August 2025 soon after becoming fourth man in series history to win 1st ATP Tour title at Masters 1000 event in Miami.
 > Also in Miami, defeated No. 4 Fritz and 6-time champion No. 5 Djokovic to join Alcaraz as only teenagers to earn multiple Top 5 wins in one event this century and became 1st Czech ATP Masters 1000 champion since 2005.
 > Reached 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2024 Doha by defeating former champions Murray, No. 5 Rublev and Monfils, becoming 1st man born in 2005 or later to play in an ATP Tour final.
 > In tour-level debut, reached 3R at 2023 US Open as Q, becoming youngest man to reach Grand Slam 3R since Nadal at 2004 Aus. Open and youngest at US Open since Santoro in 1990, losing to Fritz on 18th birthday.
 > Also advanced to Grand Slam 3R at 2024 US Open, losing to Borges after holding 3 MPs, 2025 Australian Open, losing to Davidovich Fokina after squandering 2 MPs and 2025 Wimbledon.
 > Posted 85-28 record on ITF Juniors circuit, highlighted by reaching 2022 Australian Open boys' singles final.

Barbora Krejčíková | Age: 30 | WTA World No. 65 | Career-High No. 2 (Feb 2022) | 2025: 16-9 (3 QFs) | Career: 153-92 (8 titles)
 > Owns 8 career singles trophies including two Grand Slam titles at Wimbledon 2024 and Roland Garros 2021
 > Missed first 5 months of 2025 due to back injury and made season debut at Strasbourg in May; in singles, posted three QF finishes at Eastbourne, US Open and Seoul. In doubles, won 20th career Tour title at Seoul (w/Siniakova)
 > Finished 2024 at No.10 in the year-end rankings for a 2nd consecutive and qualified for the WTA Finals where she advanced to the semifinals (l. Zheng); reached a career-high ranking of No.2 in February 2022
 > She has completed the Career Golden Slam in doubles after winning 2018 Roland Garros, 2018 Wimbledon, 2021 Tokyo Olympics, 2022 Australian Open and 2022 US Open (all w/Siniakova)
 > Owns 20 WTA doubles titles including seven Grand Slam trophies as well as 3 mixed doubles Grand Slam titles (all at Australian Open - 2019, 2020 and 2021); also won the 2021 WTA Finals with Siniakova
 > Rose to WTA Doubles World No.1 for the first time on October 22, 2018

NORWAY – GROUP D

Casper Ruud | Age: 27 | ATP World No. 12 | Career-High No. 2 | 2025: 39-16 (2 Titles) | Career: 297-156 (14 Titles)
 > Top-ranked Norwegian in history rose from No. 7 to career-high No. 2 after falling to Alcaraz in 2022 US Open final with No. 1 ranking at stake.
 > First Norwegian to win an ATP Tour title (14), an ATP Masters 1000 title (2025 Madrid), play at Nitto ATP Finals (2021 SF, 2022 final, 2024 SF), and reach a Grand Slam final (2022, 2023 Roland Garros, 2023 US Open).
 > Swept clay-court titles at Bastad, Gstaad and Kitzbuhel in July 2021 to become 1st player to win 3 titles in as many weeks since Murray at 2011 Bangkok, Tokyo and Shanghai.
 > Former No. 1 junior leads ATP Tour since start of 2020 season in clay-court wins (130), finals (17) and titles (12).
 > Defeated World No. 1 Djokovic for biggest win of career en route to 2024 ATP Masters 1000 Monte-Carlo final and won biggest titles of career on Spanish clay at 2024 Barcelona and 2025 ATP Masters 1000 Madrid.

Malene Helgo | Age: 26 | WTA World No. 532 | Career-High No. 317 (Jan 2023) | 2025: 0-0 | Career: 0-7 (0 titles)
 > Only Tour-level main draw appearances of her career have been at United Cup (2023 and 2024) where she is yet to post a win
 > From 2017-2025 earned nine ITF singles titles and eight ITF doubles titles
 > Played first Tour-level qualifying event at Hobart 2023 (l. Zanevska in Q1); has since played in two other Tour-level qualifying events: Adelaide 2025 and Bogota 2025 (fell in Q1 at both)
 > Competed for Norway in Billie Jean King Cup ties in 2023 and 2022, and Fed Cup ties in 2018 and 2017; posted a 7-7 record in BJKC and Fed Cup ties
 > As a junior, reached No.29 in ITF rankings, contesting all four majors and reaching QF in junior doubles at Wimbledon in 2016 and Australian Open in 2017

Alexander Zverev | Age: 28 | ATP World No. 3 | Career-High No. 2 | 2025: 57-25 (Munich Title) | Career: 520-223 (24 Titles)
> Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 2 after tearing 3 ligaments in right ankle during 2022 Roland Garros SF vs. Nadal.

> Led ATP Tour with 6 titles in 2021 and is tied with Alcaraz and Sinner for most titles among players born since 1990, defeating No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals, 2020 Tokyo Olympics and 2021 Nitto ATP Finals titles.

> Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.

> Earned wins over 14-time champion Nadal en route to 2024 Roland Garros final and 10-time champion Djokovic via RET to reach 2025 Australian Open final.

> Defeated Djokovic at 2017 Rome and Federer at 2017 Montreal for 1st and 2nd of his 7 ATP Masters 1000 titles.

> Joined Murray and Thiem as 3rd player to defeat Djokovic on hard (4 times), Federer on grass (2016 Halle SF) and Nadal on clay (2 times).

Eva Lys | Age: 23 | WTA World No. 40 | Career-High No. 40 (Nov 2025) | 2025: 21-18 (2 QFs) | Career: 40-35 (0 titles)

> In 2025 achieved career-best result at a WTA 1000 event by reaching the quarterfinals at Beijing, registering her first Top 10 win along the way over No.10 Rybakina in 3r

> Reached 4r at a Grand Slam for the first time in 2025 at Australian Open as a lucky loser (l. Swiatek)

> Currently competing at her career high ranking of No.40

> Career-best Tour-level results are SF run three times: Cluj-Napoca 2023, Budapest 2024 and Monastir 2024

> Made Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open 2023 as a qualifier

> Made WTA main draw debut at Stuttgart 2022 and reached 2r as a qualifier; defeated No.38 Viktoria Golubic in 1r while ranked No.342 (l. Swiatek in 2r)

POLAND – GROUP F

Hubert Hurkacz | Age: 28 | ATP World No. 72 | Career-High No. 6 | 2025: 15-11 (Geneva Final) | Career: 226-153 (8 Titles)

> Top Polish men's player in history ended 2021 and 2023 at year-end career-high No. 9 after Nitto ATP Finals appearances and reached career-high No. 6 in August 2024.

> Entered 2021 Wimbledon on 6-match losing streak, then reached 1st Grand Slam SF by defeating 8-time champion Federer 6-3 7-6(4) 6-0 in final singles match of Swiss' career.

> Upset 5 seeds to win 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Miami title and saved a championship point to win 2023 ATP Masters 1000 Shanghai after losing in the 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Montreal final.

> Also advanced to ATP Masters 1000 SFs at 2021 Paris, 2022 Miami and 2023 Cincinnati and captured ATP Masters 1000 doubles titles at 2020 Paris w/Auger-Aliassime and 2022 Miami w/Isner.

> Defeated No. 1 Medvedev 6-1 6-4 in 63 minutes to win 5th ATP Tour singles title in 5th final at 2022 Halle (now 8-4 in finals).

Iga Swiatek | Age: 24 | WTA World No. 2 | Career-High No. 1 (Apr 2022) | 2025: 62-17 (3 titles) | Career: 311-75 (25 titles)

> Won three singles titles in 2025, including her first Wimbledon title, Cincinnati and Seoul; finished at World No.2 for the second straight season

> Posted 62 match-wins in 2025, becoming the first player to achieve four consecutive 60-win seasons at Tour level since Martina Hingis (1997-2001) and Lindsay Davenport (1998-2001)

> Owns 25 career singles trophies including six Grand Slam titles, one WTA Finals trophy, eleven WTA 1000 titles, six WTA 500 titles and one WTA 250 title

> Reached PIF World No.1 ranking in April 2022 and has spent a total of 125 weeks at the top spot (seventh-most of all time)

> Became the first Polish player in history to win a Grand Slam title at Roland Garros 2020; she also became the lowest ranked (No.54) Roland Garros champion in history

> In women's doubles reached the final at Roland Garros in 2021 (w/Mattek-Sands) and in mixed doubles reached the US Open final in 2025 (w/Ruud)

NETHERLANDS – GROUP F

Tallon Griekspoor | Age: 29 | ATP World No. 26 | Career-High No. 21 | 2025: 30-23 (Mallorca Title) | Career: 123-117 (3 Titles)
> Earned personal-best 36 wins in 2023, won 1st ATP Tour title in Pune and achieved career-high No. 21 in November.

> Posted 17-3 record on home soil in 2023-24, highlighted by 2023 's-Hertogenbosch title and advancing to Rotterdam SF in 2023 (d. No. 17 Zverev in 2R) and 2024 (d. No. 8 Hurkacz in 2R).

> Rallied from a set down for Rotterdam wins as WC over No. 13 Wawrinka in 2018, No. 11 Khachanov in 2019, No. 14 Karatsev in 2022, No. 17 A. Zverev in 2023 and for 's-Hertogenbosch win over No. 18 de Minaur in 2023 – earning first 5 of 17 career Top-20 wins on home soil.

> Upset No. 2 Zverev in 2025 Indian Wells 2R to become 1st Dutch ATP Masters 1000 quarter-finalist since 2018.

> Went 8-0 in finals and 42-7 overall on ATP Challenger Tour in 2021, setting single-season record for most titles and ending season with 25 straight wins.

Suzan Lamens | Age: 26 | WTA World No. 89 | Career-High No. 57 (Sept 2025) | 2025: 19-23 (SF Rouen) | Career: 30-32 (1 title)

> 2025 highlights include semifinal at Rouen (l. Danilovic) and quarterfinals at 's-Hertogenbosch and Seoul which led to reaching a peak ranking of No.57 on September 22

> Registered first and only career Top 20 win over No.19 Diana Shnaider at Seoul 2025

> Made Grand Slam debut appearances at all four majors in 2025 and registered first Grand Slam win at Australian Open (d. Erjavec in 1r)

> Also made debut WTA 1000 event appearance at Dubai 2025 as a qualifier, and registered first WTA 1000 win at Indian Wells 2025 (d. Bouzkova in 1r)

> Won sole career WTA title at Osaka 2024 as a qualifier (d. Birrell in F)

> Best career doubles results came in 2024 with semifinals at Auckland (w/Kessler) and 's-Hertogenbosch (w/Vedder)
