DAY 4 – THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 26**[7] Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #48) vs. Magdalena Frech (POL #57)****Frech leads 2-1*****Bouzas Maneiro:***

- Making her second appearance at Merida and is into the Round of 16 for the second straight year
- Defeated qualifier Heather Watson in the opening round for her second match-win of the season (her previous 2026 win was over No.3 Gauff at United Cup)
- Seeking her first quarterfinal since WTA 1000 Montreal last summer (l. eventual champion Mboko in that round)
- Trying to reach her first WTA 500 quarterfinal; her best WTA 500 results are the Round of 16 here in Merida this year and last year

Frech:

- Making her second appearance at Merida, having lost in the first round last year
- Owns 22 career wins over Top 50 players, most recently No.17 Liudmila Samsonova at Doha earlier this month
- Her career-best WTA 500 result is winning the 2024 Guadalajara title on hard court (d. Gadecki in final); she has also made three additional WTA 500 QFs in her career, all on hard court as well
- Owns a 3-6 career Tour-level record against players from Spain; her most recent match vs. a Spanish player was a win over today's opponent Bouzas Maneiro at 2025 Madrid

[3] Ann Li (USA #39) vs. Zeynep Sonmez (TUR #81)**Sonmez leads 1-0*****Li:***

- In her one previous tournament appearance, Li was the WTA 250 Merida runner-up in 2024 – she lost in that final to today's opponent Sonmez
- Seeking her first quarterfinal since she won the Guangzhou title last October (d. Sun in final)
- Her career-best WTA 500 result was reaching the final at 2021 Grampians Trophy in Melbourne (vs. Kontaveit; final was not played due to delayed schedule)
- Has reached six WTA finals and won two WTA titles (2021 Tenerife and 2025 Guangzhou), all on hard court

Sonmez:

- Making her 3rd appearance at Merida, where she won the WTA 250 title in 2024 (d. today's opponent Li in final)
- Holds an 8-1 career win-loss record at this event; she also made the quarterfinals at WTA 500-level last year as a wild card (l. eventual champion Navarro)
- With her first-round win over qualifier Brace, she snapped a 4-match losing streak since her 2nd round win at the 2026 Australian Open
- Seeking her first Tour-level quarterfinal since her quarterfinal finish here in Merida last year

[1] [WC] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7) vs. [LL] Priscilla Hon (AUS #136)**First meeting*****Paolini:***

- Making her tournament debut as the No.1 seed and a wild card
- Aiming to end a 3-match losing streak (l. Jovic in Australian Open 3r, l. Sakkari in Doha opener; l. Eala in Dubai opener); also seeking her first quarterfinal of the year
- Holds a 2-0 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (d. Jeanjean at United Cup; d. Sasnovich at Australian Open)
- Is No.1 seed this week; she has been the top seed at two WTA tournaments in her career (also 2023 Monastir, finished runner-up to No.2 seed Mertens)
- Best result by Italy at Merida was Camila Giorgi's run to the title at the inaugural edition in 2023

Hon:

- Making her tournament debut as a lucky loser into the main draw
- Seeking her 3rd career Tour-level quarterfinal and first since 2019; her two previous Tour-level quarterfinals both came at Seoul in 2017 and 2019
- Holds an 0-2 career record vs. Top 10 players (l. No.5 Svitolina at 2018 Hong Kong; l. No.2 Sabalenka at 2024 US Open)
- Best results by lucky losers at Merida are Round of 16 showings by Varvara Gracheva in 2023 and Hon this year
- Currently ranked No.136; she broke into the Top 100 for the first time in October 2025, peaking at No.94

[Q] Zhang Shuai (CHN #86) vs. [2] Emma Navarro (USA #20)**Zhang leads 2-0*****Zhang:***

- Making her tournament debut, having qualified for the main draw
- Owns 23 wins in career over Top 20 players – her last two Top 20 wins both came over today's opponent Navarro, at 2024 Beijing and 2025 Wuhan
- Seeking her first Tour-level quarterfinal since semifinal run at Guangzhou last October (l. eventual champion Li)
- All of her three WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2013 Guangzhou, 2017 Guangzhou and 2022 Lyon)
- Attempting to become the first Chinese player to make the Merida quarterfinals; other Round of 16 showings by Chinese players at Merida were by both Wang Xinyu and Wang Xiyu in 2023

Navarro:

- Making her 2nd appearance at Merida and returning as the defending champion (d. Arango 6-0, 6-0 in last year's final, becoming just the fifth player since 2000 to win a WTA Tour final 6-0, 6-0)
- Her 2025 Merida championship run was her second career WTA singles title, and first at WTA 500-level
- Seeking her 2nd Tour-level quarterfinal of the year (also made Adelaide quarterfinals, l. Shnaider in that round)
- Owns a 5-4 career Tour-level record against players from China; her most recent match vs. a Chinese player was a loss to today's opponent Zhang at Wuhan last October
- Both of her 2 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court: 2024 Hobart and here last year

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights of 2025 include first Grand Slam R16 of career at Wimbledon (l. Samsonova), first WTA 1000 QF of career at Montreal (l. eventual champion Mboko) and additional Tour QFs at Rabat and Rouen. Hit career-high ranking of No.40 on August 18 and finished season at No.42
- In 2024, posted career-best Grand Slam results with R32 at Wimbledon and US Open (at Wimbledon, beat defending champion Vondrousova in 1r on Centre Court for first career Top 10 win, before retiring to eventual champion Krejčíková in 3r); also claimed first WTA 125 title at Antalya (d. Begu in final)
- In 2023, won ITF W60 title at Rome and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2023 Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. 1r to Kalinina)
- Earned first ITF title at Madrid \$15K in 2020 on clay
- On ITF Circuit, owns 11 singles titles and four doubles titles
- Made professional debut in January 2018 at \$15K ITF/Hammamet 2, Tunisia
- Best results in 2025 were QF runs at Washington DC (l. Rybakina) and Guadalajara (l. Bartunkova). Registered second Top 10 win of her career over No.6 Mirra Andreeva at Berlin (after No.8 Navarro at Wuhan 2024)
- In 2024 reached a career-high ranking of No.22 by reaching her career-first final at Prague (l. Linette in final) followed by her first-ever title win at Guadalajara (d. Gadecki in final); also made QF at Wuhan (l. eventual champion Sabalenka) and at Nottingham (l. eventual champion Boulter) and achieved her best result to date at a Grand Slam (R16 at the Australian Open; l. Gauff)
- In 2023 reached back-to-back QF on grass at Nottingham (l. Burrage) and Birmingham (l. eventual champion Ostapenko); advanced to 3r at Miami (l. Gracheva) and posted 2r efforts at Indian Wells, Madrid, Rome, Guadalajara and Hong Kong; at the Slams, best results were 2r at Roland Garros (l. Rakhimova) and US Open (l. Muchova); ended season on career-high ranking of No.63 after winning a 100k ITF event in Spain (d. Errani in F)
- Highlight of 2022 season was 3r run at Wimbledon - best career result at a major. Also made 2r on nine occasions
- Broke into Top 100 on October 18, 2021, following run through qualifying to 2r at Indian Wells
- Advanced to 2r three more times last season and won titles at WTA 125K Series event in Concord and W60 Prague ITF Circuit event
- Campaign in 2020 was highlighted by maiden WTA QF, at Prague (as LL, l. eventual champion Halep) - first back-to-back main draw wins at a WTA event
- Only other WTA main draw appearance in 2020 was 1r exit at Lyon (as qualifier, l. Tomova); also won her fourth career singles title on ITF Circuit, at \$25K Bendigo-AUS and contested qualifying at Australian Open, Dubai and Doha
- Appeared in six WTA main draws in 2019, falling in 1r at Dubai (l. Kasatkina), Charleston (l. Buzarnescu), Lugano (l. Peterson), Nottingham (l. Mladenovic), US Open (l. Siegemund) and Guangzhou (l. Stojanovic)
- In 2018, made 2r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Stephens), Rabat (l. Fett), Nottingham (l. Jakupovic) and San Jose (l. Tomljanovic). Also fell in 1r at six other tour-level events, including qualifying for Grand Slam debut at Australian Open

- Achieved career high singles ranking of No.115 after 2018 Roland Garros run (July 2, 2018)
- Won two of her four ITF singles titles in 2017, at \$25k ITF/Leipzig-GER and \$25k ITF/Braunschweig-GER - both on clay

CAREER MILESTONES

- Strong singles results on Tour in home nation of China in 2025, making Guangzhou SF (first WTA Tour SF since 2022; l. eventual champion Li) and defeating No.14 Navarro to make Wuhan R16 (l. eventual champion Gauff)
- Also in 2025, posted Top 20 year-end ranking in doubles, winning Washington D.C. title (w/Townsend) and making four additional WTA Tour doubles finals
- In 2024, broke a streak of 24 losses to reach WTA 1000 quarterfinal at Beijing. In doubles, won her 14th career title at Guangzhou, paired with Katerina Siniakova for the first time
- Reached R16 at 2023 Australian Open (l. Pliskova) taking her ranking to a career-high of No.22; failed to win a singles match after Lyon in January and ended her season early after Montreal (l. Blinkova)
