[5] Liudmila Samsonova (#18) vs. Janice Tjen (INA #47)

First meeting

Samsonova:

- Making 4th straight appearance at Abu Dhabi, with her best results were in 2023 as R-Up (l. Bencic) and SF in 2024 (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
- Has won two WTA 500 titles in her career, at 2021 Berlin (grass) and 2022 Tokyo (hard court)
- Three of her 5 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, all in 2022, at Tokyo, Cleveland and Washington DC
- Faces a player from Indonesia for the first time in her career
- Her 1st win here over No.28 Kenin was the first Top 50 win of her season so far after falling to No.6 Pegula at Brisbane, No.34 Vondrousova at Adelaide and No.48 Siegemund at Australian Open

Tjen:

- Making Abu Dhabi debut
- Contesting the main draw at a WTA 500 event for the first time in her career
- Best career result on hard court was winning Chennai title last year (first Indonesian to win WTA singles title since Widjaja at 2002 Pattaya City)
- This is her first time facing a Top 20 player
- Her best win by ranking was over No.23 Fernandez at the Australian Open this year

McCartney Kessler (USA #32) vs. [6] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #25)

First meeting

Kessler:

- Won her first main draw match at Abu Dhabi this week after falling in 1st as a qualifier last year (l. eventual finalist Krueger)
- Owns 8 wins in her career over Top 30 players, most recently over No.18 Samsonova at Ningbo 2025
- Two of her 3 titles have come on hard court, 2024 Cleveland and 2025 Hobart
- Best WTA 500 result of her career was QF at 2025 Ningbo (l. eventual finalist Alexandrova)

Fernandez:

- Making 3rd appearance at the tournament, where her best previous result was QF last year (l. eventual finalist Krueger)
- Her 1st win over Paquet this week was her first match win of the season after falling in the opening rounds at Brisbane, Adelaide and Australian Open
- All of her 5 career titles were achieved on hard court, including two last year at Washington DC and Osaka
- Only player from Canada to feature in the Abu Dhabi main draw this week

Navarro leads 3-1

Baptiste:

- Competing in Abu Dhabi main draw for the first time after playing qualifying last year
- Owns three wins in her career over Top 20 players; No.12 Kasatkina at Miami 2025, No.10 Krejčíková at Wuhan 2024 and No.17 Keys at Washington 2019
- Is 1-1 against players from USA in 2026, d. Townsend and I. Gauff at Australian Open
- Defeated Navarro once before in qualifying at 2018 Baton Rouge
- Best Tour result on hard court is QF run at 2025 Auckland (l. eventual finalist Osaka)
- Best result by a wild card at Abu Dhabi was Bencic's run to the title last year

Navarro:

- Making Abu Dhabi debut appearance
- Has defeated one wild card so far this season; Emerson Jones at Adelaide
- Owns two hard court titles: Merida in 2025 and Hobart in 2024; her Merida title in her best career WTA 500 result

- Opened the 2026 season by reaching QF at Auckland (l. Shnaider)

Tauson leads 1-0

Tauson:

- Making her debut at Abu Dhabi
- Faced Waltert once before at ITF level in 2021 on carpet at W25 Altenkirchen
- Posted her best WTA 500 result at 2025 Linz by reaching SF (l. Yastremska)
- Owns three career titles which all came on hard court (2021 Lyon, 2021 Luxembourg, 2024 Auckland); reached a further two finals on hard court at 2021 Courmayeur and 2025 Dubai
- A win today would be the 15th QF of her career

Waltert:

- Making her Abu Dhabi debut
- Looking for the second Top 20 win of her career after defeating No.7 Danielle Collins at 2022 Lausanne
- With a win today would reach the third QF of her career after 2022 Lausanne (l. Danilovic in QF) and 2025 Iasi (l. Teichmann in QF)
- Has equalled her career best hard court result with R16 at 2025 Singapore (l. Kalinskaya)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached ninth career final in 2025 with runner-up finish at Strasbourg, as well as SF at Adelaide and Berlin and reached QF at a Grand Slam for the first time at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Swiatek). Ended the year ranked inside the Top 20 for a third consecutive year (No.17)
- Won third career WTA doubles title in 2025 at Ningbo (w/Melichar-Martinez) and reached a further doubles finals at 's-Hertogenbosch (w/Melichar-Martinez)
- In 2024, won one title at 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Andreescu in final); also reached SF at Abu Dhabi (l. eventual champion Rybakina); notably reached the QF at Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Sabalenka) and 4r at US Open (l. Swiatek)
- Won one doubles title in 2024 at Seoul (w/Melichar-Martinez)

Ended 2023 ranked No.16; reached three finals at Abu Dhabi (l. Bencic in F), Montreal (l. Pegula in F) and Beijing (l. Swiatek)

- Also in 2023, reached SF at Washington DC and qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai going 1-1 in group play
- In doubles in 2023, won title at Dubai (w/Veronika Kudermetova)
- Lifted three titles in 2022, at Washington DC (d. Kanepi in F), Cleveland (d. Sasnovich in F) and Tokyo (d. Q.Zheng in F) ending year at No.20, her first Top 20 year-end ranking
- Also made SF at 2022 Stuttgart, QF at Adelaide 250, R16 at US Open and made Top 20 debut on October 24; earned first Top 10 win of career over No.7 Karolina Pliskova at Stuttgart
- Highlight of 2021 was coming through qualifying to lift maiden WTA title at Berlin (d. Bencic in F) and breaking into Top 50 on September 13 finishing the year at No.39, her first year-end Top 100 ranking
- Reached two further SFs in 2021, at Luxembourg and Courmayeur and reached R16 at Wimbledon
- Earned first Top 20 win of career over No.11 Kiki Bertens at 2021 Miami
- In 2020 reached 2r at Brisbane (as qualifier, d.No.24 Stephens, l. No.7 Kvitova) and Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martic), and fell 1r four times (including Australian Open, US Open and Roland Garros)
- Appeared in the first WTA main draws of her career in 2019, highlighted by SF run at Palermo (as LL, l. eventual champion Teichmann), 2r

- In a breakthrough 2025, made first WTA Tour final at Sao Paulo (in her 2nd career Tour main draw; l. Rakotomanga Rajaonah in final), then won first Tour title at Chennai (4th career Tour main draw; d. Birrell in final), becoming the first Indonesian to win a Tour singles title since Angelique Widjaja at 2002 Pattaya City. Skyrocketed from No.411 to a career-high No.53 during the season
- Also in 2025, won her first two doubles titles at Guangzhou (w/Piter) and Chennai (w/Sutjiadi); made Tour-level and Grand Slam main draw debut at US Open (as qualifier, d. No.24 seed V. Kudermetova in 1r, l. Raducanu in 2r); won WTA 125 Jinan title and claimed six ITF singles titles in the first half of the year
- In 2024, won her first of 7 ITF singles and 2 ITF doubles titles that year at W15 Monastir; has a W-L record of 39-3 that year, twice winning 15 matches consecutively
- Also in 2024, ended her collegiate career ranked No.1 in doubles and No.35 in singles in the ITA rankings
- In 2019, dominated the Indonesian junior circuit, earning nine titles; also in 2019 made ITF circuit debut as a wildcard at W25 Jakarta, fell in first round

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won Auckland title (first Tour title since 2021) and reached first career WTA 1000 final at Dubai (l. M.Andreeva); made Top 20 debut, finishing at career-high No.12 in the year-end rankings
- Highlight of 2024 season was posting best Grand Slam result by reaching R16 at Roland Garros for the first time in her career. Also achieved R-Up at two WTA 125s, Hong Kong and Oeiras
- In 2023 matched her career best Grand Slam result at Roland Garros where she reached the 3r as a qualifier (l.Avanesyan); also reached the Linz QF (l. Martic)
- Back injury restricted her to just 11 WTA main-draw outings in 2022, with best result a QF showing at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Sasnovich). Also finished R-Up in her last event of the year at WTA 125K Series event in Limoges and won one ITF Circuit title at W25 Selva Gardener
- Came through qualifying to win maiden WTA title in Lyon in March 2021 (in final, beat fellow qualifier Golubic - last time two qualifiers met in a WTA final was at 2017 Tokyo [Japan Open], when Diyas beat Kato); also in 2021, won a second title in Luxembourg and finished runner-up at Courmayeur
- Ended 2020 season ranked No.152 (up from No.267 at the end of 2019) after posting 30-7 win-loss record. Best results were 2r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, d.No.25 Brady, l. Collins) and lifting two titles on ITF Circuit
- Made Tour-level debut (main draw and qualifying) with 1r exit at 2019 Lugano (as wildcard qualifier, l. Rodina). Also lifted four ITF Circuit singles titles in 2019
- Won maiden ITF Circuit title in just her second tournament, at \$15k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2017
- Reached SF on professional debut at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR in 2017
- On ITF Junior Circuit has lifted nine singles titles, including at 2019 Australian Open (d. Fernandez in F). In 2019 she became the first Dane to top the junior world rankings
- In 2025 equalled her best career Tour result with QF at Iasi (also 2022 Lausanne), earned first WTA 125 title of her career at Rio de Janeiro and her year-end ranking was a career-high of No.86. In doubles, reached second Tour-level final at Iasi (w/Carle), and won five WTA 125 doubles titles
- In 2024, reached first career SF at WTA 125 event in Antalya (l. Bouzas Maneiro). Best result on Hologic WTA Tour was 2r run at Iasi (l. Paquet). Won ITF W75 Glasgow (d. Bolkvadze in F)
- In 2023 reached a new career-high ranking of No.107
- In 2023 reached the finals of ITF \$60k Grenoble (l. Dodin) and best results on the WTA Tour were 1r runs at Merida (l. Bonaventure) and Lausanne (l. Bogdan)
- In 2023 made her main draw Grand Slam debut with a 2r run as a qualifier at Roland Garros (l. Cocciaretto), later in the season followed up with a 1r run as a qualifier at Wimbledon (l. Bouzkova)
- 2022 season highlights were reaching her career-first Tour level QF at Lausanne (l. Danilovic), where she also earned her first Top-10 win over the No.7 Collins
- In 2021 lifted the W15 Manacor title on the ITF Tour
- Made her main draw debut on the WTA Tour in 2019 at Lausanne, where she received a wild card in the single and doubles (w/ Sugnaux) draws; made the 2r in both draws (l. Teichmann and Barthel/Knoll)
- In 2019 lifted two W15 titles at Cairo and Sharm El Sheikh
- In 2018 lifted her first two \$15k titles at Ortisei and Macon
