### [WC] Diane Parry (FRA #94) vs. Emma Raducanu (GBR #37)

Raducanu leads 1-0

#### *Parry:*

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Strasbourg; her best tournament result is R16 run in 2025 (l. eventual finalist Samsonova)
- Owns 11 career Tour-level wins over Top 50 players; her most recent Top 50 win at a Tour-level event was over No.15 Diana Shnaider at 2025 Wimbledon
- Won the WTA 125 Paris title on clay last week (d. Keys in final, after Keys retired due to left thigh injury)
- Contesting 4th Tour-level main draw of the season after SF run at Ostrava (l. eventual R-Up Korpatsch), 2r run at Indian Wells (as a qualifier, l. Keys) and 1r at Rouen (l. eventual champion Kostyuk)
- Career-best Tour-level results on clay are SF runs at 2023 Lausanne (l. eventual R-Up Burel) and 2024 Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng Qinwen)

#### *Raducanu:*

- Making 2nd appearance at Strasbourg; on her previous appearance in 2025 she fell in the R16 (l. Collins)
- Competing in her first tournament since Indian Wells in March; she is seeking her first win since defeating Zakharova in 2026 Indian Wells 2r
- Best career Tour-level results on clay are two QF runs at Stuttgart, in 2022 (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and 2024 (l. Swiatek)
- Career-best result at a WTA 500 event is SF run at 2025 Washington DC (l. eventual R-Up Kalinskaya)
- Best tournament finish so far this season is R-Up run at Cluj-Napoca (l. Cirstea in F)

### Ann Li (USA #30) vs. [2] Ekaterina Alexandrova (#14)

Alexandrova leads 2-0

#### *Li:*

- Making her first appearance at Strasbourg
- Defeated Maya Joint in this week's 1r, improving to 6-4 on clay this year (also made Rouen QF, Madrid R16, Rome 2r and Linz 1r)
- Owns 5 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.4 Iga Swiatek at 2026 Madrid (via retirement)
- Career-best Tour-level results on clay are 3 QFs at 2024 Palermo (l. Begu), 2025 Rabat (l. eventual champion Joint) and 2026 Rouen (l. eventual champion Kostyuk)
- Most recent American to win this title is Madison Keys in 2024 (d. Danielle Collins in all-American final)

#### *Alexandrova:*

- Making 4th appearance at Strasbourg, where her best tournament result is QF in 2021 (l. eventual champion Krejčíková)
- Career-best Tour-level results on clay are 4 SFs, most recently 2025 Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Ostapenko)
- Holds a 1-3 record this year vs. Top 30 players, with the one win coming over No.28 Kenin at Brisbane
- Also has a 1-3 record on clay so far this year, with her one clay-court win in 2026 coming over Knutson in Stuttgart 1r
- 1 of her 5 career WTA singles titles has been at WTA 500-level: 2025 Linz (d. Yastremska in F)
- Her best tournament finish so far this year is R-Up at WTA 500 Abu Dhabi (l. qualifier Bejlek in F)

#### Magdalena Frech (POL #49) vs. [7] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #24)

First meeting

##### *Frech:*

- Making 3rd appearance at Strasbourg; she is into R16 for the 2nd time, having also reached this round as a qualifier in 2024 (l. Vondrousova)
- Defeated Talia Gibson in 1r for her first win since beating Zhang Shuai in the Merida SF in February - Frech ended a 6-match losing streak with this week's win
- Owns 9 wins in career over Top 25 players (1-2 vs. Top 25 players this year, with the win coming over No.17 Samsonova at Doha in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- Her one career WTA singles title came at WTA 500-level: 2024 Guadalajara (d. qualifier Gadecki in F)
- Career-best Tour-level result on clay is runner-up finish at 2024 Prague (l. Linette in all-Polish F)

##### *Fernandez:*

- Making 3rd appearance at Strasbourg and is into R16 for the 2nd time; she also made this round in 2024 (d. Potapova in 1r, l. Samsonova in 2r)
- She is 7-4 on clay at Tour-level this year (also made Madrid QF, Stuttgart QF, Charleston R16 and Rome 2r)
- Her best tournament finishes of 2026 are her clay-court QF showings at Madrid (l. eventual R-Up M. Andreeva) and Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
- In 2026, she holds a 6-1 Tour-level record on clay vs. players ranked outside the Top 20 (the 1 loss was to Masarova at Rome)
- Has won one career WTA 500 title at 2025 Washington DC (d. Kalinskaya in F)

#### [1/WC] Victoria Mboko (CAN #9) vs. [WC] Lois Boisson (FRA #50)

First meeting

##### *Mboko:*

- Making tournament debut at Strasbourg, as a wildcard
- Contesting just her 4th career WTA main draw on clay after 2025 Rome (as qualifier, l. eventual R-Up Gauff in 2r), 2025 Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Zheng Qinwen in 3r) and 2026 Madrid (l. McNally in 2r)
- Career-best WTA 500 result is runner-up finish at 2026 Adelaide (l. M. Andreeva in F)
- This week, she is the No.1 seed at a WTA Tour event for the first time in her career
- Currently ranked a career-high No.9; she made her Top 10 debut earlier this year on February 16
- Best result by Canada at Strasbourg was title run by Carling Bassett-Seguso in 1987, the inaugural edition

##### *Boisson:*

- Making tournament debut at Strasbourg, as a wildcard
- Defeated Wang Xinyu in this week's 1r - her first win of the 2026 season after opening losses at Madrid, Rome and WTA 125 Parma
- Due to injury, 2026 Madrid was her first tournament appearance since Beijing in September 2025
- Holds a 2-1 career win-loss record vs. Top 10 players, and all 3 of those matches were part of her SF run at 2025 Roland Garros on clay (d. No.3 Pegula and No.6 M. Andreeva; l. eventual champion No.2 Gauff)
- Has won one career WTA title, which came on clay at 2025 Hamburg (d. Bondar in F)
- Competing in her second career WTA 500 main draw after 2025 Seoul (l. eventual finalist Alexandrova in 2r)

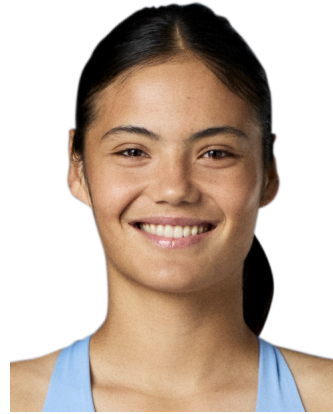

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights in 2025 included 3r runs at Wimbledon (as a qualifier) and US Open, also reached R16 at Strasbourg, Hamburg and Chennai
- 2024 season highlight was posting best result at a WTA 1000 by reaching R16 at Indian Wells and first time reaching 3r at Australian Open and 2r at US Open. Also made three SF runs at Osaka, Palermo, and Nottingham. Broke into the Top 50 for the first time and achieved new career-high ranking of No.48 in October
- The 2023 Grand Slam season included two 2r runs at Roland Garros (l. Andreeva) and Wimbledon (l. Martic); fell in 1r at Australian Open (l. Townsend) and US Open (l. Boulter)
- Best Tour level showing in 2023 was a SF run at Lausanne (l. Burel)
- In 2022, lifted the WTA 125 Paris title (d. McNally via W/O) and further reached another WTA 125 final at Colina (l. Bejlek)
- Broke into Top 100 on February 28, 2022 and continued steady progress for remainder of season
- First notable 2022 performance was 3r run at Roland Garros (l. Stephens) beating defending champion Krejčíková in 1r
- In the 2022 grass season, made SF at Gaiba 125 and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Jabeur)
- Series of impressive performances in 2022 started from QF at Palermo (l. Camelia Begu) followed by SF at Granby (l. Kasatkina), QF at Portoroz (l. Lena Friedsam), and QF at Monastir before 1r exits at Cluj Napoca, Rouen 125, and W80 Poitiers
- Finished 2021 in fine form, winning 18 of last 20 matches, highlighted by two WTA 125K Series finals, winning title in Montevideo, Uruguay and finishing R-Up at Buenos Aires, Argentina
- Overall, compiled 50-23 win-loss record last year, lifting three ITF Circuit titles and rising nearly 200 places in the rankings during second half of campaign. Also fell 1r at Roland Garros (as WC, l. Sasnovich) and Strasbourg (as qualifier, l. Niemeier)
- Lifted first ITF Circuit title in 2020, at W15 tournament in Antalya, Turkey
- Reached 2r on WTA main-draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros (as WC, d. Lapko, l. Mertens)
- First contested WTA qualifying at 2018 Roland Garros
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Best result in 2025 was reaching SF Washington DC (l. Kalinskaya). Reached QF at a WTA 1000 event for the first time at Miami; also made QF on home soil at London, Queen's Club. Ended the season ranked inside the Top 30 (No.29) for a second year after 2021. In doubles, reached first Tour-level SF at Washington DC with Elena Rybakina
- Returned to the courts in 2024 winning opening round matches at Auckland, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi. Went on to reach semifinals at Nottingham, as well as quarterfinals at Stuttgart, Eastbourne, Washington and Seoul. Achieved her first career Top 10 wins over No.5 Jessica Pegula at Eastbourne and No.9 Maria Sakkari at Wimbledon
- In 2023 made 4r of Indian Wells (l. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best win-by-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the 2021 US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell in 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top 50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)

- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event in Le Havre in 2017

- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR
- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarterfinals at Wimbledon and US Open in 2018
