Bouzkova leads 3-0

Bouzkova:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Strasbourg, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2025 (as lucky loser, l. Badosa via ret.)
- Her career-best result at a WTA 500 event is R-Up finish at 2024 Washington DC (l. Badosa in F)
- One of her 3 career WTA singles titles was on clay, at Bogota earlier this year (d. Udvardy in F)
- Holds a 7-2 Tour-level record on clay this year, with five of those wins coming during her Bogota title run, and the remaining two wins coming this week
- Earned her 150th Tour-level win of career in yesterday's 2r (via retirement over Oliynykova)

Li:

- Making her first appearance at Strasbourg
- Has reached her 2nd QF of the year, both on clay (also Rouen, l. eventual champion Kostyuk in QF)
- Seeking her first SF since her title run at 2025 Guangzhou (d. Sun in F)
- Attempting to reach her first Tour-level clay-court SF of career; she previously made clay-court QFs at 2024 Palermo (l. Begu), 2025 Rabat (l. eventual champion Joint) and 2026 Rouen (l. eventual champion Kostyuk)
- Is currently ranked No.30; she posted a new career-high ranking of No.29 earlier this month
- Most recent American to win this title is Madison Keys in 2024 (d. Danielle Collins in all-American final)

Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #33) vs. [Q] Daria Kasatkina (AUS #62)

Kasatkina leads 3-1

Cristian:

- Making 1st main draw appearance at Strasbourg; she fell in qualifying in 2018 (l. Piter) and 2019 (l. Kostyuk)
- Seeking her first WTA 500 SF of career; she previously made WTA 500 QFs at 2021 St. Petersburg (l. Kuznetsova), 2024 Charleston (l. eventual R-Up Kasatkina) and 2026 Adelaide (l. Birrell)
- Bidding for her first SF on Tour since 2025 Osaka (l. eventual R-Up Valentova in SF)
- She is the first Romanian to make Strasbourg QF since Sorana Cirstea was 2021 R-Up (l. Krejčíková in F)
- Best result by Romania at Strasbourg was Irina Spirlea's title run in 1998 (d. Julie Halard-Decugis in F)
- Earlier this year at Adelaide, she earned her first win over today's opponent Kasatkina in four attempts

Kasatkina:

- Making 2nd appearance at Strasbourg; she lost in last year's 1r to Raducanu
- This week, she has reached her first Tour-level QF since 2025 Adelaide in January of last year (l. eventual champion Keys in QF)
- Seeking her first Tour-level SF since her title run at 2024 Ningbo (d. M. Andrejeva in F)
- Six of her 8 career WTA singles titles have come at WTA 500-level; her most recent WTA 500 title is 2024 Ningbo
- Earlier this month, won the WTA 125 title at La Bisbal d'Empordà on clay (d. Korpatsch in F)
- Has won one WTA singles title on clay: 2017 Charleston, which was her first career WTA singles title (d. Ostapenko in all-teenager F)

Zhang leads 3-0

Zhang:

- Making 8th appearance at Strasbourg and is into QF for the 2nd time
- She also reached QF here in 2020 as a qualifier (l. eventual R-Up Rybakina in QF)
- Her career-best WTA 500 results are SFs at 2014 Birmingham (l. eventual champion Ivanovic), 2022 Tokyo (l. eventual champion Samsonova) and 2026 Merida (l. eventual R-Up Frech)
- Lost to Talia Gibson in final round of qualifying this week, but entered main draw as lucky loser, replacing No.5 seed Madison Keys (Keys withdrew with left thigh injury)
- First player from China to make the Strasbourg QF since her own QF run in 2020
- Best result by a lucky loser at Strasbourg is Virginie Razzano's SF run in 2016 (l. eventual champion Garcia)

Navarro:

- Making 4th appearance at Strasbourg and has reached QF here for the 3rd time; aiming for her first Strasbourg SF
- She previously reached Strasbourg QF in both 2023 (l. eventual R-Up Blinkova) and 2025 (l. Haddad Maia); also made R16 in 2024 (l. Haddad Maia)
- Bidding for her first SF since her 2025 Merida title run in March of last year
- Seeking her first clay-court SF at Tour level; she previously posted clay-court QF finishes on Tour at 2023 Strasbourg, 2023 Palermo, 2025 Charleston and 2025 Strasbourg
- Career-best WTA 500 result is winning the 2025 Merida title (d. Arango in F)
- Earned her 100th Tour-level win of career by defeating No.3 seed Jovic in yesterday's 2r

[1/WC] Victoria Mboko (CAN #9) vs. [7] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #24)

Mboko leads 1-0

Mboko:

- Making tournament debut at Strasbourg, as a wild card
- This is the first clay-court QF of her career at Tour-level
- Contesting just her 4th career WTA main draw on clay after 2025 Rome (as qualifier, l. eventual R-Up Gauff in 2r), 2025 Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Zheng Qinwen in 3r) and 2026 Madrid (l. McNally in 2r)
- Career-best WTA 500 result is runner-up finish at 2026 Adelaide (l. M. Andreeva in F)
- This week, she is the No.1 seed at a WTA Tour event for the first time in her career
- Currently ranked a career-high No.9; she made her Top 10 debut earlier this year on February 16
- Best result by Canada at Strasbourg was title run by Carling Bassett-Seguso in 1987, the inaugural edition

Fernandez:

- Making 3rd appearance at Strasbourg and is into QF for the first time
- This is her 3rd QF of 2026 and they have all been on clay – also at Madrid (l. eventual R-Up M. Andreeva in QF) and Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Rybakina in QF)
- She is 8-4 on clay at Tour-level this year (also contested Charleston R16 and Rome 2r)
- Has won one career WTA 500 title at 2025 Washington DC (d. Kalinskaya in F)
- Owns 7 wins in career over Top 10 players at WTA Tour events, most recently No.4 Jessica Pegula en route to 2025 Washington DC title (0-6 vs. Top 10 players since then)
- Seeking her first SF since 2025 Hong Kong (l. today's opponent Mboko in SF)
- Before this year, the last Canadian to make Strasbourg QF was Bianca Andreescu in 2021 (gave walkover to eventual R-Up Cirstea in QF)

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won second WTA Tour singles title of career at Prague (d. fellow Czech Noskova in final); also made SF at Monterrey and QF at Brisbane and Bogota, finishing inside the Top 50 for the fourth straight season. In doubles, won Eastbourne title w/Danilina
- Reached two WTA singles finals in 2024, at Bogota (l. Osorio) and Washington, DC (l. Badosa); finished season with SF run at Jiujiang (l. Golubic). In Grand Slam play, achieved best result at Roland Garros to date, advancing to 3r (l. Swiatek)
- Enjoyed success in second half of 2023 season with 4r at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova), 3r at US Open (l. Jabeur) and R-Up at Nanchang (l. Siniakova). Lifted two more doubles trophies in 2023 at Beijing (w/Sorribes Tormo) and Seoul (w/Mattek Sands)
- In 2022, won first WTA Tour singles title at Prague (d. Potapova in F) and made first Grand Slam QF at Wimbledon (l. Jabeur); finished R-Up at WTA 250 event in Guadalajara (l. Stephens in F), then had a SF run later in the year at the WTA 1000 event in the same city (l. Sakkari)
- Finished 2022 season ranked No.25 in singles, having started it only just inside Top 100. Also won her third career doubles title at 2022 Istanbul (w/Sorribes Tormo)
- Advanced to second career WTA singles final at 2021 Phillip Island Trophy in Melbourne, defeating No.8 Andreescu in SF (l. Kasatkina in F); followed up with SF at Guadalajara (l. Sorribes Tormo)
- In doubles in 2021, won first WTA titles of career, both w/Hradecka at Birmingham (d. Jabeur/Perez in F) and Prague (d. Stojanovic/Kuzmova in F); reached an additional final at Charleston (w/Hradecka, l. Melichar/Schuurs) and also made QF at Wimbledon and US Open
- Before tour's hiatus in March 2020, advanced to first career WTA singles final at Monterrey where she finished R-Up to Svitolina; broke into Top 50 at No.47 following the tournament
- Other highlights of 2020 came at Lexington, where she made the fourth Tour-level QF of her career (l. eventual champion Brady) and reached maiden WTA doubles final (w/Teichmann, l. Carter/Stefani)
- Standout performance of 2019 season was a SF run in her first Premier 5 appearance at Toronto (as qualifier, l. S. Williams in 3s); upset No.4
- Won second career title in 2025 at Guangzhou (after Tenerife 2021) and reached further finals at Singapore (l. Mertens in F) and Cleveland (l. Cirstea in F). Made 4r at a Grand Slam for the first time at US Open (l. Pegula) and reached a peak ranking of No.33 in October before finishing the 2025 season ranked inside the Top 40 for the first time (No.38)
- Ended 2024 with her strongest result of the year at Merida with R-Up run taking her ranking back into the Top 100 for the first time since 2022. Through the season also made QF at Palermo and at WTA 125s, lifted the title at Valencia and reached the final at Bastad
- Reached four Tour-level main draws in 2023; 1r at Austin (as qualifier, l. Blinkova), 1r at Indian Wells (l. Blinkova), Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Guadalajara (as qualifier, l. Stephens). Also reached QF at WTA 125 Valencia on clay (l. Sherif) and R-Up at ITF \$100K Bonita Springs
- Her second semifinal appearance of 2022 came at Midland WTA 125 (l. Friedsam)
- Advanced to second round at Doha WTA 500 (l. Sakkari) and reached WTA 1000 Miami 3r (l. Riske-Amritraj)
- In 2022 reached Melbourne 2 (WTA 250) semifinal (l. Sasnovich)
- Ended 2021 season in fine form, winning first WTA title at Tenerife (d. Osorio in F) and making QF at Courmayeur (l. Tauson)
- Opened 2021 campaign by reaching maiden WTA final, at Grampains Trophy (final vs. Kontaveit was not played)
- Ended 2020 season with career-high ranking of No.97 (November 9, 2020) and first-ever Top 100 finish
- Best result in 2020 was 3r run at US Open (d. No.20 Riske in 2r, l. Kerber)
- Advanced to 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2020 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kenin)
- Fell in 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2020 Auckland (as qualifier, l. McHale)
- Also captured third career ITF singles title at 80K ITF/Tyler-TX, USA (d. Kostyuk in F)
- Owns three ITF singles titles
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in US in 2016
- Was R-Up in girls' singles at 2017 Wimbledon (l. Liu)

- Halep and No.8 Stephens en route, her first career Top 20 wins
- Also in 2019, made QF at Guangzhou and was R-Up at WTA 125 Guadalajara. Lifted 12th and biggest title of career on ITF Circuit at \$80K Nur-Sultan-KAZ (d. Kostic in F), broke into the Top 100 for the first time at No.92 following the tournament (on July 22)
 - Won first Grand Slam main draw match during 2r showing at 2019 Wimbledon (as LL, d. Barthel, l. Sakkari)
 - Highlights of 2018 season were winning maiden Tour-level match during 2r showing at Quebec City (as qualifier, l. Lepchenko) and qualifying for first Grand Slam at US Open, where she fell in 1r (l. Bogdan)
 - Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2015 Acapulco (as wild card, l. Karatantcheva)
 - Professional debut was opening round loss in qualifying at 2013 Katowice
 - Girls' singles champion at 2014 US Open (d. Kalinina in F)

- In 2023, earned third career title at Hong Kong (d. Siniakova); prevented from a consecutive title run by Siniakova who defeated her in Nanchang SF. Also defeated Paolini at Billie Jean King Cup Finals to lift title with Canada
- Broke into the Top 20 in doubles in 2023, after reaching final at Roland Garros, Miami (both w/Townsend) and Auckland (w/Mattek-Sands) as well as QF at US Open (w/Townsend)
- In 2022 won her second title at Monterrey (d. Osorio in F; saved 5MP), and reached the QF at Roland Garros (l. Trevisan); missed grass-court season due to grade three stress fracture in her right foot suffered during match vs. Trevisan in Paris
- Enjoyed a memorable 2021 campaign, lifting first career title in Monterrey and advancing to maiden Grand Slam final, at US Open (l. Raducanu)

- Reached first career WTA final and notched first tour-level back-to-back wins at 2020 Acapulco as qualifier (l. Watson in F); at 17y, 177d, she was the youngest Canadian to reach a WTA singles final in 34 years (since Helen Kelesi at 1986 Tokyo [Japan Open] won at 16y, 338d)
- Owns one singles title and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit

- Won 2019 Roland Garros junior singles title (d. Navarro) becoming first Canadian to win a junior Grand Slam since Bouchard in 2012
- Played first WTA main draw and earned first main draw win of career at 2018 Quebec City defeating countrywoman Dabrowski in 1r (L. Watson in 2r)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in USA in 2016
