[Q] Diane Parry (FRA #111) vs. [WC] Venus Williams (USA #554)

First meeting

Parry:

- Making 2nd appearance at Indian Wells, on her previous appearance in 2024 she reached R16 (l. Sakkari)
- Her run to the R16 here in 2024 stands as the best WTA 1000 result of her career
- Is competing in her second Tour-level event of the 2026 season after SF run at Ostrava (l. Korpatsch)
- Bidding for third career-win over a Grand Slam champion today after defeating Petra Kvitova at US Open 2025 and defending champion Barbora Krejčíková at Roland Garros 2022
- Best result by France at Indian Wells was Runner-up run by Marion Bartoli in 2011

Williams:

- Making 10th appearance at Indian Wells; she is a three-time semi-finalist here, having reached the final four in 2018 (l. Kasatkina), 2001 (l. eventual champion S. Williams) and 1998 (l. eventual champion Hingis)
- Holds the longest gap (30 years, 1996-2026) between first and last main draw appearance at Indian Wells
- Today marks the first time she has faced a player ranked outside the Top 100 since 's-Hertogenbosch in 2023; her previous 17 consecutive Tour-level matches have all come against Top 100 opponents
- The seven-time Grand Slam champion owns 49 career WTA titles, 31 of which have come on hard court
- The last player from USA to win the title here was Serena Williams in 2001 (d. Clijsters in F)
- Since the tier format's introduction in 1990, V. Williams (109) has made the most Tier I/WTA 1000 event appearances among American players

Katerina Siniakova (CZE #44) vs. Sofia Kenin (USA #45)

Siniakova leads 1-0

Siniakova:

- Making 11th appearance at Indian Wells, her best performances here are 3r finishes in 2025 and 2017
- Career-best results at the WTA 1000 level are three QF finishes, each time as a qualifier: Wuhan 2025 (l. eventual finalist Pegula), Beijing 2018 (l. eventual champion Wozniacki) and Wuhan 2018 (l. eventual finalist Kontaveit)
- Is 5-5 in opening matches during her last 10 WTA 1000 appearances, in 2026 she is 1-1 with a win at Doha (d. Tauson) and a loss at Dubai (l. Badosa)
- 3 of her 5 career WTA titles have come on hard court: Nanchang 2023 (d. Bouzkova in F), Portoroz 2022 (d. Rybakina in F) and Shenzhen 2017 (d. Riske Amritraj in F)
- Best result by Czech Republic at Indian Wells was Runner-up run by Helena Sukova in 1990

Kenin:

- Making 7th appearance at Indian Wells, her best results here are four 2r finishes in 2025, 2023, 2019 and 2018
- Career-best results at the WTA 1000 level are 3 semifinal appearances: Guadalajara 2023 (l. eventual finalist Dolehide), Cincinnati 2019 (l. eventual champion Keys) and Toronto 2019 (l. eventual champion Andreescu)
- Owns 0-5 record so far in 2026 vs. Top 50 players, most recent was a loss to No.15 Tauson at Dubai
- The 2020 Australian Open champion owns four hard court titles (also Lyon 2020, Guangzhou 2019 and Hobart 2019) and one title on grass (Mallorca 2019)
- Is currently ranked No.45; this time last year was ranked No.47. Broke into the Top 5 (No.4) in March of 2020

Peyton Stearns (USA #48) vs. Solana Sierra (ARG #65)

First meeting

Stearns:

- Making 4th appearance at Indian Wells, where she has progressed to 2r on two occasions: in 2024 (l. Sabalenka) and 2023 (l. Andreescu)
- Enters Indian Wells off the back of claiming the second title of her career at Austin (d. Townsend in F)
- Her best WTA 1000 result came at 2025 Rome with SF (l. eventual champion Paolini)
- Is 8-3 in main draw matches against players ranked outside the Top 50 so far this year
- Looking for her sixth straight match win today following her Austin title run

Sierra:

- Making Indian Wells debut appearance
- This is the third WTA 1000 main draw of her career after 2026 Doha (as a lucky loser, l. Ka.Pliskova in 1r) and 2025 Cincinnati (as a lucky loser, l. Jovic in 1r)
- Only player from Argentina to feature in the main draw this week
- Reached a career high ranking of No.62 last month
- Has won two Tour matches this year at United Cup and Hobart; also reached SF at WTA 125 Manila

Magda Linette (POL #49) vs. Ashlyn Krueger (USA #82)

First meeting

Linette:

- Making 9th main draw appearance at Indian Wells, where she has made 2r on five occasions; 2017, 2019, 2021, 2023 and 2025 (2023 was with a 1r bye as No.20 seed)
- Her best WTA 1000 results came with QF at Miami 2025 (l. Paolini) and 2024 Wuhan (l. Gauff)
- Is 3-1 against players from United States of America this season with wins at Australian Open over Top 20 player Navarro and Ann Li as well as over wild card Venus Williams at Auckland
- One of 3 players from Poland to feature in main draw along with Frech and No.2 seed Swiatek
- Owns two hard court titles: Hua Hin in 2020; Bronx in 2019

Krueger:

- Making 6th appearance at Indian Wells and has reached 2r once before in 2025 (l. Svitolina)
- Her best WTA 1000 result is R16 which she reached at Miami 2025 (l. Q.Zheng) and Toronto 2024 (l. Pegula)
- Enters Indian Wells off the back of her SF performance at Austin (l. Townsend) and this is her first WTA 1000 of 2026
- This is her second meeting against a Top 50 player this year after falling to No.9 Keys at Australian Open
- Her most recent win over a Top 50 player was No.27 Sofia Kenin at US Open 2025
- Her sole career title was earned on hard court: Osaka in 2023
- Looking for her first WTA 1000 match win since 2025 Cincinnati when she defeated Sevastova before falling in 2r to Paolini

Antonia Ruzic (CRO #57) vs. [WC] Jennifer Brady (USA #801)

First meeting

Ruzic:

- Making her Indian Wells tournament debut
- Career-best result at WTA 1000 level came last month at Dubai where she reached the quarterfinals as a lucky loser; en route to the quarterfinals she defeated No.25 Raducanu and No.3 Rybakina (via retirement)
- Owns 0-2 career record against players from United States of America, with losses against Townsend at US Open 2025 and Li at Merida 2024
- Best career result on hard court came earlier this season with a semifinal showing at Hobart (l. eventual champion Cocciaretto)

Brady:

- Making 4th appearance at Indian Wells, she returns to the tournament for the first time since 2019, when she recorded her best result at the event by reaching the 3r (l. Barty)
- Competing in her first Tour-level event since Beijing 2023 after suffering from a serious knee injury
- Holds one career title which came on hard court at Lexington 2020 (d. Teichmann in F). She also finished Runner-up at the 2021 Australian Open (l. Osaka in F)
- Is currently ranked No.801. Reached a career-high ranking of No.13 in February 2021 after her run to the final at Australian Open

- The last player from USA to reach the final here was Serena Williams in 2016. The last player from USA to win the title here was also Serena Williams in 2001
- One of 5 wild cards competing on Day 2; 3 out of 3 wild cards suffered 1r exits yesterday (Parks, Stephens and Andreescu)
- Best result by a wild card at Indian Wells was title run by Bianca Andreescu in 2019
- The former World No.1 is currently ranked No.554; this time last year was ranked No.974. She spent 11 weeks throughout her career at the top of the WTA rankings
- Competing in her fifth event of the 2026 season after taking wild cards at Auckland, Hobart, Australian Open and Austin

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlights in 2025 included 3r runs at Wimbledon (as a qualifier) and US Open, also reached R16 at Strasbourg, Hamburg and Chennai
- 2024 season highlight was posting best result at a WTA 1000 by reaching R16 at Indian Wells and first time reaching 3r at Australian Open and 2r at US Open. Also made three SF runs at Osaka, Palermo, and Nottingham. Broke into the Top 50 for the first time and achieved new career-high ranking of No.48 in October
- The 2023 Grand Slam season included two 2r runs at Roland Garros (l. Andreeva) and Wimbledon (l. Martic); fell in 1r at Australian Open (l. Townsend) and US Open (l. Boulter)
- Best Tour level showing in 2023 was a SF run at Lausanne (l. Burel)
- In 2022, lifted the WTA 125 Paris title (d. McNally via W/O) and further reached another WTA 125 final at Colina (l. Bejlek)
- Broke into Top 100 on February 28, 2022 and continued steady progress for remainder of season
- First notable 2022 performance was 3r run at Roland Garros (l. Stephens) beating defending champion Krejčíková in 1r
- In the 2022 grass season, made SF at Gaiba 125 and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Jabeur)
- Series of impressive performances in 2022 started from QF at Palermo (l. Camelia Begu) followed by SF at Granby (l. Kasatkina), QF at Portoroz (l. Lena Friedsam), and QF at Monastir before 1r exits at Cluj Napoca, Rouen 125, and W80 Poitiers
- Finished 2021 in fine form, winning 18 of last 20 matches, highlighted by two WTA 125K Series finals, winning title in Montevideo, Uruguay and finishing R-Up at Buenos Aires, Argentina
- Overall, compiled 50-23 win-loss record last year, lifting three ITF Circuit titles and rising nearly 200 places in the rankings during second half of campaign. Also fell 1r at Roland Garros (as WC, l. Sasnovich) and Strasbourg (as qualifier, l. Niemeier)
- Lifted first ITF Circuit title in 2020, at W15 tournament in Antalya, Turkey
- Reached 2r on WTA main-draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros (as WC, d. Lapko, l. Mertens)
- First contested WTA qualifying at 2018 Roland Garros
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event in Le Havre in 2017
- Played 3 WTA events in 2025, at Washington DC, Cincinnati and US Open; went 1-3 with a win over No.35 Peyton Stearns at Washington DC. In doubles, reached the quarterfinals at the US Open (w/Fernandez)
In the 2024 season, played 1r at Indian Wells and Miami
- In the 2023 season, made 2r at Auckland, Birmingham and WTA 1000 Cincinnati
- In 2022, fell 1r at Washington DC, Toronto, Cincinnati and US Open
- Reached four QFs across 2019, including Auckland (l. eventual R-Up Andreescu), Indian Wells (l. eventual R-Up Kerber), Birmingham (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Keys)
- Scored her best win of the 2019 season at Indian Wells, ousting No.3 Kvitová in 3s. Also defeated defending champion and then-ranked No.5 Bertens in Cincinnati
- Season highlights in 2018 were SF run at Indian Wells (d. S.Williams in 3r, l. eventual R-Up Kasatkina) and QF effort at Miami (l. Collins)
- Winnings at Indian Wells took her career total past \$40 million - S.Williams (\$92 million) is the only other player to pass this milestone
