[7] Elina Svitolina (UKR #10) vs. [32] Hailey Baptiste (USA #25)

Tied 1-1

Svitolina:

- Making 91st appearance at a WTA 1000 main draw, having won four titles, including twice in Rome (2017, 2018)
- Among active players, only Venus Williams, Victoria Azarenka and Vera Zvonareva have won more matches than Svitolina in Tour-level Main draw matches
- Won her 19th career singles title earlier this year at Auckland; also reached the final in Dubai (R-Up)
- Since 2009 when the WTA 1000 level was introduced, only four players have won more matches at Rome – Victoria Azarenka, Serena Williams, Maria Sharapova and Iga Swiatek

Baptiste:

- Competing in 23rd WTA 1000 main draw with two best results coming this year – quarterfinal at 2026 Miami and semifinal at 2026 Madrid
- Playing this week on a career-high ranking of No.25; prior to Miami earlier this year, was ranked No.45
- 3 of 4 Top 10 wins in career have come in 2026 – defeating No.1 Sabalenka (Madrid), No.9 Paolini (Madrid) and No.8 Svitolina (Miami)
- Has already won 1 matches in 2026; her most Tour-level wins in a season is 20, set in 2025

Elisabetta Cocciaretto (ITA #41) vs. [4] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

Swiatek leads 1-0

Cocciaretto:

- Making 8th appearance at Rome, she is through to the 3r here for the first time in her career
- Contesting 28th career WTA 1000; career-best WTA 1000 showing is QF at 2026 Doha (as LL, l. Ostapenko)
- Owns 3 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently defeated No.5 Coco Gauff at 2026 Doha. Also defeated No.3 Pegula at 2025 Wimbledon and No.10 Kvitova at 2023 Roland Garros
- Her first career WTA singles title came on clay at 2023 Lausanne (d. Burel in F)
- Won her 2nd career WTA singles title earlier this year at Hobart, on hard court (as qualifier, d. Jovic in F)
- Seeking to become first Italian to defeat a former champion at Rome since Sara Errani in 2014 (def Jelena Jankovic)

Swiatek:

- Won her only previous meeting against Cocciaretto, conceding just one game in the 2r at Rome last year
- Making 7th appearance at Rome; she is a three time champion at this event, winning titles in 2024 (d. Sabalenka in F), 2022 (d. Jabeur in F) and 2021 (d. Pliskova in F)
- Since the WTA 1000 format was introduced in 2009, only Serena Williams (5) has claimed more clay-court WTA 1000 titles than Swiatek (4, level with Sharapova)
- She has won 11 WTA 1000 titles in her career (4 of those on clay); her most recent WTA 1000 title is 2025 Cincinnati on hard court (d. Paolini in F)
- Best result by Poland at Rome are Swiatek's three titles in 2024, 2022 and 2021
- Bidding to reach the R16 at Rome for the fifth time in her career, only at Indian Wells (six) does she have more WTA 1000 career R16 appearances

[5] Jessica Pegula (USA #5) vs. [Q] Rebeka Masarova (SUI #160)

First meeting

Pegula:

- Making 5th appearance at Rome, where her previous best result was reaching QF in 2021 (l. Martić)
- Owns 4 WTA 1000 titles, all on hard court at Dubai 2026, Toronto 2024, Montreal 2023 and Guadalajara 2022
- Has won 13 matches at WTA 1000 events so far this year, only the current World No.1 and 2 Sabalenka and Rybakina have claimed more
- Two of her 11 career titles have come on clay; at Charleston in 2026 (d. Starodubtseva in F) and 2025 (d. Kenin in F)
- Pegula has won six of her seven clay court matches in 2026, only losing to eventual Champion Kostyuk at Madrid
- Has won 26 matches so far this season; she is one of four players with 25+ main draw match wins this season alongside Rybakina, Sabalenka & M. Andrejeva

Masarova:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Rome, on her first appearance in 2024 she fell in the 1r (l. Begu)
- Contesting her 9th WTA 1000 main draw; she is bidding to reach the R16 at a WTA 1000 event for the first time in her career today
- Owns 1 career win over Top 10 players which came over No.8 Maria Sakkari at 2023 US Open (1-8 career record vs. Top 10 players)
- Best career result on clay is SF run at Gstaad in 2016 (as a WC, l. eventual champion Golubic)
- Best result by qualifier at Rome was Runner-Up run by Alizé Cornet in 2008
- Best result so far this season is QF run at Austin (l. eventual finalist Townsend)

[15] Naomi Osaka (JPN #16) vs. [19] Diana Shnaider (#20)

First meeting

Osaka:

- Making 7th appearance at Rome, where her best tournament result is QF in 2019 (l. Bertens)
- She is a 2-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2018 Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina) and 2019 Beijing (d. Barty)
- Her best career Tour-level result on clay is SF at 2019 Stuttgart
- Her best finish of the year so far is R16 at both Indian Wells and Madrid (l. Sabalenka on both occasions)
- Has won three matches on clay so far this season with a R16 run at Madrid (l. Sabalenka in 3-sets)
- Last year on clay, Osaka won the WTA 125 Saint Malo title and reached R16 at WTA 1000 Rome, along with opening losses at Madrid and Roland Garros

Shnaider:

- Making 3rd appearance at Rome, where her tournament-best result is QF run in 2025 (l. eventual champion Paolini)
- Contesting 25th career WTA 1000 main draw; her best result at this level is SF finish at 2024 Toronto (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Defeated Talia Gibson in the 2r to register 13th match win of the season (5th win on clay)
- One of her 5 career WTA titles was won on clay at Budapest 2024 (d. Sasnovich in F)
- She is 1-8 in 2026 vs. Top 20 players, with a win over No.15 Emma Navarro at Adelaide 2026. She has lost her last seven consecutive matches against Top 20 opponents
- Reached a 6th career doubles final at Madrid last week with M. Andrejeva (l. Siniakova/Townsend in F)

Alexandra Eala (PHI #42) vs. [2] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2)

First meeting

Eala:

- Making 2nd appearance at Rome, on her previous appearance in 2025 she fell in the 1r (I. Kostyuk)
- Contesting 15th WTA 1000 main draw; her best result at this level is SF run at 2025 Miami (as a wild card defeated No.5 Keys, No.11 Badosa and No.2 Swiatek en route)
- Owns 4 career wins over Top 10 players, including two in 2026 over Paolini at Dubai and Gauff at Indian Wells (via ret.)
- Best career result on clay court is 3r run here at Rome this year; seeking three consecutive wins on clay for the first time in her career today
- Her first round win over Frech saw her become the first woman from the Philippines to win a main draw match here at Rome
- Has won 16 matches so far in 2026; her best results this season are a SF run at Auckland (I. Wang Xinyu), also reached the QFs at Abu Dhabi and Dubai

Rybakina:

- Making 5th appearance at Rome; she lifted the title here in 2023 (d. Kalinina in F via retirement)
- Owns two WTA 1000 titles, both won in 2023 at Rome and Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Leads the Tour this year in number of main draw match wins with 28; has also hit the most winners (897) and aces of any player with 230 (the only player to hit more than 200 aces this season)
- She is 19-4 against Top 50 players this season, and has won her last six such meetings
- 5 of her 13 career WTA titles have come on clay court: Stuttgart in 2026; Strasbourg in 2025; Stuttgart in 2024; Rome in 2023; Bucharest in 2019
- She is 7-1 so far this season on clay, picking up her 13th career title at Stuttgart (d. Muchova in F) and R16 run at Madrid (I. Potapova)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Went 16-3 on clay at Tour-level events in 2025, including her 18th career title at Rouen, Madrid SF, Rome QF and Roland Garros QF; also made Australian Open QF (l. eventual champion Keys)
- Achieved runner-up in her opening tournament of 2024 at Auckland (l. Gauff in F) before finishing R16 at Australian Open (l. Noskova, retired due to low back injury). Reached QF at Wimbledon (l. Rybakina), 4r at Roland Garros (l. Rybakina) and 3r at US Open (l. Gauff). Ended season after US Open
- Returned to the Tour in April 2023, following birth of daughter Skai. Won Strasbourg (d. Blinkova) for a second time (also in 2020) before achieving Grand Slam results of QF at Roland Garros (l. Sabalenka) and SF at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- 2022 season reached 3r at Australian Open (l. Azarenka) and QF at Monterrey (l. Osorio), before going on maternity leave in spring
- Highlight of 2021 was lifting 16th career title at Chicago [250]. Also made SF at Miami, Stuttgart and the Olympics (won bronze medal)
- Won her 14th and 15th titles in 2020, firstly at Monterrey (d. Bouzkova in F) and then Strasbourg (d. Rybakina in F). Contested her 30th consecutive major at 2020 Australian Open (streak ended by missing 2020 US Open)
- In 2019, made first two Grand Slam SFs of career at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep) and US Open (l. S.Williams). Became the first woman from Ukraine to reach a major SF (on the men's, Andrei Medvedev made that stage at 1993 and 1999 Roland Garros, finishing runner-up in 1999)
- Also in 2019, made Australian Open QF and reached the title match as defending champion at the Shiseido WTA Finals (l. Barty)
- In 2018, won 13th - and most prestigious - career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Enjoyed standout 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60). Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)
- In 2025, reached first WTA Tour QF of career at Auckland (l. Osaka) and first Grand Slam R16 of career at Roland Garros (l. Keys); made Top 50 debut, peaking at a career-high ranking of No.47 on August 25
- During 2024, made Tour-level R16 at Bogota, Seoul and Wuhan as well as reaching 2r at Roland Garros. Also made semifinal at WTA 125 Puerto Vallarta and broke into the Top 100 for the first time, achieving a career high ranking of No.80 in October
- Won back-to-back Tour main draw matches for the first time at 2023 Guadalajara 1000 reaching R16 (l. Garcia)
- During 2022 season, reached 2r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Inglis), Guadalajara 250 (as qualifier, l. Osorio) and Charleston (l. Cornet)
- In 2021, made 2r at Roland Garros as qualifier (l. Kenin), and also reached 2r at Chicago 500 (as WC, l. Azarenka) and Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur); won first WTA Tour doubles title at Charleston 250 w/McNally (d. Perez/Sanders in F)
- In 2020, made Grand Slam main draw debut as wild card at US Open (l. Mladenovic in 1r); also contested qualifying at Australian Open and Lexington
- Highlight of 2019 was 2r showing on WTA main draw debut at Washington DC (as wild card, d. No.17 Keys, l. Mladenovic); also contested qualifying at US Open, and on ITF Circuit won \$25K titles at Tucson, Sumter and Plantation
- As a junior reached career-high ranking of No.38 in 2018
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Florida in 2017

- In 2017, became first player to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season (Dubai, Rome, Toronto), since such tournaments were introduced in 2009
- One of five players to make Top 10 debut in 2017, after winning Dubai in February (also Ostapenko, Garcia, Mladenovic and Vandeweghe). Peaked in rankings at No.3 on September 11, 2017
- On four occasions could have reached World No.1 - at 2017 US Open, then needed to win 2017 Beijing (fell QF), then needed to triumph at 2017 WTA Finals (fell in group stage), or reach final at 2018 Australian Open (fell in QF)
- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska). Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)
- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova). Another 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)

- Parents are Mykhaylo and Olena; brother is Yulian. Introduced to tennis at age 5 by family
- Married to ATP tennis player Gael Monfils on July 16, 2021. Daughter Skai Monfils was born on October 15, 2022
- Tennis idol growing up was Andre Agassi
- Speaks English, Ukrainian, and French
- Hobbies are learning about business and economics, studies nutrition
- Extremely passionate about her foundation, created in 2019, and spends a lot of time continuing to expand the programming of the Elina Svitolina Foundation
- Enjoys cooking, reading and hiking
- Favorite food is Mom's and Grandma's Ukrainian dishes
- People most admired are Kobe Bryant and Nik Vujicic; Favorite artists are Eminem, AC/DC and Okean Elzy

- Assistant coach is Will Woodall
- Formerly coached by Peter Lucassen at the USTA National Campus in Orlando
- Met Williams sisters as a kid when they were playing World Team Tennis and managed to hit with both
- Pet dog, a half-Shar Pei, half-Pug named Tsonga

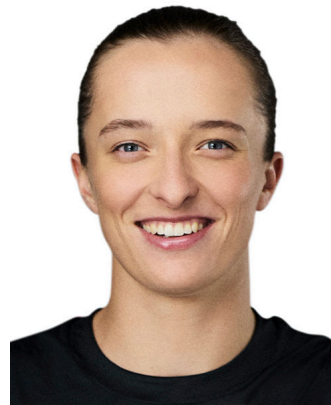

- In 2019, fell 1r on WTA debut at Rome (as WC, l. Anisimova) and Palermo (as qualifier, l. Kuzmova), and won three titles on ITF Circuit. Rose over 500 ranking spots during the year, finishing season at No.215
- In 2018, won maiden title on ITF Circuit at \$15K Nules-ESP
- Owns six singles titles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Professional debut came on ITF Circuit in Italy in 2017
- Former junior World No.12 and reached the junior singles semifinals at the 2018 Australian Open
- Won three singles titles in 2025, including her first Wimbledon title (her 6th Grand Slam title overall), Cincinnati and Seoul; finished at World No.2 for the second straight season
- Posted 62 Tour match wins in 2025, becoming the first player to achieve four consecutive 60-win seasons at Tour level since Martina Hingis (1997-2001) and Lindsay Davenport (1998-2001)
- Claimed five titles in 2024, making it a three-peat at Roland-Garros and also winning Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid and Rome. Crossed \$30m in prize money and qualified for her fourth WTA Finals
- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F). Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - joint-longest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome. Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage). Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejciikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since Agnieszka Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media. Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
