Swiatek leads 6-5

Pegula:

- Making 5th appearance at Rome; she is through to the QFs here for a second time in her career after also reaching the last eight in 2021 (l. Martic in QF)
- Contesting her 51st WTA 1000 main draw; she owns 4 WTA 1000 titles all coming on hard court at Dubai 2026, Toronto 2024, Montreal 2023 and Guadalajara 2022
- This marks her 25th career QF at a WTA 1000 event, and her fourth in 2026 after title run at Dubai (d. Svitolina in F) and QF finishes at Indian Wells and Miami (l. Rybakina in both QFs)
- Has won 15 matches at WTA 1000 events so far this year; only the current World No.1 and No.2 Sabalenka and Rybakina have claimed more
- Has won her last two meetings against today's opponent Swiatek; once on grass at 2025 Bad Homburg and once on hard court at 2024 US Open. She is 0-1 against Swiatek on clay (Swiatek d. Pegula in 2022 Roland Garros QF)
- It has been 10 years since a player from USA won the Rome title: Serena Williams defeated Madison Keys to win her fourth and final Rome title in 2016 (also triumphed in 2002, 2013-14)
- Pegula owns the second-most wins at WTA 1000 events by an American since the format's introduction in 2009 (113 wins), trailing only Serena Williams (148)

Swiatek:

- Making 7th appearance at Rome; she is a three-time champion at this event, winning titles in 2024 (d. Sabalenka in F), 2022 (d. Jabeur in F) and 2021 (d. Pliskova in F)
- Contesting her 46th career WTA 1000 main draw; she owns 11 WTA 1000 titles (4 of those on clay), and her most recent WTA 1000 title is 2025 Cincinnati on hard court (d. Paolini in F)
- Since the WTA 1000 format was introduced in 2009, only Serena Williams (5) has claimed more clay-court WTA 1000 titles than Swiatek (4, level with Sharapova)
- She is through to a 28th career WTA 1000 QF, now equaling Ka. Pliskova; only Azarenka (38) and Sabalenka (33) have more among active players
- Looking to reach a 22nd career SF at WTA 1000 events, and her first since her title run at 2025 Cincinnati
- Also seeking her first Tour-level SF of 2026 after QF losses at Stuttgart, Indian Wells, Doha and Australian Open
- Bidding for her first win this season over a fellow Top 10 player (currently 0-4 vs. Top 10 players in 2026)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)

Rybakina leads 4-3

Svitolina:

- Making 12th appearance at Rome, where she won back-to-back titles in 2017 and 2018 (d. Halep in both finals)
- Through to a sixth career QF at Rome; among currently active players, only Venus Williams (8) has reached more
- Making 91st appearance in a WTA 1000 main draw, and she has won 4 WTA 1000 titles
- Along with her two Rome titles, her other WTA 1000 titles came at 2017 Dubai and 2017 Toronto (d. Wozniacki in both of those finals) – earlier this year reached her first WTA 1000 final since 2018 at Dubai (l. Pegula in F)
- Contesting her 6th Tour-level QF of the season after Auckland, Australian Open, Dubai, Indian Wells and Stuttgart (5-0 record in 2026 QFs)
- Seeking 15th career WTA 1000 SF, and 4th WTA 1000 SF on clay after Rome in 2017-2018 and Madrid 2025 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- She is 4-3 in 2026 vs. Top 10 opponents; her most recent Top 10 win was over No.2 Swiatek at 2026 Indian Wells
- 7 of her 19 career singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is 2025 Rouen (d. Danilovic in F)
- This year, she returned to the Top 10 of the PIF WTA Rankings for the first time since October 2021

Rybakina:

- Making 5th appearance at Rome; she lifted the title here in 2023 (d. Kalinina in F via retirement)
- Owns two WTA 1000 titles, both won in 2023 at Rome and Indian Wells (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Contesting her 21st career WTA 1000 QF, and 4th of this year after Doha QF (l. eventual R-Up Mboko), Indian Wells R-Up (l. Sabalenka in F) and Miami SF (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Looking to reach a 14th career WTA 1000 SF, and 3rd WTA 1000 SF on clay after 2023 Rome title run and 2024 Madrid (l. Sabalenka in SF in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- She is now 9-1 on clay in 2026, winning her 13th career title at Stuttgart (d. Muchova in F) and making Madrid R16 (l. Potapova)
- Leads the Tour this year in number of main draw match wins with 30; she has also hit the most aces of any player with 237 (the only player to hit more than 200 aces this season)
- Holds a 7-2 record in 2026 vs. fellow Top 10 opponents; her most recent Top 10 win was over No.9 Andreeva in 2026 Stuttgart SF
- Rybakina's seven Top 10 wins in 2026 are the most of any player so far this season

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won three singles titles in 2025 across all three surfaces - Bad Homburg (grass), Charleston (clay) and Austin (hard); also had runner-up finishes at Wuhan, Miami and Adelaide
- Qualified for the 2025 WTA Finals for a fourth consecutive year and reached the semifinals for the second time after 2023
- In 2024, won two singles titles - Toronto (WTA 1000) and Berlin - en route to year-end ranking of No.7, her third-straight year-end Top 10 finish; two-time runner-up at Cincinnati and US Open; joined Rosie Casals (1970), Evonne Goolagong Cawley (1973) and Serena Williams (2013) as the only women in the Open Era to make the final at the Canadian Open, Cincinnati Open and US Open in the same season
- Also qualified for the 2024 WTA Finals (withdrew during round-robin play due to left knee injury)
- Won two titles in 2023, her second WTA 1000 tournament at Montreal and also WTA 250 Seoul. Also finished R-Up at Doha, Tokyo and at the WTA Finals in Cancun
- In doubles ascended to No.1 ranking (co-ranked with Coco Gauff) after 2023 US Open
- Achieved career-high No.3 in October 2022 after defeating four Grand Slam champions at Guadalajara, en route to ending three-year wait for second WTA title (d. Sakkari in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals in both singles and doubles (w/Gauff), thus becoming the first Americans to debut in singles and doubles at the season-ending showpiece since Davenport in 1994
- Reached QF at three of the four majors in 2022, breaking into Top 10 after doing so at Roland Garros (June 6, 2022)
- One of seven players to win 40 or more matches in 2022, alongside Swiatek, Jabeur, Garcia, Sakkari, Kasatkina and Bencic
- In 2021, reached the QF or better on seven occasions, including at the Australian Open
- Broke into Top 20 on November 1, 2021
- Began 2020 with runner-up finish at Auckland (L. S.Williams), other standout results were a QF at Western & Southern Open (as qualifier, l. Mertens) and a 3r showing at US Open (l. Kvitova)

- Opened 2020 by reaching the championship match at four of her first five tournaments, including a title run at Hobart (d. Zhang in F), and made Top 20 debut at No.19 on February 17, after reaching St. Petersburg final. First Top-5 win came over No.3 Ka. Pliskova during R-Up finish at 2020 Dubai
- Won maiden WTA singles title at 2019 Bucharest (d. Tig in F), breaking into Top 100 for the first time in the following week's rankings at No.65 (July 22). Went on to make Top 50 debut on September 16 after reaching second career Tour final at Nanchang (l. Peterson)
- Highlights of 2018 included reaching maiden WTA QF at St. Petersburg (l. Goerges) and clinching title at \$15K ITF/Kazan. First Top 10 win came over No.7 Garcia at 2018 St. Petersburg
- Made WTA qualifying and main draw debut at 2017 Moscow (as qualifier, l. Begu in 1r)

- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova). Another 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)
