Gauff leads 3-0

Cirstea:

- If Cirstea reaches the final, she will make her Top 20 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings, becoming the oldest player to make a Top 20 debut (currently holds a career-high ranking of No.21, reached for the first time in August 2013)
- Making 8th main draw appearance at Rome and is through to the SF for the first time
- Before this year, her previous best results at Rome were R16 finishes in 2024 (l. Keys) and 2012 (l. Kvitova)
- This is her 94th career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 result is finishing runner-up at 2013 Toronto (l. S. Williams in F)
- Contesting her 4th career WTA 1000 SF after 2024 Dubai (l. eventual champion Paolini in SF), 2023 Miami (l. eventual champion Kvitova in SF) and 2013 Toronto (l. S. Williams in F)
- Owns 24 Tour-level wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in this fortnight's 3r (that was her first career win over a reigning World No.1)
- Attempting to claim multiple Top 5 wins at the same tournament for the second time in her career, after 2023 Miami (d. No.4 Garcia and No.2 Sabalenka en route to SF)
- Holds a 10-2 clay-court record in 2026, also making Madrid 3r (l. Gauff), Linz QF (l. eventual champion M. Andreeva) and Rouen SF (gave walkover to eventual R-Up Podrez, the walkover does not count as a loss)
- She is the first Romanian to make Rome SF since Simona Halep's title run in 2020 (d. Ka. Pliskova in F via retirement)
- Has won 25 Tour-level matches this year, 6th-most on Tour in 2026

Gauff:

- Making 7th appearance at Rome, where she finished runner-up last year (l. Paolini in F)
- Has claimed a total of 21 main draw wins at Rome in her career; she only has more at Roland Garros (27) at a single Tour-level event
- She has become the first player to reach three consecutive Rome SFs since Karolina Pliskova (2019-2021) and the youngest since Amelie Mauresmo (1999-2001)
- This is her fourth career Rome semifinal (also 2021, 2024 and 2025) - in the Open Era, only Gabriela Sabatini (7) notched more Rome SF appearances before the age of 23 (Gauff's 4 is equal with Martina Hingis)
- Attempting to become the youngest American since Venus Williams (1998-99) to reach the Rome final in consecutive seasons
- Has won 3 WTA 1000 titles in her career, at 2023 Cincinnati (d. Muchova in F), 2024 Beijing (d. Muchova in F) and 2025 Wuhan (d. Pegula in F)
- This is her 3rd Tour-level SF of the year, all occurring at WTA 1000 events: also Miami R-Up (l. Sabalenka in F) and Dubai SF (l. eventual R-Up Svitolina)
- Holds a 17-3 record this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 20 (including wins in her last 8 such matches)
- Has defeated today's opponent Cirstea twice this year, both times at WTA 1000 events in Miami 4r and Madrid 3r (all of Gauff's 3 career wins over Cirstea have been in 3 sets)

[4] Iga Swiatek (POL #3) vs. [7] Elina Svitolina (UKR #10)

Swiatek leads 4-2

Swiatek:

- Making 7th appearance at Rome; she is a three-time champion at this event, winning titles in 2024 (d. Sabalenka in F), 2022 (d. Jabeur in F) and 2021 (d. Pliskova in F)
- Contesting her 46th career WTA 1000 main draw; she owns 11 WTA 1000 titles (4 of those on clay), and her most recent WTA 1000 title is 2025 Cincinnati on hard court (d. Paolini in F)
- Attempting to reach her 14th career WTA 1000 final, and first since her 2025 Cincinnati title run
- Has made her first Tour-level SF of 2026 after QF losses at Stuttgart, Indian Wells, Doha and Australian Open
- Bidding for her 2nd Top 10 win of the year; Swiatek was 0-4 vs. Top 10 players this year before she defeated No.5 Jessica Pegula in yesterday's QF
- Since the WTA 1000 format was introduced in 2009, only Serena Williams (5) has claimed more clay-court WTA 1000 titles than Swiatek (4, level with Sharapova)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)
- Seeking her 26th career match-win at Rome, which would be her most at a single WTA 1000 event (currently has 25 career match-wins at both Rome and Indian Wells)
- Swiatek has defeated today's opponent Svitolina in both of their two previous clay-court meetings, in 2021 Rome QF and 2025 Roland Garros QF (straight sets on both of those occasions)

Svitolina:

- Making 12th appearance at Rome, where she won back-to-back titles in 2017 and 2018 (d. Halep in both finals)
- This is her 91st appearance in a WTA 1000 main draw, and she has won 4 WTA 1000 titles in her career
- Along with her two Rome titles, her other WTA 1000 titles came at 2017 Dubai and 2017 Toronto (d. Wozniacki in both of those finals)
- Earlier this year, she reached her first WTA 1000 final since 2018 at Dubai (l. Pegula in F)
- Has made her 15th career WTA 1000 SF, and 4th WTA 1000 SF on clay after 2017-2018 Rome (won those two titles) and 2025 Madrid (l. eventual champion Sabalenka in SF)
- Holds a 5-3 record in 2026 vs. Top 10 opponents, including a win over No.2 Elena Rybakina in yesterday's QF
- Attempting to claim multiple Top 5 wins at a single event for the first time since the 2019 WTA Finals, where she defeated No.2 Ka. Pliskova and No.5 Halep
- 7 of her 19 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is 2025 Rouen (d. Danilovic in F)
- This year, she returned to the Top 10 of the PIF WTA Rankings for the first time since October 2021
- Has won 26 Tour-level matches so far in 2026, 5th-most on Tour this year
- Svitolina defeated Swiatek in their most recent meeting, a three-set victory in the 2026 Indian Wells QF

- Her victory over Sabalenka earlier this event was her first career win over a reigning World No.1
- Owns 43-38 career Tour-level record against players from USA (0-2 in 2026: l. today's opponent Gauff at Miami and Madrid)
- 1 of her 4 career WTA singles titles has come on clay: 2021 Istanbul (d. Mertens in F)
- Best result by Romania at Rome was Simona Halep's run to the title in 2020 (d. Ka.Pliskova in F via ret.) - that was also the last time a Romanian made the SF here before this year
- Is currently ranked No.27; this time last year was ranked No.131

- This is her 15th career WTA 1000 SF, and she is seeking her 7th career WTA 1000 final
- Her most recent WTA 1000 final was earlier this year at Miami (l. Sabalenka in F)
- This is her 3rd Tour-level SF of the year, all occurring at WTA 1000 events; also Miami R-Up and Dubai SF (l. eventual R-Up Svitolina)
- Faces No.27 Sorana Cirstea in SF today; Gauff is 17-3 this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 20
- Owns 8-4 career Tour-level record against players from Romania (2-0 in 2026: d. today's opponent Cirstea at both Miami and Madrid)
- Two of her 11 career WTA singles titles have come on clay, at 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in F) and 2021 Parma (d. Wang Qiang in F)

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won Cleveland title as qualifier (first WTA Tour singles final since 2021; d. Li in final) en route to tenth straight Top 100 year-end finish in singles; also won her biggest career doubles title at WTA 1000 Madrid (w/Kalinskaya)
- Highlights of 2024 came in the Middle East, making QF at Abu Dhabi and saving six match points in her Dubai QF match against Vondrousova to reach SF (l. eventual champion Paolini). Ended her 2024 season after Wimbledon to undergo foot surgery
- 2023 saw her best results achieved in the USA: advanced to Indian Wells QF for first time (l. Swiatek), then made SF at Miami (l. eventual champion Kvitova) and QF at US Open (l. Muchova)
- In 2022, reached SF on all three surfaces: hard court at Lyon (l. Yastremska), clay at Istanbul (l. Kudermetova), and grass at Birmingham (l. Zhang). Also enjoyed success at the Australian Open, where she fell in R16 (l. Swiatek)
- Highlight of 2021 was ending near-13-year wait for 2nd WTA Tour singles title, triumphing at Istanbul (d. Mertens in F). Also finished R-Up at Strasbourg (l. Krejckikova), reached QF at Grampians Trophy and Portoroz, and R16 at Roland Garros

- Won three singles titles in 2025, including her first Wimbledon title (her 6th Grand Slam title overall), Cincinnati and Seoul; finished at World No.2 for the second straight season

- Won her 14th and 15th titles in 2020, firstly at Monterrey (d. Bouzkova in F) and then Strasbourg (d. Rybakina in F). Contested her 30th consecutive major at 2020 Australian Open (streak ended by missing 2020 US Open)
- In 2019, made first two Grand Slam SFs of career at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep) and US Open (l. S.Williams). Became the first woman from Ukraine to reach a major SF (on the men's, Andrei Medvedev made that stage at 1993 and 1999 Roland Garros, finishing runner-up in 1999)
- Also in 2019, made Australian Open QF and reached the title match as defending champion at the Shiseido WTA Finals (l. Barty)
- In 2018, won 13th - and most prestigious - career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Enjoyed standout 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60). Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)

- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska). Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)
- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova). Another 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)
