[4] Iva Jovic (USA #16) vs. Alycia Parks (USA #97)

Jovic leads 1-0

Jovic:

- Making Charleston Open tournament debut
- Competing in just her third career Tour-level event on clay after Bogota and Roland Garros in 2025
- Owns one WTA title which came at the WTA 500 level on hard court at Guadalajara 2025 (d. Arango in F)
- She is 13-4 so far this season vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- Defeated today's opponent Parks on clay at Bogota 2025
- Is currently ranked at a new career-high of No.16; this time last year was ranked No.150
- Owns 15 match wins already this season; including a R-Up run at Hobart and career first Grand Slam QF at Australian Open

Parks:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Charleston; she is through to the 2r here for the first time after 1r exits in 2022 (l. Cornet) and 2023 (l. Shnaider)
- Career-best result at a WTA 500 event is SF run at 2025 Monterrey (l. eventual champion Shnaider)
- Owns 7 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently defeating No.11 Emma Navarro at Monterrey 2025
- Best career result on clay is QF run at Rabat in 2023 (l. eventual champion Bronzetti)
- Owns one WTA career title which came on hard court at Lyon in 2023 (d. top seed Garcia in F)
- Best result so far in 2026 is QF run at Ostrava; also coming off a 3r appearance at WTA 1000 Miami last week

[1] Jessica Pegula (USA #5) vs. Yulia Putintseva (KAZ #72)

Pegula leads 3-0

Pegula:

- The defending champion returns to make her 8th appearance at Charleston, she defeated fellow American Sofia Kenin in last year's final
- She is a three-time WTA 500 champion, with titles at Charleston 2025, Bad Homburg 2025 and Berlin 2024
- Won her 10th career WTA title earlier this season at Dubai (d. Svitolina in F)
- Last defeated today's opponent Putintseva on hard court at Adelaide 2025
- She is 5-0 so far this year vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 50, most recently defeating No.93 F. Jones (via retirement) at Miami
- Won her first and only-to-date career title on clay here at Charleston last year
- Has won 19 matches so far in 2026; she is ranked joint 4th for match wins alongside Mboko, behind Sabalenka (23), Rybakina (21) and Svitolina (20)

Keys leads 4-1

Keys:

- The former champion returns to make her 13th appearance at Charleston, she defeated Caroline Wozniacki to claim her maiden career clay court title here in 2019
- She also finished Runner-Up here in 2015 (l. Kerber in F)
- She is a seven-time WTA 500 champion, most recently Adelaide 2025 (d. Pegula in F)
- Two of her 10 career titles have come on clay at Strasbourg in 2024 and Charleston in 2019
- She is 2-0 so far this season vs. qualifiers, with wins over Parry at Indian Wells and Valentova at Adelaide
- Last defeated today's opponent Vekic on clay at Madrid 2025
- Best results so far this season are two QF runs at Brisbane and Adelaide

Vekic:

- Making 2nd appearance at Charleston, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2015 (l. Brengle)
- Best career runs at WTA 500 events are four Runner-Up showings at Bad Homburg 2024, Berlin 2023, San Diego 2022 and St. Petersburg 2019
- Defeated Tomljanovic in the 1r to register just her 2nd Tour-level match win of the 2026 season. Her first win came over Valentova at Indian Wells
- Owns 29 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently defeated No.12 Shnaider at Bad Homburg 2025
- Career-best result on clay is her silver medal run at Paris 2024 (l. Zheng Qinwen in gold medal match)
- Owns four career WTA titles; three on hard court and one on grass. Her most recent title was Monterrey 2023

First meeting

Starodubtseva:

- Making tournament debut at Charleston
- Defeated No.62 Shuai Zhang in the 1r to register 4th Tour-level win of her 2026 season, and is coming off the back of a 3r run at Miami
- Owns 2 career wins over Top 20 opponents, having defeated No. 10 Kalinskaya at Beijing 2024 and No.18 Samsonova at Madrid 2025
- Best career result on clay is R16 run at Madrid 2025 (l. M. Andreeva)
- Is currently ranked No.89 (career best of No.63 in 2025); this time last year was ranked No.103
- Career-best result at the WTA 500 level is R16 run at Ningbo 2025 (l. Bencic)

Alexandrova:

- Is currently ranked No.13, broke into the WTA's Top 10 for the first time at the end of last season; this time last year was ranked No.26
- Best result so far this season is a Runner-up finish at Abu Dhabi (l. Bejlek in F)

[15] Hailey Baptiste (USA #33) vs. Renata Zarazua (MEX #85)

Zarazua leads 3-1

Baptiste:

- Making 5th appearance at Charleston; she has fallen in the 2r here on all four of her previous appearances
- Career-best result at WTA 500 events is SF run at Abu Dhabi 2026 (l. eventual R-Up Alexandrova)
- Coming off a QF run at Miami last fortnight, which is her career best result at a WTA 1000 event
- Is currently ranked at a new career-high of No.33; this is her first time being seeded at a WTA 500 event
- Best career result on clay is a R16 run at Roland Garros 2025 (l. Keys); which is also her career-best major result

Zarazua:

- Career-best results at the WTA 500 level are R16 runs at Abu Dhabi 2026 (l. Kartal), Monterrey 2024 (l. Alexandrova) and Guadalajara 2024 (l. Trevisan)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Had breakthrough week at WTA 500 Guadalajara in 2025, making her first Tour-level QF (saved MP vs. Jimenez Kasintseva) and going on to win her first Tour title at age 17 (d. Arango in final); rose from No.73 to No.36 following her triumph in Mexico
- Also in 2025, won WTA 125 title at Ilkley (d. Marino in final) and played all four Grand Slam main draws; made Top 100 and Top 50 debuts and peaked at No.33 on October 20
- In 2024, made US Open 2r in her first Grand Slam and Tour-level appearance (as wild card); reached final at ITF W100 Tyler and ended the year with a career-high ranking of No.194
- Claimed her first ITF title in 2023 at 25K Reading
- Played her first ITF tournament in 2022 reaching the final at 15K Los Angeles; also reached 3r at 2022 Junior US Open
- Best results of 2025 were semifinals at Monterrey (l. eventual champion Shnaider) and Auckland (l. Osaka); registered first Roland Garros main draw match win over No.13 Karolina Muchova
- Highlight of 2024 season was posting best Grand Slam result courtesy of run to 3r at Australian Open (l. Gauff). Also won three WTA 125 titles, at Angers, Warsaw and Gaiba
- Won first singles title in 2023 at Lyon (d. Garcia). In doubles won Cincinnati (w/Townsend) and achieved R-Up at Birmingham (w/Hunter)
- Contested three WTA main draws in 2022, highlighted by maiden QF at this level at Ostrava (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Krejckikova)
- In 2022, also made 2r at Berlin (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Jabeur) and finished the campaign with a 10-match winning streak that brought WTA 125K Series titles at Andorra and Angers
- Closed out 2021 with R-Up finish at W25 event in Daytona Beach-FL, USA
- In 2021, also made 2r at Lausanne and fell 1r at US Open (as WC, l. Danilovic) and Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. Rus); struck 129mph serve during 1r defeat at US Open, matching V.Williams' record for the fastest serve in the tournament's history
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2021 Charleston (as qualifier, l. Jabeur)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Charleston (l. Vikhlyantseva in final round)
- Owns one ITF Circuit singles title from six finals, triumphing at \$25k Orlando-FL in November 2020 (also won doubles title)
- Made ITF Circuit debut at a \$15k event in Orlando-FL, USA in March 2017

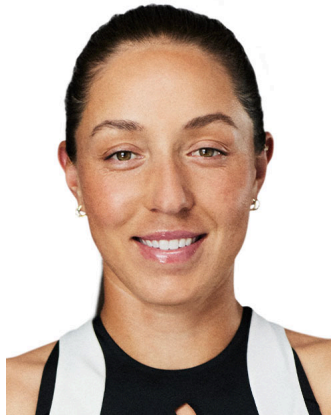

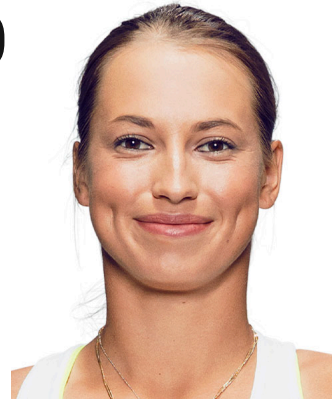

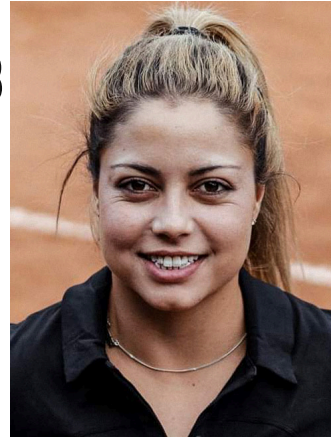
