QUARTERFINAL QUICK HITS

- This is the second time in the Open Era that all eight quarterfinalists are seeded at the Canadian Open, following 1991 - Gabriela Sabatini (1), Manuela Maleeva-Fragniere (2), Jennifer Capriati (3), Katerina Maleeva (4), Helena Sukova (6), Amy Frazier (8), Natalia Zvereva (9), Laura Arraya (10)
- Diana Shnaider (22) is this fortnight's youngest quarterfinalist – she is 20 days younger than the second-youngest quarterfinalist, Coco Gauff (also 22)
- Elina Svitolina (31) is this fortnight's oldest quarterfinalist – today, she faces the second-oldest quarterfinalist, Ekaterina Alexandrova (also 31)
- Naomi Osaka has reached the quarterfinals at four consecutive WTA events entered for the first time since 2021 (US Open 2020; Gippstand, Australian Open, Miami 2021)
- Osaka and Gauff are the two players this fortnight who have reached the quarterfinals without losing a set
- Belinda Bencic can reach her second Canadian Open SF, after claiming tournament victory in Toronto in 2015 – it would be the longest seasonal gap between two semifinal appearances at this event in the Open Era
- Elena Rybakina is the ace leader during this fortnight (28 entering the quarterfinals) and on Tour this year (317, including her aces at this event)

Swiatek leads 1-0

Shnaider:

- Making 3rd appearance at this tournament, where she reached SF on debut in 2024 (l. eventual champion Pegula) – her SF run at 2024 Toronto is her career-best result at a WTA 1000 event
- Owns 3 wins in career over Top 10 players, defeating No.2 Coco Gauff at this event in 2024, No.1 Aryna Sabalenka at 2026 Roland Garros, and No.3 Jessica Pegula in this fortnight's Round of 16
- Attempting to notch multiple Top 10 wins at the same event for the first time in her career
- 3 of her 5 career WTA titles have come on hard court: 2024 Hua Hin (d. Zhu in F), 2024 Hong Kong (d. Boulter in F) and 2025 Monterrey (d. Alexandrova in F)
- Her top results this year are 3 semifinals, including her first Grand Slam SF of career at Roland Garros on clay (l. eventual R-Up Chwalinska)
- Her 2 other semifinals this year came on hard court, at Adelaide in January (l. eventual champion M.Andreeva) and Washington DC last week (l. eventual R-Up Pegula)

Swiatek:

- Making 5th appearance at this tournament, where her best result is SF in 2023 (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Has won 11 WTA 1000 titles in her career, most recently at 2025 Cincinnati (d. Paolini in F)
- This is her 29th career WTA 1000 QF (4th of this year), and she is seeking her 23rd career WTA 1000 SF (which would be her 2nd of this year)
- Her best tournament finish so far this year is SF at WTA 1000 Rome (l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- 14 of her 25 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently 2025 Seoul (d. Alexandrova in F)
- Only Serena Williams (84.1%, 148-28) has a better career win rate than Swiatek (79.8%, 138-35) in WTA 1000 matches since the format's introduction in 2009 (minimum 10 matches played)
- Swiatek is trying to reach WTA 1000 semifinals on both hard court and clay for the 5th straight year (2022-26) – she would become just the third player since 2009 to achieve that, after Halep (2014-19) and Sabalenka (2021-25)
- Defeated today's opponent Shnaider in their only prior meeting, in three sets at 2025 Madrid on clay

[16] Ekaterina Alexandrova (#19) vs. [9] Elina Svitolina (UKR #9)

Svitolina leads 3-1

Alexandrova:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at this event, and she has reached QF of this tournament for the first time
- This is her 6th career WTA 1000 QF (first of this year), and she is seeking her 4th career WTA 1000 SF
- Her best tournament finishes at WTA 1000 events are SFs at 2022 Madrid (l. eventual champion Jabeur), 2024 Miami (l. eventual champion Collins) and 2025 Doha (l. eventual champion Anisimova)
- Owns 21 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently World No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in the previous round

- Alexandrova lost her first three meetings vs. Svitolina, but she won their most recent meeting at 2021 Berlin

Svitolina:

- Making 10th appearance at this tournament – she won this title in 2017 (notched four Top 10 wins during that title run; d. Wozniacki in F) and was also a semifinalist in 2018 (l. eventual R-Up Stephens)
- She is a 5-time WTA 1000 champion, winning titles at 2017, 2018 and 2026 Rome, 2017 Dubai and 2017 Toronto
- Has reached her 28th career WTA 1000 QF, and is seeking her 16th career WTA 1000 SF
- This is her 4th WTA 1000 QF of this season after title run at Rome (d. Gauff in F), R-Up finish at Dubai (l. Pegula in F) and SF showing at Indian Wells (l. eventual R-Up Rybakina)
- Owns 12 hard court WTA titles, including one this year at Auckland (d. Wang Xinyu in F)
- Only Jessica Pegula (40) has claimed more Tour-level match-wins in 2026 than Svitolina (39)
- Svitolina won the most recent WTA 1000 title (2026 Rome) – she is now attempting to claim 10 consecutive WTA 1000 match-wins for the second time in her career (after 11 straight between Rome and Cincinnati in 2017)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Top singles results of 2025 were winning Monterrey title (d. Alexandrova in final) and making Ningbo SF, posting a Top 25 finish for second straight year; in doubles, partnered with M.Andreeva to win two titles (Brisbane and Miami) and qualify for their first WTA Finals
- Won first four titles of career in 2024 across all three surfaces; WTA 500 Bad Homburg and WTA 250s Hua Hin, Budapest and Hong Kong. Made Top 20 debut on August 12 and finished the season at World No.13
- Also in 2024, won the Paris Olympic silver medal in women's doubles with Mirra Andreeva
- Reached 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2023 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Sakkari in 3s)
- Won WTA 125 title in Montevideo, Uruguay to end 2022 just outside Top 100. Overall win-loss record in 2022 was 56-17; reached four ITF Circuit finals, highlighted by a 15-match, three tournament winning streak, culminating with a W60 title in Istanbul
- Won first ITF Circuit tournament at W15 event in Antalya in late 2021. Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Moscow
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Played first senior matches on ITF Circuit towards end of 2020
- As junior, made SF at Roland Garros in 2021 and US Open in 2022. Also won girls' doubles at three of the four majors and reached No.2 in the ITF rankings
- Won three singles titles in 2025, including her first Wimbledon title (her 6th Grand Slam title overall), Cincinnati and Seoul; finished at World No.2 for the second straight season
- Posted 62 Tour match wins in 2025, becoming the first player to achieve four consecutive 60-win seasons at Tour level since Martina Hingis (1997-2001) and Lindsay Davenport (1998-2001)
- Claimed five titles in 2024, making it a three-peat at Roland-Garros and also winning Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid and Rome. Crossed \$30m in prize money and qualified for her fourth WTA Finals
- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F). Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - joint-longest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome. Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage). Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejčíková/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since Agnieszka Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media. Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l.

Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)

- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano. Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016
- Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Kung in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016
