- The 2026 WTA Tour grass court swing kicks off this week with the 28th edition of the Libema Open in 's-Hertogenbosch, the Netherlands. It is the first WTA 250 grass court tournament of the season, running alongside the WTA 500 event at Queen's, London.
- Top seed this week is two-time Libema Open champion Ekaterina Alexandrova, who is making her 7th appearance at the tournament. The world No.14 has won two grass court titles in her career, both coming back-to-back here in 2022 (d. No.1 seed Sabalenka in F) and 2023 (d. No.1 seed V. Kudermetova in F). Alexandrova owns a career-record of 18-4 here at 's-Hertogenbosch, only Flipkens (21) has won more matches at this tournament than Alexandrova in its 28 editions. The No.1 seed is 6-13 at Tour-level so far this season, suffering first-round exits at nine of her 13 tournaments. Her standout result of the season remains a run to her 14th career Tour-level final at Abu Dhabi, where she finished runner-up to qualifier Bejlek.
- No.2 seed Clara Tauson is making her second appearance at 's-Hertogenbosch, and is seeking her first match win here after falling in the opening round on her debut appearance in 2024 (l. Niemeier). The Danish No.1 owns a 6-8 career Tour-level record on grass, with all six wins coming during last year's grass court swing, where she made QFs at Nottingham, R16 at Bad Homburg and R16 at Wimbledon (d. former Wimbledon champion Elena Rybakina in the 3r before losing to eventual champion Swiatek). Semifinalist at Abu Dhabi and quarterfinalist at Dubai earlier this season, she is looking for her first match win since 2r finish at Indian Wells, after posting an 0-3 record during the clay-court swing.
- The reigning Libema Open champion Elise Mertens returns as this week's No.3 seed on her eighth appearance at the tournament. Last year's title run here delivered her maiden Tour-level singles title on grass (d. Ruse in F). The former champion also owns seven hard-court and two clay-court titles. She carried her momentum on grass last year into Wimbledon, reaching the R16 (l. Sabalenka), and went on to win her second Wimbledon doubles title (w/ V. Kudermetova). Has won 16 Tour-level matches so far this season, with her best results being R16 finishes at Australian Open, Dubai and Rome.
- Making her tournament debut this week is No.4 seed Emma Navarro of the United States. Last month, the former Top 10 player won her third career WTA Tour singles title on the clay of Strasbourg. Navarro's best Tour-level finishes on grass are Bad Homburg SFs in 2023 and 2024, and she also reached the Wimbledon QF in 2024 (l. eventual R-Up Paolini).
- Dutch No.1 Suzan Lamens received one of this year's main draw wild cards. Lamens returns to 's-Hertogenbosch for the 4th time in her career, she reached the quarterfinals here last year which marked her career-best run on the grass. Another main draw wild card went to 17-year-old Mia Pohankova of Slovakia, who won Junior Wimbledon last year.
- The remaining main draw wild cards have been awarded to former Top 5 players Bianca Andreescu and Paula Badosa. Andreescu is a former finalist at 's-Hertogenbosch, she reached her second career Tour-level final on grass here in 2024 where she fell to Samsonova in the championship match (first final was 2022 Bad Homburg, l. Garcia). Badosa returns to the Libema Open for the second time in her career after coming through qualifying to reach the 2r in 2019, her career-best results on grass are QF runs at 2025 Berlin and 2024 Bad Homburg.
- Another notable entrant this week is two-time Grand Slam champion Barbora Krejčíková, who achieved the pinnacle of grass court tennis in 2024 by capturing the Wimbledon title (d. Paolini in F). 6 players in this year's main draw have reached finals already this year: Sara Bejlek (WON: Abu Dhabi), Emma Navarro (WON: Strasbourg), Ekaterina Alexandrova (R-UP: Abu Dhabi), Tamara Korpatsch (R-UP: Ostrava), Panna Udvardy (R-UP: Bogota) and Anastasia Potapova (R-UP: Linz).
