- The 28th edition of the Copa Colsanitas Colsubsidio is headlined by top seed Marie Bouzkova, a former finalist who reached her first career final on clay court during her tournament debut in 2024 (l. home favorite Camila Osorio). The Czech enters with a 6–9 record this season, her best result a quarterfinal run in Merida (l. eventual finalist Frech). Bouzkova owns two career WTA titles, both secured on home soil in Prague (2022, 2025). This marks her third consecutive year as the No.1 seed in Bogota and the sixth time she has held top-seed status at Tour-level, most recently here last year where she advanced to the quarterfinals.
- No.2 seed Jessica Bouzas Maneiro makes her Bogota tournament debut this week, contesting her eighth Tour-level event of the 2026 season. She has recorded three match wins so far this year, with opening match victories at United Cup, Merida and Indian Wells. Her season began with a standout win over World No.4 Coco Gauff while representing Spain at the United Cup, marking her maiden Top 5 victory. The Spaniard enjoyed a breakthrough on clay last season, reaching her first two career quarterfinals on the surface in Rouen (l. eventual champion Svitolina) and Rabat (l. Tomljanovic).
- Home favorite Camila Osorio is seeded No.3 this year. Osorio returns to Bogota as the defending champion after defeating qualifier Katarzyna Kawa in last year's final. A three-time champion at the event (2021, 2024, 2025), Osorio boasts an outstanding 20–3 career record here. She captured her maiden WTA title at this tournament in 2021 as a wild card ranked No.180, defeating No.5 seed Zidansek in the final. The Colombian has recorded six Tour-level match wins so far in 2026, highlighted by a R16 run at Doha as a qualifier (l. Ostapenko), which marked her second career WTA 1000 R16 after Rome 2023 (l. Haddad Maia). She also lifted the WTA 125 title in Manila earlier this year, notably defeating local favorite and Top 50 player Alexandra Eala en route.
- Completing the top four seeds is two-time Copa Colsanitas Colsubsidio champion Tatjana Maria, who makes her 13th appearance at Bogota. The 38-year-old holds a 17–10 career record at the event, highlighted by back-to-back titles in 2022 and 2023, becoming the first player to achieve the feat since Colombia's Fabiola Zuluaga won three consecutive titles from 2002–2004. Maria owns four career WTA singles titles; two on clay at Bogota and two on grass (Mallorca 2018 and London 2025). During her London triumph, she defeated four Top 15 players en route to the title as a qualifier ranked World No.86 (d. Anisimova in the final). At 37, she became the oldest WTA Tour singles champion since Serena Williams (38) in Auckland 2020. Maria has recorded just one match win so far so far in 2026, with a first round victory over Venus Williams in Hobart, but has fallen in the opening round at eight of her nine events this season.
- The main draw wild cards have been awarded to Colombians Valentina Mediorreal Arias and Maria Torres Murcia, Argentina's Julia Riera, and American teenager Julieta Pareja. 17-year-old Pareja made her WTA main draw debut in Bogota last year, where she raced to the semifinals as a No.550-ranked qualifier. Then aged 16, she became the youngest player to reach a Tour-level semifinal since a 15-year-old Coco Gauff won the Linz title in 2019.
