2026 AUSTRALIAN OPEN

The Australian Open was first held in 1905, with the first women's singles championship being staged in 1922. This is the 99th staging of the women's singles championship and the 57th of the Open Era, which began in 1968 (1969 for Australian Open) and saw the introduction of prize money.

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PIF WTA WORLD NO.1

For the fifth time in her career, **Aryna Sabalenka** enters a Grand Slam tournament as the PIF WTA World No.1. Sabalenka first attained the ranking on September 11, 2023 and returned to the top spot on October 21, 2024. During the Australian Open, Sabalenka will extend her streak of week at No.1 to 66 and 67 consecutive weeks.

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GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS (ACTIVE PLAYERS)

ACTIVE GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

There are 16 active Grand Slam champions, five of whom have lifted the trophy previously at Australian Open: **Madison Keys** (2025), **Aryna Sabalenka** (2023-24), **Naomi Osaka** (2019, 2021), **Sofia Kenin** (2020), **Caroline Wozniacki** (2018) and **Victoria Azarenka** (2012-13).

Iga Swiatek is bidding to complete her career Grand Slam having already won titles at Roland Garros (2020, 2022, 2023, 2024), Wimbledon (2025) and US Open (2022). If she wins the title, Swiatek would be the third youngest woman to complete the career Slam behind only Stefanie Graf and Serena Williams.

GRAND SLAM MAIN DRAW: CONSECUTIVE APPEARANCES

Alize Cornet made her 69th consecutive appearance across the Grand Slams at 2024 Roland Garros, a streak that started at the 2007 Australian Open. Cornet initially retired after the French Open last season which ended that run, before retiring for a second time in September 2025.

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STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with five or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (26-1 in 1r, 96.3%):** Swiatek has been defeated in the 1r only once in 27 Grand Slam main draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic). She is 7-0 in R128 at the Australian Open
- **Mirra Andrejeva (10-1 in 1r, 90.9%):** Only loss in opening round at a Slam came at 2024 Wimbledon
- **Elena Rybakina (22-3 in 1r, 88.0%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel). Rybakina is 6-0 at the Australian Open
- **Madison Keys (43-6 in 1r, 87.8%):** Has won 13-straight Slam opening round matches with last loss coming at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens). She owns an 10-1 record here in opening matches
- **Elise Mertens (30-5 in 1r, 85.7%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu). Is 8-0 at the Australian Open in R128.
- **Emma Raducanu (12-2, 85.7%):** Both of Raducanu's first round losses came at the US Open; in the opening round she is 4-0 at the Australian Open.
- **Elina Svitolina (40-7 in 1r, 85.1%):** Svitolina has won 37 of her last 37-8 opening round matches at Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with only loss during that time coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria). She is 11-1 in R128 at the Australian Open.
- **Coco Gauff (21-4 in 1r, 84.0%):** Owns a 5-1 record in R128 at the Australian Open with only loss coming in 2022 (I. Qiang Wang)
- **Aryna Sabalenka (25-5, 83.3%):** Has not lost in 1r at a Slam since 2020 Australian Open; since then has won 20-straight first round matchups
