## DAY 1 – TUESDAY, MARCH 17<sup>TH</sup>

### Simona Waltert (SUI #88) vs. Ajla Tomljanovic (AUS #81)

Waltert leads 1-0

#### **Waltert:**

- Making her Miami Open tournament debut
- Also contesting her maiden main draw appearance at a WTA 1000 event, after failing to qualify on each of her five previous attempts
- Owns 2-0 career record against players from Australia, most recent was a win over today's opponent Tomljanovic at Singapore 2025
- Equalled her career-best result on hard court last month at Abu Dhabi with a R16 finish; also made R16 at Singapore 2025
- The winner of this match is set to face 6th seed Amanda Anisimova in the second round

#### **Tomljanovic:**

- Making 12th appearance at Miami, her previous best result here is a R16 run in 2013 (as a wild card, l. Flipkins)
- Contesting 53rd WTA 1000 main draw; since the format's introduction in 2009 only Samantha Stouser (84) has made more appearances amongst Australians
- Career-best result at the WTA 1000 level is a QF run at Cincinnati 2022, defeated world No.4 Badosa in the R16 before losing to eventual finalist Kvitova in the quarterfinals
- Best career results on hard court are three Runner-Up finishes at Hua Hin 2019, Seoul 2018 and Pattaya City 2015
- Reached the QFs at Austin last month, defeating former Grand Slam champion Venus Williams and world No.18 Iva Jovic en route

### McCartney Kessler (USA #51) vs. Magdalena Frech (POL #37)

First meeting

#### **Kessler:**

- Making 2nd appearance at Miami, on her previous appearance in 2025 she reached the 3r (l. Raducanu)
- Career-best results at WTA 1000 level are three R16 showings; all coming in 2025 at Dubai (l. Muchova), Montreal (l. Kostyuk) and Beijing (l. Lys)
- Two of her three career WTA titles have come on hard court at Hobart 2025 and Cleveland 2024
- Six players from USA have won the title here at Miami: Danielle Collins, Sloane Stephens, Serena Williams, Venus Williams, Monica Seles and Chris Evert
- Record in opening matches so far this season stands at 3-2, with 1r wins at Brisbane, Australian Open and Abu Dhabi
- Best result so far this season is QF run at Abu Dhabi (l. Tauson)

#### ***Frech:***

- Making 5th appearance at Miami, her best result here is a R32 run in 2023 (l. Gracheva)
- Career-best result at WTA 1000 level is QF run at Wuhan 2024 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Owns one career WTA title which came on hard court at Guadalajara 500 in 2024 (d. Gadecki in F)
- Is 0-2 so far this season against Americans, with losses to Peyton Stearns at Dubai and Ann Li at Doha
- Reached a third career Tour-level final last month at Merida (l. Bucsa in F)
- Best results by Poland at Miami are Champion runs by Iga Swiatek in 2022 and Agnieszka Radwanska in 2012
- The winner of this match will face 8th seed Mirra Andreeva in the second round

#### **Zeynep Sonmez (TUR #83) vs. Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #69)**

**First meeting**

#### ***Sonmez:***

- Making main draw debut at Miami (fell in Q1 in 2025)
- This is the 8th WTA 1000 main draw appearance of her career and looking for her second WTA 1000 match win of the season after a 1r win over Kessler at Indian Wells
- Career-best result at the WTA 1000 level is 3r run at Beijing 2025 (l. Potapova)
- Best career result on hard court was winning the Merida title in 2024 (d. Li in F)
- This is the first time a player from Turkey has competed in the main draw at Miami
- Reached the quarterfinals at Merida last month (l. eventual champion Bucsa), this was her third consecutive QF at the event

#### ***Haddad Maia:***

- Making 8th appearance at Miami, her best result here is reaching R32 four times (2024, 2023, 2022 and 2018)
- Has reached one WTA 1000 final at Toronto 2022 (l. Halep in F)
- Bidding for her first match win of the 2026 season today; she is 0-6 in opening matches so far this year
- Most recent win over a Top 100 player was at 2025 US Open (d. No.64 Sakkari)
- Two of her four career WTA titles have come on hard court: Seoul in 2024 (d. Kasatkina in F) and Zhuhai in 2023 (d. Q. Zheng in F)
- Broke inside the WTA's Top 10 in June of 2023, becoming the first Brazilian in the Open Era to do so
- The winner of this match is set to face 12th seed Belinda Bencic in the second round

#### **Katerina Siniakova (CZE #42) vs. Camila Osorio (COL #58)**

**Tied 1-1**

##### ***Siniakova:***

- Making 11th appearance at Miami, her best result here came in 2022 with a R32 finish
- Career-best results at the WTA 1000 level are three QF finishes, each time as a qualifier: Wuhan 2025, Beijing 2018 and Wuhan 2018
- Owns 1-1 career record against today's opponent Osorio, losing to her most recently on hard court at Doha 2026. She won their first meeting on clay at WTA 125 Lleida in 2024
- 3 of her 5 career WTA titles have come on hard court: Nanchang 2023, Portoroz 2022 and Shenzhen 2017
- Produced her best result of the season earlier this month at Indian Wells, reaching the R16 with three Top 50 wins along the way, including her 11th career Tour-level victory over a Top 10 player (d. No.8 M. Andreeva)
- Coming off the back of winning the 2026 Indian Wells doubles title with Taylor Townsend, marking Siniakova's 34th career Tour-level doubles trophy

##### ***Osorio:***

- Making 2nd appearance at Miami, on her previous appearance in 2025 she fell in the opening round (l. Mboko)
- Her best WTA 1000 result is R16 which she reached last month at Doha (as a qualifier, l. Ostapenko) and at 2023 Rome (l. Haddad Maia)
- Seeking her 20th career win at WTA 1000 events, becoming the first Colombian to achieve this feat in the format's history
- Is 4-4 so far this season vs. Top 50 players, most recent win was over No.18 Jovic at Indian Wells
- Best career result on hard court is R-Up which she has reached twice: Monterrey in 2022 and Tenerife in 2021.
- One of 2 players from Colombia competing in this year's main draw alongside Emiliana Arango; the last time this happened was 2005 (Catalina Castaño and Fabiola Zuluaga)

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025 equalled her best career Tour result with QF at Iasi (also 2022 Lausanne), earned first WTA 125 title of her career at Rio de Janeiro and her year-end ranking was a career-high of No.86. In doubles, reached second Tour-level final at Iasi (w/Carle), and won five WTA 125 doubles titles
- In 2024, reached first career SF at WTA 125 event in Antalya (l. Bouzas Maneiro). Best result on Hologic WTA Tour was 2r run at Iasi (l. Paquet). Won ITF W75 Glasgow (d. Bolkvadze in F)
- In 2023 reached a new career-high ranking of No.107
- In 2023 reached the finals of ITF \$60k Grenoble (l. Dodin) and best results on the WTA Tour were 1r runs at Merida (l. Bonaventure) and Lausanne (l. Bogdan)
- In 2023 made her main draw Grand Slam debut with a 2r run as a qualifier at Roland Garros (l. Cocciaretto), later in the season followed up with a 1r run as a qualifier at Wimbledon (l. Bouzkova)
- 2022 season highlights were reaching her career-first Tour level QF at Lausanne (l. Danilovic), where she also earned her first Top-10 win over the No.7 Collins
- In 2021 lifted the W15 Manacor title on the ITF Tour
- Made her main draw debut on the WTA Tour in 2019 at Lausanne, where she received a wild card in the single and doubles (w/ Sugnaux) draws; made the 2r in both draws (l. Teichmann and Barthel/Knoll)
- In 2019 lifted two W15 titles at Cairo and Sharm El Sheikh
- In 2018 lifted her first two \$15k titles at Ortisei and Macon
- 2025 highlights include SF finishes at Austin (l. eventual champion Pegula) and Rabat (l. eventual champion Joint); best win by ranking came over No.12 Tauson en route to Ningbo QF (l. eventual champion Rybakina)
- Highlights of 2024 season were reaching her 5th career WTA final at Birmingham (l. Putintseva in F) and earning WTA 125 title at Hong Kong
- Began 2023 season in August after undergoing minor knee surgery in January; ended season on a high note by winning Florianopolis WTA 125 title (d. Capurro Taborda). Posted career-high ranking of No.32 during her injury layoff on April 3
- In 2022, made Wimbledon QF for second straight year, then reached 2nd consecutive Slam QF at US Open (d. S.Williams in 3r, in Williams' final professional singles match). Also made QF at Istanbul, Rabat, Nottingham and Cincinnati
- Had major breakthrough in 2021, reaching first career Grand Slam QF at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Barty). Other 2021 highlights include R16 at Indian Wells and US Open 3r
- In 2019, reached 4th career WTA singles final at Hua Hin (l. Yastremska in final). Also posted two Top 10 wins in 2019, defeating No.10 Sabalenka at Miami and No.8 Bertens at Zhengzhou
- Finished R-Up twice on Tour in 2018, at Rabat (l. Mertens in final) and Seoul (l. Bertens in final)
- Underwent shoulder surgery in February 2016 and was sidelined for rest of season; returned at 2017 Acapulco, more than 12 months later
- In 2015, reached first career WTA singles final at Pattaya City (l. Hantuchova in final). Made Top 50 debut in 2015, rising as high as No.47 (week of February 23)
- During 2014, made first Grand Slam R16 at Roland Garros (l. Suarez Navarro), defeating No.3 A.Radwanska en route for first career Top 10 win
- Announced in 2014 she would switch nationalities and start representing Australia (first did so at 2014 US Open)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of four singles titles and three doubles titles
- Made pro debut on ITF Circuit in Croatia in 2007 and WTA main draw debut at 2009 Indian Wells (as WC, l. 1r to Haynes)
- As a junior, achieved career-high ranking of No.4, won Australian Open junior doubles title in 2009 (w/McHale), and was a member of Croatia's victorious junior Fed Cup team in 2009
