### [31] Alexandra Eala (PHI #29) vs. Laura Siegemund (GER #53)

First meeting

#### *Eala:*

- Making 4th main draw appearance at Miami
- Last year at this event, she reached her first Tour-level quarterfinal and semifinal as a wild card ranked No.140 (l. eventual runner-up Jessica Pegula in semifinals)
- Picked up her first Top 10 wins of career during semifinal run in Miami last year (d. No.5 Madison Keys in 3rd round and No.2 Iga Swiatek in quarterfinals)
- Has an 0-3 career Tour-level record against players from Germany - all three of those losses were to Tatjana Maria during 2023
- Currently sitting at a new career-high ranking of No.29 this week; this time last year was ranked No.140

#### *Siegemund:*

- Making 7th main draw appearance at Miami, where she has matched her tournament-best result by making 2nd round for the 4th time (also 2021, 2023-24)
- Contesting her 37th career WTA 1000 main draw; her career-best WTA 1000 showing is quarterfinals at Wuhan last year (l. eventual champion Coco Gauff)
- Defeated Petra Marcinko in this week's 1r; she also defeated Marcinko in the 1r at Indian Wells earlier this month
- She is 1-1 vs. Top 50 players this year (d. No.18 Liudmila Samsonova at Australian Open; l. No.9 Elina Svitolina at Indian Wells)
- Best results by Germany at Miami are Stefanie Graf's 5 titles in 1987, 1988, 1994, 1995 and 1996

### Magda Linette (POL #50) vs. [2] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

Swiatek leads 1-0

#### *Linette:*

- Making 9th appearance at Miami; her best result here came last year with a QF run (d. No.3 Coco Gauff and No.20 Ekaterina Alexandrova en route before losing to No.7 Jasmine Paolini in QFs)
- Career-best results at the WTA 1000 level are two QF runs at Miami 2025 (l. Jasmine Paolini) and Wuhan 2024 (l. Coco Gauff)
- Owns 7 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently defeated No.4 Jessica Pegula at Cincinnati 2025
- 2 of her 3 career WTA titles have come on hard court at Hua Hin 2020 and Bronx 2019
- Best result so far this season are two QF runs at Auckland (l. Alexandra Eala) and Hobart (l. eventual finalist Iva Jovic)
- Eight of her 11 Tour-level match wins so far this season have gone to a third set

#### ***Swiatek:***

- Making 5th appearance at Miami, she is a former champion here winning the title in 2022 (d. Naomi Osaka in F); last year she made the quarterfinals (l. WC Alexandra Eala)
- Holds 11 WTA 1000 trophies, winning one last year at Cincinnati (d. Jasmine Paolini in F)
- In 2022 she became one of four female players to have completed the Sunshine Double along with Steffi Graf (1994, 1996), Kim Clijsters (2005) and Victoria Azarenka (2016)
- Has gone undefeated in her last 73 opening matches; her last such defeat was to Sakkari at 2021 WTA Finals
- Owns 11-1 record so far this season against players ranked outside the Top 20; with only loss coming against No.52 Sakkari at Doha
- Best result by Poland at Miami was Champion run by Iga Swiatek in 2022 and Agnieszka Radwanska in 2012
- Best results so far this season are three QF showings at Australian Open (l. eventual champion Elena Rybakina), Doha (l. Maria Sakkari) and Indian Wells (l. Elina Svitolina)

#### **[8] Mirra Andreeva (#10) vs. McCartney Kessler (USA #51)**

**Kessler leads 1-0**

#### ***Andreeva:***

- Making 2nd appearance at Miami, on her previous appearance in 2025 she reached R32 (l. Amanda Anisimova)
- Owns two WTA 1000 titles which she won back-to-back last year at Dubai (d. Clara Tauson in F) and Indian Wells (d. Aryna Sabalenka in F)
- Her 2025 Dubai title made her the youngest WTA 1000 champion since this tournament tier began in 2009
- Contesting her 22nd career WTA 1000 main draw; career record in opening matches at WTA 1000 events stands at 17-4, last losing to Laura Siegemund at Wuhan 2025
- Holds a 12-5 win-loss record so far this year, with top result of 2026 being Adelaide title run (d. Victoria Mboko in final)

#### ***Kessler:***

- Making 2nd appearance at Miami, on her previous appearance in 2025 she reached R32 (l. Emma Raducanu)
- Career-best results at WTA 1000 level are three R16 showings all coming in 2025 at Dubai (l. Karolina Muchova), Montreal (l. Marta Kostyuk) and Beijing (l. Eva Lys)
- Owns 2 career wins over Top 10 players, most recent was win over today's opponent No.5 Mirra Andreeva at Montreal 2025; her first Top 10 win came against No.3 Coco Gauff at Dubai 2025
- Two of her three career WTA titles have come on hard court at Hobart 2025 and Cleveland 2024
- Best result so far this season is QF run at Abu Dhabi (l. Clara Tauson)

**First meeting**

##### ***Parks:***

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Miami, where her tournament-best result is 2nd round last year (d. Varvara Gracheva in 1st round, l. Leylah Fernandez)
- She is 1-1 at Tour-level this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (d. No.169 Elina Avanesyan at Ostrava; l. No.136 Himeno Sakatsume at Indian Wells)
- Seeking first Tour-level win since defeating No.21 Shnaider in 2026 Doha 1st round (0-3 at Tour-level since then)
- Best result of 2026 so far is quarterfinal run at Ostrava (d. Grabher and Avanesyan, l. fellow American Volynets)

##### ***Kraus:***

- Making her Miami tournament debut; she is also making her first career appearance in a WTA 1000 main draw
- Career-best Tour-level result on hard court is her R16 finish at 2026 Auckland (as qualifier, d. fellow Austrian Julia Grabher in 1r, l. Francesca Jones in R16)
- Made her Top 100 debut at No.99 on February 23, 2026, which is her career-high ranking (currently ranked No.120)
- Best result by an Austrian woman at Miami was runner-up finish by Judith Wiesner in 1990 (l. Monica Seles in F)

#### **Francesca Jones (GBR #93) vs. [WC] Venus Williams (USA #517)**

**First meeting**

##### ***Jones:***

- Making her Miami Open tournament debut
- Contesting in her third WTA 1000 main draw after Indian Wells 2026 and Madrid 2025; bidding for first WTA 1000 main draw win today
- Has fallen in the opening round at her last 3 consecutive events and is seeking her first match win since reaching the QFs at Auckland 2026, where she recorded maiden Top 20 victory over No. 15 Navarro en route
- Best career result on hard court is SF run at Sao Paulo 2025 (l. Janice Tjen); has also reached a SF on clay at Bogota 2023 (l. eventual champion Tatjana Maria)
- Best result by Great Britain at Miami was title run by Johanna Konta in 2017

##### ***Williams:***

- Making 23rd appearance at Miami, she is a three-time champion here, winning titles in 2001, 1999 and 1998
- Is one of six players from USA to win the title here at Miami; alongside Danielle Collins, Sloane Stephens, Serena Williams, Monica Seles and Chris Evert
- She is the oldest WTA 1000 title winner, claiming the trophy at Wuhan 2015 at 35 years old. The next oldest is Serena Williams, who won Rome 2016 at the age of 34
- The seven-time singles Grand Slam champion owns 49 career WTA titles, 31 of which have come on hard court
- Has lost her last seven consecutive matches against Top 100 players, most recent was to No.74 Ajla Tomljanovic at Austin 2026
- Since the tier format's introduction in 1990, Venus Williams (110) has made the most Tier I/WTA 1000 event appearances among American players

**First meeting**

#### ***Brady:***

- Making 4th appearance at Miami, she returns to the tournament for the first time since 2021 and is seeking her first career match win at the event after three previous 1r exits
- Career-best results at the WTA 1000 level are three R16 showings at Madrid 2021 (l. Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova), Beijing 2019 (l. Bianca Andreescu) and Dubai 2019 (l. eventual finalist Petra Kvitova)
- Her 1r loss at Indian Wells earlier this month (l. Antonia Ruzic) marked her first Tour-level match since Beijing 2023 after suffering from a serious knee injury
- Has one career title which came on hard court at Lexington 2020 (d. Jil Teichmann in F). She also finished Runner-up at the 2021 Australian Open (l. Naomi Osaka in F)
- Best results by wild cards at Miami are SF runs by Alexandra Eala in 2025, Victoria Azarenka in 2018 and Justine Henin in 2010

#### ***Stephens:***

- The former champion is set for her 13th appearance at Miami, having won the title in 2018 (d. Jelena Ostapenko in final)
- Her trophy run here in 2018 is her career-best WTA 1000 result; she also reached the final at Montreal 2018 (l. Simona Halep in final)
- The 2017 US Open champion owns eight career WTA titles, six of which have come on hard court
- One of six Americans to win the title here alongside Danielle Collins, Serena Williams, Venus Williams, Monica Seles and Chris Evert
- Seeking her first main draw match win of the 2026 season after 1r exits at Auckland, Australian Open and Indian Wells. She won three qualifying matches at Australian Open to reach 1r (l. Karolina Pliskova)
- Closing in on a milestone 100 wins at WTA 1000 level, she currently sits on 98 victories

## CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakout 2025 season saw her break into the Top 100 after SF run at WTA 1000 Miami; as a wild card she registered back-to-back Top 10 wins over No.5 Keys and No.2 Swiatek. Went on to reach maiden Tour final at Eastbourne and then won her first WTA 125 title Guadalajara. Her year-end ranking was a career high No.50
- Following her Miami 2025 result, she made history by becoming the first player from the Philippines to reach a WTA 1000 semifinal and the first to enter the WTA World Top 100 ranking
- In 2024 made 2r at WTA 1000 Madrid (l. Cirstea) as well as playing main draw at Abu Dhabi, Guadalajara, Wuhan, Guangzhou and Jiujiang. Earned fourth ITF career title at W100 Vitoria-Gasteiz and reached a career high ranking of No.143 in July
- Entered first Grand Slam in 2023 at Australian Open qualifying (l. Doi in Q1). As a qualifier reached main draw at Hua Hin (l. Maria), Osaka (l. Sakatsume), Guangzhou (l. Maria) and Monastir (l. Mertens) taking her ranking into Top 200 for first time
- Claimed first ITF title in 2022 at Chiang Rai \$25K and also played WTA Miami opening main draw match (l. Brengle) and qualifying at Madrid (l. Bondar).
- In 2021 played first Tour level match at Miami qualifying (l. Kuzmova) and reached 2r at Cluj Napoca on clay (l. Sherif).
- Best result of 2021 was reaching QF at Grenoble \$25K
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2020 at the age of 14
- Highlights of 2025 included reaching second Grand Slam QF of her career at Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka) and posting her best career WTA 1000 result with QF at Wuhan (l. eventual champion Gauff). In doubles, won 16th Tour title at Nottingham with Haddad Maia
- Best results of 2024 came in the second half of the season achieving runner-up at Hua Hin 2 and reaching semifinal at Jiujiang. Also made quarterfinals across the season at Adelaide, Bogota and Rabat
- 2023 season highlights include a final in Warsaw (l. Swiatek) and a QF at Zhengzhou (l. Paolini) and Nanchang (l. Siniakova)
- Ended her 2023 singles season ranked at No.86
- In the 2023 season reached a doubles career-high of No.5 and lifted doubles title at the WTA Finals (w/Zvonareva)
- Best result of 2022 was QF run at Stuttgart (as WC, l. Samsonova)



## CAREER MILESTONES

- Played her first tournament since Beijing 2023 at Austin 2026 where she competed in qualifying
- Returned to WTA Tour at 2023 Washington DC after two years out with right foot injuries - made 2r (l. Keys). Made further 2r appearances at Montreal (l. Rybakina) and Beijing (l. Linette) with best comeback result achieved at US Open with 3r (l. Wozniacki) also during her comeback month on Tour).
- Reached debut Grand Slam singles final at 2021 Australian Open (l. Osaka)  
Posted career-best US Open result in 2020 by reaching SF (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s) had not dropped a set through first five rounds including wins over fellow Top 50 players Garcia, Kerber and Putintseva. Was first former college player to reach US Open SF since Lori McNeil in 1987
