- This will be the 41st edition of the women's singles at the Miami Open, since its inaugural edition in 1985. Martina Navratilova was the winner of the inaugural tournament
- 19 different women have won the singles title at Miami. Aside from Serena Williams who has won a record eight singles titles, followed by Stefanie Graf (5), Venus Williams (3) and Victoria Azarenka (3)
- The title has been won 12 times by the current WTA No.1 ranked player and 33 times by a player who held the No.1 ranking at some point during their career. Of the former champions at Miami, only five have not held the No.1 ranking: Gabriela Sabatini (1989), Svetlana Kuznetsova (2006), Agnieszka Radwanska (2012), Johanna Konta (2017), Sloane Stephens (2018), Petra Kvitova (2023) and Danielle Collins (2024)
- The final has featured the Top 2 seeds seven times (1985, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1993, 2000, 2014) with the top seed winning six of those finals; the No.1 seed has won the final 14 times overall
- An American has won the singles title 15 times, with the last of these coming in 2024 (Collins)
- No player has more match wins at the Miami Open than Serena Williams, winning 76 matches while 57 of those have come in straight sets, which is also the most in women's singles history.
- At 16y 113d, Monica Seles (1990) remains the youngest winner of the women's singles at the Miami Open, since the event's inauguration in 1985. Seles (1990-91) is one of four players to win the event before turning 18 along with Steffi Graf (1987), Martina Hingis (1997) and Venus Williams (1998).
- At 33y 190d, Serena Williams (2015) remains the oldest winner of the women's singles at the Miami Open, since the event's inauguration in 1985. Williams is one of only two players to win the event after turning 33, along with 2023 winner, Petra Kvitova.
- Steffi Graf (1987) and Martina Hingis (2000) have dropped the least games on the way to tournament victory, dropping 21 games each over the course of respective tournaments.
- Venus Williams will be making her 23rd appearance at Miami after receiving a wildcard. At 45 years old, Williams is a three-time tournament champion in Miami (1998, 1999, 2001).

ABOUT WTA 1000 LEVEL

The WTA 1000 level was introduced in 2009 – originally as Premier Mandatory and Premier 5. Miami is the 150th staging of a WTA 1000 overall. There are 10 WTA 1000 tournaments in 2026 – Doha, Dubai, Indian Wells, Miami, Madrid, Rome, Montreal, Cincinnati, Beijing and Wuhan.

Since the level was introduced, 49 different players have won a WTA 1000 titles led by Serena Williams (13), Iga Swiatek (11), Victoria Azarenka (10), Aryna Sabalenka (10) Simona Halep (9) and Petra Kvitova (9).

Eight of the 49 total WTA-1000 event winners have done so while holding the WTA #1 ranking since 2009, with Serena Williams (11) claiming the most such titles.

This year, the first three WTA 1000 titles have been won by Karolina Muchova (Doha), Jessica Pegula (Dubai) and Sabalenka (Indian Wells).

Victoria Azarenka (209) has claimed the most main draw match wins of any player at WTA-1000 events, and remains the only player in the format's history to have claimed 200+ wins, with Simona Halep (186) claiming the next-most.

Since the format's introduction in 2009, Serena Williams (84.1%, 148-28) holds the best win rate of any player at WTA-1000 events, with Iga Swiatek (80.2%, 130-32) currently the best among active players – minimum 25 matches.

Out of the previous 149 WTA-1000 events since 2009, 22 have been won by unseeded players – Maria Sharapova (Tokyo 2009) was the first to achieve the feat, with Victoria Mboko (Montreal 2025) the latest.

Since the format's introduction in 2009, Victoria Mboko (#89, Montreal 2025) is the lowest-ranked player to win a WTA-1000, and is one of six players ranked outside the WTA top 50 to achieve the feat.

Since the format's introduction in 2009, seven players have claimed tournament victory at WTA-1000 events as teenagers – Mirra Andreeva (17 years, 293 days) became the youngest with tournament victory in Dubai last season.

Since 2009, Bianca Andreescu (Indian Wells and Toronto 2019) and Mirra Andreeva (Dubai and Indian Wells 2025) are the only two players to win multiple WTA-1000 titles as teenagers.

Eleven players aged 30+ have claimed tournament victory at a WTA-1000 event in the format's history – Venus Williams (35 years, 103 days) remains the oldest to achieve the feat with tournament victory in Wuhan in 2015.
