## MATCH NOTES – DAY 1 - SUNDAY, MAY 24

### *Tribute to Howard Fendrich*

The WTA was deeply saddened by the sudden passing of veteran tennis writer Howard Fendrich (Associated Press) following a short health battle.

Howard dedicated more than two decades to covering tennis around the world with exceptional professionalism, integrity and passion. Since starting at AP in 1994, he stepped up the AP's lead tennis writer in 2002, and quickly became one of our sport's most respected and recognisable voices, known for his tireless work ethic, thoughtful reporting and commitment to asking important questions with fairness and care.

Leading the tributes, Jessica Pegula, WTA World No.5 and member of the WTA Players' Council, said: "Howard was one of the most respected journalists in our sport and someone players trusted because he always approached his work with honesty, professionalism and fairness. He cared deeply about tennis and the people within it, and his presence in our media rooms and at tournaments around the world will be greatly missed. On behalf of the Players' Council and all WTA athletes, we send our condolences to his family, friends and colleagues."

### **[8] Mirra Andreeva (#8) vs. [WC] Fiona Ferro (FRA #200)**

**Andreeva leads 1-0**

#### ***Andreeva:***

- Making 4th appearance at Roland Garros; her best result at the tournament is a semifinal finish in 2024 (l. Paolini) and she also reached the quarterfinals here last year (l. wild card Boisson)
- Made her Grand Slam debut here in 2023, where she made a run to the 3r as a qualifier (l. Gauff)
- Contesting her 13th Grand Slam main draw; semifinal run here in 2024 is her best career result at a Grand Slam
- Career record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 11-1, only losing in the first round at 2024 Wimbledon (l. B. Fruhvirtova)
- Two of her 5 career WTA singles titles have come on clay: 2024 Iasi (d. Avanesyan in F via ret.) and 2026 Linz (d. Potapova in F)
- Her record on clay so far this season is 15-3; including a title run at Linz, SF at Stuttgart, R-Up at Madrid and QF at Rome. She leads the Tour for most match wins on clay in 2026
- Has won 29 matches so far this year; she is currently second on Tour for match wins, only behind Rybakina (30)

#### ***Ferro:***

- This is her 11th main draw appearance at Roland Garros with her best result in 2020 with R16 (l. eventual finalist Kenin)
- Contesting 21st career Grand Slam main draw; her R16 showing here in 2020 is her best Grand Slam result
- Career-record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 7-13; has lost her last six consecutive Grand Slam opening matches, last making a major 2r at 2021 US Open
- She is 0-5 in her career vs. Top 10 players, most recent meeting was loss to No.4 Badosa at 2022 Roland Garros
- Owns two career WTA titles, both won on clay at 2020 Palermo and 2019 Lausanne
- Best result by a wild card at Roland Garros was semifinal by Lois Boisson in 2025
- Won a WTA 125 title on clay earlier this season at Oeiras #2

## [Q] Sinja Kraus (AUT #101) vs. [11] Belinda Bencic (SUI #11)

First meeting

### **Kraus:**

- Making her Roland Garros main draw debut after falling in qualifying in 2023, 2024 and 2025
- Also making her Grand Slam main draw debut after falling in 12 previous Grand Slam qualifying events
- Has faced Top 20 players twice in BJK Cup ties; losing to No.18 Ostapenko in 2022 and No.3 Pegula in 2023. This is her first career Tour-level meeting against a Top 20 player
- Best career results on clay are R16 finishes at 2025 Hamburg and 2023 Bogota
- Best result by a qualifier at Roland Garros is SF by Nadia Podoroska in 2020
- During this year's clay court swing so far, fell in 1r at Linz (as a WC, l. Cirstea), Madrid (as a qualifier, l. Pliskova) and Rome (as a qualifier, l. Cocciaretto)

### **Bencic:**

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros; she returns to Paris for the first time since 2023 where she fell in the opening round (lucky loser Avanesyan)
- Career-best results at Roland Garros are two 3r showings in 2022 (l. Fernandez) and 2019 (l. Vekic)
- Contesting her 38th Grand Slam main draw; she is a two-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, reaching the semifinals at 2025 Wimbledon and 2019 US Open
- Career record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 30-7, she has won her last six consecutive Grand Slam opening matches, last losing to lucky loser Avanesyan in the 1r here in 2023
- One of her 10 career WTA titles has come on clay at Charleston 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)
- Her win over Yastremska in the opening round at Charleston in March marked her 300th career Tour-level win, she is one of only 14 active players to achieve this feat

## [15] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #15) vs. Oksana Selekhmeteva (#88)

First meeting

### **Kostyuk:**

- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best result was R16 in 2021 (l. Swiatek)
- Her best career result across all majors is quarterfinal at Australian Open 2024 (l. Gauff)
- Coming off winning back-to-back titles at Rouen (d. Podrez in F) and Madrid (d. M. Andreeva in F), she is the only player undefeated so far this season on clay court on Tour (11-0)
- Only M.Andreeva (15) has claimed more clay court Tour wins than Marta Kostyuk (11) in 2026
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 in 2026 stands at 10-1, with the sole loss to No.88 Jacquemot at Australian Open 2026
- Is currently ranked at a career-high of No.15

### **Selekhmeteva:**

- Making 3rd appearance at Roland Garros
- Has made main draw appearances at all majors, with the best result coming at Australian Open 2026 where she made 3r (l. Pegula); she is yet to win a main draw match at the other three Slams
- Her best career win by ranking is defeating No.26 Badosa at Australian Open 2026
- Best career result on clay is quarterfinal at Prague 2024 (l. Samson)
- Is looking to her first career Top 20 win and first main draw win on clay of 2026 season

## [WC] Ksenia Efremova (FRA #625) vs. [18] Sorana Cirstea (ROU #18)

First meeting

### ***Efremova:***

- Making tournament debut at Roland Garros, as a wildcard
- Today marks the first Grand Slam main draw match of her career; fell in 1r of qualifying at 2025 Roland Garros and 2026 Australian Open
- This is the first meeting of her career against a player ranked inside the Top 50
- Looking to earn her first Tour-level match draw match win today; she won her first and only WTA qualifying match this season over Lulu Sun at Madrid
- The 17 year old will become the third player born since 2009 to appear in a women's singles main draw at a Grand Slam event (after Julieta Pareja and Hannah Klugman) and the first to do so at Roland Garros
- Currently ranked No.1 in the World Tennis Tour Junior Rankings; she won the junior girls' Australian Open title this year

### ***Cirstea:***

- Making 17th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching QF in 2009 (l. Stosur)
- Contesting in her 67th Grand Slam main draw, she is a two-time major quarterfinalist; reaching the QFs at US Open 2023 (l. eventual finalist Muchova) and 2009 Roland Garros (l. Stosur)
- One of her 4 career WTA singles titles has come on clay: 2021 Istanbul (d. Mertens in F)
- Lost the two matches she played in Grand Slam main draw matches against players under the age of 18: Amanda Anisimova at Wimbledon 2019 and Coco Gauff at US Open 2020
- Looking to win a Roland Garros main draw match for the first time since 2022 when she reached 2r (l. Stephens)
- Is currently competing at a career-high ranking of No.18 after becoming the oldest player to make her Top 20 debut this week

## [26] Hailey Baptiste (USA #26) vs. Barbora Krejcikova (CZE #42)

Tied 1-1

### ***Baptiste:***

- Making 5th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best and most recent result was reaching 4r in 2025 (l. Keys)
- Competing in her 12th career Grand Slam main draw with her 4r run at Roland Garros last season still her best result to date
- Has hit the most aces on clay so far this season in Tour level main draw matches (66)
- One of three players to defeat World No.1 Sabalenka this season (in QF at Madrid), along with Rybakina (Australian Open final) and Cirstea (3r at Rome)
- Best career result on clay came at 2026 Madrid, advancing to the semifinal (l. M.Andreeva)
- Won the only Tour level meeting against Krejcikova at Wuhan 2024 (Krejcikova defeated Baptiste at ITF level in 2019)

### ***Krejcikova:***

- 2021 Roland Garros champion is making her 8th appearance here; she also won the doubles title that year for a second time after 2018 (both w/Siniakova)
- One of the two current players with a title at both Roland Garros and Wimbledon, along with Iga Swiatek
- 2026 Roland Garros marks her 24th main draw appearance at a Grand Slam
- Two of her 8 career titles have come on clay court: 2021 Roland Garros & 2021 Strasbourg
- Played her first clay court event of the season at Rome (l. Sabalenka in 2r) after being sidelined by left thigh injury following Dubai; also played WTA 125 Parma where she reached the final (l. Yastremska)
- Looking for her second Top 50 win of the season today after defeating No.32 Maya Joint at United Cup

## Sofia Kenin (USA #87) vs. Peyton Stearns (USA #92)

**Stearns leads 1-0**

### ***Kenin:***

- In her 7<sup>th</sup> Roland Garros main draw, she reached the final here in 2020 (l. Swiatek in F); also reached 4r in 2019 (l. Barty) and 2021 (l. Sakkari)
- Owns one Grand Slam title, winning Australian Open in 2020 (d. Muguruza in F)
- At Roland Garros, Kenin is 4-1 against players from USA with only loss to Keys in 2025 (previous wins include defeating Serena Williams in 3r in 2019)
- Best career result on clay is R-Up which she has reached twice: Charleston in 2025 and Roland Garros in 2020
- Has won 3 matches so far in 2026 with two of those achieved on clay at Charleston and Madrid

### ***Stearns:***

- Making 4th appearance at Roland Garros, where she has reached R32 on two occasions in 2023 (l. Kastakina) and 2024 (l. M.Andreeva)
- This is her 14th Grand Slam main draw and her best result is 4r which she made at 2023 US Open (l. Vondrousova)
- Stearns and Kenin meet in the 1r at a Grand Slam for the second time in a row after Stearns defeated Kenin in 1r at Australian Open this year
- Her career record in Grand Slam 1r matches is 6-7
- Record against players from United States of America stands at 3-3 in 2026 including defeating Kenin in 1r at Australian Open and defeating Taylor Townsend in final at Austin
- Has won 14 matches so far in 2026 including winning the second title of her career at Austin

## Francesca Jones (GBR #105) vs. Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #78)

**Haddad Maia leads 2-0**

### ***Jones:***

- Making Roland Garros main draw debut; she has now made main draw at all four majors
- Contesting 7th career Grand Slam main draw; she is looking to reach the 2r of a Grand Slam for the first time in her career
- Career-record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 0-6, most recently losing in the 1r at 2026 Australian Open (l. qualifier Klimovicova)
- Seeking her first Tour-level match win since defeating Venus Williams at Miami in March
- Best career result on clay is semifinal at 2023 Bogota (l. eventual champion Maria)
- Has won 3 Tour-level matches so far this season; her best result so far is QF at Auckland (l. Wang Xinyu), has only won one Tour-level match since this QF showing

### ***Haddad Maia:***

- Has defeated today's opponent Jones at two ITF events in 2021
- Making 6th appearance at Roland Garros, she reached the semifinals here in 2023 (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Contesting 24th Grand Slam main draw; her SF finish here in 2023 is her best result at a major
- Career-record in Grand Slam opening matches stands at 16-7, most recently she lost in the 1r at 2026 Australian Open (l. Putintseva)
- Seeking first Tour-level match win of her 2026 season today (currently 0-9 in 2026 Tour-level main draw matches)
- Best career results on clay are SF runs at 2025 Strasbourg, 2023 Roland Garros and 2019 Bogota

**Katie Volynets (USA #108) vs. [WC] Clara Burel (FRA #1483)**

**First meeting**

***Volynets:***

- Making her 5th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching 2r in 2024 and 2022
- She is contesting her 14th straight main draw at a Grand Slam, dating back to the Australian Open in 2023
- Second meeting versus a player from France at a Grand Slam (l. No.5 Caroline Garcia at Wimbledon in 2023)
- First time facing a wild card at a Grand Slam (1-8 in her Tour-level career against wild cards)
- Has won the first set in five of her six career victories at Grand Slams

***Burel:***

- Contesting her 6th main draw at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching the Round of 32 in 2020 (tied for her best result at a Grand Slam: Australian Open in 2024 and US Open in 2023 and 2022)
- Making her first appearance at a main draw of a WTA Tour event since Wuhan in October 2024. She was ranked 55th at that time
- Lowest ranked player from France to appear in the women's singles main draw of Roland Garros this century
- Owns a 3-0 record against players from United States of America at Grand Slams
- Seeking her first Tour-level victory since Beijing in 2024

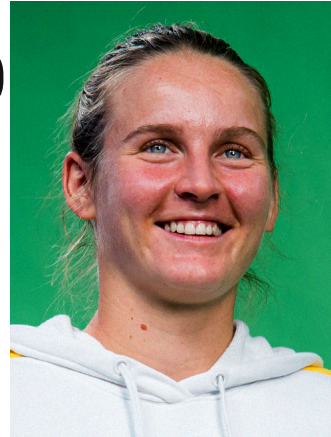
