QUARTERFINAL QUICK HITS

Sabalenka has made the semifinals at each of the last six Grand Slam events (since the US Open 2024) and could become the first player to make this stage at 7+ consecutive women's singles Grand Slam events since Serena Williams (10 in a row between the US Open 2014 and the Australian Open 2017).

With a win in the quarterfinals, it would be Aryna Sabalenka's 400th career win in Tour-level matches and she would join Venus Williams, Victoria Azarenka, Vera Zvonareva, Elina Svitolina, Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova and Karolina Pliskova as the only active players to surpass the 400+ career win mark.

Of the remaining six players in the draw, only Sabalenka has reached a Grand Slam final.

Maja Chwalinska is the first qualifier to reach the women's singles quarterfinals at Roland Garros since 2020 (Nadia Podorska and Martina Trevisan), and the first at any Grand Slam event since Lulu Sun at Wimbledon 2024. With a win, Chwalinska could equal the best result achieved by a qualifier in women's singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era (SF by Nadia Podoroska in 2020).

Two left-handed players (Maja Chwalinska and Diana Shnaider) have made the quarterfinals in a women's singles Grand Slam event for the first time since 2022 Roland Garros (Martina Trevisan and Leylah Fernandez).

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Making 9th consecutive main draw appearance at Roland Garros, with her best result coming last year with run to the final (l. Gauff)
- She also made the SF here in 2023 (l. Muchova) and the QF in 2024 (l. Andreeva)
- Overall, this is her 32nd Grand Slam main draw appearance; she is a four-time major champion, lifting the titles at Australian Open (2023-24) and US Open (2024-25)
- Seeking her 15th career Grand Slam semifinal; she holds a 13-1 record in Grand Slam QF matches (plus one advancement via walkover), with the one loss coming to M. Andreeva at 2024 Roland Garros
- She is 12-1 so far this season vs. Top 25 players, losing only to No.5 Rybakina in the Australian Open final
- Current PIF WTA World No.1; she will remain at No.1 after Roland Garros
- She has won a Tour-leading three WTA singles titles in 2026, at Brisbane, and the Sunshine Double of Indian Wells and Miami
- Her 3r win here saw her become the ninth player since the inception of the WTA Rankings to claim 100+ wins as World No.1 after Navratilova, Graf, Evert, S. Williams, Hingis, Seles, Swiatek and Henin
- Could become the first woman to make the semifinal stage at 7+ consecutive Grand Slam events since Serena Williams (10 in a row between 2014 US Open and 2017 Australian Open)
- Seeking the 400th Tour-level win of her career today

Shnaider:

- Making 4th appearance at Roland Garros; she is through to the QF here for the first time in her career after 2r runs in 2025 (l. Yastremska) and 2023 (l. Haddad Maia), and a 1r exit in 2024 (l. WC Paquet)
- Contesting 12th career Grand Slam main draw and has reached a Grand Slam QF for the first time (previously 0-1 in Grand Slam 4r matches, l. eventual R-Up Pegula at 2024 US Open)
- Looking to reach her first career Grand Slam semifinal today
- Has notched 1 career win over a Top 10 player, defeating No.2 Coco Gauff at 2024 Toronto (0-1l vs. Top 10 players since then)
- This is her first career meeting vs. a reigning World No.1
- Attempting to reach her 2nd SF of the year; her best tournament finish so far this season is SF at Adelaide on hard court (l. eventual champion M. Andreeva)
- Holds a 9-4 clay-court record so far this year, also making Charleston QF (l. eventual champion Pegula), Stuttgart R16 (l. eventual champion Rybakina), Madrid R32 (l. Bencic), and Rome R32 (l. Osaka)
- One of her 5 career WTA titles was won on clay at Budapest 2024 (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Two left-handed women (Shnaider and Maja Chwalinska) have made QF at a Grand Slam event for the first time since 2022 Roland Garros (Martina Trevisan and Leylah Fernandez)

First meeting

Kalinskaya:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Roland Garros; she is through to the quarterfinals here for the first time after 2r run in 2024 (d. Burel in 1r, l. Andreescu in 2r), and 1r exits in 2025, 2022 and 2020
- She had only won 1 main draw match at Roland Garros prior to this year
- Contesting her 22nd career Grand Slam main draw; she is through to the second Grand Slam QF of her career after 2024 Australian Open (l. eventual R-Up Zheng Qinwen)
- Looking to reach her first career Grand Slam semifinal today
- Career record in Grand Slam matches against qualifiers stands at 3-1, most recent was win over Stojanovic at 2025 Wimbledon. Her loss came against Osorio at 2021 Wimbledon
- She has now equaled her best career result on clay after also reaching the quarterfinals at Charleston (2023, 2025 and 2026) and Strasbourg (2025)
- Prior to Roland Garros, her best tournament finishes this year were QF showings at Doha (l. eventual champion Muchova) and Charleston (l. Jovic)
- Came back from 4-1 down in the third-set match tiebreak against Potapova in the 4r, winning nine of the final 12 points to reach her first Roland Garros QF

Chwalinska:

- Making 1st main draw appearance at Roland Garros (fell in qualifying in 2021, 2023 and 2025)
- Contesting the 3rd Grand Slam main draw of her career; she has reached a Grand Slam QF for the first time in her career
- Her previous Grand Slam main draw showings were 2025 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. 1r to Niemeier) and 2022 Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Siniakova in 1r, l. 2r to Riske-Amritraj)
- She is through to her second career Tour-level quarterfinal after 2026 Cluj-Napoca (as a qualifier, l. eventual finalist Raducanu). Cluj-Napoca was her only other Tour-level main draw showing this year
- Owns 2 career wins over Top 50 players, both coming during this year's Roland Garros - defeated No.21 Mertens in the 2r and No.49 Sakkari in the 3r
- Chwalinska is the 4th Polish player in the Open Era to reach a Grand Slam QF after Radwanska, Swiatek and Linette. She is looking to become the 2nd player from Poland to reach Roland Garros SF after Swiatek
- Bidding to equal the best result achieved by a qualifier at Roland Garros in the Open Era, which is Nadia Podoroska's SF run in 2020
- Best career Tour-level result on clay is this year's run at 2026 Roland Garros; prior to this year's event she had only won 2 Tour-level matches on clay in her career
- Has won 3 clay-court WTA 125 titles in her career, including at Oeiras in April of this year

- Sabalenka first attained the World No.1 ranking on September 11, 2023 and has held it for an overall total of 93 weeks (including weeks of May 25 & June 1, 2026 during Roland Garros)
- Defeated Jessica Bouzas Maneiro, Elsa Jacquemot, Daria Kasatkina and No.16 seed Naomi Osaka so far this fortnight, making her 4th straight Roland Garros QF
- Faces No.23 Diana Shnaider in QF today; she is 12-1 so far this season vs. Top 25 players, losing only to No.5 Rybakina in Australian Open final
- 3 of her 24 career WTA singles titles have come on clay, all at Madrid in 2021, 2023 and 2025
- She has won a Tour-leading 3 WTA singles titles in 2026, at Brisbane, and the Sunshine Double of Indian Wells and Miami
