MATCH NOTES – DAY 2 - MONDAY, MAY 25

Veronika Erjavec (SLO #84) vs. [2] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2)

First meeting

Erjavec:

- Making her main draw debut at 2026 Roland Garros after falling in qualifying here in 2024 and 2025
- This is her fourth career Grand Slam main draw appearance, having lost in the 1r at Australian Open in 2025 (as a qualifier, I. Lamens) and 2026 (I. Frech), and reaching the 2r at 2025 Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Kostyuk, I. Collins)
- Contesting 3rd Tour-level main draw of her 2026 season after 1r exits at Australian Open and Cluj-Napoca
- First time facing a Top 10 player in her career
- At Tour-level on clay so far this year, fell in qualifying at Madrid and Rome
- Reached the final at Huzhou WTA 125 event on clay last month (I. Kawa in F)

Rybakina:

- Making 8th consecutive appearance at Roland Garros; she has reached the QF stage here twice, in 2021 (I. eventual R-Up Pavlyuchenkova) and 2024 (I. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- Made her Grand Slam debut here at Roland Garros in 2019 (as a qualifier, I. Siniakova in 1r)
- Contesting 27th career Grand Slam main draw; she is a two-time major champion, winning 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F) and 2026 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Career-record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 23-3; she hasn't lost a Grand Slam 1r since 2022 US Open (I. Burel), and hasn't lost an opening match in her last 25 consecutive Tour-level events played
- Owns 9-2 record on clay so far this season, including claiming 6th career title on clay at Stuttgart (d. Muchova in F)
- Has won 30 matches so far this season, she leads the Tour for most match wins

[3] Iga Swiatek (POL #3) vs. [WC] Emerson Jones (AUS #136)

First meeting

Swiatek:

- Four-time champion here in Paris, lifting the title in 2020 (d. Kenin), 2022 (d. Gauff), 2023 (d. Muchova) and 2024 (d. Paolini)
- Was the first player since Henin from 2005-07 to win three Roland Garros titles in a row
- Record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 27-1, only loss came at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic)
- Contesting her 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance; she owns two further major titles, at 2022 US Open (d. Jabeur in F) and 2025 Wimbledon (d. Anisimova in F)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)
- At Grand Slam level – in both main draw and qualifying – has never lost to a player ranked outside the Top 100

Jones:

- Making her main draw debut appearance at Roland Garros
- Competing in her 3rd Grand Slam main draw, after two 1r exits at Australian Open in 2025 (l. Rybakina) and 2026 (l. Mboko)
- Bidding for fourth Tour-level main draw win today, following victories at 2025 Adelaide (d. Wang Xinyu), 2026 Brisbane (d. Maria) and 2026 Miami (d. L. Fruhvirtova)
- Currently 0-3 vs. Top 10 opposition, losing to No.10 Kasatkina (2025 Adelaide), No.7 Rybakina (2025 Australian Open) and No.8 Svitolina (2026 Miami)
- Seeking to become the youngest player to defeat a Top 5 opponent at a Grand Slam since Mirra Andreeva defeated Aryna Sabalenka at 2024 Roland Garros
- Best result by a wild card at Roland Garros was QF run by Mary Pierce in 2002

[WC] Tiantsoa Rakotomanga Rajaonah (FRA #155) vs. [6] Amanda Anisimova (USA #6) First meeting

Rakotomanga Rajaonah:

- This is her second main draw appearance at Roland Garros after falling in the 1r last year (as a wild card, l. qualifier Romero Gormaz)
- Only other Grand Slam main draw appearance came at 2026 Australian Open (as a WC, l. eventual finalist Sabalenka in 1r)
- Contesting 5th Tour-level main draw of 2026; she is seeking first Tour-level match win since Guangzhou in October 2025
- Won maiden WTA title last season at Sao Paulo (ranked No.214, d. Tjen in F)
- Faces No.6 Amanda Anisimova in 1r today; second time in career facing Top 10 opposition following loss to No.1 Sabalenka at Australian Open earlier this year

Anisimova

- Enjoyed break-out performance here in 2019 when she reached the semifinal aged 17, knocking out defending champion Halep in the quarterfinals before falling to eventual champion Barty
- Made her Grand Slam main draw debut here in 2017, falling in the 1r (as a wild card, l. Nara)
- She is a two-time Grand Slam R-Up, contesting the title match at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Swiatek) and 2025 US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- Owns a 16-8 record in Grand Slam 1r matches, most recent 1r exit was at 2024 US Open (l. Q. Zheng)
- Playing first match today since R16 exit at Miami, withdrawing from Madrid and Rome with a wrist injury

[7] Elina Svitolina (UKR #7) vs. Anna Bondar (HUN #58)

Tied 2-2

Svitolina:

- Making 13th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where she is a 5-time quarterfinalist, most recently last year (l. Swiatek)
 - This is her 49th Grand Slam main draw appearance; she has reached four Grand Slam semifinals, most recently at this year's Australian Open (l. eventual R-Up Sabalenka)
 - Svitolina is undefeated in Roland Garros 1r matches (12-0), only losing 2 sets in that span, to Romina Oprandi in 2013 and Karolina Pliskova in 2024
 - Eight of her 20 career WTA singles titles have come on clay, including WTA 1000 Rome earlier this month (d. Gauff in F) - Svitolina is undefeated in WTA clay-court finals (8-0)
 - Is currently on a 6-match winning streak - the last player to defeat Svitolina is today's opponent Bondar at 2026 Madrid
 - Svitolina defeated Bondar here last year and at 2025 Wimbledon, but Bondar has won their last two meetings at 2025 US Open and 2026 Madrid
- The 17 year old will become the third player born since 2009 to appear in a women's singles main draw at a Grand Slam event (after Julieta Pareja and Hannah Klugman) and the first to do so at Roland Garros

Bondar:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best tournament result is reaching 2r last year (l. today's opponent Svitolina)
- Contesting her 14th career Grand Slam main draw, and holds a 5-8 record in Grand Slam 1r matches (1-2 in Roland Garros 1r matches)
- Earned her first career Top 10 win last month by defeating No.7 Svitolina at WTA 1000 Madrid
- Attempting to become the first woman from Hungary to defeat a Top 10 seed at a Grand Slam since Tímea Babos (d. Vandeweghe at 2018 Australian Open), and the first at Roland Garros since Agnes Szavay in 2009 (d. V. Williams)
- Holds a 9-5 record on clay this year, including QFs at Rouen and Rabat, and R16s at Charleston and WTA 1000 Madrid
- Career-best Tour-level result on clay is R-Up at 2025 Hamburg (l. Boisson in F)

Anastasia Zakharova (#79) vs. [10] Karolina Muchova (CZE #10)

First meeting

Zakharova:

- Making Roland Garros main draw debut; she has now made main draw at all four majors
- Contesting 5th career Grand Slam main draw; her career-best Grand Slam run came on her Grand Slam debut, with a 3r run at 2024 Australian Open (l. Frech)
- Contesting just her 5th career Tour-level main draw on clay; she registered her first career Tour-level win on clay at Rome this year (d. Yastremska in 1r, l. Noskova in 2r)
- Owns 0-3 career record against Top 10 opponents, most recent was loss to No.9 Mboko at 2026 Miami
- Has won 7 matches so far in 2026; her best results are 3r runs at Miami (as a qualifier, l. Mboko) and Dubai (as a qualifier, l. Ruzic)

Muchova:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros; she is a former finalist here, finishing R-Up in 2023 (l. Swiatek in F)
- Contesting her 27th Grand Slam main draw; her run to the final here in 2023 marked her career-best Grand Slam result
- She has also reached a further three Grand Slam semifinals, all on hard court at 2021 Australian Open (l. Brady), 2023 US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff) and 2024 US Open (l. Pegula)
- Career record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 17-9; she was defeated in the first round here last year (l. Parks)
- Owns 9-0 record so far this season vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 50
- She is a 4-time Runner-up on clay; at 2026 Stuttgart, 2024 Palermo, 2023 Roland Garros and 2019 Prague
- 4-2 record during this year's clay court swing so far, this involves reaching her fourth career Tour-level final on clay at Stuttgart (l. Rybakina in F), and an opening round exit at Rome (l. qualifier Potapova)
- Captured her maiden WTA 1000 crown at Doha in February, marking her second Tour-level title and first appearance in a Tour-level final since 2024 Beijing

[13] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #13) vs. Dayana Yastremska (UKR #45)

Paolini leads 6-1

Paolini:

- Yastremska is the opponent that Paolini has claimed the most wins against in her career (six, level with Schmiedlova)
- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros; she is a former finalist here, finishing R-Up in 2024 (l. Swiatek in F)
- Contesting 26th career Grand Slam main draw; she reached back-to-back Grand Slam finals in 2024 at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) and Wimbledon (l. Krejčíková)
- Has won her last nine Grand Slam opening matches; last losing in the 1r of a Grand Slam at 2023 US Open (l. Ostapenko)
- Roland Garros is the tournament that Paolini has won the most main draw matches at in her career (12)
- Won the doubles title here last year (w/Errani), becoming the second all-Italian pair in the Open Era to win the title after Sara Errani and Roberta Vinci in 2012

Yastremska:

- Has defeated today's opponent Paolini once in her career; in the quarterfinals at 2022 Lyon where she finished Runner-Up
- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros; her best tournament result is two 3r showings in 2025 (l. Samsonova) and 2024 (l. Gauff)
- Contesting 25th career Grand Slam main draw; her best result at a major is SF run at 2024 Australian Open (l. Q.Zheng)
- Career-record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 11-13; she has lost her last two Grand Slam opening matches at 2026 Australian Open (l. Ruse) and 2025 US Open (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- She is 2-4 on clay so far this season; with 2r runs at Charleston and Linz, and 1r exits at Madrid and Rome
- For the first time since 2008, 7 players from Ukraine are contesting in a Roland Garros main draw (Yastremska, Svitolina, Snigur, Kostyuk, Starodubtseva, Oliynykova and Kalinina)

Tatjana Maria (GER #52) vs. [23] Elise Mertens (BEL #23)

Mertens leads 2-0

Maria:

- Making 12th appearance at Roland Garros, where her career-best results are 2r finishes in 2017 (l. Halep) and 2016 (l. Cornet)
- Contesting 50th career Grand Slam main draw; her best result at a major is SF run at Wimbledon 2022 (l. Jabeur)
- Owns 32 career wins over Top 50 players, most recently the five consecutive wins over No.30 Fernandez, No.14 Muchova, No.11 Rybakina, No.8 Keys and No.15 Anisimova during title run at 2025 Queen's, London (as qualifier)
- Two of her four singles titles have come on clay at Bogota 2023 (d. Stearns in F) and 2022 (d. Pigossi in F)
- Best result on clay this season is SF run at Rouen (l. eventual champion Kostyuk)

Mertens:

- Making 10th appearance at Roland Garros, where her career-best result here are three R16 finishes in 2018 (l. eventual champion Halep), 2022 (l. Gauff) and 2023 (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Her best result at Grand Slams is SF run at Australian 2018 (l. eventual champion Wozniacki)
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 stands at 9-2 in 2026, most recent was win over No.71 Udvardy at Rome
- Record in 1r matches at Roland Garros stands at 9-1 (31-5 in Grand Slam 1r matches), with her only loss coming against wild card Boisson at Roland Garros 2025
- Owns two singles titles on clay at Rabat and Lugano in 2018

[WC] Leolia Jeanjean (FRA #124) vs. [Q] Kaitlin Quevedo (ESP #127)

First meeting

Jeanjean:

- Making 5th appearance at Roland Garros; her career-best result here came on her main draw debut in 2022 with a run to the R32 (as a wild card, l. Begu)
- Contesting 16th Grand Slam main draw; her 3r run here at Roland Garros in 2022 marked her career-best Grand Slam finish to date
- Best career result on clay is Quarter-Finalist at Bogota in 2025
- During this year's clay court season so far, played 2r at Madrid and Rome (both times as a qualifier), and fell in the 1r at Strasbourg (as a wild card, l. Fernandez)
- Today's winner will face No.7 seed Elina Svitolina or Anna Bondar in 2r

Quevado:

- Making tournament debut at Roland Garros; today also marks her Grand Slam main draw debut
- Contested first career Tour-level event on clay at Madrid this year (as a wild card, d. V. Williams in 1r, l. Baptiste in 2r)
- Competing in just her fourth career Tour-level main draw after 2026 Auckland (made 2r), 2026 Cluj-Napoca (fell in 1r), and 2026 Madrid (made 2r)
- Best result by Spain at Roland Garros was Champion run by Garbiñe Muguruza in 2016 and Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario in 1998, 1994 & 1989
- Is currently ranked at a career-high of No.127, reached in April 2026

- Making her main draw debut at 2026 Roland Garros after falling in qualifying here in 2024 and 2025
- This is her fourth Grand Slam main draw appearance overall, having lost 1r at Australian Open in 2025 (as qualifier, l. Lamens) and 2026 (l. Frech) and reaching the 2r at 2025 Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Kostyuk, l. Collins)
- Contesting 3rd Tour-level main draw of her 2026 season after 1r exits at Australian Open and Cluj-Napoca
- So far during this year's clay court swing at Tour level is coming off falling in qualifying at Madrid and Rome
- Faces No.2 Elena Rybakina in 1r today; First time facing opposition ranked inside the Top 40
- Has defeated both Top 50 players she has faced in career overcoming No.25 Kostyuk at 2025 Wimbledon and No.43 Maria at 2025 Guangzhou
- These remain her only Tour-level main draw wins of career to date
- Only player from Slovenia to begin the 2026 women's main draw
- Is currently ranked at a new career-high of No.84; this time last year was ranked No.174
- Reached the final at Huzhou WTA 125 event on clay last month (l. Kawa in F)

PLAYER NOTES

- Making her eighth consecutive appearance at Roland Garros, and has reached the QF stage twice here in Paris, in 2021 (l. eventual R-Up Pavlyuchenkova) and 2024 (l. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- Her appearance here in 2019 was her Grand Slam main draw debut (as qualifier, fell 1r to Siniakova)
- Overall this is her 27th Grand Slam main draw appearance, she is a two-time Major champion, winning 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F) and 2026 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Has reached one further final, at 2023 Australian Open, and at US Open has made the R16 once in 2025
- Owns a strong record in Grand Slam 1r matches, with current record standing at 23-3. Hasn't lost a Slam 1r match since 2022 US Open. Hasn't lost an opening match overall since 2025 Miami (l. Krueger)
- Enters 2026 Roland Garros with a Grand Slam win-loss record of 66-22
- Currently on a career-high ranking of No.2 which she achieved in March. Can become the new WTA World No.1 this fortnight and overtake Sabalenka. See WTA Preview Notes for full breakdown
- Faces No.84 Veronika Erjavec in 1r today - loss would be worst by ranking since falling to No.85 Mboko at 2025 Montreal. Loss would be worst at a Grand Slam level for almost four years, since losing to No.131 Burel at 2022 US Open
- Owns a perfect 3-0 career record against players from Slovenia
- Five-time clay court champion: Stuttgart in 2026; Strasbourg in 2025; Stuttgart in 2024; Rome in 2023; Bucharest in 2019
- Yulia Putintseva in 2016 and 2018 and Yaroslava Shvedova in 2010 and are the only other Kazakhstan women to reach the QF in Paris
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.11
- Has won 30 matches so far in 2026, the most on the WTA Tour

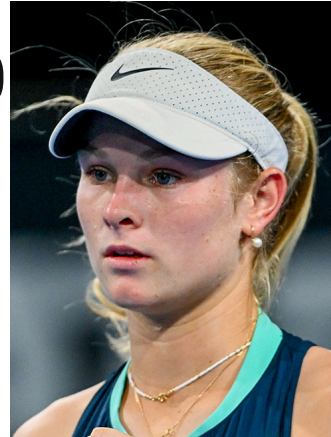

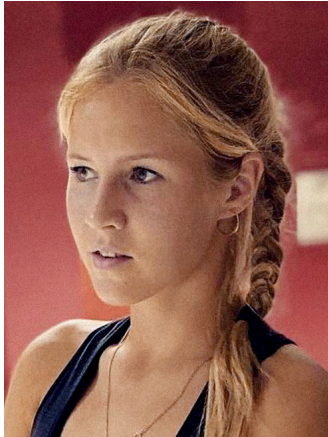
