MATCH NOTES – DAY 3 - TUESDAY, MAY 26

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #50)

Sabalenka leads 2-0

Sabalenka:

- Making 9th consecutive main draw appearance at Roland Garros, with her best result coming last year with run to the final (l. Gauff)
- She also made the SF here in 2023 (l. Muchova) and the QF in 2024 (l. Andreeva)
- Overall this is her 32nd Grand Slam main draw appearance; she is a four-time major champion, lifting the titles at Australian Open (2023-24) and US Open (2024-25)
- The last top seed to lose in the 1r at a Grand Slam was Simona Halep at 2018 US Open (defeated by Kaia Kanepi)
- Only once before has the top seed fallen in the opening round here at Roland Garros - Kerber losing to Makarova in 2017
- 24 of her 27 wins this season have been in straight sets - she is the player with the most main draw matches won in two sets so far this season

Bouzas Maneiro:

- Making 3rd main draw appearance at Roland Garros, her career-best result is 3r run in 2025 (l. Baptiste)
- Best result across the Slams is R16 appearance at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Samsonova)
- Faces No.1 Aryna Sabalenka in 1r today; third time facing the reigning World No.1, following losses to Sabalenka at 2025 Australian Open and 2025 Cincinnati
- Contesting her 10th Grand Slam main draw, and owns a 5-4 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches
- Career-best results on clay are QF runs at 2026 Rabat, 2025 Rabat and 2025 Rouen

[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. Taylor Townsend (USA #75)

Townsend leads 1-0

Gauff:

- Returning to 2026 Roland Garros as the defending champion - lifted the title here last year after defeating World No.1 Sabalenka in the final
- Gauff became the first US woman to win the title here in Paris since Serena Williams in 2015
- 2025 Roland Garros title was her second Grand Slam triumph after winning 2023 US Open (also defeating Sabalenka in F)
- Has suffered four 1r Grand Slam exits in her career, none of which have occurred at Roland Garros. Overall record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 22-4, with her last loss coming at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Yastremska)
- Only 3 times in the Open Era has the defending champion lost in the 1r at Roland Garros - Myskina in 2005 (l. Sanchez Lorenzo), Ostapenko in 2018 (l. Kozlova) and Krejčíková in 2022 (l. Parry).
- Faces No.75 Taylor Townsend in 1r today – she is undefeated in her last three matches vs. American women, last loss coming to Pegula at 2025 WTA Finals

Townsend:

- Making 10th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, her best result here came on her Grand Slam debut in 2014, with a run to the 3r (as a wild card, d. 20th seed Cornet in 2r, l. Suarez Navarro in 3r)
- Has fallen in the 1r on her last four occasions here in Paris, last earning a singles win here in 2018 with a 1r victory over Georges
- Career-best result across the Grand Slams has come at US Open, making the R16 in 2019 (as a qualifier, d. No.4 Halep en route) and 2025 (d. No.5 M.Andreeva en route)
- Holds a 3-15 career record against Top 10 opponents; she is 1-1 on clay against such opponents, losing to No.1 Halep at 2018 Roland Garros and defeating No.3 Pegula at 2023 Rome
- Two-time Grand Slam doubles champion, winning 2024 Wimbledon and 2025 Australian Open (both w/Siniakova)

Kimberly Birrell (AUS #83) vs. [5] Jessica Pegula (USA #5)

Pegula leads 1-0

Birrell:

- Competing in her 3rd Roland Garros main draw, she is bidding for her first win here following 1r exits in 2023 (l. Jeanjean) and 2025 (l. Cristian)
- Overall this is her 14th Grand Slam main draw appearance; with her best result coming at 2019 Australian Open with a run to the 3r (l. Kerber)
- Owns a 3-14 career record across the Slams, with wins coming during 2019 Australian Open (Badosa and Vekic) and also at 2023 Australian Open (Kanepi)
- Has defeated a Top 10 player twice in her career, both achieved at Brisbane with wins over No.8 Emma Navarro in 2025 and No.10 Daria Kasatkina in 2018

Pegula:

- Making 7th Roland Garros main draw appearance; her career-best result here is a QF run in 2022 (l. eventual champion Swiatek); also reached R16 on most recent outing in 2025 (l. wild card Boisson)
- Overall this is her 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance, she has reached at least the quarterfinal stage at all the Slams - US Open final in 2024, QF at Wimbledon in 2023 and SF at 2026 Australian Open
- She is the only player among the Top 5 seeds at Roland Garros this year who is yet to win a Grand Slam title
- Overall Slam w/l record stands at 62-28 entering 2026 Roland Garros
- She is a two-time clay court champion at 2025-26 Charleston

[9] Victoria Mboko (CAN #9) vs. [WC] Nikola Bartunkova (CZE #69)

First meeting

Mboko:

- Making 2nd appearance at Roland Garros; she made her Grand Slam debut here last year and reached the 3r as a qualifier (l. Zheng)
- Contesting her 5th Grand Slam main draw; career-best Grand Slam result is her 4r finish at this year's Australian Open (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka)
- Achieved her career-best result on clay last week with a R-Up finish at Strasbourg (l. Navarro in F)
- Made her Top 10 debut earlier this year on February 16, becoming the fourth Canadian to enter the elite ranking bracket joining Carling Bassett-Seguso, Eugenie Bouchard and most recently Bianca Andreescu
- Owns a 22-8 match record so far this season, including three Runner-Up finishes at Adelaide, Doha and Strasbourg, and back-to-back quarterfinals at Indian Wells and Miami

Bartunkova:

- Making Roland Garros main draw tournament debut
- Competing in her second career Grand Slam main draw; her Grand Slam debut came at this year's Australian Open where she made a run to the 3r as a qualifier (d. No.10 Bencic en route)
- Contesting just her third career Tour-level main draw on clay after 2026 Rome (as a LL reached R16, l. eventual champion Svitolina), and 2022 Istanbul (as a WC, l. eventual champion Potapova in 1r)
- Owns 1-1 career record against Top 10 players, defeating No.10 Bencic on her Australian Open debut earlier this year, and losing to No.10 and eventual champion Svitolina at 2026 Rome
- Has won 7 Tour-level main draw matches so far in 2026; her best result so far this season is QF run at Ostrava
- Is currently ranked at a new career-high of No.65; this time last year was ranked No.504

Laura Siegemund (GER #47) vs. [16] Naomi Osaka (JPN #16)

Tied 2-2

Siegemund:

- Has lost her last two meetings against Osaka, falling in straight sets at 2018 US Open and 2018 Charleston
- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros, her best result here is QF run in 2020 (l. Kvitova)
- Career record in Roland Garros 1r matches is 2-5, has lost in the 1r here the last 3 consecutive years
- Contesting her 32nd career Grand Slam main draw; her best results at a major are QF finishes here in 2020 and at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Owns two career Tour-level singles titles, both coming on clay at 2017 Stuttgart and 2016 Bastad

Osaka:

- Making 9th appearance at Roland Garros; her best results here are 3r finishes in 2019 (as the current World No.1, l. Siniakova), 2018 (l. Keys) and 2016 (l. Halep)
- Contesting her 33rd Grand Slam main draw; she is a four-time Grand Slam champion, winning titles at Australian Open in 2021 and 2019, and at US Open in 2020 and 2018
- Career record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 26-6; most recent 1r exit came here last year (l. Badosa)
- Best career result on clay is SF run at 2019 Stuttgart (l. Kontaveit)
- Holds a 4-2 record on clay so far this year, involving R16 runs at Madrid (l. Sabalenka) and Rome (l. Swiatek)
- Is currently ranked No.16; this time last year was ranked No.49, reached World No.1 ranking for the first time on January 28, 2019; she held the top ranking for a total of 25 weeks

[17] Iva Jovic (USA #17) vs. Alexandra Eala (PHI #37)

First meeting

Jovic:

- Making 2nd appearance at Roland Garros; on her debut appearance in 2025 she reached the 2r (as a wild card, d. Zarazua in 1r, l. Rybakina in 2r)
- Contesting her 7th Grand Slam main draw; registered her career-best Grand Slam result during Australian Open debut earlier this season with a run to the quarterfinals (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka)
- Broke inside the World's Top 20 after her Australian Open quarterfinal run; this time last year was ranked No.80
- Career record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 5-1, only losing in the first round at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Lamens)
- Contesting just her 7th career WTA main draw on clay, her career-best result on this surface came during this year's clay court swing with a SF finish at Charleston (l. eventual champion Pegula)

Eala:

- Making 2nd appearance at Roland Garros, on her first appearance in 2025 she fell in the 1r (l. Arango)
- Contesting 5th career Grand Slam main draw appearance; her best result is 2r run at 2025 US Open (d. Tauson in 1r, l. Bucsa in 2r)
- Career-record in Grand Slam opening matches stands at 1-3
- Career-best result on clay came earlier during this year's clay court swing with a 3r run at Rome (l. Rybakina)
- She is 4-5 so far this season on clay, with 3r showing at Rome, 2r runs at Madrid and Linz, and opening round exits at Stuttgart and Strasbourg
- Eala's main draw debut here last year marked the first time a player from the Philippines had ever competed in the main draw at Roland Garros

Hanne Vandewinkel (BEL #99) vs. [19] Madison Keys (USA #19)

First meeting

Vandewinkel:

- Making her Grand Slam main draw debut
- Contested her Tour-level main draw debut earlier this year at Bogota, where she earned her first Tour-level win in 1r over her countrywoman Costoulas (l. eventual champion Bouzkova in 2r)
- Won 19 consecutive matches at ITF events earlier this year, picking up 3 ITF titles during that span
- Her biggest career title came at WTA 125 Tampico on hard court last year (d. Brace in F)
- This year, she made her PIF WTA Rankings Top 100 debut on March 30, peaking at No.92 on April 20 (one of eight players who have made their Top 100 debuts in 2026, as of the May 18 rankings)

Keys:

- Making 14th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best tournament result is SF in 2018 (l. eventual R-Up Stephens)
- Contesting her 51st career Grand Slam main draw; she has won one Grand Slam title at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Holds a 44-6 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches
- Two of her 10 career WTA singles titles have been achieved on clay: 2019 Charleston (d. Wozniacki in F) and 2024 Strasbourg (d. Collins in F)
- Holds a 4-2 Tour-level record on clay this year, making Charleston SF (l. eventual R-Up Starodubtseva) and Rome 3r (l. Bartunkova)
- Retired from WTA 125 Paris final two weeks ago due to left thigh injury; same injury caused her to withdraw from Strasbourg last week

[22] Anna Kalinskaya (#24) vs. Lois Boisson (FRA #43)

First meeting

Kalinskaya:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best performance is reaching 2r in 2024 (d. Burel in 1r; l. Andreescu)
- Contesting her 22nd Grand Slam main draw of career; her best Grand Slam result is QF at 2024 Australian Open (l. eventual R-Up Zheng Qinwen)
- Has an 11-10 record in Grand Slam 1r matches (1-3 in Roland Garros 1r matches)
- Kalinskaya is undefeated (4-0) in clay court Tour-level matches vs. French players, with an 8-1 sets record (only Alize Cornet at 2023 Charleston has claimed a set)
- Holds a 4-3 record on clay this year: Charleston QF (l. Jovic), Madrid 2r (l. Galfi) and Rome R16 (l. Ostapenko)

Boisson:

- Made her Grand Slam main draw debut at last year's Roland Garros, and reached the SF as a wild card ranked No.361 (l. eventual champion Gauff in SF)
- Last year at Roland Garros, she became the first woman to reach SF in their maiden Grand Slam main draw appearance since Jennifer Capriati at 1990 Roland Garros
- This is her 3rd career Grand Slam main draw; her other Slam main draw was 2025 US Open (l. Golubic in 1r)
- In 2025, she posted a Tour-level main draw match record of 11-2 on clay, winning her first WTA title at Hamburg (d. Bondar in F), SF at Roland Garros and 2r at Rouen
- Due to injury, she did not make her 2026 season debut until WTA 1000 Madrid in April
- Last week, defeated Wang Xinyu in Strasbourg 1r - her first win of the 2026 season after opening losses at Madrid, Rome and WTA 125 Parma

- The No.1 seed has lost in the 1r here on only one occasion - Kerber in 2017 (l. Makarova)
- Faces No.50 Jessica Bouzas Maneiro in 1r today - she is 16-2 so far this season vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 20, with her losses coming during the clay court swing at Rome (l. No.27 Cirstea) and Madrid (l. No.32 Baptiste)
- At Slam level, last loss to a player outside the Top 20 came at the hands of No.38 Mirra Andreeva at 2024 Roland Garros
- Has won one match this season against a player from Spain, defeating Bucsa during title run at Brisbane
- Three-time clay court champion, winning Madrid in 2021, 2023 and 2025
- Is currently ranked No.1; she has held the top ranking for 82 consecutive weeks
- 4-2 so far this season on clay after QF exit at Madrid and 3r exit at Rome
