MATCH NOTES – DAY 4 – WEDNESDAY, MAY 27

Yuliia Starodubtseva (UKR #55) vs. [2] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2)

First meeting

Starodubtseva:

- Making 3rd appearance at Roland Garros, her best result here is a 3r run in 2025
- Contesting 10th career Grand Slam main draw; 3r run here last year is career-best result across all the majors
- Made a breakthrough run to first career Tour-level final, on any surface, at Charleston last month (l. Pegula in F)
- Also reached SF at the WTA 125 event in Paris earlier this month (l. Keys)
- She is 0-6 in her career vs. Top 10 players, with a loss to No.5 Pegula in the Charleston final
- Best result by Ukraine at Roland Garros are Svitolina's 5 QF runs in 2025, 2023, 2020, 2017 and 2015

Rybakina:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros, she has reached the QF stage here twice, in 2021 (l. eventual R-Up Pavlyuchenkova) and 2024 (l. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- She is a two-time Grand Slam champion, winning 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F) and 2026 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Five-time clay court champion: Stuttgart in 2026; Strasbourg in 2025; Stuttgart in 2024; Rome in 2023; Bucharest in 2019
- Has won 31 matches so far in 2026, the most on the WTA Tour
- Has won 10 clay court matches so far in 2026, it is only the second time in her career that she has claimed 10+ wins on this surface in a single season, after 12 clay court wins in 2024
- Entered the tournament leading the Tour in most aces served
- Has a chance to move to WTA World No.1 after Roland Garros; will need to reach (at least) the semifinals

Sara Bejlek (CZE #35) vs. [3] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

First meeting

Bejlek:

- Making 3rd appearance at Roland Garros, she is through to the 2r for a second consecutive year (as a qualifier last year, d. No.26 seed Kostyuk in 1r, l. Cristian in 2r)
- Contesting 8th career Grand Slam main draw; she is bidding to reach the 3r at a major for the first time
- Defeated Sloane Stephens in the 1r to register her second clay court win of the season after 2r run at Charleston and 1r exits at Rome, Paris 125 and Strasbourg
- Won her maiden career title earlier this year at Abu Dhabi (as a qualifier, d. Alexandrova in F)
- Seeking first career Top 5 win; she is 0-1 in her career vs. Top 10 players (l. to No.4 Rybakina at 2024 Madrid)
- Recorded first two Top 20 wins in career this year defeating No.11 Ekaterina Alexandrova and No.116 Clara Tauson – both wins at Abu Dhabi

Swiatek:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros, she is a four-time champion here in Paris, lifting the title in 2020 (d. Kenin), 2022 (d. Gauff), 2023 (d. Muchova) and 2024 (d. Paolini)
- Was the first player since Henin from 2005-07 to win three Roland Garros titles in a row
- Is 25-2 in Grand Slam 2r matches; last losing in the 2r of a Grand Slam at 2019 US Open (l. Sevastova)
- Contesting her 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance; she owns two further major titles, at 2022 US Open (d. Jabeur in F) and 2025 Wimbledon (d. Anisimova in F)
- Owns 41-3 record at Roland Garros – losses came to Sabalenka (2025 SF), Sakkari (2021 QF) and Halep (2019 R16)
- Is 7-3 on clay so far this season; including first SF of the year at Rome last week (l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)

[7] Elina Svitolina (UKR #7) vs. [Q] Kaitlin Quevedo (ESP #126)

First meeting

Svitolina:

- Making 49th Grand Slam main draw appearance
- A four-time Slam semifinalist, Roland Garros is the only Slam she is yet to reach the semifinals
- Making 13th appearance at Roland Garros; a five-time quarterfinalist in Paris
- Has won 10 3-set matches in 2026 including her opening round win over Anna Bondar; only Coco Gauff (11) has won more 3-set matches this year
- Record against opponents outside Top 100 stands at 5-0 in 2026, with the most recent loss coming at Bad Homburg to No. 112 Wozniacki
- Record in 2r matches at Roland Garros stands at 9-2 (overall 33-7 across all majors), having not lost a match in 2r since losing to Ivanovic at Roland Garros 2014

Quevedo:

- Making Grand Slam main draw debut; only previous appearance in singles at a Slam was 2026 Australian Open losing in first round of qualifying
- Recorded first career Grand Slam main draw win in opening round defeating Leolia Jeanjean
- First time facing a Top 10 ranked opponent
- No.4 ranked Spanish woman (at No.126)
- As qualifier, has beaten Kostovic and Maristany Zuleta De Reales to make main draw; defeated Leolia Jeanjean to score her career first main draw win at Grand Slams
- Career-best win by ranking is defeating No.64 Stearns at Auckland 2026

[8] Mirra Andreeva (#8) vs. [Q] Marina Bassols Ribera (ESP #175)

First meeting

M. Andreeva:

- Making 13th career Grand Slam main draw appearance (4th at Roland Garros, including semifinal run in 2024)
- Making 4th appearance at Roland Garros; her career-best result at the tournament is a SF finish in 2024 (l. Paolini), which is her career-best result at a Grand Slam
- Has beaten Fiona Ferro in 1r, raising her record on clay to 16-3 this season; She leads the tour for most match wins on clay in 2026
- In Tour-level matches, her record against opponents outside Top 100 stands at 21-6 (4-0 in 2026)
- Record in 2r matches at Grand Slams stands at 9-2 (3-0 at Roland Garros)
- Has won 30 matches so far this year; she is currently No.1 on tour for match wins, along with Rybakina (30)

Bassols Ribera:

- Making main draw debut at Roland Garros; this is her 13th time competing in qualifying at a Grand Slam
- Making second career Grand Slam main draw appearance (2024 US Open, via qualifying, R128)
- For second time in career faces a Top 10 ranked opponent – lost to No.8 Barbora Krejčíková at 2024 US Open
- Currently the No.7 ranked Spanish woman
- As qualifier, has beaten Monnot, Ka. Pliskova and Sasnovich to make main draw; defeated Emiliana Arango in 1r to score her career first Grand Slam main draw win

[10] Karolina Muchova (CZE #10) v. Kamilla Rakhimova (UZB #89)

Muchova leads 1-0

Muchova:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros; is a former finalist here, finishing Runner-Up in 2023 (l. Swiatek in F)
- Her run to the final here in 2023 marked her career-best result at a Grand Slam
- She has also reached a further three Grand Slam semifinals, all on hard court at 2021 Australian Open (l. Brady), 2023 US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff) and 2024 US Open (l. Pegula)
- Has beaten Anastasia Zakharova in 1r, raising her record to 10-0 this season vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 50
- She is a 4-time R-Up on clay - 2026 Stuttgart, 2024 Palermo, 2023 Roland Garros and 2019 Prague
- Has won 23 matches so far in 2026: last year she won a total of 26 matches on Toua

Rakhimova:

- Making 6th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best result was reaching 3r in 2023 (l. Sabalenka)
- Also reached 3r at Grand Slams for another two times, at Wimbledon 2025 (l. Noskova) and US Open 2021 (l. Krejčíková), which is her best result at all majors
- Is looking to her second career Top 10 win, after defeating No.5 Jasmine Paolini at Wimbledon 2025
- Best career results on clay are four SF runs at Rabat 2024, Bogota in 2024-2022
- Best result of 2026 season is R16 run at Rouen (l. Li) and Austin (l. Selekhtmeteva)

Caty McNally (USA #63) vs. [11] Belinda Bencic (SUI #11)

First meeting

McNally:

- Making Roland Garros main draw debut; played qualifying in 2022, 2021 and 2020
- Overall this is her 12th career Grand Slam main draw appearance
- With a win would equal career best result across all majors (previously, 3r, US Open 2020, I. Mertens)
- Owns 1-13 record vs Top 20 ranked opponents with lone win against No.10 Victoria Mboko at 2026 Madrid
- Currently the No.10 ranked American woman

Bencic:

- Contesting her 38th Grand Slam main draw; she is a two-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, reaching SFs at Wimbledon 2025 (I. eventual champion Swiatek) and US Open 2019 (I. eventual champion Andreescu)
- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros; she returns to Paris for the first time since 2023 where she fell in the opening round (I. LL Avanesyan)
- With a win in R64, would equal her best result at Roland Garros – previously R32 in 2019, 2022
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 stands at 7-1 in 2026, with only loss coming against No.126 Bartunkova at Australian Open
- Currently ranked No.11; this time last year was ranked No.39. Reached a career-high ranking of No.4 in Feb. 2020

[13] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #13) vs. Solana Sierra (ARG #68)

First meeting

Paolini:

- 2024 Roland Garros finalist (I. Swiatek in F) is making her 8th appearance at Roland Garros
- Contesting 26th career Grand Slam main draw; she reached back-to-back Grand Slam finals in 2024 at Roland Garros (I. Swiatek) and Wimbledon (I. Krejčíková)
- Roland Garros is the tournament that Paolini has won the most main draw matches at in her career (13)
- First career meeting against a player from Argentina
- Won the doubles title here last year (w/Errani), becoming the second all-Italian pair in the Open Era to win the title after Sara Errani and Roberta Vinci in 2012

Sierra:

- Has progressed to 2r at Roland Garros for the first time after reaching the main draw through qualifying last year (I. Putintseva in 1r)
- This is her 6th Grand Slam main draw; she has progressed past the 1r round only once before at 2025 Wimbledon as a lucky loser where she made R16 (I. Siegemund) - it was the first time in the Open Era (since 1968) that a lucky loser made Wimbledon R16 in women's singles
- Reached the R16 at WTA 1000 Madrid last month, which is her best Tour-level result on clay (I. Ka.Pliskova)
- Has won two WTA 125 titles in her career, both on clay at 2025 Mallorca and 2025 Antalya #3
- Looking for her first win over a Top 20 player today (currently 0-4 in Tour matches vs. Top 20)

[15] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #15) v. Katie Volynets (USA #108)

Volynets leads 1-0

Kostyuk:

- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best result was R16 run in 2021 (I. Swiatek)
- Her career best result across all majors was QF run at Australian Open 2024 (I. Gauff)
- With opening round win over Oksana Selekhmeteva, has won 12-straight on this clay this season; at 12-0 is the only player undefeated so far this season on clay court at WTA level
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 in 2026 stands at 10-1, with the sole loss to No.88 Jacquemot at Australian Open 2026
- Record in 2r matches at Grand Slams stands at 11-4 (1-1 at Roland Garros)

Volynets:

- Making 5th appearance at Roland Garros and has equaled her previous best result – also 2r in 2022, 2024
- With a win today would equal her best result across all majors is 3r run at Australian Open 2023 (I. Zhang)
- Owns 3 wins in career over Top 20 players, defeating today's opponent No.18 Kostyuk at Beijing 2024, No.6 Jabeur at Indian Wells 2024 and No.9 Kudermetova at Australian Open 2023
- Her best result of 2026 season is SF run at Ostrava (I. eventual champion Boulter)

- Faces No.55 Yuliia Starodubtseva in 2r today; she is 22-2 in 2026 vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 20, with losses against No.56 Potapova at Madrid and No.67 Ruzic at Dubai (via Ret.)
- Five-time clay court champion: Stuttgart in 2026; Strasbourg in 2025; Stuttgart in 2024; Rome in 2023; Bucharest in 2019
- Yulia Putintseva in 2016 and 2018 and Yaroslava Shvedova in 2010 and are the only other Kazakhstan women to reach the QF in Paris
- Has won 31 matches so far in 2026, the most on the WTA Tour
- She is 10-2 on clay so far this season, involves claiming the title at Stuttgart, a R16 finish at Madrid and QF showing at Rome

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won her first WTA Finals title, where she posted a perfect round robin record before topping World No.1 Sabalenka in the final; by going undefeated (5-0) at 2025 WTA Finals Riyadh, she earned \$5.235m, the biggest prize money payout in women's sporting history
- Overall, won three titles in 2025, adding Strasbourg and Ningbo crowns to her Riyadh triumph; finished at No.5 in the rankings and as the year's Tour leader in total aces (516)
- Won three titles from five finals in 2024, tasting success at Brisbane, Abu Dhabi and Stuttgart and finishing R-Up at Doha and Miami. Qualified for her second WTA Finals and defeated WTA World No.1 Sabalenka in the group stage
- Reached second Grand Slam final at 2023 Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in 3s); made Top-10 debut following tournament (January 30, 2023). Also in 2023 won first two WTA 1000 titles at Indian Wells and Rome and finished R-Up at Miami. Qualified for first WTA Finals, going 1-2 in group stage.

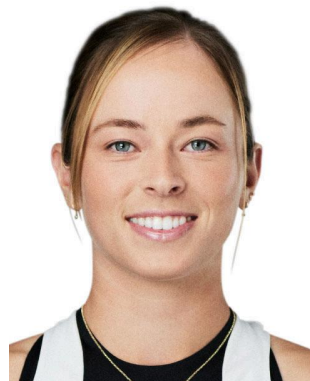
