MATCH NOTES – DAY 5 – THURSDAY, MAY 28

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Elsa Jacquemot (FRA #67)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Making 9th consecutive main draw appearance at Roland Garros, with her best result coming last year with run to the final (l. Gauff)
- She also made the SF here in 2023 (l. Muchova) and the QF in 2024 (l. Andreeva)
- Overall, this is her 32nd Grand Slam main draw appearance; she is a four-time major champion, lifting the titles at Australian Open (2023-24) and US Open (2024-25)
- Has not lost to an unseeded player at a Grand Slam since falling to Mirra Andreeva at Roland Garros 2024
- Is one of the three players who has reached 2r at Roland Garros in each of the last eight seasons (since 2019), along with Iga Swiatek and Daria Kasatkina
- Has made 3r in all the Grand Slam events she has played in the last six years (since US Open 2020)
- Has claimed the most Tour-level wins in straight sets this season (25)

Jacquemot:

- Contesting her sixth Roland Garros main draw; her best and most recent result was reaching 3r in 2025 (l. Boisson)
- This is her 11th Grand Slam main draw and she has reached 2r for a sixth time
- Her 1r win over Linda Fruhvirtova this week was her first clay court match win of the season
- This is the first meeting of her career against a Top 10 player
- Her best career win by ranking was over No.20 Kostyuk at Australian Open this year, which Jacquemot won after three tiebreak sets
- Could become the third woman from France in the Open Era to defeat the No.1 seed at Roland Garros after Gail Sherriff in 1971 (vs. Court), and Mary Pierce in 1994 (vs. Graf), 2000 (vs. Hingis) and 2005 (vs. Davenport)
- One of two players from France to reach 2r along with Diane Parry

[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. [Q] Mayar Sherif (EGY #129)

Gauff leads 1-0

Gauff:

- Returning to Roland Garros as the defending champion - she lifted the title here last year by defeating World No.1 Sabalenka in the final
- Gauff became the first US woman to win the title here in Paris since Serena Williams in 2015
- Making her 7th consecutive 2r appearance at Roland Garros, joining Daria Kasatkina, Elena Rybakina, Aryna Sabalenka and Iga Swiatek as the only women to do so in each of the last seven editions
- Has defeated Taylor Townsend so far this week for her 28th main draw victory at Roland Garros (most at a single tournament in her professional career)
- Has won 22 straight Tour-level matches versus players ranked outside the Top 100, and holds a 21-3 career record at Grand Slams (7-1 at Roland Garros) against such opponents
- Seeking her 80th career main draw victory at a Grand Slam; she would become the first woman since Maria Sharapova at the 2008 Australian Open to achieve this feat before turning 23

Sherif:

- Contesting her fifth career 2r at a Grand Slam and fourth at Roland Garros, equaling her best result at the tournament after also reaching 2r in 2022, 2023 and 2024
- She is one of 8 qualifiers to have reached the second round - the most at Roland Garros since 2011
- Seeking to reach her first Grand Slam 3r of career; she would become the first Egyptian woman in the Open Era to make the third round at a Grand Slam event
- Her win in 1r over Dalma Galfi was her first Tour-level victory since 1r at Miami in 2025
- Owns two wins in her career over Top 10 players, with both coming on clay (d. No.5 Caroline Garcia at Madrid in 2023; d. No.7 Maria Sakkari at Parma in 2022)
- Her one career WTA Tour singles title came on clay at Parma in 2022 (d. Sakkari in F)
- Has notched 100 clay-court match-wins at WTA 125 events in her career, leading all players at that tournament level

Julia Grabher (AUT #121) vs. [6] Amanda Anisimova (USA #6)

First meeting

Grabher:

- In her second Roland Garros main draw, she has equalled her previous result of 2r in 2023 (I. Gauff)
- A win today would be her first 3r at a Grand Slam, after also reaching 2r at Australian Open this year (I. Kalinskaya)
- Looking for her first Top 10 win today; her best career win by ranking in a completed Tour main draw match was over No.28 Zhang Shuai at 2023 Charleston
- Owns one main draw Tour match win over USA players, defeating Sachia Vickery at Charleston 2023
- One of two players from Austria through to the 2r along with No.28 seed Potapova

Anisimova:

- A breakthrough performance at Roland Garros in 2019 saw her reach the semifinal aged 17, knocking out defending champion Halep in the quarterfinals before falling to eventual champion Barty
- Made her Grand Slam main draw debut here in 2017, falling in the 1r (as a wild card, I. Nara)
- She is a two-time Grand Slam runner-up, contesting the title match at 2025 Wimbledon (I. Swiatek) and 2025 US Open (I. Sabalenka)
- Has never been defeated by a player ranked outside the Top 100 in a main draw Grand Slam match
- Competing in first clay event of the season after withdrawing from Madrid and Rome with a wrist injury
- Seeking her 50th Grand Slam main draw win of career today (currently 49-24 in Grand Slam main draw matches)

[9] Victoria Mboko (CAN #9) vs. Katerina Siniakova (CZE #36)

First meeting

Mboko:

- Making 2nd appearance at Roland Garros; she made her Grand Slam debut here last year and reached the 3r as a qualifier (l. Zheng)
- Contesting her 5th Grand Slam main draw; career-best Grand Slam result is her 4r finish at this year's Australian Open (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka)
- Achieved her career-best result on clay last week with a runner-up finish at Strasbourg (l. Navarro in final)
- Her record against opponents outside Top 20 stands at 17-2 in 2026, with the two losses to No.39 Navarro in Strasbourg final and No.76 McNally at Madrid
- Owns a 23-8 match record so far this season, including three runner-up finishes at Adelaide, Doha and Strasbourg, and back-to-back quarterfinals at Indian Wells and Miami
- Made her Top 10 debut earlier this year on February 16, becoming the fourth Canadian to enter the elite ranking bracket joining Carling Bassett-Seguso, Eugenie Bouchard and most recently Bianca Andreescu

Siniakova:

- Making 12th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best result was R16 run in 2019 (l. Keys) – that is also her best singles result across all Grand Slams
- This is her 45th consecutive Grand Slam appearance, the current longest active streak (along with Yulia Putintseva)
- Attempting to reach her first 3r at a Grand Slam event since Wimbledon 2021
- Owns 11 wins in career over Top 10 players at Tour-level events, most recently No.8 Mirra Andreeva at Indian Wells 2026
- Seeking her first Top 10 win on clay since she defeated Serena Williams at Parma in 2021
- In doubles, Siniakova and Townsend are the No.1 seeds. Siniakova is a three-time women's doubles champion at Roland Garros, lifting the trophy in 2024 (w/Gauff), 2021 and 2018 (both w/Krejčíková)

Donna Vekic (CRO #72) vs. [16] Naomi Osaka (JPN #16)

Osaka leads 2-0

Vekic:

- Contesting her 14th consecutive main draw at Roland Garros, and her making her fifth straight 2r appearance
- Her opening round victory against Alice Tubello was her 12th career win at Roland Garros, which is the most wins she has claimed at a Tour-level event on clay
- Contesting her 50th career Grand Slam main draw; her career-best Grand Slam performance is SF at 2024 Wimbledon (l. Paolini)
- Seeking her 30th career Tour-level win over a Top 20 player, with her most recent such victory coming over No.12 Diana Shnaider at Bad Homburg in 2025 (0-5 vs. Top 20 players since then)
- Best career result on clay was winning the silver medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics, which took place at the Roland Garros site (l. No.7 Zheng Qinwen in gold-medal final)
- One of two players from Croatia to reach 2r, joining Antonia Ruzic

Osaka:

- Appearing in her sixth 2r at Roland Garros; she could equal her best result at this tournament with a victory today (previously reached the 3r in 2016, 2018 and 2019)
- Defeated Laura Siegemund in 1r to claim her 9th career win at Roland Garros. The only Tour-level event on clay she currently has 10-plus wins at is Rome (11)
- Holds a 20-4 career record in 2r matches at Grand Slams (excluding walkovers)
- Won both of her two previous meetings against today's opponent Vekic, in 2019 Stuttgart QF (in 3rd-set tiebreak) and 2016 Australian Open 1r
- Since the start of the 2025 season, she is 6-1 on clay against players ranked outside the Top 50 at Tour-level (l. Lucia Bronzetti at Madrid in 2025) and has won her last six such matches
- Contesting her 33rd Grand Slam main draw; she is a four-time Grand Slam champion, winning titles at Australian Open in 2021 and 2019, and at US Open in 2020 and 2018

[17] Iva Jovic (USA #17) vs. Emma Navarro (USA #25)

Navarro leads 1-0

Jovic:

- On her debut Roland Garros appearance last year, she made 2r (as a wild card, d. Zarazua in 1r, l. Rybakina in 2r)
- Contesting her 7th Grand Slam main draw; she has progressed past the 2r only once before, at Australian Open this season with quarterfinal (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka)
- This is her 7th career WTA main draw on clay; her best result on this surface came during this year's clay court swing with SF at Charleston (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Owns 4 wins in her career over Top 30 players, most recently No.22 Kalinskaya at 2026 Charleston
- This is her 10th meeting against a player from USA this season; her current record is 5-4, with her most recent such meeting a loss against today's opponent Navarro at Strasbourg last week
- Made her Top 20 debut following her Australian Open QF result this year

Navarro:

- This is her 4th Roland Garros appearance; her best previous result was reaching 4r in 2024 (l. Sabalenka)
- Roland Garros is the only Slam she is yet to reach at least quarterfinal; her best Slam result is semifinal which she reached once at US Open in 2024 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Enters Roland Garros off the back of earning her third career title at Strasbourg (d. Mboko in F)
- Defeated today's opponent Jovic in the 2r at Strasbourg last week on the way to earning the title
- Her Strasbourg wins over No.17 Jovic and No.9 Mboko are her only meetings against Top 20 players so far this year
- Is currently on a 6-match winning streak after claiming the Strasbourg title

Antonia Ruzic (CRO #64) vs. [19] Madison Keys (USA #19)

First meeting

Ruzic:

- Making main draw debut at Roland Garros (fell in qualifying in 2023, 2024 and 2025)
- Has defeated Ashlyn Krueger so far this week to reach 2r at a Grand Slam for first time in her career
- Her 1r win this week was her 3rd career Tour-level win on clay (also d. Grant at 2025 Rome, and d. Rakhimova at 2026 Rome)
- Looking to earn second career Top 20 win today (d. Rybakina at Dubai 2026, via retirement)
- Best results of 2026 season so far include reaching SF at Hobart (l. eventual champion Cocciaretto) and QF at Dubai (l. eventual R-Up Svitolina)
- One of 2 players from Croatia to reach 2r (alongside Vekic)

Keys:

- Making 14th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best tournament result is SF in 2018 (l. eventual R-Up Stephens)
- Also reached the Roland Garros QF in 2019 (l. eventual champion Barty) and 2025 (l. eventual champion Gauff)
- Her 1r win over Hanne Vandewinkel has put Keys into the Roland Garros 2r for the 12th time in her career
- Contesting her 51st career Grand Slam main draw; she has won one Grand Slam title at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Two of her 10 career WTA singles titles have been achieved on clay: 2019 Charleston (d. Wozniacki in F) and 2024 Strasbourg (d. Collins in F)
- Holds a 5-2 Tour-level record on clay this year, making Charleston SF (l. eventual R-Up Starodubtseva) and Rome 3r (l. Bartunkova)

[30] Ann Li (USA #29) vs. Diane Parry (FRA #92)

Li leads 1-0

Li:

- Making 4th appearance at Roland Garros, where her previous best results were reaching 2r in 2025 (l. Pegula) and 2021 (l. Svitolina) – seeking her first trip to a Roland Garros 3r
- Her best result across all Grand Slam events is R16 run at US Open 2025 (l. Pegula)
- Is seeded at a Grand Slam event for the first time in her career, at No.30
- Best career Tour-level result on clay is SF run at 2026 Strasbourg last week (l. eventual champion Navarro), which is also her best result of 2026 season so far
- Currently ranked at her career-best No.29 (first achieved on May 4th, 2026)
- Defeated today's opponent Parry in their only previous meeting, at an ITF event in Tyler, Texas in 2020 – Li went on to win that title

Parry:

- Making 8th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best tournament result was reaching 3r in 2022 (l. Stephens)
- Defeated defending champion and then-World No.2 Barbora Krejckova here in the first round in 2022, which is her career-best win by opponent ranking
- Her career-best Grand Slam results are 3r finishes on five occasions, most recently 2025 US Open (l. Kostyuk)
- Has claimed 6 career main draw wins at Roland Garros - the Tour-level event where she has the most wins (equal with Palermo)
- Is looking to claim consecutive Tour-level main draw wins for the first time since Ostrava in February, and for the first time on clay since Palermo 2024
- Earlier this month, won the WTA 125 Paris title on clay (d. Keys in F via ret.)

- One of 2 players from France to reach 2r along with Parry
- Best result by France in Open Era at Roland Garros was by Mary Pierce who won the title in 2000
- Is currently ranked No.67; this time last year was ranked No.138. Reached career-high ranking of No.53 in February 2026
- Best results this season so far are 2r at Australian Open (l. Putintseva) and 2r at Miami (l. Bouzkova), as well as 2r this week

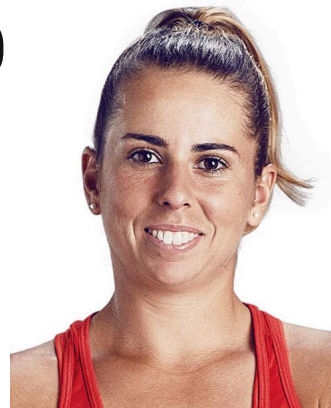

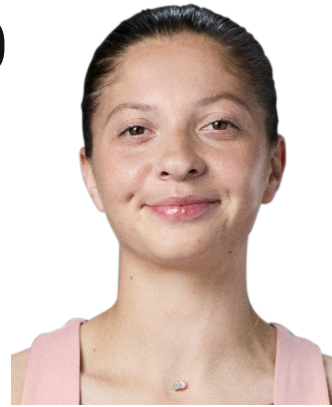
