MATCH NOTES – DAY 6 – FRIDAY, MAY 29

Magda Linette (POL #35) vs. [3] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

Tied 1-1

Linette:

- Making 12th main draw appearance at Roland Garros and has reached 3r here for the 3rd time - she lost in 3r in 2017 (l. Svitolina) and 2021 (l. Jabeur)
- Contesting her 43rd career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam showing is SF at 2023 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Owns 8 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently today's opponent No.3 Swiatek at 2026 Miami
- She has notched two of her Top 10 wins here at Roland Garros, defeating No.1 Barty in 2021 (via retirement) and No.6 Jabeur in 2022
- Before this year, the last time two players from Poland reached 3r at Roland Garros was 2021: Linette (3r) and Swiatek (QF)
- One of her 3 career titles has come on clay, at 2024 Prague (d. Frech in all-Polish final)

Swiatek:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros; she is a four-time champion here in Paris, lifting the title in 2020 (d. Kenin in F), 2022 (d. Gauff in F), 2023 (d. Muchova in F) and 2024 (d. Paolini in F)
- Was the first player since Justine Henin from 2005-07 to win three Roland Garros titles in a row
- Owns 42-3 record at Roland Garros - her three losses here came to Sabalenka (2025 SF), Sakkari (2021 QF) and Halep (2019 R16)
- Contesting her 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance; she owns two further major titles, at 2022 US Open (d. Jabeur in F) and 2025 Wimbledon (d. Anisimova in F)
- Is 8-3 on clay so far this season, including first SF of the year at Rome last week (l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)
- Has become the 9th woman in the Open Era to reach 3r in each of her first eight main draw appearances at Roland Garros

[7] Elina Svitolina (UKR #7) vs. Tamara Korpatsch (GER #95)

First meeting

Svitolina:

- Making 49th Grand Slam main draw appearance
- A four-time Slam semifinalist, Roland Garros is the only Slam she is yet to reach the semifinals
- Making 13th appearance at Roland Garros; a five-time quarterfinalist in Paris
- Has claimed 35 main draw wins at Roland Garros becoming the event where she has the most in her career
- Eight of her 20 career WTA singles titles have come on clay, including WTA 1000 Rome this month (d. Gauff in F) - Svitolina is undefeated in WTA clay-court finals (8-0)
- Is 16-1 this season against players ranked outside the Top 50, falling only to Anna Bondar at Madrid; then defeated Bondar in 1r here this week

Korpatsch:

- Is through to 3r of a Grand Slam for the first time in her career after previously reaching 2r at all four Slams
- Looking to earn first career over Top 10 player today; she is currently 0-3 against Top 10 players after falling against No.9 Ka.Pliskova at 2021 Stuttgart, No.7 Jabeur at 2023 Ningbo and No.8 at 2024 Roland Garros
- Best career result on clay is reaching semifinal stage at Gdynia in 2021 & Lausanne in 2019
- Best result of 2026 season so far is reaching the final at Ostrava (l. Boulter in F); this was the second Tour final of her career after winning the Cluj-Napoca title in 2023 (d. Ruse in F)
- Only player from Germany to reach 3r

[8] Mirra Andreeva (#8) vs. [27] Marie Bouzkova (CZE #28)

Andreeva lead 4-0

Andreeva:

- Owns 4-0 head-to-head record against Bouzkova, defeating her once before on clay at 2025 Madrid
- In her 4th Roland Garros main draw, her best result was semifinal in 2024 (l. Paolini); she also reached QF last year (l. wild card Boisson)
- Her SF run here in 2024 is her best Grand Slam result
- Holds a 17-3 match record on clay this season and leads the Tour for most match wins on clay in 2026
- Her clay season in 2026 results include a title run at Linz, SF at Stuttgart, R-Up at Madrid and QF at Rome
- Has won 31 matches so far this year; a win today would see her surpass Rybakina (also on 31 wins), in leading the Tour for most match wins this season

Bouzkova:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros; she is bidding to reach the 4r here for the first time after two 3r exits in 2024-2025
- Her best Grand Slam result is reaching the quarterfinals at 2022 Wimbledon (l. eventual finalist Jabeur)
- Won her first title on clay during this year's clay court swing at Bogota (d. Udvardy in F)
- Has lost her last 10 consecutive meetings against Top 10 players, last claiming a Top 10 victory at 2024 Washington with a win over No.3 Sabalenka
- Record in 3r matches at Grand Slams stands at 2-3 (0-2 at Roland Garros)

Jil Teichmann (SUI #170) vs. [10] Karolina Muchova (CZE #10)

Tied 1-1

Teichmann:

- Making 5th appearance at Roland Garros, with her best result reaching 4r in 2022 (l. Stephens)
- Contesting 20th career Grand Slam main draw; her 4r run here in 2022 is her best result at a major
- Is competing in her second Tour-level main draw of the 2026 season after her semifinal run at Rabat last week (l. eventual champion Marcinko)
- Owns 8 career wins over Top 10 players; most recent was a win over No.9 Bencic at 2023 Indian Wells
- Owns two career clay court titles: 2019 Palermo (d. No.1 seed Bertens in F) and 2019 Prague (as a qualifier, d. today's opponent Muchova in F)
- Reached a career-high ranking of No.21 in July 2022

Muchova:

- Defeated today's opponent Teichmann during their most recent encounter at 2023 Miami
- Making 7th appearance at Roland Garros; she is a former finalist here, finishing runner-up in 2023 (l. Swiatek)
- Her run to the final here in 2023 marked her best result at a Grand Slam; she has also reached a further three Grand Slam semifinals, all on hard court at 2021 Australian Open, 2023 US Open and 2024 US Open
- She is 11-0 so far this season vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 50
- During this year's clay court swing, reached her fourth career Tour-level final on clay at Stuttgart (l. Rybakina in F), fell in the opening round at Rome (l. qualifier Potapova)
- Has won 24 matches so far in 2026: last year she won a total of 26 matches on Tour

Peyton Stearns (USA #78) vs. [11] Belinda Bencic (SUI #11)

First meeting

Stearns:

- Enters 3r at Roland Garros for a third time after 2023 (l. Kastakina) and 2024 (l. M.Andreeva)
- This is her 14th Grand Slam main draw and her best result is 4r which she made at 2023 US Open (l. Vondrousova)
- Owns nine career wins over Top 20 players, most recently defeating No.14 Elina Svitolina at Rome 2025
- Looking for her first Top 20 win of the season with a current record of 0-4
- Owns one clay court title at Rabat in 2024 (d. Sherif in F)
- Claimed the second title of her career earlier this year at Austin (d. Townsend in F)

Bencic:

- Contesting her 38th Grand Slam main draw; she is a two-time Grand Slam semi-finalist, reaching SFs at Wimbledon 2025 (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and US Open 2019 (l. eventual champion Andreescu)
- Looking to surpass previous best results at Roland Garros: two 3r showings in 2022 (l. Fernandez) and 2019 (l. Vekic)
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 stands at 8-1 in 2026, with only loss coming against No.126 Bartunkova at Australian Open
- Holds 12-9 record against American opponents at Grand Slams; she is yet to defeat a player from USA at Roland Garros (l. V.Williams in 2014, l. Keys in 2015)
- Currently ranked No.11, she reached a career-high ranking of No.4 in February 2020

[15] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #15) vs. Viktorija Golubic (SUI #82)

Kostyuk leads 2-0

Kostyuk:

- Making 7th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result is R16 run in 2021 (l. Swiatek)
- Contesting her 25th career Grand Slam main draw; her best result across all majors is QF run at Australian Open 2024 (l. Gauff)
- Coming off winning back-to-back titles at Rouen (d. Podrez in the first all-Ukrainian WTA singles final) and Madrid (d. M.Andreeva in F)
- She has raised her winning streak in this clay season to 13-0 at Tour events, the only player undefeated so far this season on clay court at WTA level
- Her Tour-level record against opponents outside Top 50 in 2026 stands at 12-1, with the sole loss to No.60 Jacquemot at Australian Open in 3 tiebreak sets

Golubic:

- In her 9th main draw at Roland Garros, she has reached 3r for the first time (previously 0-3 in Roland Garros 2r matches)
- Contesting her 35th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam showing is quarterfinal at 2021 Wimbledon (l. eventual R-Up Pliskova)
- Is into a Grand Slam 3r for the first time since 3r showing at 2024 Australian Open (l. Svitolina)
- Owns 7 wins in career over Top 20 players at Tour-level events, most recently No.17 Veronika Kudermetova at 2024 Australian Open
- One of her two titles was earned on clay at 2016 Gstaad (d. Kiki Bertens in F); her other title was on hard court at 2024 Jiujiang (d. Rebecca Sramkova in F)

Solana Sierra (ARG #68) vs. [18] Sorana Cirstea

Cirstea leads 1-0

Sierra:

- Has progressed to 3r at Roland Garros for the first time after reaching the main draw through qualifying last year (l. Putintseva in 1r)
- This is her 6th Grand Slam main draw; she has progressed past the 1r round only once before at 2025 Wimbledon as a lucky loser where she made R16 (l. Siegemund) - it was the first time in the Open Era (since 1968) that a lucky loser made Wimbledon R16 in women's singles
- Reached the R16 at WTA 1000 Madrid last month, which is her best Tour-level result on clay (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Her 2r win here over No.13 Paolini was the first Top 20 win of her career
- Has won two WTA 125 titles in her career, both on clay at 2025 Mallorca and 2025 Antalya #3

Cirstea:

- Making 17th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching quarterfinal in 2009 (l. Stosur)
- Contesting in her 67th Grand Slam main draw, she is a two-time major quarterfinalist; reaching the QFs at US Open 2023 (l. eventual finalist Muchova) and 2009 Roland Garros (l. Stosur)
- Undefeated against players ranked outside the Top 50 so far this season with a record of 16-0
- One of her 4 career titles has come on clay: 2021 Istanbul (d. Mertens in F)
- Is currently competing at a career-high ranking of No.18 after becoming the oldest player to make her Top 20 debut last week in WTA Rankings

[Q] Wang Xiyu (CHN #148) vs. Yuliia Starodubtseva (UKR #55)

First meeting

Wang:

- Has reached 3r at Roland Garros for the first time in her career; her previous best result was reaching 2r in 2024 (I. Fernandez)
- She has equalled her best Grand Slam result, also reaching 3r at US Open in 2022 (I. Riske Amritraj)
- This is her first Tour appearance since Hong Kong 2025, playing only at WTA 125 and ITF level so far this season
- With a win today would be through to her first 4r at Grand Slam events
- Best career result on clay is quarterfinal at Budapest 2022 (I. Krunic)
- This is only her second Tour main draw meeting against a Top 100 player this season after defeating No.26 Baptiste via retirement in previous round here this week

Starodubtseva:

- By reaching 3r has equalled her best Grand Slam result which was here at Roland Garros last year (I. Paolini in 3r)
- Her win over No.2 Rybakina in 2r is her first career Top 10 win, after failing her previous six attempts against such opponents
- With a win today, would be through to her first 4r at a Grand Slam
- Made a breakthrough run to first career Tour-level final, on any surface, at Charleston last month (I. Pegula in F)
- Also reached SF at the WTA 125 event in Paris earlier this month (I. Keys)
- Best result by Ukraine at Roland Garros are Svitolina's five QF runs in 2025, 2023, 2020, 2017 and 2015

- Swiatek is the only player from Poland to have won the Roland Garros title
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)
- She is 8-3 on clay this season; she made her first SF of the year at Rome earlier this month (l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- Is currently ranked No.3; this time last year was ranked No.5. Reached World No.1 for the first time on April 4, 2022, and spent 125 weeks holding the top ranking

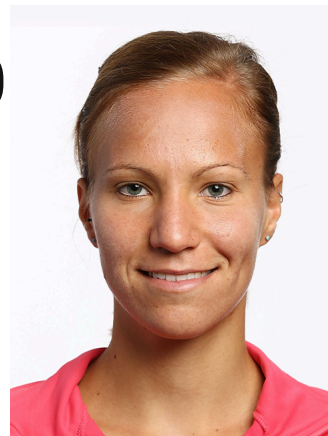

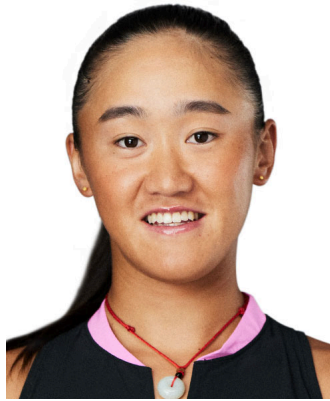

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, won ITF W75 Lexington title (d. Tjen in F), and posted 2r results on Tour at Australian Open, WTA 1000 Beijing (l. eventual finalist Noskova) and Guangzhou
- Kicked off 2024 with SF at Auckland (l. Svitolina) before reaching her second career Tour-level final at Austin (l. Yuan)
- In 2023, won first WTA Tour title at Guangzhou (d. Linette in F) and posted new career-high ranking of No.49 on January 9; also reached R16 at Eastbourne, Rome, Prague, and Merida
- Recorded first Top 100 season finish in 2022, ending the year ranked No.50; season highlighted by reaching the semifinals at WTA 250 events in Cluj-Napoca and Washington DC; also reached the quarterfinals at Granby and Budapest
- During 2021, made 2r at Abu Dhabi (l. Rybakina) and Nottingham (l. Riske). Also finished R-Up at ITF/W25 event in Florence, SC, USA
- In 2020, reached her first career WTA Tour SF at Acapulco as qualifier, where she defeated No.2 seed YWang and two-time champion Errani (l. eventual champion Watson); following that event, posted new career-high ranking of No.106 on March 2
- Earlier in 2020, reached her first career WTA Tour QF at Hua Hin (l. eventual champion Linette), upsetting No.15 Martic in 1r for first victory over a Top 20 player
- In 2019, best Tour-level result was Miami 2r (as WC, l. Bertens); also fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at US Open (as LL, l. Flipkens), and won third ITF Circuit singles title at \$60K Internacional de Solgirones
- Season highlights in 2018 were maiden ITF singles titles at \$25K Nonthaburi and \$25K Tsukuba, and also won three ITF doubles titles that year; at Tour-level, contested Wuhan, falling 2r to Kasatkina in her first match vs. a Top 20 opponent
- Made WTA singles main draw debut at 2017 Tianjin Open as wildcard, defeating Kovinic in 1r
- Made professional debut at 2016 \$10K ITF/Anning, CHN
- In Juniors, became first Chinese girl to win a Grand Slam Junior singles title at 2018 US Open; also teamed up with Wang Xinyu to claim Junior doubles title at 2018 Wimbledon
- As a junior, achieved career-high ranking of No.1 in both singles and doubles; also took bronze in the girls' doubles (w/Wang Xinyu) at 2018 Summer Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires
- Highlights in 2025 were R16 runs at WTA 1000 Madrid and WTA 500 Ningbo as well as posting her best Grand Slam result at Roland Garros with 3r as a qualifier. Reached a new career-high ranking of No.63 on August 11
- A breakthrough year in 2024 saw her start the year at No.150, before climbing to a career high ranking of No.79 on Oct 7, 2024 after reaching QFs at WTA 250 Monastir (as a qualifier, l. eventual champion Kartal) and WTA 1000 Beijing (as a qualifier, l. eventual champion Gauff).
- She began 2024 by reaching her first Tour-level main draw as a qualifier at Australian Open and facing a Top 10 player for the first time (l. No.6 Jabeur in 1r).
- In 2024 as a qualifier, she reached the main draw of all four Slams for the first time, winning her first Tour-level main draw match at Wimbledon (l. Sun in 2r).
- Won four ITF circuit titles in 2023 including W60 events in Sumter, Dallas, and Rancho Sante Fe. Earned a spot in Grand Slam qualifying for the first time at 2023 US Open (l. Naef). Reached career high ranking of No. 151 on November 27, 2023.
- Played only one ITF tournament between 2018 and 2022, returning to the courts for the 2023 season.
- Made professional debut on ITF circuit in 2016 at 16 years of age.
