## MATCH NOTES – DAY 7 – SATURDAY, MAY 30

### [1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. Daria Kasatkina (AUS #53)

**Sabalenka leads 7-2**

#### ***Sabalenka:***

- Making 9th consecutive main draw appearance at Roland Garros, with her best result coming last year with run to the final (l. Gauff)
- She also made the SF here in 2023 (l. Muchova) and the QF in 2024 (l. Andreeva)
- Overall, this is her 32nd Grand Slam main draw appearance; she is a four-time major champion, lifting the titles at Australian Open (2023-24) and US Open (2024-25)
- Current PIF WTA World No.1; she will remain at No.1 after Roland Garros following Rybakina's loss in the 2r
- Has won her last 14 matches vs. players ranked outside the Top 50, dating back to a loss to No.164 Vondrousova at 2025 Berlin
- Has not lost to an unseeded player at a Grand Slam event since falling to Mirra Andreeva at Roland Garros 2024
- She has won a Tour-leading three WTA singles titles in 2026, at Brisbane, and the Sunshine Double of Indian Wells and Miami
- Currently with 99, Sabalenka could become the ninth player since the inception of the WTA Rankings to claim 100+ wins as World No.1 after Navratilova, Graf, Evert, S. Williams, Hingis, Seles, Swiatek and Henin

#### ***Kasatkina:***

- Making her 11th appearance at Roland Garros, and is into the Roland Garros 3r for the 8th time
- Her career-best results at Roland Garros are SF in 2022 (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and QF in 2018 (l. eventual R-Up Stephens)
- Contesting her 41st career Grand Slam main draw, with her best Grand Slam result being the 2022 Roland Garros SF
- Owns 24 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.10 Paula Badosa at 2025 Roland Garros
- Holds a 2-3 career record vs. players ranked World No.1 at the time of their meeting, with wins over Kerber at 2017 Sydney and Wozniacki at 2018 St. Petersburg
- Has won one WTA singles title on clay: 2017 Charleston, which was her first career WTA singles title (d. Ostapenko in all-teenager F)
- Most recent Australian to win Roland Garros title is Ashleigh Barty in 2019 (d. Vondrousova in F)

## [4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. [28] Anastasia Potapova (AUT #30)

**Tied 2-2**

### ***Gauff:***

- Returning to Roland Garros as the defending champion - she lifted the title here last year by defeating World No.1 Sabalenka in the final
- Gauff became the first US woman to win the title here in Paris since Serena Williams in 2015
- One of 3 players to have reached the Roland Garros 3r in its last six editions, alongside Sabalenka and Swiatek
- She is the youngest player to reach 3r at Roland Garros for six consecutive years (2021-2026) since Maria Sharapova (2004-2009)
- Gauff has now claimed the most main draw wins at Roland Garros (29) among players competing for the United States of America before turning 23, surpassing Mary Joe Fernandez (28)
- Owns 80 Grand Slam main draw wins; becoming the first woman since Maria Sharapova at the 2008 Australian Open to achieve this feat before turning 23
- Has won 29 main draw matches at Roland Garros: this is her highest tally in a single WTA tournament in her career (seven more than the second-best, in Rome)

### ***Potapova:***

- Defeated Gauff during their most recent encounter and only meeting on clay at 2023 Stuttgart
- Making 6th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result is R16 run in 2024 (l. eventual champion Swiatek), which is also her best result across all Grand Slam events
- Is currently ranked No.30 (career best at No.21 in 2023); she began this year's clay court season at Linz ranked No.97
- Owns 8 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently No.2 Elena Rybakina at Madrid 2026 (as a lucky loser)
- Could become the second player in the Open Era to defeat the defending champion at Roland Garros in the 3r after Maria Kirilenko defeated Svetlana Kuznetsova in the 3r in 2010
- Owns 13 wins on clay so far this season; she is joint second on Tour for most clay court wins in 2026 (alongside Kostyuk), only behind M. Andreeva
- Coming into this year's Roland Garros, reached her third career clay court final at Linz, SF run at Madrid (as a lucky loser) and made R16 at Rome (as a qualifier)

## **Diane Parry (FRA #92) vs. [6] Amanda Anisimova (USA #6)**

**First meeting**

### ***Parry:***

- Making 8th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, and has reached 3r here for the second time
- She previously posted a 3r finish here in 2022, when she defeated defending champion and then-World No.2 Barbora Krejčíková in 1r before losing to Stephens in 3r
- Seeking the first Grand Slam R16 of her career (0-5 in Grand Slam 3r matches)
- Has claimed 7 career main draw wins at Roland Garros - the Tour-level event where she has the most wins
- Has notched one Top 10 win in her career, over No.2 Krejčíková at 2022 Roland Garros (0-7 vs. Top 10 players since)
- Only player from France to reach this week's 3r; the most recent French woman to win this title is Mary Pierce in 2000 (d. Conchita Martínez in F)
- Earlier this month, won the WTA 125 Paris title on clay (d. Keys in F via ret.)

## ***Anisimova:***

- A breakthrough performance at Roland Garros in 2019 saw her reach the semifinal aged 17, knocking out defending champion Halep in the quarterfinals before falling to eventual champion Barty
- Made her Grand Slam main draw debut here in 2017, falling in the 1r (as a wild card, l. Nara)
- She is a two-time Grand Slam runner-up, contesting the title match at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Swiatek) and 2025 US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- Has never been defeated by a player ranked outside the Top 100 in a main draw Grand Slam match
- Competing in first clay event of the season after withdrawing from Madrid and Rome with a wrist injury
- Seeking her 50th Grand Slam main draw win of career today (currently 49-24 in Grand Slam main draw matches)

## **[9] Victoria Mboko (CAN #9) vs. [19] Madison Keys (USA #19)**

**Mboko leads 1-0**

### ***Mboko:***

- Making 2nd appearance at Roland Garros; she made her Grand Slam debut here last year and reached the 3r as a qualifier (l. Zheng)
- She is the youngest Canadian to reach back-to-back 3r at Roland Garros since Helen Kelesi (1988-1989)
- Bidding to become the fourth Canadian this Century to reach 4r at Roland Garros after Aleksandra Wozniak (2009), Eugenie Bouchard (2014) and Leylah Fernandez (2022)
- Contesting her 5th Grand Slam main draw; career-best Grand Slam result is her 4r finish at this year's Australian Open (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka)
- Could become the second Canadian in the Open Era to reach 4r at both Australian Open and Roland Garros in the same season since Eugenie Bouchard in 2014
- Achieved her career-best result on clay last week with a runner-up finish at Strasbourg (l. Navarro in final)
- Owns a 24-8 match record so far this season, including three runner-up finishes at Adelaide, Doha and Strasbourg, and back-to-back quarterfinals at Indian Wells and Miami
- Made her Top 10 debut earlier this year on February 16, becoming the fourth Canadian to enter the elite ranking bracket joining Carling Bassett-Seguso, Eugenie Bouchard and most recently Bianca Andreescu

### ***Keys:***

- Making 14th appearance at Roland Garros, where her best tournament result is SF in 2018 (l. eventual R-Up Stephens). Also reached QFs here in 2018 and 2025
- Won her maiden Grand Slam trophy at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Also finished R-Up at 2017 US Open (l. Stephens in F) - she is the player with the longest gap between their first two Grand Slam finals in the Open Era
- Among currently active players, only Venus Williams (271) has won more Grand Slam main draw matches than Madison Keys (127)
- Seeking her 24th career Grand Slam R16, and sixth at Roland Garros
- Since her Grand Slam main draw debut at 2011 US Open, only Serena Williams (28) has made more 4r at Grand Slams than Madison Keys (23, level with Angelique Kerber)
- Started the 2025 season with five consecutive wins over Top 10 opponents (claiming the titles at Adelaide and Australian Open), however she has lost all of her last eight Top 10 meetings since the final in Melbourne

## [17] Iva Jovic (USA #17) vs. [16] Naomi Osaka (JPN #16)

**First meeting**

### ***Jovic:***

- Through to the 3r here at Roland Garros for the first time, on her debut appearance last year, she made 2r (as a wild card, d. Zarazua in 1r, I. Rybakina in 2r)
- This is the second time in her career that she has progressed beyond the 2r of a Grand Slam, after QF run at 2026 Australian Open (l. eventual finalist Sabalenka)
- Contesting her 7th career WTA main draw on clay; her best result on this surface came during this year's clay court swing with SF finish at Charleston (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Bidding to become the second player born after 2005 to reach the Roland Garros 4r after Mirra Andreeva (also born in 2007)
- Owns 1-9 career record vs. Top 20 players, with sole win coming over No.8 Paolini at 2026 Australian Open
- Best tournament results this year are Hobart R-Up (l. Cocciaretto in F), Auckland SF (l. eventual champion Svitolina) and Charleston SF (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Made her Top 20 debut following her Australian Open QF result this year

### ***Osaka:***

- Through to her first Roland Garros 3r since 2019; and is looking to reach the 4r here for the first time in her career after three 3r losses in 2019, 2018 and 2016
- Career record in Grand Slam 3r matches stands at 7-13; last won a Grand Slam 3r match during SF run at 2025 US Open
- Contesting her 100<sup>th</sup> career Grand Slam main draw match today; she is 73-26 in Grand Slam matches
- Looking to become the first player from Japan to reach the Roland Garros 4r since Shinobu Asagoe in 2004
- Best career result on clay is SF run at 2019 Stuttgart (l. Kontaveit via WO)
- Holds a 6-2 record on clay in 2026, involving R16 runs at Madrid and Rome
- Most recently faced a player from USA in the semifinals at 2025 US Open (l. Anisimova)
- Contesting her 33rd Grand Slam main draw; she is a four-time Grand Slam champion, winning titles at Australian Open in 2021 and 2019, and at US Open in 2020 and 2018

## [22] Anna Kalinskaya (#24) vs. Camila Osorio (COL #86)

**Osorio leads 2-1**

### ***Kalinskaya:***

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, she is through to the 3r here for the first time after 2r run in 2024 (d. Burel in 1r, I. Andreescu in 2r), and 1r exits in 2025, 2022 and 2020
- Contesting her 22nd career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam result is QF run at 2024 Australian Open (l. eventual R-Up Zheng Qinwen)
- She is through to her sixth career Grand Slam 3r; and is bidding to reach 4r at a Grand Slam for the third time in her career today after QF run at 2024 Australian Open and 4r finish at 2024 Wimbledon
- Career-best Tour-level results on clay are QF runs at Charleston (2023, 2025 and 2026) and Strasbourg (2025)
- Best tournament finishes this year are QF finishes at Doha (l. eventual champion Muchova) and Charleston (l. Jovic)
- Owns 1-2 head-to-head record against Osorio, defeating her on their second encounter at 2022 Guadalajara, and losing to her at 2025 Beijing and 2021 Wimbledon

## ***Osorio:***

- Making 6th appearance at Roland Garros, she has reached the 3r here for the first time in her career after three 2r runs in 2022 (l. Parry), 2023 (l. Mertens) and 2024 (l. Jabeur)
- Contesting her second career Grand Slam 3r today after 3r run at 2021 Wimbledon (l. Sabalenka)
- Bidding to reach 4r at a Grand Slam for the first time in her career
- Her win over No.14 Alexandrova in the 1r here marked her 100th career Tour-level win
- All three of her career WTA singles titles have come on clay - Bogota 2025 (d. Kawa in F), Bogota 2024 (d. Bouzkova in F) and Bogota 2021 (d. Zidasek in F)
- Best result by Colombia at Roland Garros was 4r run by Fabiola Zuluaga in 2004; the last time a player from Colombia reached 3r at Roland Garros was Mariana Duque-Marino in 2017
- Owns 6-4 record on clay so far in 2026; her best result was QF finish at Rabat (l. eventual finalist Udvardy)

## **[25] Diana Shnaider (#23) vs. Oleksandra Oliynykova (UKR #65)**

**First meeting**

### ***Shnaider:***

- Making 4th appearance at Roland Garros, she is through to the 3r here for the first time in her career after 2r runs in 2025 (l. Yastremska) and 2023 (l. Haddad Maia), and a 1r exit in 2024 (l. WC Paquet)
- Bidding to reach the 4r at a Grand Slam for the second time in her career today after 4r finish at 2024 US Open
- Career record in Grand Slam 3r matches stands at 1-3; most recently fell in the 3r at 2026 Australian Open (l. Svitolina)
- One of her 5 career WTA titles was won on clay at Budapest 2024 (d. Sasnovich in F)
- So far during this year's clay court swing, made Charleston QF, Stuttgart R16 and Madrid R32
- Best result so far this season is SF run at Adelaide (l. eventual champion M. Andreeva in F)
- Won her 3rd career doubles title (first doubles title on clay) earlier this month at Rome (w/ M. Andreeva)

### ***Oliynykova:***

- Making her second Grand Slam main draw appearance and tournament main draw debut at Roland Garros
- Her 1r win here over Pridankina marked her first career Grand Slam main draw match win, after falling to Keys in the 1r at 2026 Australian Open
- Has reached a Grand Slam 3r for the first time, in just the 2nd Grand Slam main draw of her career
- Owns 3 career wins over Top 50 players, most recently No.38 Alexandra Eala at Strasbourg 2026
- Best career best result on clay is 3r run at 2026 Rome (l. Noskova); this also marked her career-best result at a WTA 1000 event
- Her Grand Slam debut at 2026 Australian Open also marked her first career Tour-level main draw appearance; she won her first career Tour-level main draw match at Cluj-Napoca, and made a run to the semifinals

**Sakkari leads 1-0**

### ***Sakkari:***

- Making 10th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best tournament result is SF in 2021 (l. eventual champion Krejcikova after holding 1 match point)
- Contesting her 41st career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam results are SFs at 2021 US Open (l. eventual champion Raducanu) and 2021 Roland Garros
- Seeking her 6th career Grand Slam R16, and first since 2022 Australian Open (l. Pegula in R16)
- 1 of her 2 career WTA singles titles has come on clay, 2019 Rabat (d. Konta in F)
- Her best tournament result so far this year is SF at WTA 1000 Doha (l. eventual champion Muchova)
- Holds a career-high ranking of World No.3, first achieved in March 2022

### ***Chwalinska:***

- Successfully qualified for this year's main draw, making her Roland Garros main draw debut
- Has reached a Grand Slam 3r for the first time, in just the 3rd Grand Slam main draw of her career
- Her previous Grand Slam main draw showings are 2025 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. 1r to Niemeier) and 2022 Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Siniakova in 1r, l. 2r to Riske-Amritraj)
- Her 2r victory over No.23 seed Elise Mertens this week was the first Top 50 win of her career (previously 0-3 vs. Top 50 players)
- Her only other Tour-level main draw showing of 2026 is QF run at Cluj-Napoca as a qualifier (l. eventual R-Up Raducanu), which was her first career WTA Tour QF
- One of 3 players from Poland to reach 3r (joining Swiatek and Linette, who faced each other in the 3r yesterday)

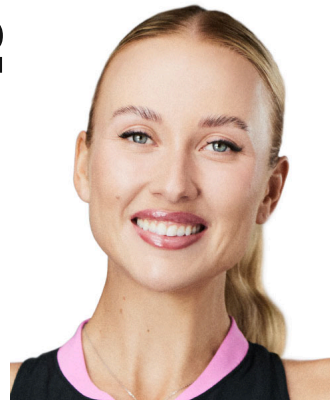

- A breakthrough season in 2025 saw her lift her first WTA title during a fairytale run on home soil at Montreal as an 18-year-old wild card, registering her first Top 10 win over No.2 Gauff along the way. Three months later she was crowned champion of WTA 250 Hong Kong.

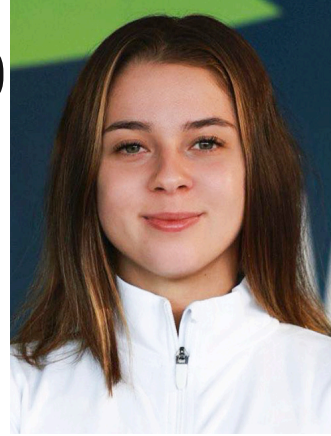

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2025, reached QF at WTA 500 events in Linz and Washington D.C.; notched Top 10 win over No.6 Paolini to make R16 at WTA 1000 Madrid
- Key result of 2024 was reaching Indian Wells final for the second time, losing to Swiatek who also defeated her in 2022 final. Also reached SF at Charleston (l. Collins). Did not play after US Open
- In 2023, won first WTA 1000 title (2nd WTA Tour singles title overall) at Guadalajara (d. Dolehide in F). Also finished R-Up at Washington (l. Gauff). Contested WTA Finals for third consecutive season (was first alternate and went 0-3 in Group Stage following Muchova withdrawal)
- Finished 2022 ranked No.6 for the second consecutive year; a four-time finalist in 2022 including runs to the final at two WTA 1000 tournaments, Indian Wells and Guadalajara; returned to the WTA Finals and advanced to the semifinals, falling to eventual champion Garcia
