MATCH NOTES – DAY 8 – SUNDAY, MAY 31

[15] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #15) vs. [3] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

Swiatek leads 3-0

Kostyuk:

- Making 7th main draw appearance at Roland Garros and is into R16 for the 2nd time; she previously posted a R16 finish here in 2021 (l. today's opponent Swiatek)
- Contesting her 25th career Grand Slam main draw; her best result across all Grand Slam events is QF run at Australian Open 2024 (l. Gauff)
- Coming off winning back-to-back clay titles at Rouen (d. Podrez in the first all-Ukrainian WTA singles final) and Madrid (d. M. Andrejeva in F)
- Her winning streak in the clay swing is up to 14-0 at Tour events (15-0 when including Billie Jean King Cup Qualifiers last month) – she is the only player undefeated so far this season on clay-court at WTA level
- This is the longest clay-court win streak to start a season on Tour (BJK Cup included) since her opponent Swiatek won her first 18 clay-court matches of the 2022 season
- Holds a 5-3 record vs. Top 10 players this year (three Top 10 wins en route to Brisbane R-Up, and two more Top 10 wins en route to Madrid title)
- Is currently at a career-high ranking of No.15, which was first achieved earlier this month on May 4th

Swiatek:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros; she is a four-time champion here in Paris, lifting the title in 2020 (d. Kenin in F), 2022 (d. Gauff in F), 2023 (d. Muchova in F) and 2024 (d. Paolini in F)
- Was the first player since Justine Henin from 2005-07 to win three Roland Garros titles in a row
- Contesting her 29th career Grand Slam main draw appearance; she owns two further Grand Slam titles, at 2022 US Open (d. Jabeur in F) and 2025 Wimbledon (d. Anisimova in F)
- Owns 43-3 record at Roland Garros - her three losses here came to Sabalenka (2025 SF), Sakkari (2021 QF) and Halep (2019 R16)
- Swiatek is the first woman to reach R16 at Roland Garros for 8 consecutive years since 2000 (Conchita Martinez with 13 between 1988 and 2000, and Arantxa Sanchez Vicario with 10 between 1991 and 2000)
- She is 9-3 on clay this season; she made her first SF of the year on the clay of Rome earlier this month (l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)

[7] Elina Svitolina (UKR #7) vs. [11] Belinda Bencic (SUI #11)

Svitolina leads 4-2

Svitolina:

- Contesting her 13th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where she is a five-time quarterfinalist, most recently last year (l. Swiatek)
- Making her 49th Grand Slam main draw appearance – this is Svitolina’s 22nd Grand Slam R16, and she is seeking her 15th career Grand Slam QF
- A four-time Grand Slam semifinalist, Roland Garros is the only Slam she is yet to reach the semifinals
- Has claimed 36 main draw wins at Roland Garros, which is the event where she has the most main draw wins in her career
- Eight of her 20 career WTA singles titles have come on clay, including WTA 1000 Rome earlier this month (d. Gauff in F) - Svitolina is undefeated in WTA clay-court finals (8-0)
- Has claimed her 9th consecutive Tour-level win on clay, equaling her career-best winning streaks on the surface which she previously achieved in both 2017 and 2025
- Since 2015 Roland Garros (Svitolina’s first career Grand Slam R16 and QF), only Madison Keys and Iga Swiatek (22 each) have made as many women’s singles Grand Slam R16s as Svitolina (22)

Bencic:

- Making 8th appearance at Roland Garros and is into R16 for the first time – her previous best tournament results were 3r showings in 2022 (l. Fernandez) and 2019 (l. Vekic)
- This is her first appearance at Roland Garros since 2023, when she fell in the opening round (l. LL Avanesyan)
- Contesting her 38th Grand Slam main draw; she is a two-time Grand Slam semifinalist, reaching SFs at Wimbledon 2025 (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and US Open 2019 (l. eventual champion Andreescu)
- This is her 12th career Grand Slam R16, and she is seeking her 5th career Grand Slam QF
- Owns 38 Tour-level wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.6 Amanda Anisimova at Miami 2026 (3-3 record vs. Top 10 players in 2026)
- Holds an 8-3 record at clay-court Tour-level events this year, also reaching QF at Charleston (l. Keys), R16 at Madrid (l. Baptiste) and R32 at Rome (l. Kalinskaya)
- On February 2, 2026, Bencic and Svitolina made history by marking the first time two mothers were ranked inside the WTA Top 10 simultaneously
- Bencic has lost her last 4 meetings vs. Svitolina, but Bencic won their only prior clay meeting (2014 Charleston)

[8] Mirra Andreeva (#8) vs. Jil Teichmann (SUI #170)

First meeting

Andreeva:

- Making her 4th career Roland Garros appearance; her best tournament result was SF in 2024 (l. eventual R-Up Paolini), and she also reached QF last year (l. wild card Boisson)
- She has become the youngest player to reach the Round of 16 at Roland Garros for three consecutive seasons since Martina Hingis in 1997-1999
- This is her 13th career Grand Slam main draw, and her SF run here in 2024 is her best Grand Slam result
- Has won 32 matches so far this year – she has the most Tour-level match-wins in 2026, followed by Rybakina and Svitolina tied for second place (both with 31, before today’s matches)
- Holds an 18-3 match record on clay this season, also leading the Tour for most clay-court match-wins in 2026
- She is the first teenager to claim 18+ WTA Tour-level clay-court wins in a calendar year since Caroline Wozniacki in 2009 (Wozniacki had 23 by the end of that season)
- Her clay-court results this year include a title run at Linz (d. Potapova in F), SF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Rybakina), R-Up at Madrid (l. Kostyuk in F) and QF at Rome (l. eventual R-Up Gauff)

Teichmann:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Roland Garros and has reached R16 here for the second time; she also posted a R16 finish here in 2022 (l. Stephens)
- Contesting her 20th career Grand Slam main draw; her R16 runs here in 2022 and this year are her best results at Grand Slam events
- Is competing in her second Tour-level main draw of the 2026 season after her semifinal run on the clay of Rabat last week (l. eventual champion Marcinko)
- Owns 9 career wins over Top 10 players, including a win over No.10 Karolina Muchova in the previous round here
- If she can notch another Top 10 win today, this would be the 2nd time in her career that she defeats two Top 10 players at the same event (during R-Up run at WTA 1000 Cincinnati in 2021, d. No.2 Osaka and No.4 Ka. Pliskova)
- Owns two career WTA singles titles, both on clay: 2019 Palermo (d. No.1 seed Bertens in F) and 2019 Prague (as a qualifier, d. wild card Muchova in F)

[18] Sorana Cirstea (ROU #18) vs. [Q] Wang Xiyu (CHN #148)

Wang leads 1-0

Cirstea:

- Making 17th main draw appearance at Roland Garros, where her best result was reaching QF in 2009 (l. Stosur)
- Contesting her 67th career Grand Slam main draw and is seeking her 3rd career Grand Slam quarterfinal - her two previous Grand Slam QFs came at 2023 US Open (l. Muchova) and 2009 Roland Garros
- This is her 6th career Grand Slam R16, and her first since her 2023 US Open QF run
- Cirstea is 16-0 at Tour-level this year vs. players ranked outside the Top 50
- Currently competing at a career-high ranking of No.18; earlier this month, she became the oldest player to make a Top 20 debut in the WTA Rankings
- Has won 28 Tour-level matches so far in 2026, with a clay-court record of 13-3
- Her top results in 2026 include 4th WTA singles title of her career at Cluj-Napoca (d. Raducanu in F); also made clay-court SFs at Rouen (gave walkover to eventual R-Up Podrez), and Rome (l. eventual R-Up Gauff)
- Aiming to become the first Romanian quarterfinalist at Roland Garros since Halep in 2019 (l. Anisimova in QF)

Wang:

- Contesting her 16th career Grand Slam main draw, and this is the first time she has reached a Grand Slam R16
- Owns 4 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.3 Maria Sakkari at 2022 US Open (0-13 vs. Top 20 players since then)
- Holds an 8-0 career Tour-level record against players from Romania, most recently a win over Todoni at 2024 Budapest
- This is her first Tour-level event since 2025 Hong Kong (l. Fernandez in 1r) – before Roland Garros, she had only played at WTA 125-level or ITF-level this year
- She has gone 18-1 at ITF-level events this season, including three titles (and the one loss was a retirement); she also made SF at WTA 125 Huzhou on clay a month ago (l. No.1 seed Erjavec)
- If she wins, this would be the second straight year that a Chinese player makes the Roland Garros QF – Zheng Qinwen reached that round here last year (l. eventual R-Up Sabalenka in QF)
- Wang defeated Cirstea in their only previous meeting, on hard court in Shenzhen in 2020

- Faces No.3 Iga Swiatek in 4r today; Kostyuk owns 14 career Top 10 wins, most recently No.8 Mirra Andreeva in the 2026 Madrid final
- Holds a 5-3 record vs. Top 10 players this year (three Top 10 wins en route to Brisbane R-Up, and two more en route to Madrid title)
- Owns 2-3 career Tour-level record against players from Poland - all three of those losses were to today's opponent Swiatek
- 2 of her 3 career WTA singles titles have come on clay: her titles this year at Madrid and Rouen (her other WTA title came on hard court at 2023 Austin)
- Best results by Ukraine at Roland Garros were Elina Svitolina's five QF runs in 2015, 2017, 2020, 2023 and 2025
- Is currently at a career-high ranking of No.15 (first achieved earlier this month on May 4th); this time last year was ranked No.25

- Swiatek is the first woman to reach the R16 at Roland Garros for 8 consecutive years since 2000 (Conchita Martinez with 13 between 1988 and 2000, and Arantxa Sanchez Vicario with 10 between 1991 and 2000)
- Faces No.15 Marta Kostyuk in 4r today; Swiatek is 2-2 vs. Top 20 players on clay this year (d. Osaka and Pegula at Rome; l. Svitolina at Rome and Andreeva at Stuttgart)
- Owns 15-3 career Tour-level record against players from Ukraine (1-2 in 2026: d. Snigur at Madrid; l. Svitolina at both Rome and Indian Wells)
- 10 of her 25 career WTA singles titles have come on clay; her most recent clay-court title is her 4th Roland Garros title in 2024 (d. Paolini in F)
- Swiatek is the only player from Poland to have won the Roland Garros title
- She is 9-3 on clay this season; she made her first SF of the year on the clay of Rome earlier this month (l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- Is currently ranked No.3; this time last year was ranked No.5. Reached World No.1 for the first time on April 4, 2022, and spent 125 weeks holding the top ranking

CAREER MILESTONES

- Best results in 2025 were three QF finishes all at WTA 1000 events: Doha (l. eventual champion Anisimova), Madrid (l. eventual champion Sabalenka) and Montreal. Made 4r at a Grand Slam for the second time in her career (after QF at 2024 Australian Open) at US Open (l. Muchova)
- Reached two WTA 500 finals in 2024 at San Diego and Stuttgart finishing runner-up at both. Also made first Grand Slam quarterfinal at Australian Open and first WTA 1000 semifinal at Indian Wells
- Earned five Top 10 wins in 2024, entered the year with only three in career and made Top 20 debut on May 6, 2024 finishing the year at No.18

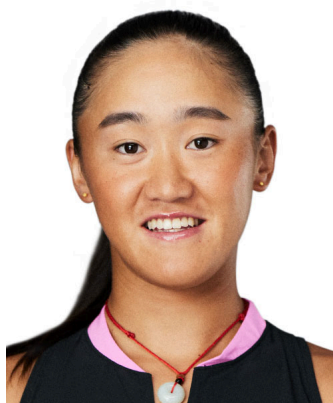
