- Errani/Vavassori are bidding to become the first team to retain the Roland Garros mixed doubles title since 2018-19, when Latisha Chan and Ivan Dodig defeated Gabriela Dabrowski and Mate Pavic in back-to-back finals.
- Last year, they defeated Evan King alongside Taylor Townsend in the final to become the first all-Italian team to win the mixed doubles title in Roland Garros history.
- Errani/Vavassori are also attempting to become the first No.1 seeds to win the Roland Garros mixed doubles title since Liezel Huber and Bob Bryan in 2009.

ERRANI QUICK HITS:

- She is a three-time Grand Slam mixed doubles champion (including last year's Roland Garros title), and is 3-0 in mixed doubles Grand Slam finals
- All of her Grand Slam mixed doubles titles have been with Vavassori: 2024 US Open (d. Young/Townsend in F), 2025 Roland Garros (d. King/Townsend in F) and 2025 US Open (d. Ruud/Swiatek in F)
- Is a six-time Grand Slam women's doubles champion: 2025 Roland Garros (w/Paolini); 2014 Wimbledon; 2014 Australian Open; 2013 Australian Open; 2012 Roland Garros; 2012 US Open (all w/Roberta Vinci)
- Won the 2024 Paris Olympics women's doubles gold medal with Paolini, and that event took place at Roland Garros (d. Mirra Andrejeva/Diana Shnaider in F)
- Errani is one of only seven women who have completed a career Golden Slam in doubles
- Has won 36 career WTA doubles titles, and spent 87 weeks ranked WTA Doubles World No.1 during her career
- She is also a former World No.5 in singles, winning 9 WTA singles titles and finishing R-Up at 2012 Roland Garros

VAVASSORI QUICK HITS:

- Partnering Bolelli also advanced to men's doubles semi-finals as No. 5 seeds and meet No. 1 seeds Granollers/Zeballos in SF.
- Bidding to win 4th Grand Slam mixed doubles title, all w/Errani, winning last year's Roland Garros title as well as US Open titles in 2024 and 2025.
- Also reached 3 Grand Slam men's doubles finals, all w/Bolelli, at 2024 Australian Open (l. to Bopanna/Ebden), 2024 Roland Garros (l. to Arevalo/Pavic) and 2025 Australian Open (l. to Heliovaara/Patten).
- Captured 13 tour-level men's doubles titles – including 3 this season, winning in Rotterdam, ATP Masters 1000 Miami and ATP Masters 1000 Rome, all w/Bolelli.
- Reached career-high men's doubles ranking of No. 6 in October 2024. Currently ranked at No. 9.

DABROWSKI QUICK HITS:

- She is a two-time Grand Slam mixed doubles champion, winning the titles at 2017 Roland Garros (w/Bopanna) and 2018 Australian Open (w/Pavic)
- Also a two-time Grand Slam mixed doubles runner-up at 2018 and 2019 Roland Garros (both w/Pavic) – she made three straight mixed doubles finals here in Paris between 2017 and 2019
- Her mixed doubles title at 2017 Roland Garros saw her become the first Canadian woman to win a Grand Slam title (non-juniors)
- Won an Olympic bronze medal with Felix Auger-Aliassime in the Paris 2024 mixed doubles event
- She is also a two-time Grand Slam champion in women's doubles, winning US Open titles in 2023 and 2025 (both w/Routliffe)
- Has won 22 career WTA doubles titles, including two this year at Dubai and Strasbourg (both w/Stefani)
- Posted a new career-high doubles ranking of No.2 earlier this year (currently ranked No.4)
- Also made women's doubles SF this fortnight (as No.4 seeds w/Stefani, vs. No.1 seeds Siniakova/Townsend)

KING QUICK HITS:

- King advanced to back-to-back Roland Garros mixed doubles finals after losing to Errani/Vavassori in last year's final with Townsend.
- Partnered with Goransson in men's doubles this week, defeating No. 16 seeds Luz/Matos in 1R en route to 3R, where they lost to No. 2 seeds Heliovaara/Patten.
- Also last year, teamed up with C. Harrison to reach Roland Garros men's doubles semi-final without dropping a set, including win over No. 2 seeds Heliovaara/Patten in QF (l. to Salisbury/Skupski in SF).
- Made Grand Slam mixed doubles debut at 2016 US Open w/Bektas (l. to Babos/Butorac in 1R) and advanced to last year's Roland Garros final in his second mixed doubles appearance.
- Attempting to become the first American mixed doubles champion at Roland Garros since Krawczyk (w/Salisbury) in 2021.
- Won 3 tour-level men's doubles titles, all w/C. Harrison, in Dallas, Acapulco and Brussels last year.
- Reached career-high men's doubles ranking of No. 14 in February 2026. Currently ranked at No. 40.
