## 2026 ROLAND GARROS

The first national French Championships for women were held in 1897, with foreign competitors eligible to take part from 1925. This year marks the 59th staging of the Open Era (which began in 1968). Of the 128 players in the singles main draw, 104 gain direct entry based on WTA Singles Rankings. In addition, there are 16 qualifiers who play three rounds of qualifying matches, as well as eight wildcards.

## PIF WTA WORLD NO.1 SCENARIOS

For the second time in her career, **Aryna Sabalenka** enters Roland Garros as the PIF WTA World No.1; this is her sixth Slam as the World No.1. Sabalenka first attained the ranking on September 11, 2023 and returned to the top spot last year on October 21 and has held the distinction since.

The WTA World No.1. Ranking will be on the line in Paris as Elena Rybakina has a chance to overtake Sabalenka. Rybakina would take over as PIF WTA World No.1 if she wins the title in Roland Garros.

Rybakina will need to reach the semifinal in order to have a chance at moving to WTA World No.1. Those scenarios could shift based on results:

- If Sabalenka reaches the R16, then Rybakina would need to reach the final.
- If Sabalenka reaches the SF, then Rybakina would need to win the title

## STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with five or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Roland Garros draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (27-1 in 1r, 96.4%):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 28 Grand Slam main draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic). Swiatek is 7-0 in first round matches at Roland Garros
- **Mirra Andreeva (11-1 in 1r, 91.7%):** Since making her Grand Slam main draw debut at 2023 Roland Garros, Andreeva is 11-1 in the opening rounds of a Slam (3-0 in Paris), with only loss coming at 2024 Wimbledon
- **Elena Rybakina (23-3 in 1r, 88.5%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel). Rybakina is 6-1 in R128 matches in Paris.
- **Madison Keys (44-6 in 1r, 88.0%):** Owns 11-2 record in opening round matches at Roland Garros. Has won 15 of her last 16 matches in first round at the Slams with only loss coming at 2025 US Open.
- **Emma Raducanu (13-2 in 1r, 86.7%):**
- **Elise Mertens (31-5 in 1r, 86.1%):** Last year's loss in the opening round at Roland Garros was her first opening round loss here (8-1 record).
- **Elina Svitolina (41-7 in 1r, 85.4%):** Svitolina is 12-0 in opening round at Roland Garros. Overall, she has won 24 of the last 25 opening round matches at the Slams.
- **Coco Gauff (22-4 in 1r, 84.6%):** Is 6-0 in opening round at Roland Garros. Has won 10 of her last 11 first round matches at the Slams with only loss in that stretch coming against 2025 Wimbledon.
- **Aryna Sabalenka (26-5, 83.9%):** Has not lost 1r at a Slam since 2020 Australian Open; since then has won 21-straight opening round matches at the Slams.

This year’s draw at Roland Garros has 24 players who are aged 30 or older. **Tatjana Maria** (38y, 304d) and **Laura Siegemund** (38y, 95d) are the two oldest players in the women’s main draw.

In the Open Era, a 30-something has won a Grand Slam title 25 times, a feat accomplished by 10 different women: **Serena Williams** (10), **Margaret Court** (3), **Martina Navratilova** (3), **Chris Evert** (2), **Billie Jean King** (2), **Ann Jones** (1), **Angelique Kerber** (1), **Li Na** (1), **Flavia Pennetta** (1) and **Virginia Wade** (1). Serena Williams is the oldest woman in the Open Era to win a Grand Slam singles title – most recently at 2017 Australian Open.

## ROLAND GARROS MISCELLANY

- This will be the 59th edition of the women’s singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era, and the 125<sup>th</sup> edition of the event all-time.
- Only five times, in 1933 (**Margaret Scriven**), 2010 (**Francesca Schiavone**), 2017 (**Jelena Ostapenko**), 2020 (**Iga Swiatek**) and 2021 (**Barbora Krejčíková**) has the singles title at Roland Garros not been won by a Top 10 seed
- The players who have won the most Roland Garros singles titles (in the tournament’s entire history) are **Chris Evert (7)**; **Stefanie Graf (6)**; **Margaret Smith Court (5)**; **Justine Henin, Helen Wills-Moody** and **Iga Swiatek (4)**; and **Hilde Sperling, Monica Seles, Arantxa Sánchez-Vicario, Serena Williams (3)**
- The players who own the most doubles titles are **Martina Navratilova (7)**, **Simonne Mathieu, Natasha Zvereva** and **Gigi Fernandez (6 apiece)**
- In 2021, **Barbora Krejčíková** became the first player since **Mary Pierce** in 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. **Lucie Safarova** also contested both the singles and doubles finals in 2015

- A left-handed player has won the singles title 10 times (most recently, **Monica Seles** in 1992)
- The singles title has been won without dropping a set 21 times (most recently, **Iga Swiatek** in 2020)
- Five players have won the title after saving match point: **Osborne DuPont** (1946); **Smith-Court** (1962); **Myskina** (2004); **Henin** (2005) and **Barbora Krejčíková** (2021)
- Only six players have won the Roland Garros women's singles title after winning the Roland Garros girls' singles title (**Halep, Durr, Jausovec, Mandlikova, Capriati** and **Henin**)
- Previous girls' singles winners in this year's main draw are: **Cornet** (2007), **Halep** (2008), **Mladenovic** (2009), **Svitolina** (2010), **Jabeur** (2011), **Kasatkina** (2014), **Badosa** (2015), **Masarova** (2016), **Gauff** (2018), **Fernandez** (2019), **Jacquemot** (2020), **Noskova** (2021)
- Chris Evert has won the most women's singles titles at Roland Garros in the Open Era, winning the event seven times. Evert is one of two players to have won the event five or more times in that span, along with Steffi Graf (6).
- Chris Evert and Steffi Graf have reached the most women's singles finals at Roland Garros in the Open Era, appearing in nine finals each over that span.
- Six players in the Open Era have won the women's singles at Roland Garros without dropping a set - Evonne Goolagong (1971), Billie Jean King (1972), Chris Evert (1974), Steffi Graf (1988), Justine Henin (2006-07) and Iga Swiatek (2020).
- Margaret Court holds the best winning percentage in the women's singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era, at 95.2% - min. 10 matches. Among active players, Iga Swiatek (94.6%) holds the highest winning percentage.
- Steffi Graf has appeared in and won the most women's singles matches at Roland Garros in the Open Era, holding a win-loss record of 84-10 at the event. Graf is the only player to have won 75+ matches at the event over that span.
- At 16y 189d, Monica Seles (1990) is the youngest winner of the women's singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Only Martina Hingis (16y 117d – Australian Open 1997) is a younger women's singles Grand Slam winner over that span.
- Only two players in the Open Era have won multiple women's singles titles at Roland Garros before the age of 20 – Steffi Graf (1987-88) and Monica Seles (1990, 1991 and 1992)
- Since 2000, Iga Swiatek (2020) is the only teenager to win the women's singles title at Roland Garros

- At 33 years old, Serena Williams is the oldest winner of the women's singles title at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Williams (2013, 2015) is one of two players in the Open Era to win multiple women's singles titles at the event after turning 30, along with Chris Evert (1985-86).
- A qualifier has never reached the women's singles final at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Nadia Podoroska (2020) has gone the furthest of any qualifier at the event in that span, losing to eventual winner Iga Swiatek in the semifinal.
- Since WTA rankings were first published in 1975, Iga Swiatek (#54, 2020) is the lowest-ranked winner of the women's singles at Roland Garros, and is the only player ranked outside the WTA Top 50 to win the event.
- A wildcard has not reached the women's singles final at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Mary Pierce (2002) has gone the furthest of any wildcard at the event, losing to eventual winner Serena Williams in the quarterfinal.
- In 2024, Iga Swiatek became the third player in the Open Era to win the women's singles at Roland-Garros for three consecutive years, after Monica Seles (1990-92) and Justine Henin (2005-07). She was also the first to win a single Grand Slam event for three straight years since Serena Williams (US Open 2012-14).
- In 2024, Iga Swiatek claimed a fourth women's singles title at Roland Garros from six appearances in the main draw at the event. In the Open Era, only Margaret Court (3/4, 75%) holds a better title win rate from main draws entered at the event.
- In the Open Era, the top seed in the women's singles at Roland Garros has lost in the opening round only once, with Angelique Kerber falling to Ekaterina Makarova in 2017.

- In 2024, **Iga Swiatek** won her fourth Roland Garros title – becoming the eighth woman to win three or more Roland Garros titles
- In 2021, **Barbora Krejčíková** won her first Grand Slam in singles on her fifth main draw appearance at the majors, and she became the first woman since 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. Having saved a match point en route, she also became the first Czech woman to win Roland Garros since Hana Mandlíková in 1981
- In 2011, **Li Na** won the title at Roland Garros as the No.6 seed, the first Asian to win a Slam singles title
- In the Open Era, the Top 2 seeds have played in the final 13 times, with the No.2 seed winning eight times (most recently 2025)
- Thirty-five of the Roland Garros women’s titles have been won by one of the Top 2 seeds; the top seed has won the title 22 times, and the No.2 seed has won the title 13 times
- The Roland Garros final has been decided in three sets on 24 occasions, most recently in 2025
