DAY 2 – TUESDAY, JUNE 30

Lois Boisson (FRA #154) vs. [2] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2)

First meeting

Boisson:

- Making her Wimbledon main draw debut; she fell in the first round of qualifying here last year (l. Branstine)
- Contesting just her third career Grand Slam main draw, having fallen in the first round at 2025 US Open (l. Golubic) after making a breakthrough semifinal run at 2025 Roland Garros as a wild card ranked No.361, defeating No.3 Pegula and No.6 Andreeva before losing to eventual champion Gauff
- Contesting just her second career Tour-level event on grass after 1r exit at 2026 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Sierra)
- This is her third career grass court match at any level; she is looking for her first career win on grass today
- Has won just one Tour-level match so far this season, defeating Wang Xinyu at Strasbourg
- Two French women have won the title here at Wimbledon – Mauresmo in 2006 and Bartoli in 2013
- Owns 2-2 career record against Top 10 players, with wins over No.3 Pegula and No.6 M. Andreeva at 2025 Roland Garros, and losses to No.2 Gauff at 2025 Roland Garros and No.9 Mboko at 2026 Strasbourg

Rybakina:

- Making her sixth main draw appearance at Wimbledon; she is a former champion here, lifting the title in 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)
- Won her second career Grand Slam trophy earlier this season at Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- She is undefeated in the first round at Wimbledon (5-0 record), she has lost only one set across those five matches, against Shelby Rogers in 2023
- Since making her Wimbledon debut in 2021, she has recorded a Tour-leading 21 match wins at the tournament, the most of any player during that span. It is also her joint-highest win total at a single event, matching Australian Open
- Has gone undefeated in her last 14 Grand Slam opening matches (last losing to Clara Burel at 2022 US Open)
- She is 1-2 so far this season on grass; falling in the 2r at London (l. wild card Boulter) and the 1r at Berlin (l. wild card Eala)
- Seeking her 300th Tour-level match win today

Taylor Townsend (USA #79) vs. [3] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

First meeting

Townsend:

- Making 6th main draw appearance at Wimbledon, her best results here are 2r finishes in 2018 (l. Sasnovich) and 2019 (l. Bertens)
- Best results across the Grand Slams are R16 runs at 2025 US Open (l. Krejčíková) and 2019 US Open (l. eventual champion Andreescu)
- Owns 3-16 career record against Top 10 players, her most win came over No.5 M. Andreeva at 2025 US Open
- She is 2-3 in the opening round at The Championships, defeating Pauline Parmentier in 2018 1r and Arina Rodionova in 2019 1r
- Is contesting her second grass event of the season, after falling in the second round of qualifying at Bad Homburg last week (l. Ruse)



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Swiatek:

- The defending champion returns to Wimbledon for the seventh time in her career, she defeated Anisimova in last year's final to claim her sixth career Grand Slam title
- Owns 28-1 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches, 5-1 at Wimbledon with her only 1r exit coming here on her debut in 2019 (l. Golubic)
- Has won in straight sets on all five of her previous Grand Slam opening matches as the defending champion
- In the Open Era, the defending Wimbledon champion has only lost twice in their opening match: Steffi Graf in 1994 (l. Lori Mcneil) and Marketa Vondrousova in 2024 (l. Jessica Bouzas Maneiro)
- Swiatek has made the 2r in all her last 26 Grand Slam events (since US Open 2019), she could become the first player to reach a 27th consecutive Grand Slam 2r since Davenport (27, between Wimbledon 1993 to Australian Open 2000)
- Among currently active players, only Serena Williams (86.8%) holds a higher winning percentage at Majors than Iga Swiatek (82.8%, 111-23)
- Last year she became the second player in the Open Era to win a Grand Slam final 6-0 6-0 after Steffi Graf at Roland Garros 1988

[6] Amanda Anisimova (USA #6) vs. [Q] Lina Gjorcheska (MKD #222)

First meeting

Anisimova:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Wimbledon; she reached her first Grand Slam final at this event last year (finished R-Up to Swiatek)
- She also reached the Wimbledon QF in 2022 (l. former champion Halep) and holds an 11-4 career main draw record at this tournament
- Her best Grand Slam results are her two R-Up showings last year, at Wimbledon and US Open (l. Sabalenka in F)
- In 2025, she led all players in Tour-level grass-court wins, with 12 (Swiatek was second place with 10)
- Her career-best results on grass are two R-Up finishes last year, at Queen's Club (l. Maria in F) and Wimbledon
- Her best tournament finish so far this year is SF run at WTA 1000 Dubai (l. eventual champion Pegula)

Gjorcheska:

- 31-year-old is making her Grand Slam main draw debut here at 2026 Wimbledon
- After successfully making it through qualifying, she becomes the first player from her country to compete in a Grand Slam main draw
- Previously played Grand Slam qualifying 12 times without making a main draw, before breaking through this time on her 13th attempt
- This will be Gjorcheska's first career meeting vs. a player ranked higher than No.40
- This is just her 2nd career Tour-level match; her one previous Tour-level match came at 2017 Biel as a lucky loser (l. 1r to eventual champion Vondrousova)
- Reached career-high ranking of No.170 in June 2017



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[8] Elina Svitolina (UKR #8) vs. Daria Snigur (UKR #77)

First meeting

Svitolina:

- Making 12th main draw appearance at Wimbledon; she has reached the semifinals here twice in her career - in 2023 (l. eventual champion Vondrousova) and 2019 (l. eventual champion Halep)
- Making her 50th Grand Slam main draw appearance; she is a four-time Grand Slam semifinalist: 2026 Australian Open, 2023 Wimbledon, 2019 US Open and 2019 Wimbledon
- She is the first player from Ukraine to achieve 50 Grand Slam main draw appearances
- Career record in Grand Slam 1r matches stands at 42-7; she last lost in the opening round of a Grand Slam at 2025 US Open (l. Bondar)
- Svitolina has claimed 22 main draw wins at Wimbledon, twice as many as any other Ukrainian player in the Open Era (Lesia Tsurenko has the second-most with 11)
- Has reached back-to-back quarterfinals on the grass at Berlin and Bad Homburg coming into this year's Wimbledon

Snigur:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, on her previous appearance in 2024 she reached 2r (d. Dodin in 1r, l. Ostapenko in 2r)
- Contesting her sixth career Grand Slam main draw, her best results are 2r finishes at 2022 US Open, 2024 Wimbledon and 2026 Roland Garros
- Reached her first career QF on grass earlier this month at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. eventual champion Montgomery)
- Owns 2 career wins over Top 10 players, defeating No.10 Haddad Maia at 2023 Nottingham and No.7 Halep at 2022 US Open
- Reached her first career Tour-level SF earlier this season at Cluj-Napoca (l. eventual champion Cirstea)

Ella Seidel (GER #100) vs. [9] Linda Noskova (CZE #12)

Noskova leads 1-0

Seidel:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, she fell in the 1r on her previous appearance in 2025 (as qualifier, l. Bouzas Maneiro)
- Contesting her fifth career Grand Slam main draw; she is looking to reach the 2r of a Major for the first time
- Owns 1-4 career record against Top 20 players, with sole win coming over No.11 Navarro at 2025 Cincinnati
- This is just her second Tour-level main draw match on grass after 1r exit at Wimbledon last year
- She is 2-11 so far this season in main draw Tour-level matches, with 2r runs at Dubai and Auckland

Noskova:

- Making 4th appearance at Wimbledon, her previous best result was reaching 4r in 2025 (l. eventual runner-up Anisimova)
- Best result across all Grand Slams was QF run at Australian Open 2024 (l. Yastremska)
- Record against opponents ranked outside the Top 50 stands at 12-2 in 2026, with the only two losses to No. 73 Gracheva at Doha and No.105 Ruse at Bad Homburg
- This is her first time being seeded amongst the Top 10 at a Grand Slam
- Won her career first singles title on grass at Berlin 2026 (d. Pegula in F); marking her second career title
- Is currently ranked No.12 - broke into the Top 10 for the first time in her career on June 22; this time last year was ranked No.27



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Nadia Podoroska (ARG #574) vs. [12] Marta Kostyuk (#13)

First meeting

Podoroska:

- Making her 4th main draw appearance at Wimbledon, on her previous appearance in 2024 she fell in the 1r (l. Yastremska); her best results are 2r runs in 2023 (l. Azarenka) and 2021 (l. Martincova)
- Best career result at a Grand Slam is SF run at Roland Garros 2020 (as a qualifier, l. eventual Champion Swiatek)
- Owns 3 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently No.8 Serena Williams at Rome 2021
- Best career result on grass is QF finish at Bad Homburg in 2021 (l. Petra Kvitova)
- This marks her first Tour-level event since Australian Open 2025 (returning from a hip injury)

Kostyuk:

- Making 6th appearance at Wimbledon; her best results here are 3r runs in 2024 and 2023 (l. Keys both times)
- Making her 26th Grand Slam main draw appearance; her career-best run at a Slam was her SF finish at 2026 Roland Garros (l. eventual Champion M. Andrejeva)
- Wimbledon is the only Grand Slam event where Kostyuk is yet to reach the R16
- Best career results on grass are R16 runs at Eastbourne in 2022 & Birmingham in 2021
- Best result by Ukraine at Wimbledon was Semi-Finalist run by Elina Svitolina in 2023 & 2019
- No.12 is the highest Kostyuk has been seeded at a Major (previous highest was No.15 at 2026 Roland Garros)

[13] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #17) vs. [Q] Robin Montgomery (USA #195)

First meeting

Paolini:

- Making 6th appearance at Wimbledon, she reached the final here in 2024 (l. Krejčíková in championship match)
- She became the first woman from Italy in the Open Era to reach the singles final at Wimbledon
- Also finished R-Up at Roland Garros in 2024 (l. Swiatek in championship match)
- First time facing an opponent ranked outside the Top 150 this season. The last time she lost to such opponents was against No. 225 Saville at Hamburg 2023
- Owns 4-1 career record in Grand Slams against qualifiers, with only loss coming against Danilovic at 2023 Roland Garros
- Is playing her second grass event of the year after falling in the 1r at Eastbourne last week (l. eventual R-Up Maria)

Montgomery:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2024 (as a qualifier, d. Gadecki in 1r, l. Jabeur)
- Contesting her 5th Grand Slam main draw; her best result across the Slams are 2r finishes here in 2024 and Roland Garros in 2025 (l. Bouzas Maneiro)
- Defeated Dolehide, Kalieva and Bassols Ribera to reach this year's main draw
- Won her maiden career Tour-level title earlier this grass court season at 's-Hertogenbosch; as a qualifier ranked No.484, she is the lowest ranked WTA titlist so far this season
- Seeking her first career Top 20 win; currently 0-4 vs. Top 20 players



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[29] Alexandra Eala (PHI #32) vs. Renata Zarazua (MEX #75)

Zarazua leads 1-0

Eala:

- Looking to reach 2r at Wimbledon for the first time after falling in her debut last year to 2024 Wimbledon champion Krejčíková
- This is her sixth Grand Slam main draw and she has reached 2r once before at 2025 US Open (l. Bucsa)
- The only other female player from the Philippines to be ranked within the Top 300 was Maricris Gentz who was ranked No.284 in 1999
- Posted her best grass court result at Eastbourne in 2025 by reaching the final (l. Joint)
- Reached the SF on grass this month at Berlin (l. eventual champion Noskova); also earned WTA 125 title at Brimingham (d. Bartunkova in F)

Zarazua:

- Making 3rd appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous and best result was reaching 2r in 2025 (l. Anisimova)
- Contesting the 12th Grand Slam main draw of her career; she is 5-6 in Grand Slam 1r matches, and has never advanced beyond the 2r of a Slam
- Owns 7 Tour wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.33 Hailey Baptiste at Charleston 2026
- Has won only one Tour level main draw match in her career on grass: at Wimbledon last year over Wickmayer
- Best result of 2026 season so far is reaching 3r at Charleston (l. Starodubtseva)

[Q] Kayla Day (USA #137) vs. [26] Madison Keys (USA #22)

Tied 1-1

Day:

- Making main draw debut at Wimbledon, having contested in qualifying in 2017, 2023-2025
- Career-best Grand Slam result is 3r run at 2023 Roland Garros (l. Schmiedlova)
- As a qualifier, defeated Brace, E. Andreeva and Kawa to make this year's main draw
- Owns 3 career wins over Top 50 players, most recently defeating today's opponent No.20 Madison Keys at Roland Garros 2023
- Has played only one Tour-level main draw match on grass in her career, at Nottingham in 2024 (l. Watson)
- Is contesting her third Tour-level main draw of the season after reaching 2r as a qualifier at Indian Wells and falling in 1r at Charleston (also as a qualifier)

Keys:

- Making 12th appearance at Wimbledon, where she was a two-time quarterfinalist - in 2015 (l. A. Radwanska) and 2017 (l. Sabalenka)
- Owns one Grand Slam singles title at Australian Open 2025 (d. Sabalenka in F); also finishes runner-up at US Open 2017 (l. Stephens in F)
- Won her fourth career grass court title at Eastbourne last week (d. Maria in F)
- Record in 1r matches at Wimbledon stands at 11-0 (45-6 overall); the last time she fell in the opening round at a Grand Slam was US Open 2025 (l. Zarazua)
- Has won 7 matches on grass in 2026, winning Eastbourne (d. Maria in F) and reaching QF at Berlin (l. eventual R-Up Pegula)



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Katie Boulter (GBR #60) vs. [Q] Tyra Caterina Grant (ITA #172)

First meeting

Boulter:

- Competing in her eighth Wimbledon main draw, her best results are 3r finishes in 2022 (l. Tan) and 2023 (l. Rybakina)
- Has won two grass court titles: Nottingham 2024 (d. Pliskova in final) and Nottingham 2023 (d. Burrage in final)
- Had the best win-by-ranking of her career at Queens 2026, defeating World No.2 Elena Rybakina in the quarterfinals
- Has not lost in the opening round at Wimbledon since 2017 (l. McHale)
- Career record in Grand Slam matches against qualifiers stands at 4-0, most recently defeated Monnet at 2025 Roland Garros
- Won her fourth career title earlier this season at Ostrava (d. Korpatsch in F)

Grant:

- Defeated Taylah Preston, Joanna Garland and Harmony Tan in qualifying to making her Grand Slam main draw debut. Only other previous Grand Slam qualifying appearance came at 2024 US Open (l. Baptiste in Q1)
- Prior to this year's Wimbledon qualifying, Grant had never played a match on grass (at any level) in her career
- A win today would be the best win-by-ranking of her career (current best win is over then-No.62 Elsa Jacquemot at Madrid 2026)
- Contesting just her fifth career Tour-level main draw, and third this season after 2r finishes at Madrid and Rome
- As a qualifier, defeated Jacquemot in the 1r at Madrid earlier this season to mark her career first Tour-level win

[WC] Serena Williams (USA unranked) vs. Maya Joint (AUS #87)

First meeting

Williams:

- Today, the 23-time Grand Slam singles champion returns to singles action for the first time since 2022 US Open
- The former World No.1 is making her 22nd appearance at Wimbledon, where she is a 7-time singles champion (2002, 2003, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2015 and 2016)
- Holds a 78-3 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches (19-2 in Wimbledon 1r matches, falling in her Wimbledon openers in her last 2 appearances here)
- She has won 8 Tour-level singles titles on grass: her 7 Wimbledon titles plus the 2012 Olympic gold medal (which she won on Wimbledon Centre Court)
- Since the inception of the WTA Tour in 1990, Williams has claimed the most WTA-level titles (73) and the most on grass court (8)
- Reached the World No.1 singles ranking for the first time on July 8, 2002, and spent 319 weeks ranked World No.1 – the third-most all-time since the WTA Rankings started in 1975, behind only Graf (377) and Navratilova (332)
- Will become the fourth-oldest player to appear in a women's singles Grand Slam main draw in the Open Era, and the second-oldest at Wimbledon (younger only than Martina Navratilova in 2004)
- She is the player with the most Women's Singles Grand Slam wins in the Open Era (367)
- Holds the fourth-highest winning percentage in Women's Singles Majors in the Open Era (86.8%, 367-56)
- Williams is the most recent American to win the Wimbledon title, in 2016 (d. Angelique Kerber in F)



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Joint:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where she fell 1r last year (l. Samsonova)
- Contesting her 8th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam results are 2r showings at 2024 US Open (as qualifier, l. Keys) and 2025 US Open (l. eventual R-Up Anisimova)
- Career-best result on grass is winning the title at 2025 Eastbourne (d. Eala in F, in 3rd-set tiebreak)
- In this year's grass swing, fell 1r at both Nottingham (l. Starodubtseva) and Eastbourne (as defending champion, l. Arango)
- Seeking her first Tour-level win since reaching Adelaide QF in January, which is her best tournament finish this year (has lost her last 11 Tour-level matches)
- Is currently ranked No.87; this time last year was ranked No.41. Reached career-high ranking of No.28 in February of this year
- Most recent Australian to win this title is Ashleigh Barty in 2021 (d. Ka. Pliskova in F)

- Former World No.1 is making her 22nd appearance at Wimbledon, where she is a 7-time singles champion (2002, 2003, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2015 and 2016)
- Today, the 23-time Grand Slam singles champion returns to singles action for the first time since 2022 US Open (l. Tomljanovic in 3r)
- Contesting the 82nd Grand Slam main draw of her career
- As a main draw wild card this year, faces No.87 Maya Joint in 1r today
- Owns 34-4 career Tour-level record against players from Australia - her most recent singles match was also against an Australian (loss to Tomljanovic in 2022 US Open 3r)
- Holds a 78-3 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches (19-2 in Wimbledon 1r matches, falling in her Wimbledon openers in her last 2 appearances here)
- She has won 8 Tour-level singles titles on grass: her 7 Wimbledon titles plus the 2012 Olympics gold medal (which she won on Wimbledon Centre Court)
- Leads all active players in Tour-level grass-court titles (Venus Williams is second place with 5, all Wimbledon titles)
- One of 18 players from United States of America in the main draw
- Serena Williams is the most recent American to win this title, in 2016 (d. Kerber in F)
- Currently unranked (to be ranked a player must earn points at 3 events OR earn 10 ranking points)
- She reached the World No.1 ranking for the first time on July 8, 2002 and spent 319 weeks ranked World No.1 - third most all-time since WTA Rankings started in 1975, behind only Graf (377) and Navratilova (332)
- Williams will become the fourth-oldest player to appear in a Women's Singles Grand Slam main draw in the Open Era, and the second-oldest at Wimbledon (younger only than Martina Navratilova in 2004)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won first two WTA Tour titles in 2025, at Rabat on clay (d. Cristian in final) and Eastbourne on grass (d. Eala in final); reached 3 additional Tour-level SFs, made Top 100 and Top 50 debuts, and finished season at career-high ranking of No.32. Also claimed first Tour doubles title at Rabat (w/Kalashnikova)
- Made Tour-level main draw debut as a qualifier at 2024 US Open (d. Siegemund for first career main draw win before falling to No.14 seed Keys); also played at Merida (lost in opening round); finished the season ranked No.119
- 2024 season also included six appearances at WTA 125 events, including a runner-up finish at 2024 Warsaw 125; made her first WTA 125 appearance in January at Canberra, advancing to QF (l. Tauson)
- Began on the ITF circuit in 2021 and 2022
- Played four singles events in 2022, ending career at 2022 US Open (d. World No.2 Kontaveit in 2r; l. Tomljanovic in 3r), until her return to singles and doubles in the 2026 grass-court swing
- Highlight of 2021 campaign came at Australian Open, where she fell in her 40th Grand Slam SF (l. eventual champion Osaka); defeated No.7 Sabalenka in R16 and No.2 Halep in QF
- Captured 73rd career title to begin 2020 campaign at Auckland, also reached SF of US Open (l. Azarenka in 3s)
- With 73 career singles titles, ranks fifth on the Open Era list of most titles, after Martina Navratilova (167), Chris Evert (154), Steffi Graf (107) and Margaret Court (92)
- Highlights of 2019 season were her 32nd and 33rd Grand Slam finals, at Wimbledon (l. Halep) and US Open (l. Andreescu)
- Reached one further final in 2019 at Toronto (ret. vs. Andreescu w/back injury). Ended 2019 ranked No.10, her first year-end finish inside the elite ranking bracket since 2016 (at No.2)
- Other highlights of 2019 were reaching QF at Australian Open and partnering with Andy Murray to contest Mixed Doubles at Wimbledon (reaching 3r)
- Defeated World No.1 Halep in R16 at 2019 Australian Open - at 37 years, is oldest player to defeat the reigning World No.1. Has registered 17 career wins over (eight different) No.1 ranked players, second-most behind Navratilova (18)
- Reached two Grand Slam finals in 2018, at Wimbledon (l. Kerber) and US Open (l. Osaka). Made return to Tour following birth of daughter Olympia at 2018 Indian Wells
- Ended 2017 ranked No.22, despite playing only two events all season, and both in January. Broke streak of 10 consecutive Top 20 finishes. Overall, has 16 Top 10 finishes to her name (most recently in 2019) - third-most behind Navratilova (20) and Evert (19) - including five as the year-end No.1
- Holds distinction of being the oldest No.1 in WTA history - set record when most recent streak began on February 18, 2013. Spent her 319th week at No.1 in May 2017. Third on all-time list after Graf's 377 weeks and Navratilova's 332
- Held the top ranking for 186 consecutive weeks (through 2016 US Open) which equaled the record held by Graf (186 weeks, August 17, 1986 through March 10, 1991)
- Until Sabalenka's \$15 million season in 2025, held single-season prize money record of

\$12,385,572, achieved in 2013, when she compiled a 78-4 win-loss record and won 11 tournaments (including two Slams and WTA Finals)

- Singles gold medalist at London 2012 Olympics
- Along w/sister Venus held all four Grand Slam titles at same time, from 2009 Wimbledon through 2010 Roland Garros - third pair to do so (also Navratilova/Shriver and Fernandez/Zvereva). Also teamed with Venus to win three Olympic gold medals: 2000 Sydney, 2008 Beijing and 2012 London
- Spent eight weeks as co-No.1 in doubles (w/V. Williams); one of six players to hold No.1 in singles and doubles simultaneously (also Navratilova, Hingis, Sánchez Vicario, Davenport and Clijsters)
- With 23 singles, 14 doubles and two mixed doubles Grand Slam titles, owns 39 majors overall
- On Grand Slam debut, at 1998 Australian Open, upset No.6 seed Spilaea in 1r before falling to sister Venus in 2r.
- Ended 1997 season by winning first WTA main draw matches during SF run at Chicago (L. Davenport).
- WTA main draw debut ended in 1r defeat at 1997 Moscow (as qualifier, L. Po)
- First match of career was defeat to Annie Miller in qualifying at 1995 Québec City.

- Currently coached by Chris Mahony
- Started playing in kindergarten, her local playground was next to the tennis courts. Dad, Michael Joint, was a pro squash player, so they used to take squash rackets to hit on the tennis courts
- Preferred surfaces are hard court and clay. Believes her game suits hard courts, and likes to slide on clay courts
- Looks up to Roger Federer and Ash Barty. Has met Ash, but not Roger
- Hobbies include reading, drawing and watching Netflix. Favorite TV shows are Friends, Seinfeld, Psych, How to Get Away with Murder, The Good Place

- Began playing at age 5 at public courts in Compton, California, coached by father, Richard Williams
- Mother is Oracene Price
- Youngest of five sisters: Lyndrea, Isha, Yetunde (died September 14, 2003) and Venus
- Charitable efforts include opening two Serena Williams Secondary Schools in Kenya (2008, 2010); touring Lagos and Johannesburg with sister Venus for 'Breaking The Mould' tour (in 2012); UNICEF International Goodwill Ambassador; and has also made many other appearances at schools and community organizations, particularly those which target at-risk youth
- Lifelong interest in fashion, with a custom-designed Nike apparel line, her own clothing line (Aneres) and her successful HSN collection of handbags and jewelry (Serena Williams Signature Statement)
- In 2017 founded Serena Ventures, a venture capital fund
- Married Reddit co-founder Alexis Ohanian in New Orleans on 16 November, 2017
- Gave birth to first daughter, Alexis Olympia Ohanian, Jr., on 1 September, 2017
- Returned to the Tour in 2018 and reached four more Grand Slam finals before retiring at 2022 US Open
- Second daughter, Adira River, arrived on 15 August, 2023.
