[25] Elise Mertens (BEL #27) vs. [2] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #2)

Rybakina leads 7-1

Mertens:

- Making 9th main draw appearance at Wimbledon; her best tournament results are R16 finishes in 2019 (l. Strycova), 2022 (l. eventual R-Up Jabeur) and last year (l. Sabalenka)
- Contesting her 38th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam result is SF at 2018 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Wozniacki)
- Owns 13 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.8 Jasmine Paolini at 2026 Rome
- Has never defeated a Top 10 player on grass (0-4 record, including her loss to No.1 Sabalenka here last year)
- One of her 10 career WTA singles titles has come on grass, at 2025 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Ruse in F)
- She is 5-3 on grass so far this year, posting R16 finishes at each of 's-Hertogenbosch, Berlin and Bad Homburg
- Her sole career win over Rybakina was on clay at 2021 Madrid; this is their first meeting on grass

Rybakina:

- Has a chance to move to No.1 in the PIF WTA Rankings after Wimbledon; needs to reach at least the QF to have a chance to overtake Sabalenka
- Making her sixth main draw appearance at Wimbledon; a former champion here, winning her first Grand Slam title here in 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)
- Won her second career Grand Slam trophy earlier this season at Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Earned her 300th career Tour-level win by defeating Lois Boisson in this week's 1r
- Is the first player since Serena Williams in 2004 to have reached R32 in each of their first six appearances at Wimbledon
- Holds an 11-5 career record in Grand Slam 3r matches (4-1 in Wimbledon 3r matches - her only loss in a Wimbledon 3r match was to Tauson last year)
- Her seven wins against Mertens is her most against a single opponent at WTA level (tied with her seven wins against Sabalenka)
- Currently ranked at a career-high of No.2 reached for the first time in March this year

[29] Alexandra Eala (PHI #32) vs. [3] Iga Swiatek (POL #3)

Tied 1-1

Eala:

- Through to the third round at Wimbledon for the first time after falling in the 1r last year (l. defending champion Krejčíková)
- In her 6th Grand Slam main draw she has reached 3r for the first time
- Becomes the first player from the Philippines, male or female to make 3r at a Grand Slam
- Seeded for the first time at a Slam
- Owns 6 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently both No.2 Elena Rybakina and No.8 Elina Svitolina on grass in Berlin last month
- Holds a 6-3 Tour-level record on grass so far this year, reaching Berlin SF (l. eventual champion Nosková), London (l. Jovic) and Bad Homburg 1r (l. Mertens)
- Opened this year's grass swing by winning the WTA 125 grass court title at Birmingham (d. Bartunková in F)
- Defeated Swiatek in their first meeting at 2025 Miami on hard court

Swiatek:

- The defending champion is at Wimbledon for the seventh time in her career; she defeated Anisimova in last year's final to claim her sixth career Grand Slam title
- Holds a 22-4 career record in Grand Slam 3r matches (3-2 in Wimbledon 3r matches – she lost in this round at Wimbledon to Cornet in 2022 and Putintseva in 2024)
- Is the only player to have reached 3r at all 26 Grand Slam events held this decade (since 2020)
- She has become the third woman in the Open Era to reach R32 for 26+ consecutive Grand Slam events, after Martina Navratilova (35 between Wimbledon 1980 and Australian Open 1989) and Conchita Martínez (30 between Australian Open 1993 and Roland Garros 2000)
- Went 10-1 on grass last year, notching the second most grass court Tour-level wins in 2025 (behind only Anisimova's 12)
- Among currently active players, only Serena Williams (86.6%) holds a higher winning percentage at majors than Iga Swiatek (83.1%, 113-23) - minimum 10 matches
- Currently ranked No.3; she reached World No.1 for the first time on April 4, 2022 and held the top ranking for 125 weeks in total

[6] Amanda Anisimova (USA #6) vs. [26] Madison Keys (USA#22)

Anisimova leads 1-0

Anisimova:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Wimbledon; she reached her first Grand Slam final here last year (finished R-Up to Swiatek)
- Also reached Wimbledon QF in 2022 (l. former champion Halep); holds 12-4 career main draw record at Wimbledon
- Has won seven of the nine career Grand Slam meetings against players from USA, including defeating Kenin in previous round here
- Wimbledon is the Grand Slam where Anisimova holds the highest main draw winning percentage in her career (76.5%, 13-4)
- Holds a 7-9 Grand Slam record against former Slam champions
- Has reached 3r at all of the first three Slams of the season for the second time in her career after having achieved the feat in 2022
- Served 20 aces against Kenin in the previous round, her highest career tally in a single Tour level main draw match

Keys:

- Making 12th appearance at Wimbledon; she is a two-time quarterfinalist - in 2015 (l. A. Radwanska) and 2017 (l. Sabalenka)
- Contesting 52nd career Grand Slam main draw; owns one Slam title at 2025 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F)
- Among currently active players, only Serena Williams (367) and Venus Williams (271) have claimed more main draw wins than Keys (130) at Grand Slams
- Has won a Tour-leading 9 matches on grass in 2026, winning Eastbourne (d. Maria in F) and reaching QF at Berlin (l. eventual R-Up Pegula)
- Among currently active players, only Serena Williams (107) and Venus Williams (98) have claimed more Tour level grass court wins than Keys (61)
- Has won her last seven matches after winning her fourth grass court title at Eastbourne last week (d. Maria in F)
- This is her longest streak since last season when she won back-to-back title at Australian Open and Adelaide and then reached SF at Indian Wells for 16 consecutive match wins

[17] Sorana Cirstea (ROU #18) vs. [9] Linda Noskova (CZE #12)

Cirstea leads 3-2

Cirstea:

- Making 17th appearance at Wimbledon and looking to reach R16 for the first time after making R32 six times including this year
- Contesting her 68th career Grand Slam main draw, ranked No.4 for most Slam appearances after Serena Williams (95), Venus Williams (82) and Victoria Azarenka (69)
- In May, after a semifinal run at Rome, made her PIF WTA Rankings Top 20 debut, becoming the oldest player to make her Top 20 debut at 36 years old
- Has faced Noskova four times already this season with a record of 3-1; this is their first career meeting on grass
- Won her 4th career title earlier this season at Cluj-Napoca (d. Raducanu in F)

Noskova:

- Making 4th appearance at Wimbledon, her best previous result was reaching 4r in 2025 (l. eventual runner-up Anisimova)
- Looking to reach 4r at a Slam for the third time in her career after here last year and reaching QF at Australian Open 2024 (l. Yastremska)
- This is her first time being seeded amongst the Top 10 at a Grand Slam
- Won her first grass court title at Berlin 2026 (d. Pegula in F) marking her second career title; also won the doubles title in Berlin completing the singles/doubles title sweep, 1 of 2 players to complete a sweep this year after Bucsa at Merida
- Is currently ranked No.12 - broke into the Top 10 for the first time in her career last month; this time last year was ranked No.27

[23] Emma Navarro (USA #26) vs. [12] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #13)

Navarro leads 4-0

Navarro:

- In her 4th appearance at Wimbledon, she posted her best result in 2024 with quarterfinal (l. eventual R-Up Paolini)
- Best result across all Grand Slams is SF at US Open 2024 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)
- Reached her first Tour-level final on grass earlier this season at Nottingham (l. Bouzkova in F)
- Has defeated Kostyuk four times, with the most recent on grass at 2025 Bad Homburg
- Career record in Grand Slam 3r matches stands at 5-2; her most recent Grand Slam 3r appearance was at 2025 US Open (l. Krejčíková in 3r)
- Has won 18 matches so far in 2026 including winning her third career Tour-level title at Strasbourg

Kostyuk:

- Looking to reach 4r at Wimbledon for the first time after posting 3r finishes in 2023 and 2024 (l. Keys on both occasions); Wimbledon is the only Grand Slam she is yet to reach 4r
- Best result across all majors is semifinal at Roland Garros 2026 (l. eventual champion M. Andrejeva)
- Prior to this year's Wimbledon, she hadn't won a match on grass since 2024 Wimbledon (0-3 on grass last season)
- She is 8-0 so far this season against players from United States of America, with her most recent win over Volynets at Roland Garros
- Has won 24 matches so far in 2026; she went 16-1 during the clay court season, winning Rouen and Madrid back-to-back and reaching SF at Roland Garros

[13] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #17) vs. Maria Sakkari (GRE #43)

Sakkari leads 3-2

Paolini:

- In her 6th Wimbledon main draw she reached the final here in 2024 (l. Krejčíková in final) to become the first woman from Italy to reach the singles final at Wimbledon in the Open Era
- Contesting her 27th career Grand Slam main draw; she is a 2-time Grand Slam R-Up, also finishing R-Up at Roland Garros 2024 (l. Świątek in final)
- Is playing her second grass event of the year after falling in 1r at Eastbourne last week (l. eventual R-Up Maria)
- Has a 2-6 match record against Top 50 players this season with only wins over No.47 Siegemund at Madrid and No.45 Yastremska at Roland Garros
- Her 2024 Wimbledon final is her only career grass court final; also reached semifinals on grass at Bad Homburg 2025 (l. Świątek) and Eastbourne 2024 (l. Kasatkina)
- Her best tournament finish this year is SF at WTA 500 Merida (l. eventual champion Bucsa)

Sakkari:

- Making 10th appearance at Wimbledon
- This is her 5th trip to the Wimbledon 3r, but she has not yet advanced to the R16 here (0-4 in Wimbledon 3r matches)
- Contesting her 42nd career Grand Slam main draw; her best Slam results are SFs at 2021 Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Krejčíková) and 2021 US Open (l. eventual champion Raducanu)
- Seeking her first Grand Slam R16 appearance since 2022 Australian Open (l. Pegula)
- Best career results on grass are back-to-back Berlin SFs in 2022 (l. eventual R-Up Bencic) and 2023 (l. eventual R-Up Vekic)
- Her best tournament finish so far this year is SF at WTA 1000 Doha (l. eventual champion Muchova)

Liudmila Samsonova (#41) vs. [21] Marie Bouzkova (CZE #23)

Samsonova leads 3-2

Samsonova:

- Making her 5th main draw appearance at Wimbledon; she posted her best result here last year QF (l. eventual champion Świątek)
- Her 2r win over No.15 Shnaider was her third career Grand Slam win over a Top 20 player (also defeated No.18 Kasatkina in 3r at Wimbledon 2025 and No.14 Fernandez in 2r at US Open 2022)
- This is her second main draw Grand Slam meeting with Bouzkova after defeating her in 2r at US Open in 2024 (also took the win over Bouzkova in qualifying at 2019 Roland Garros)
- Two of her five career Tour-level titles have come on grass: 's-Hertogenbosch 2024 (d. Andreescu in F) and Berlin 2021 (d. No.12 Bencic in F)

Bouzkova:

- Contesting her 7th consecutive main draw at Wimbledon; her best result was reaching QF in 2022 (l. finalist No.2 Jabeur) which is also her best result across Slams
- Victories over Talia Gibson and Tyra Caterina Grant so far this week brings her Wimbledon career total to 12 match wins, her most at any of the Slams (has seven career wins at Roland Garros)
- Won her first Tour-level title on grass last week at Nottingham (d. Navarro in F); her second title of 2026 after Bogota
- Seeking her first win against a Top 50 player at a Grand Slam since 1r at Wimbledon 2025 (d. No.47 Sun); four of her seven career victories at Grand Slams versus Top 50 opponents have come at Wimbledon
- Currently on a seven-match win streak following her Nottingham title; also won seven straight in 2025 (won the title at Prague during this stretch)

Daria Snigur (UKR #77) vs. [Q] Ashlyn Krueger (USA #102)

First meeting

Snigur:

- This is her second Wimbledon main draw; on her debut in 2024 she reached 2r (as a qualifier, d. Dodin in 1r, I. Ostapenko in 2r)
- Competing in her 6th career Grand Slam main draw; she is through to 3r of a Slam for the first time
- Earlier this grass court swing, made first career quarterfinal on grass at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. eventual champion Montgomery), then at Eastbourne qualified and fell in 1r (l. Kalinina)
- Defeated No.8 Elina Svitolina in 1r to register her third career win over a Top 10 player (also defeated No.10 Haddad Maia at 2023 Nottingham and No.7 Halep at 2022 US Open)
- Looking for her first career win over a player from United States of America with a current record of 0-6 (0-2 in 2026 with losses to Montgomery at 's-Hertogenbosch and Stearns at Roland Garros)
- Best result by Ukraine at Wimbledon is semifinal by Elina Svitolina in 2023 and 2019

Krueger:

- Has reached 3r at Wimbledon for the first time in her third main draw appearance here (previous best was 2r in 2025, l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Contesting her 14th career Grand Slam main draw; she is through to the 3r of a Slam for the second time in her career after 2024 US Open (l. Samsonova)
- She is 15-1 so far this season on the grass (across all levels); reached the semifinals at WTA 125 Birmingham (l. Bartunkova) and won the title at WTA 125 Ilkley (d. Naef in F)
- Her best Tour-level result on grass is quarterfinal at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Hruncakova)
- Best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon was semifinal by Alexandra Stevenson from USA in 1999
- One of three players to reach the 3r this week that are ranked outside the Top 100 along with No. 164 Sawangkaew and No.146 Liu

- Went 5-3 during last year's grass court swing: made QF at London (l. eventual champion Maria), QF at Berlin (l. Sabalenka), and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Tauson)
- Is currently ranked a career-high No.2 (reached for the first time in March of this year); this time last year was ranked No.11
- Has a chance to move to No.1 in the PIF WTA Rankings after Wimbledon; needs to reach at least the QF to have a chance to overtake Sabalenka
