FIRST MEETING

GUO/MLADENOVIC QUICK HITS

- Guo and Mladenovic teamed up for the first time at Auckland at the start of this year – and they won that title (d. Xu/Yang in F)
- At the previous Grand Slams this year, they reached R16 at Australian Open (l. Birrell/Gibson) and made QF at Roland Garros (l. Aoyama/Liang)
- This is their 7th Tour-level event together (including Grand Slams); other key results this year include SF at Queen's, London (l. eventual champions Mihalikova/Nicholls) and QF at Indian Wells (l. Errani/Paolini)
- Their team win-loss record stands at 17-5 in Tour-level events

GUO QUICK HITS

- This is her first career Grand Slam final in any discipline
- Prior to this run, her career-best Grand Slam result was QF at 2026 Roland Garros (w/Mladenovic, l. Aoyama/Liang)
- This is her third appearance in the Wimbledon Ladies Doubles event – she fell 1r in 2024 (w/Jiang, l. Fernandez/Shibahara) and made 2r last year (w/Panova – l. today's opponent Stefani w/Babos)
- Cracked the doubles Top 20 in 2025, and reached career-high ranking of No.18 on April 6, 2026
- Has won 6 Tour-level doubles titles, including Auckland this January (w/Mladenovic)
- One of her Tour-level titles has come on grass, at 2025 Bad Homburg (w/Panova)
- Bidding to become the fourth player representing China to win the Ladies' Doubles title at Wimbledon after Yan Zi (now HKG, was representing China at the time) and Zheng Jie won the trophy together in 2006, and Peng Shuai claimed the title in 2013 (w/Hsieh)



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MLADENOVIC QUICK HITS

- Has won 6 Grand Slam women's doubles titles – 2016 and 2022 Roland Garros w/Garcia; 2019 and 2020 Roland Garros w/Babos; 2018 and 2020 Australian Open w/Babos
- This is her 12th career Grand Slam women's doubles final, and her first since 2024 US Open (w/Zhang, I. L. Kichenok/Ostapenko in F)
- This is her 2nd women's doubles final at Wimbledon – her first career Grand Slam women's doubles final came here in 2014 (w/Babos, I. Errani/Vinci in F)
- She also has won 3 Grand Slam mixed doubles titles, and made 3 further mixed doubles Grand Slam finals, including one earlier this year at Australian Open (w/Guinard, I. defending champions Gadecki/Peers in F)
- Reached WTA Doubles World No.1 for the first time on June 10, 2019, and held the top ranking for a total of 12 weeks
- Has won 30 Tour-level doubles titles, including Auckland this January (w/Guo)
- One of her Tour-level titles has come on grass, at 2018 Birmingham (w/Babos)
- Has also reached a career-high singles ranking of No.10 in October 2017
- Bidding to become the first woman from France in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon Ladies' Doubles trophy



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DABROWSKI/STEFANI QUICK HITS

- Contesting their first Grand Slam final as a team
- This is their 5th Grand Slam event as a team, and they have reached the semifinals or better at four of those events
- They previously reached three Grand Slam semifinals as a pairing, at 2021 US Open (ret. vs. Gauff/McNally due to Stefani's knee injury) and both of this year's previous Slams - 2026 Australian Open (l. Danilina/Krunic) and 2026 Roland Garros (l. eventual champions Siniakova/Townsend)
- They hold a 34-7 team record in 2026, and have won three team titles this year at Dubai, Strasbourg and Eastbourne – they are 3-0 in finals this year
- The team is currently on a 9-match winning streak, having won the title two weeks ago on the grass of Eastbourne (d. Maleckova/Skoch in F)
- They have won 5 Tour doubles titles as a team – along with their 3 titles this year, they also paired up for titles at 2021 Montreal and 2022 Chennai
- Dabrowski and Stefani teamed up for the first time on Tour at 2020 Ostrava – they reached the final or won the title at their first four Tour-level events as a team
- They have played 11 events as a pairing in 2026 – this year marks their first tournaments together since 2023 Roland Garros

DABROWSKI QUICK HITS

- Has won 2 Grand Slam women's doubles titles – 2025 & 2023 US Open (w/Routliffe)
- This is her 3rd career Wimbledon Ladies' Doubles final, after 2024 (w/ Routliffe) and 2019 (w/Xu)
- She also has won 2 Grand Slam mixed doubles titles, and made 3 further mixed doubles Grand Slam finals, including one earlier this year at Roland Garros (w/King, l. defending champions Errani/Vavassori in F)
- Reached a career-high doubles ranking of World No.2 in February 2026
- Has won 23 Tour-level doubles titles, including three this year at Eastbourne, Strasbourg and Dubai (all w/Stefani)
- Bidding to become the first woman from Canada in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon Ladies' Doubles trophy



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STEFANI QUICK HITS

- This is her first career Grand Slam Ladies' Doubles final; she owns one Grand Slam Mixed Doubles trophy which came at 2023 Australian Open (w/Matos).
- She also reached the Wimbledon Mixed Doubles final with Salisbury in 2025 (l. Siniakova/Verbeek in F)
- Prior to this run, her career-best Grand Slam results were SF runs at Australian Open in 2026, Roland Garros in 2026 and US Open in 2023 and 2021
- This is her sixth appearance in the Wimbledon Ladies' Doubles event – prior to this year her best runs at the event were QF finishes in 2025 (w/Babos) and 2023 (w/Garcia)
- Reached a career-high doubles ranking of No.7 last month
- Has won 16 Tour-level doubles titles, including three this year at Eastbourne, Strasbourg and Dubai (all w/Dabrowski)
- Two of her Tour-level titles have come on grass, at 2026 Eastbourne (w/Dabrowski) and 2023 Berlin (w/Garcia)
- Bidding to become the first woman from Brazil to win the Ladies' Doubles title at Wimbledon in the Open Era
