### SEMIFINAL QUICK HITS

- Youngest remaining: Linda Noskova (21 years old)
- Oldest remaining: Karolina Muchova (29 years old)
- If both Czechs Muchova and Noskova win their SFs, it would be the first time two women representing the same nation reach the final at a Grand Slam since 2017 US Open (USA - Sloane Stephens d. Madison Keys)
- If both Kostyuk and Gauff progress to the final, it will be the first time in the Open Era that two players meet in their maiden grass court Tour-level finals at Wimbledon
- The most recent Czech woman to win the Wimbledon title is Barbora Krejckova in 2024. The most recent American woman to win the Wimbledon title is Serena Williams, who won her 7th Wimbledon title in 2016
- Kostyuk is attempting to become the first Ukrainian woman to reach a Grand Slam final in the Open Era
- In the last two years, Linda Noskova (18) has won more matches on grass than any other player on Tour ahead of Elise Mertens (15), Emma Navarro (15) and Amanda Anisimova (15)
- Since the start of this year's European clay swing in April, only Mirra Andrejeva (23) has claimed more match-wins at Tour-level than Marta Kostyuk (22)
- With their results this fortnight, both Gauff and Muchova have now made the semifinals or better at all four Grand Slam events

### [10] Karolina Muchova (CZE #9) vs. [7] Coco Gauff (USA #7)

Gauff leads 6-1

#### **Muchova:**

- Making 7th main draw showing at Wimbledon, and has reached the semifinals here for the first time
- Her previous best Wimbledon finishes were quarterfinals in 2019 (l. Svitolina) and 2021 (l. Kerber)
- With her result this fortnight, she has now made the semifinals or better at all four Grand Slam events
- She has become the fourth woman competing for Czech Republic in the Open Era to make the SFs at all four Grand Slam events after Hana Mandlikova, Jana Novotna and Karolina Pliskova
- Contesting her 28th Grand Slam main draw; she has reached one Grand Slam final at 2023 Roland Garros (finished R-Up to Swiatek in F)
- This is her 5th career Grand Slam semifinal - her 3 further Grand Slam SFs all came on hard court at 2021 Australian Open (l. Brady), 2023 US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff) and 2024 US Open (l. Pegula)
- Her five wins this week are her first victories at Wimbledon since her 2021 QF run
- Currently on a 9-match winning streak, having won the title at her event prior to Wimbledon at Bad Homburg (d. Osaka in F, via ret.) – this is her career-best winning streak at Tour-level
- 2026 Bad Homburg was also the first grass court title of her career
- Holds a 10-1 record on grass this year; along with Bad Homburg title, she also reached Berlin R16 (l. Keys)
- Owns 20 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.7 Elina Svitolina in 2026 Stuttgart SF (also defeated today's opponent Gauff in QF of that event)
- Her win over Gauff in the 2026 Stuttgart QF on clay (their most recent meeting) was her first victory in their 7 career meetings
- Has won 2 titles this year at Doha (d. Mboko in F) and Bad Homburg, and was also R-Up at 2026 Stuttgart (l. Rybakina in F)

#### **Gauff:**

- Making 7th appearance at Wimbledon; she has reached the quarterfinals and semifinals here for the first time in her career after three previous R16 exits in 2019, 2021 and 2024
- This is her 6th career Grand Slam SF (her first since title run at 2025 Roland Garros)
- With her result this fortnight, she has now made the semifinals or better at all four Grand Slam events
- Gauff is the youngest woman to reach semifinals at all four Grand Slam events since Maria Sharapova (who achieved the feat at 2007 Roland Garros)
- Gauff is the youngest American woman to reach the Wimbledon SF since Serena Williams's title run in 2003
- Contesting her 28th career Grand Slam main draw; she is a 2-time Grand Slam champion, winning titles at 2023 US Open and 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in both finals)
- Seeking her 4th career Grand Slam final; along with her 2 Grand Slam titles, she was also R-Up at 2022 Roland Garros (l. Swiatek in F)
- Bidding to become the fourth currently active woman to reach Grand Slam finals on all three surfaces after Venus Williams, Serena Williams and Iga Swiatek
- Her 5 wins so far this fortnight are her first grass-court wins since she defeated Kartal in 2024 Wimbledon 3r
- Owns 36 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.4 Jessica Pegula in their QF match on Tuesday
- Seeking her first grass court final of career – she has also made grass court SFs at 2022 Berlin (l. eventual champion Jabeur), 2023 Eastbourne (l. eventual champion Keys) and 2024 Berlin (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Gauff is 15-8 so far this season in three-set matches; she leads the Tour in three-set match wins (including four consecutive three-set victories at this event)
- Defeated Muchova in their first 6 meetings before losing to her in their most recent meeting, in the 2026 Stuttgart QF on clay

**Kostyuk leads 1-0**

### ***Kostyuk:***

- Making sixth main draw appearance at Wimbledon; she is through to the SF here for the first time in her career
- Prior to this year's tournament, Wimbledon was the only Grand Slam event where Kostyuk had yet to reach R16
- Contesting her 26th career Grand Slam main draw and is into her 2nd career Grand Slam semifinal, which have occurred at consecutive Slams
- She just made her first Grand Slam semifinal at 2026 Roland Garros (l. eventual champion Andreeva)
- Bidding to become the first Ukrainian woman in the Open Era to reach the final at a Grand Slam event
- Has become the 2nd woman from Ukraine to reach the Wimbledon SF, following SF runs by Elina Svitolina in 2019 and 2023
- Owns 22 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.17 Jasmine Paolini in yesterday's QF
- Seeking her first grass court final of career - this fortnight's run is already her first time reaching QF and beyond of a grass court event
- Prior to this year's Wimbledon, she hadn't won a match on grass since 2024 Wimbledon (0-3 on grass last season, and did not play a grass court event this year before Wimbledon)
- Defeated Noskova in their only prior meeting, on clay at 2026 Madrid – Kostyuk went on to win that title

### ***Noskova:***

- Making her 4th Wimbledon main draw appearance, and she has advanced to a Grand Slam semifinal for the first time in her career
- Her previous best Wimbledon result was a 4r showing last year (l. eventual R-Up Anisimova)
- She has become the youngest Wimbledon semifinalist since Jelena Ostapenko in 2018
- She is also the youngest Czech player to reach the Wimbledon semifinals since Petra Kvitova in 2011, who went on to win the title that year
- Owns 21 Tour-level wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.18 Cirstea in this fortnight's 3r
- Has posted 18 grass court Tour-level wins since the start of last year – the most by any player in that time frame
- Holds a 10-1 record on grass this year, surpassing her previous career-high of 8 grass court wins in a single season, set in 2025
- Won her first grass court title at 2026 Berlin (d. Pegula in F), marking her second career title
- Also won the doubles title in Berlin, completing the singles/doubles title sweep - 1 of 2 players to complete a sweep this year after Bucsa at Merida
- Currently ranked No.12 – she made her Top 10 debut last month after winning the Berlin title
- This is her first time being seeded amongst the Top 10 at a Grand Slam event

## PROJECTED RANKING WATCH

The winner of Kostyuk vs. Noskova will reach the Top 10 after Wimbledon (which would be Kostyuk's Top 10 debut).

Kostyuk: Title = No.6 or No.7 (if Muchova in final) ... R-UP = No.8 ... SF = No.11

Noskova: Title = No.6 or No.7 (if Muchova in final) ... R-UP = No.8 ... SF = No.11

Muchova will set a new career-high ranking after Wimbledon (current career-high No.8). If she wins the title, she would climb to No.4. ... If she is runner-up, she will climb to No.6 ... If she loses in SF, she will be No.6, or No.7 if Kostyuk or Noskova win the title.

By reaching SF, Gauff is projected to move back into the Top 5 - either at No.4 or No.5 (if Muchova wins the title). ... If Gauff wins the title, she will move to No.3, ahead of Pegula as the top-ranked American.
