DAY 1 – MONDAY, JUNE 29

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#1) vs. [Q] Teodora Kostovic (SRB #184)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Making seventh Wimbledon appearance, she reached the semifinals in her last three visits here: 2021 (l. Pliskova), 2023 (l. Jabeur) and 2025 (l. Anisimova)
- This is her 33rd Grand Slam main draw; she is a four-time major champion, lifting titles at Australian Open (2023-24) and US Open (2024-25)
- This is her seventh consecutive Grand Slam appearance as top seed; since 2000, only Serena Williams (15), Iga Swiatek (11) and Martina Hingis (8) have had more consecutive major appearances as No.1 seed
- In the Open Era, the top seed has only lost three times in the opening round at Wimbledon: Steffi Graf in 1994 (l. Lori Mcneil) and Martina Hingis in 1999 (l. Jelena Dokic) and 2001 (l. Virginia Ruano Pascual)
- She is undefeated at Grand Slams against qualifiers (11-0); has also never lost a set to a qualifier at a Grand Slam
- She has won a Tour-leading three WTA singles titles in 2026 (level with M. Andrejeva); at Brisbane, and the Sunshine Double of Indian Wells and Miami
- Won her last 22 Grand Slam opening matches, she was last defeated in the 1r at a major by Carla Suarez Navarro at 2020 Australian Open
- Best career results on grass are runner-up finishes at 2022 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova) and 2018 Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki)

Kostovic:

- Defeated Yeon Woo Ku, Rebecca Sramkova and Zhu Lin in her maiden career Grand Slam qualifying event to reach her first Grand Slam main draw
- Had never played a match (at any level) on grass prior to this year's Wimbledon qualifying
- Contesting her 3rd career Tour-level main draw after 2025 Madrid (as a qualifier, l. Lys) and 2026 Abu Dhabi (as a wild card, l. Baptiste)
- This is her first career meeting against a player ranked inside the Top 50
- Best career result by ranking was a win over No.76 Petra Marcinko at WTA 125 Dubrovnik earlier this season
- Reached her second career WTA 125 semifinal earlier this season at WTA 125 Oeiras (l. Golubic)
- Only player from Serbia contesting this year's main draw
- Best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon was SF finish by Alexandra Stevenson in 1999



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[4] Jessica Pegula (USA #4) vs. Darja Vidmanova (CZE #92)

First meeting

Pegula:

- Making 7th main draw appearance at Wimbledon, her best result here is QF finish in 2023 (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- Overall this is her 30th Grand Slam main draw appearance and she has reached at least the quarterfinal stage at all the Slams - US Open final in 2024, QF at Roland Garros in 2022 and SF at 2026 Australian Open
- Coming off the back of reaching her third career final on grass, finishing runner-up at Berlin (l. Noskova in F)
- Two of her 11 career Tour-level titles have come on grass; at 2025 Bad Homburg (d. Swiatek in F) and 2024 Belin (d. Kalinskaya in F)
- Will be the first player to appear within the Top 5 seeds at Wimbledon after having turned 32 since Serena Williams in 2016 when she claimed the title
- Owns 10-1 record this season vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 50, only loss came against No.83 Birrell in the 1r at Roland Garros

Vidmanova:

- Contesting her maiden Grand Slam singles main draw after falling in qualifying at 2025 US Open and 2026 Australian Open
- This is her sixth career Tour-level main draw appearance, she has won one Tour-level match in her career, defeating Parks at 2025 Guadalajara on her Tour-level main draw debut
- Reached semifinals on the grass at Ilkley WTA 125 earlier this month (l. eventual champion Krueger); today marks her first career Tour-level match on grass
- This is her first career meeting against a Top 20 player, and her second against a Top 50 player after loss to No.31 Bucsa at 2026 Indian Wells
- Reached her maiden WTA 125 final earlier this season at Oeiras 125 Indoor (l. Korneeva in F)

Magda Linette (POL #59) vs. [5] Mirra Andreeva (#5)

Andreeva leads 3-1

Linette:

- Making her 11th consecutive main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2023, 2021 and 2019
- Looking for her third 1r victory at a Grand Slam this year. Overall, has won four of her last six opening matches at Wimbledon
- Owns eight wins in her Tour-level career over Top 10 players, most recently No.3 Swiatek at Miami in 2026
- Has won four matches at Grand Slams against Top 10 players, with her most such victory coming in 4r at Australian Open in 2023 (d. No.4 Caroline Garcia)
- Twelve of her 18 Tour-level victories in 2026 have come via a decider (12-2 in deciders in 2026)

Andreeva:

- Contesting her 4th main draw at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching QF in 2025 (l. Bencic)
- First teenager to appear at Wimbledon in Ladies' Singles as a Top 5 seed since Caroline Wozniacki in 2010
- Seeking to become the first player since Serena Williams in 2015 to win Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same year
- Has won 12 of her 13 opening round matches at Grand Slams (only loss was in 1r at Wimbledon in 2024 to Brenda Fruhvirtova)
- Has defeated Linette once already this year at Doha (2r) and this is their first meeting on grass
- Holds a 24-4 career record at Grand Slams against opponents ranked outside the Top 50 (7-0 in such matches at Grand Slams this year)



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Tamara Korpatsch (GER #78) vs. [7] Coco Gauff (USA #7)

Korpatsch leads 1-0

Korpatsch:

- Making 4th main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best tournament result was 2r in 2023 as a lucky loser (l. Stevanovic)
- Her best Grand Slam performance occurred at the most recent Slam, when she reached 3r at 2026 Roland Garros (l. Svitolina)
- Holds a 0-4 career record vs. Top 10 players (0-1 this year, l. Svitolina at Roland Garros)
- Has won two Tour-level matches on grass in her career (d. Peterson in 2021 Bad Homburg 1r; d. Zhao in 2023 Wimbledon 1r)
- Best tournament result so far this year is making 2nd career final at Ostrava (finished R-Up to Boulter)
- Defeated today's opponent Gauff in their only previous meeting, in qualifying at 2019 Linz – however, Gauff went on to win that title as a lucky loser (Gauff's first WTA singles title, at age 15)

Gauff:

- Making 7th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best tournament results are R16 finishes in 2019 (l. eventual champion Halep), 2021 (l. Kerber) and 2024 (l. Navarro)
- She is a 2-time Grand Slam champion, winning titles at 2023 US Open and 2025 Roland Garros (d. Sabalenka in both finals)
- Holds a 23-4 record in Grand Slam 1r matches (4-2 in Wimbledon 1r matches)
- Best career results on grass are SFs at 2022 Berlin (l. eventual champion Jabeur), 2023 Eastbourne (l. eventual champion Keys) and 2024 Berlin (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Best tournament finishes so far this year are R-Up showings at WTA 1000 events in Miami (l. Sabalenka in F) and Rome (l. Svitolina in F)
- Has lost her last four grass court matches – her most recent win on grass was over Kartal in 2024 Wimbledon 3r

[10] Karolina Muchova (CZE #9) vs. Anastasia Zakharova (#85)

Muchova leads 1-0

Muchova:

- Making 7th appearance at Wimbledon, where she is a two-time quarterfinalist in 2021 (l. Kerber) and 2019 (l. Svitolina)
- Contesting her 28th Grand Slam main draw; her runner-up finish at Roland Garros 2023 marked her best Grand Slam result
- She has also reached a further three Grand Slam semifinals, all on hard court at 2021 Australian Open (l. Brady), 2023 US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff) and 2024 US Open (l. Pegula)
- Won the first grass court title of her career last week at Bad Homburg (d. Osaka in final via ret.)
- Looking to defeat Zakharova in the 1r of a Grand Slam for the second time this year after Roland Garros
- One of 10 players from Czech Republic in main draw

Zakharova:

- Making 2nd appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2025 (l. Yastremska)
- Contesting sixth career Grand Slam main draw; her best result came on her Grand Slam debut, with a 3r run at 2024 Australian Open (l. Frech)
- Career record in Grand Slam opening matches stands at 3-2; most recent was a 1r exit at 2026 Roland Garros (l. Muchova in their only previous meeting)
- Best career result on grass is R16 at Queen's, London in 2025 (l. Keys) 33701300
- Has won 8 matches so far in 2026; her best result a 3r run at Miami (as a qualifier, l. Mboko)



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[11] Belinda Bencic (SUI #11) vs. [WC] Mika Stojsavljevic (GBR #276)

First meeting

Bencic:

- Making 10th appearance at Wimbledon, where her best tournament result was reaching last year's SF (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Best Grand Slam results are SFs at 2019 US Open (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and 2025 Wimbledon
- Since the start of the 2025 season, Bencic is 14-1 vs. players ranked outside the Top 100 (the one loss was to No.126 Bartunkova at 2026 Australian Open)
- One of her 10 career titles has come on grass, at 2015 Eastbourne (d. A. Radwanska in F), and she has made 4 additional WTA grass court finals
- Best tournament finishes this year are QFs at Miami (l. eventual R-Up Gauff) and Charleston (l. Keys); she also went 5-0 in singles at 2026 United Cup for Team Switzerland, who finished as runners-up
- The one Swiss woman to win this title is Martina Hingis, who claimed the 1997 title at age 16 (d. Novotna in F)

Stojsavljevic:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Wimbledon; she fell 1r last year (l. Krueger)
- This is her 2nd career Grand Slam main draw, following her Wimbledon main draw showing last year
- One of two 17-year-olds in this year's main draw, along with fellow British wild card Klugman - they are the youngest players in the field
- Today's match will be Stojsavljevic's first meeting vs. a Top 20 player
- Seeking her first Tour-level match win of career (currently 0-2 in grass court main draw matches on Tour, and 0-3 in Tour-level matches overall)
- Earlier this year, she made a WTA 125 grass court QF at Birmingham (l. eventual R-Up Bartunkova in 3rd-set tiebreak)

Elsa Jacquemot (FRA #80) vs. [14] Naomi Osaka (JPN #14)

Osaka leads 1-0

Jacquemot:

- Making her 3rd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 2r in 2025 (l. Bencic)
- Appearing in Wimbledon's main draw as a direct entry for the first time in her career (she was lucky loser in 2024 and qualifier in 2025)
- Seeking her sixth straight opening round victory at a Grand Slam, dating back to Roland Garros in 2025; prior to this streak, she only had one such win in six opportunities
- Owns one win in her Tour-level career over a Top 20 player (d. No.20 Marta Kostyuk in 1r at Australian Open in 2026)
- Six of her seven career wins at Grand Slams came against an opponent with a higher ranking than her own
- So far on grass this season she has competed in qualifying at London, Nottingham and Eastbourne

Osaka:

- Contesting her 6th main draw at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching 3r in 2025 (l. Pavlyuchenkova) and 2017 (l. No.11 Venus Williams)
- Seeking to advance to the 4r at Wimbledon for the first time (only Grand Slam where she has not done so)
- Since the Australian Open in 2024, she is 8-2 in opening round matches at Grand Slams
- With a win, would improve to 7-0 at Wimbledon against opponents ranked outside the Top 50
- Won her lone career meeting against Jacquemot at WTA 125 Saint Malo last year on her way to claiming the title
- Her 37 aces at Grand Slams this year is the third-most, trailing only Rybakina (53) and Sabalenka (44)
- Reached the final at Bad Homburg last week in her first grass tournament of the season; retired during the second set of the final against Muchova through right foot injury



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[22] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #24) vs. Janice Tjen (INA #42)

Tjen leads 2-0

Fernandez:

- Making 5th appearance at Wimbledon; her best tournament results are 2r showings in each of the last 3 years
- Contesting her 25th career Grand Slam main draw; her career-best Grand Slam result is R-Up at 2021 US Open (l. Raducanu in all-teenage F)
- Career-best Tour-level result on grass is R-Up finish at 2024 Eastbourne (l. Kasatkina in F)
- Best tournament finishes in 2026 are 3 QFs, all on clay at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Rybakina), Madrid (l. eventual R-Up Andreieva) and Strasbourg (l. eventual R-Up Mboko)
- One of 2 players from Canada in the main draw, along with qualifier Bianca Andreescu (the 2019 US Open champion)
- Fernandez has lost to Tjen in their two previous meetings, at 2026 Australian Open and 2026 Dubai (both on hard court)

Tjen:

- Making her Wimbledon tournament debut
- Contesting her 4th career Grand Slam main draw; she made her Grand Slam main draw debut at 2025 US Open
- Best Grand Slam results are 2r showings at 2025 US Open (as qualifier, d. V. Kudermetova in 1r; l. Raducanu) and 2026 Australian Open (d. Fernandez in 1r; l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Seeking first Tour-level grass court win of her career - went 0-3 on grass so far this season at Tour-level (1r losses at 's-Hertogenbosch, Nottingham and Eastbourne)
- First woman from Indonesia to contest the Wimbledon main draw since Angelique Widjaja in 2004
- Best result by Indonesia at Wimbledon was QF run by Yayuk Basuki in 1997 (l. eventual R-Up Novotna)

Antonia Ruzic (CRO #61) vs. [30] Emma Raducanu (GBR #33)

Ruzic leads 1-0

Ruzic:

- Making her Wimbledon main draw debut; she fell in qualifying in 2024 and 2025
- Contesting her 4th career Grand Slam main draw; she made her Grand Slam main draw debut at last year's US Open (l. Townsend in 1r)
- Posted her first Grand Slam main draw win at the most recent Slam, 2026 Roland Garros (d. Krueger in 1r; l. Keys in 2r)
- Best Tour result on grass is R16 at 2025 Nottingham, where she earned her sole career Tour-level win on this surface (d. Bronzetti in 1r; l. eventual R-Up Yastremska in R16)
- Owns 7 Tour-level wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.23 Zheng Qinwen at 2026 Indian Wells
- Defeated today's opponent Raducanu in their only previous meeting, at WTA 1000 Dubai this February – Ruzic went on to make QF of that event as a lucky loser (l. eventual R-Up Svitolina)

Raducanu:

- Making 5th main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best tournament results are R16 in 2021 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.) and 2024 (l. Sun)
- She won one Grand Slam title at 2021 US Open (d. Fernandez in all-teenage final), where she became the first qualifier in the Open Era to win a Grand Slam title
- Holds 13-3 career record in Grand Slam 1r matches (4-0 in Wimbledon 1r matches)
- Best result on grass is finishing runner-up at Queen's Club, London earlier this year (l. Vekic in F)
- Her best tournament finishes this year are R-Up showings at Cluj-Napoca (l. Cirstea in F) and Queen's, London - her first finals since her 2021 US Open triumph
- One of 9 players from United Kingdom in the main draw; Raducanu is currently the British No.1



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[Q] Mananchaya Sawangkaew (THA #164) vs. [20] [WC] Maja Chwalinska (POL #21) First meeting

Sawangkaew:

- Making her Wimbledon main draw debut as a qualifier; she previously fell in qualifying in 2024
- This year, she won all three of her qualifying matches in three sets - and she saved 3 match points in her final-round qualifying win over Dodin
- Contesting the 2nd Grand Slam main draw of her career; she made her Grand Slam main draw debut at this year's Australian Open (I. Raducanu in 1r)
- This is her first main draw grass court match at a Tour-level event
- One of 2 players from Thailand in the main draw (along with Tararudee) - the last time two women from Thailand featured in the same Wimbledon main draw was 2010 (Tanasugarn and Lertcheewakarn)
- Missed 6 months of action from end of May 2025 to end of November 2025, due to injury (suffered a back injury during 2025 Roland Garros qualifying event)

Chwalinska:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where she made her Grand Slam main draw debut in 2022 and reached 2r as a qualifier (d. Siniakova in 1r; I. Riske-Amritraj)
- Contesting her 4th career Grand Slam main draw, and is seeded in a Grand Slam main draw for the first time
- At the most recent Grand Slam event, Chwalinska made the 2026 Roland Garros final as a qualifier (I. M. Andreieva in F) – her first career Tour-level final
- She became the 2nd qualifier to make a Grand Slam final in the Open Era, following Raducanu's title run at 2021 US Open
- Received a main draw wild card for 2026 Wimbledon (she was ranked No.116 at the main draw entry list deadline, prior to her Roland Garros run)
- Has contested two previous Tour-level matches on grass - her 2022 Wimbledon main draw performance

Barbora Krejckova (CZE #38) vs. [WC] Hannah Klugman (GBR #416) First meeting

Krejckova:

- Won the second Grand Slam title of her career at Wimbledon in 2024 (d. Paolini in final)
- Also won Roland Garros in 2021 (d. Pavlyuchenkova in final)
- Seeking first Grand Slam match win of the season after falling in the 1r at Australian Open (I. Shnaider) and Roland Garros (I. Baptiste)
- Her 2024 Wimbledon trophy is her only title on grass
- Former World No.1 in doubles, she also lifted the Wimbledon doubles trophy in 2018 and 2022, both w/Siniakova
- Strongest result of 2026 was reaching the final at 's-Hertogenbosch (I. Montgomery via walkover through respiratory illness)

Klugman:

- Competing in the main draw of a Grand Slam for the second time after receiving a Wimbledon wild card for the second year in a row; fell in 1r to Fernandez last year
- One of two 17-year-olds in this year's main draw, along with fellow British wild card Stojanovic - they are the youngest players in the field
- Won her first Tour level main draw match at Nottingham this year as a lucky loser (defeated fellow British player, Harriet Dart)
- Her highest win by ranking was over No.90 Zakharova in Nottingham qualifying this year; looking for her first Top 50 win

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Won a Tour leading four titles in 2025, including her 4th career Grand Slam title at US Open (d. Anisimova in final) as well as Madrid, Miami and Brisbane; also finished runner-up at WTA Finals, Australian Open, Roland Garros, Indian Wells and Stuttgart for a Tour leading nine finals overall

Ended 2025 by finishing at World No.1 for the second straight year, posting the most Tour match wins of any player with 63 and setting a new WTA single-season record in prize money with \$15,008,519

Reached seven finals across 2024, defending her Australian Open crown, winning the US Open and also won titles at Cincinnati and Wuhan. Recaptured the No.1 ranking in October and finished the season as the WTA Year-End No.1 for the first time in her career

Outstanding 2023 saw her win debut Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F), reach second Major final at US Open (l. Gauff in F) and become the WTA World No.1 player for the first time in career (after US Open). In addition won titles at Adelaide and Madrid

Highlight of 2022 season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament

Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open

In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejickova/Siniakova in F)

Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10. Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season

Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA

singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)

Made Top-10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open

Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejciakova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)

Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suarez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings. Entered Top 50 on April 16 after run to Lugano final, and Top 20 on August 27 following New Haven title

Broke into Top 100 at No.76 on October 16, 2017 after reaching first Tour-level final at Tianjin (l. Sharapova). Also in 2017 made SF at Tashkent (l. Babos) and lifted WTA 125k Series title at Mumbai (d. Jakupovic)

Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2017 Wimbledon, falling in 2r (as qualifier, d. Khromacheva, l. Witthoef)

Fell 1r on main draw debut at 2017 Dubai (as qualifier, l. Ka.Bondarenko). WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Rabat

Lifted first three ITF Circuit titles in 2015, including a 13-match win streak towards the year's end, winning back-to-back trophies in Antalya, Turkey

Made debut on ITF Circuit in Minsk in 2012

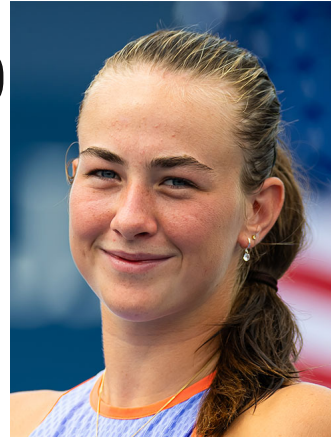

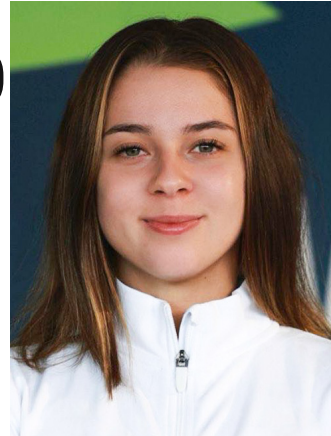

CAREER MILESTONES

- Missed first 5 months of 2025 due to back injury and made season debut at Strasbourg in May; in singles, posted three QF finishes at Eastbourne, US Open and Seoul. In doubles, won 20th Tour-level title of career at Seoul (w/Siniakova)
 - Finished 2024 at No.10 in the year-end rankings (2nd consecutive year-end Top 10 finish) after winning 2nd Grand Slam singles title at Wimbledon (d. Paolini in F); also made Australian Open QF; qualified for the WTA Finals as a Grand Slam champion and advanced to SF (l. Zheng)
 - Reached four singles finals across 2023, winning first WTA 1000 title at Dubai (d. No.1 Swiatek in F) in addition to WTA 500 San Diego title (d. Kenin in F), and finishing R-Up at Birmingham (l. Ostapenko) and Zhengzhou (l. Zheng Qinwen). Ended season inside the Top 10 at No.10
 - In 2022, started with R-Up at Sydney (l. Badosa) and QF at Australian Open (l. Keys) before missing several months w/arm injury. Ended 2022 in fine form, winning back-to-back titles at Tallinn (d. Kontaveit) and Ostrava (d. Swiatek). Also completed Career Doubles Grand Slam by winning US Open w/Siniakova
 - Won first WTA Tour singles title at 2021 Strasbourg, then swept singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros (her first Grand Slam singles title and 3rd Grand Slam doubles title). Roland Garros was just her fifth Slam main draw in singles; only two women have won a major with fewer main draw appearances to their name
 - Also in 2021, won Prague title (d. Martincova in F), reached final at Dubai (l. Muguruza), made Wimbledon R16 and US Open QF, and qualified for WTA Finals in singles for the first time
 - Posted another excellent doubles campaign across 2021; along with aforementioned Roland Garros, added titles at Madrid, Gippsland Trophy, WTA Finals and the gold medal at Tokyo Olympic Games (all w/Siniakova). Additionally, won 3rd straight Australian Open mixed doubles title (w/2019 partner Ram)
 - Enjoyed breakout year in singles in 2020, posting career-high ranking of No.65 (November 16) and making R16 at Roland Garros and reaching second WTA SF at Linz; in doubles, won Shenzhen title (w/Siniakova), finished R-Up at Dubai (w/Zheng Saisai) and defended Australian Open mixed doubles title (w/new partner Pavic)
 - Played 1r at 2025 Wimbledon (as WC, l. Fernandez)
 - Made her Tour level debut at Nottingham in 2025 (l.Putintseva in 1r)
 - In 2024 reached third round of qualifying as a wild card at Wimbledon (l. Parks)
 - Won 2023 Orange Bowl junior championships to close out the first season as a professional player
 - In October 2023, at 14 years-old, became youngest player to qualify for a \$100K ITF series event, reaching QF at Shrewsbury

- Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Quebec City (w/Mestach)
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2014 Luxembourg (w/Hradecka, L. Bacsinszky/Barrois)
- Reached 2r on WTA singles debut as qualifier at 2014 Quebec City (L. Hradecka)
- On ITF Circuit, owns 14 singles and 19 doubles titles
- Made professional debut at \$10K ITF/Piestany-SVK in 2010
