2026 WIMBLEDON

This is the 139th Wimbledon Championships. The event was first held in 1877, with the first women’s singles championship being staged in 1884. This is the 132nd staging of the Wimbledon women’s singles championship and the 58th of the Open Era, which began in 1968 and saw the introduction of prize money. Due to the pandemic, the tournament was not held in 2020.

PIF WTA WORLD NO.1 SCENARIOS

For the second time in her career, **Aryna Sabalenka** enters Wimbledon as the PIF WTA World No.1; this is her seventh Slam as the World No.1. Sabalenka first attained the ranking on September 11, 2023 and returned to the top spot last year on October 21 and has held the distinction since.

The WTA World No.1. Ranking will be on the line at Wimbledon as Elena Rybakina has a chance to overtake Sabalenka.

- Rybakina will need to reach the QF to have a chance at moving to No.1
- If Sabalenka reaches the R16 or QF then Rybakina will need at least SF
- If Sabalenka reaches SF, Rybakina would need to reach the final
- If Sabalenka vs. Rybakina meet in final then winner will take be No.1

Sabalenka is looking to extend her streak atop the WTA Rankings. Sabalenka will extend her streak during Wimbledon (weeks of June 29 and July 6) will mark her 89th and 90th consecutive weeks at No.1. If she holds on to No.1, the week of July 13 will bring her equal to the sixth longest streak in WTA Rankings history:

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with five or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Wimbledon draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (28-1 in 1r, 96.6%):** Swiatek has been defeated in the 1r only once in 29 Grand Slam main draw appearances, here at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic)
- **Serena Williams (78-3 in 1r, 96.3%):** Competing in first Grand Slam since 2022 US Open, S. Williams owns a 78-3 record in opening rounds at the Slams. She is 19-2 in R128 at Wimbledon with her two losses coming in her two most recent appearances – 2021 (I. Sasnovich) and 2022 (I. Tan).
- **Mirra Andreeva (12-1, 92.3%):** Andreeva's only loss in the opening round a Slam came at 2024 Wimbledon (I. B. Fruhvirtova).
- **Elena Rybakina (24-3 in 1r, 86.96%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel) and owns a 5-0 record in R128 at Wimbledon.
- **Madison Keys (45-6 in 1r, 88.2 %):** Has won 15 of last 16 opening round matches at the Slams with last loss coming at 2025 US Open. She owns a perfect 11-0 record here in opening matches at Wimbledon.
- **Elise Mertens (32-5 in 1r, 86.%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances. Has won 13 of last 14 opening round matches with only loss in that span coming at 2025 Roland Garros.
- **Elina Svitolina (42-7 in 1r, 85.7%):** Svitolina has won 24 of last 25 opening round matches at Slams – dating back to 2018 US Open – with only loss during that time coming at 2025 US Open.
- **Iva Jovic (6-1 in 1r, 85.7%):** Despite 6-1 record in R128, is seeking first career main draw win at Wimbledon.
- **Coco Gauff (23-4 in 1r, 85.2%):** Wimbledon is the only Slam that Gauff has lost in the opening round more than once (4-2 record) with losses coming in 2025 and 2023.
- **Aryna Sabalenka (27-5, 84.4%) :** Has not 1r at a Slam since 2020 Australian Open, winning 22 straight R128 matches.

WIMBLEDON MISCELLANY VIA STATS PERFORM

This will be the 58th edition of the Women’s singles at Wimbledon in the Open Era, Billie Jean King won the inaugural edition of the tournament in 1968.

Martina Navratilova in Wimbledon is the player with the most Women’s Singles titles in a single Grand Slam in the Open Era (nine).

Four players in the Open Era have won the Women’s Singles at Wimbledon on five or more occasions: Martina Navratilova (nine), Steffi Graf, Serena Williams (seven each) and Venus Williams (five).

Williams sisters along with Petra Kvitova are the only current player with multiple titles at the Championships in Women’s Singles.

Martina Navratilova has appeared in (134) and won (120) the most Women’s Singles matches at Wimbledon of any player in the Open Era - she has the most wins (120) of any female or male player at a single Grand Slam event in that span.

Martina Navratilova has appeared in the most Women's Singles finals at Wimbledon in the Open Era, holding a win-loss record of 9-3 from her 12 appearances: she is one of three over that span to appear in 10+ Women's Singles finals at the event, along with Serena Williams (11) and Chris Evert (10).

With a win-loss record of 74-7 at the event, Steffi Graf (91.4%) holds the highest winning percentage in the Women's Singles in Wimbledon in the Open Era (among players with 20 matches played) – Serena Williams is the current player with the highest win ratio (87.5%, 98-14).

Only Venus Williams (24), Martina Navratilova (23) and Serena Williams (21) have appeared in 20+ Women's Singles main draws in Wimbledon in the Open Era. Venus Williams (95) has the most appearances in Women's Singles Grand Slams in the Open Era.

Six players in the Open Era have won the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon without dropping a set: Chris Evert (1981), Lindsay Davenport (1999), Venus Williams (2008), Marion Bartoli (2013) and the two to achieve the feat multiple times, Serena Williams (2002 and 2010) and Martina Navratilova (1983, 1984, 1986 and 1990).

Having achieved the feat in Wimbledon, Martina Navratilova is the only player in the Open Era to win a single Women's Singles Grand Slam event without dropping a set on four separate occasions (1983, 1984, 1986 and 1990).

At 16 years and 266 days, Martina Hingis (1997) is the youngest player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles at Wimbledon - she is one of two players in the Open Era to win the event before turning 18, along with Maria Sharapova (2004).

In the Open Era, only Novak Djokovic (24) has claimed more Singles Major titles than Serena Williams (23) - only Djokovic (404) and Roger Federer (369) have claimed more wins in Grand Slam events than her (367).

Only her sister Venus (95) and Novak Djokovic (83, including Wimbledon 2026) have appeared in more Singles Grand Slam main draws than Serena Williams (82, including Wimbledon 2026) in the Open Era - surpassing Roger Federer and Feliciano Lopez (81 each).

Serena Williams holds the fourth-highest winning percentage in Women's Singles Majors in the Open Era (86.8%, 367-56).

Only Steffi Graf (91.4%) and Martina Navratilova (89.6%) have a highest winning ratio in Wimbledon than Serena Williams (87.5%) in Women's Singles in the Open Era - min 15 matches.

Serena Williams will appear in a Grand Slam event for the first time since the US Open 2022 - among Women's Singles Grand Slam champions, only Tracy Austin, Martina Navratilova and Kim Clijsters had a bigger gap between consecutive Major's appearances in the Open Era.

Since the inception of the WTA Tour in 1990, Serena Williams has claimed the most WTA level titles (73) and the most on grass court (eight, seven in Wimbledon and one at the Olympics).

At 34 years and 274 days, Serena Williams (2016) is the oldest player in the Open Era to win the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon: Serena Williams (2012, 2015 and 2016) and Martina Navratilova (1987 and 1990) are the only two players over that span to win the event multiple times after turning 30.

Martina Navratilova holds the longest winning streak in the Women's Singles in Wimbledon in the Open Era, with 47 straight wins between 1982 and 1988: this is the longest winning streak of any female or male player at a single Grand Slam event over that span.

Ann Jones in 1969 and Virginia Wade in 1977 are the only two players from Great Britain to reach the Women's Singles final in Wimbledon in the Open Era, with both going on to win the event in respective years.

Dropping 25 games, Martina Navratilova in 1983 has conceded the fewest games en route to winning the Women's Singles at Wimbledon in the Open Era. Iga Swiatek's 35 games dropped last year is the least a Women's player dropped to win this title in this century.

Barbora Krejčíková in 2024 conceded the most games en route winning the Women's Singles title in Wimbledon in the Open Era (76).

The Women's Singles reigning champion has lost in the opening round only twice in Wimbledon in the Open Era: Steffi Graf in 1994 and Marketa Vondroušová in 2024.

Iga Swiatek in 2025 became the second player in the Open Era to win a Women's Singles Grand Slam final with a 6-0 6-0 scoreline after Steffi Graf at Roland Garros 1988.

Elena Rybakina (53) is the player with the most aces in Women's Singles Grand Slams in 2026.

Aryna Sabalenka (18hrs and 44 minutes) has spent the most time on court in Women's Singles Grand Slams 2026.

Aryna Sabalenka (403) has the most winners in Women's Singles Grand Slams in 2026.

Only Barbara Jordan (last career title in a Major), Marion Bartoli (last career title in a Major), Flavia Pennetta (last career title in a Major), Bianca Andreescu (2499 days at the start of Wimbledon 2026) and Iva Majoli (1785 days) had a longest gap than Emma Raducanu (1764 days at the start of Wimbledon 2026) between claiming her maiden Major title and her following at WTA level in the Open Era.
