Sabalenka:

- The two-time defending champion returns for her ninth main draw appearance at the US Open, having reached the final in each of her last three visits; she won back-to-back titles in 2024 (d. Pegula in F) and 2025 (d. Anisimova in F), after finishing runner-up in 2023 (l. Gauff in F)
- Looking to become the first player to win three consecutive titles at the US Open since Serena Williams (2012-2014).
- Contesting her 34th career Grand Slam main draw; along with her two US Open titles, she also won back-to-back Australian Open titles in 2023 (d. Rybakina in F) and 2024 (d. Zheng Qinwen in F)
- Has won her last 22 consecutive Grand Slam 2r matches, last losing to Azarenka at 2020 US Open
- At Grand Slams this year, as well as her runner-up finish at Australian Open (l. Rybakina in F), she made QF at Roland Garros (l. Shnaider) and R16 at Wimbledon (l. Osaka)
- Sabalenka (14) is the player with the most wins at Grand Slams in 2026 - Mirra Andreeva, Coco Gauff and Karolina Muchova (12 each) are the next best
- Has reached R16 or better at the last 15 Slams; last time failing to reach R16 came at 2022 Roland Garros (3r)
- Sabalenka is one of only two players on Tour to have won three titles this season (Brisbane, Indian Wells, Miami), alongside M. Andreeva (Adelaide, Linz, Roland Garros)



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- Last time a No.1 seed at the US Open lost in R64 was 2020 (Karolina Piskova)
- She is undefeated against qualifiers at Grand Slams (12-0 record), her most recent win was over Kostovic at 2026 Wimbledon
- 21 of her 24 career WTA titles have come on hard court, including her three titles this year at Brisbane (d. Kostyuk in F), Indian Wells (d. Rybakina in F) and Miami (d. Gauff in F)
- Sabalenka has held the No.1 ranking since October 21, 2024. Including the upcoming weeks at the US Open, she will hold the No.1 ranking for 99 consecutive weeks, bringing her career total to 107 weeks atop the Rankings
- Sabalenka must win the title in order to have a chance of retaining the No.1 ranking after the US Open

Latcenko:

- Making her Grand Slam debut at this year's US Open, having never previously contested US Open qualifying
- Made her Grand Slam qualifying debut at this year's Australian Open (l. Lourdes Carle in Q1), then fell in Q1 at Roland Garros (l. Monnet) and reached Q3 at Wimbledon (l. Krueger)
- Defeated Struplova, Bronzetti and Lazaro Garcia in this year's qualifying draw to make her Grand Slam debut
- Defeated No.74 Renata Zarazua in a third set championship tiebreak in the 1r to register her maiden Grand Slam career win; this win marked her first career victory over a Top 100 player
- This is her first career meeting against a Top 50 player; previous Top 100 matches:
 - def #74 Renata Zarazua at 2026 US Open
 - lost to #98 Janice Tjen at 2025 Jinan (WTA 125)
 - lost to #97 Emina Bektas at 2024 Fukuoka (ITF)
- Contesting just her second career Tour-level main draw appearance, she made her Tour-level debut at 2025 Chennai and reached the QFs (l. Tararudee). She had not contested another Tour-level main draw again until this year's US Open
- Owns one WTA 125 title which came on hard court at Caldas da Rainha in 2025 (d. Knutson in F)

Pegula:

- Making her 10th appearance at US Open (31st Major appearance), her best result at the event is R-Up finish in 2024 (l. Sabalenka); this is also her best result across all Slams
- Owns 18-4 record in R64 at the Grand Slams including 6-1 at US Open
- 7 of her 11 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently 2026 Dubai
- In addition to her Dubai title this season, she also triumphed on clay at Charleston (d. Starodubtseva in F)
- Has reached three additional finals this season at Cincinnati, Washington DC and Berlin, the most Tour-level finals among all player in 2026



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- At Grand Slams this year, made SF at Australian Open (l. eventual champion Rybakina), fell in 1r at Roland Garros (l. Birrell) and reached QF at Wimbledon (l. Gauff)
- Has claimed the most wins (45), hard court wins (29, level with Elena Rybakina), wins on American soil (19) and wins in three sets (17) at WTA level events this season
- Has won her last 7 Tour level matches against opponents from Romania including two this year over Cirstea at Cincinnati and Cristian at Miami; her last loss was to Halep at 2022 Toronto
- Holds a Tour-level record of 15-1 in 2026 against opponents ranked outside the Top 50 (l. No.83 Birrell in 1r at Roland Garros)
- Remains in contention for the World No.1 ranking if she wins the title at the US Open

Kenin:

- Making 11th appearance at the US Open; her best result at the tournament is 4r in 2020 (l. Mertens)
- Has won one Grand Slam title at the 2020 Australian Open (d. Muguruza in final); also finished as runner-up at 2020 Roland Garros (l. Swiatek in final)
- Four of her 5 career Tour-level titles have come on hard court, most recently 2020 Lyon (d. Friedsam in final)
- Earlier this month, defeated Lys in 1r at Cincinnati for her first hard court match-win since Brisbane in January of this year (d. Ruse in 1r)
- Reached career-high ranking of No.4 in March 2020
- Owns 10-9 record in R64 at the Slams; trying to advance past the R64 at the US Open for the first time since 2020 (R16)
- Is 4-13 vs. Top 3 ranked opponents with three of the four wins coming on hardcourts defeating No.1 Ashleigh Barty twice (2019 Toronto, 2020 Australian Open) and No.1 Naomi Osaka (2019 Cincinnati)

Tatarudee:

- Making her US Open main draw debut, having fallen in the 1r of qualifying in each of the past two years (I. Marino in 2025 and Li in 2024)
- Made her Grand Slam debut at this year's Australian Open (as a qualifier, I. Mertens in 1r), followed by a Q1 exit at Roland Garros (I. Papamichail) and a 2r run on her Wimbledon debut (d. Tagger in 1r, I. Alexandrova in 2r)
- Has won two WTA 125 titles this year (both on hard court) – winning WTA 125 Istanbul 2 (d. Vandewinkel in F) and WTA 125 Austin 1 (d. Andreescu in F)
- Contesting just her 10th career Tour-level main draw; her best career result came on hard court with a SF run at 2025 Chennai (ranked No.171, I. eventual champion Tjen)
- Has won five Tour-level matches so far this season; with her best tournament finish in 2026 being a QF run at Prague (I. Snigur)
- This is her second career meeting against a Top 10 player after 2r loss to No.10 Anisimova at 2026 Toronto
- Her best career win by ranking came earlier this season at Prague with a win over No.44 Bartunkova
- Reached a new career-high ranking of No.72 last week; she made her Top 100 debut in May this year

Noskova:

- Making her 5th appearance at the US Open; her best performance is reaching 3r last year (I. Muchova)
- Won her first career Grand Slam title at Wimbledon (d. Muchova in all-Czech final), becoming the youngest Wimbledon champion since her fellow Czech Petra Kvitova in 2011
- She is 10-2 at Grand Slam events this year – this is her most Grand Slam match wins in a calendar year (previous best was 6 Grand Slam main draw match-wins in 2024)
- Her best result at a hard court Grand Slam is quarterfinals at 2024 Australian Open (I. Yastremska)
- Has won two titles this year, both on grass at Berlin (d. Pegula in F) and Wimbledon
- Holds a 12-8 record on hard court this year, with her best hard court result in 2026 being Indian Wells SF (I. eventual champion Sabalenka)



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- Has a 5-4 career record in Grand Slam 2r matches, 1-1 in US Open 2r matches with a 2r win over Lys last year and a 2r loss to Jabeur in 2023
- This is her first career meeting against a player from Thailand
- Owns a 15-3 record this season against opponents ranked outside the Top 50, most recently defeating No.78 Volynets in the 1r here; most recent loss came against No.70 McNally at Toronto
- Made her Top 10 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings on June 22 of this year (following her 2026 Berlin title), and reached career-high ranking of No.6 on August 24
- Remains in contention to qualify for the WTA Finals as she is closing in on the Top 7; also as a Grand Slam champion is in position to secure the No.8 spot if she is not among the Top 7

Boulter:

- Making her fifth main draw appearance at the US Open; reached her best result in 2023 with 3r (l. Stearns)
- Also made 3r at Wimbledon in 2022 (l. Tan) and 2023 (l. Rybakina) for her best Slam results
- Overall this is her 22nd Grand Slam main draw appearance
- Her 1r win here over Carol Young Suh Lee was her second Grand Slam win of the season after defeating Akasha Urhobo in 1r at Roland Garros
- Is 3-10 in R64 at the Grand Slams, including 1-1 record at US Open
- Earned one hard court title this season, at Ostrava (has won four titles in career)
- Looking for 6th Top 10 win of her career, most recently defeating No. 2 Rybakina at London this year; 4 of her 5 Top 10 wins were achieved on grass, with only one on hard court at the 2024 United Cup vs. No.5 Pegula
- Has a record of 2-2 against players from Czech Republic with her two wins posted on Czech soil at Ostrava this year over Linda Fruhvirtova and Lucie Havlickova; losses were to the Top two Czech players Muchova at Miami and Noskova at Cincinnati
- Reached career-high ranking of No.23 in November 2024



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Muchova:

- Making her 9th main draw appearance at the US Open and 29th Grand Slam main draw appearance
- She is a two-time US Open semifinalist in 2023 (l. eventual champion Gauff) and 2024 (l. eventual runner-up Pegula), and also reached quarterfinals last year (l. Osaka)
- She is a two-time Grand Slam runner-up at 2023 Roland Garros (l. Swiatek in final) and 2026 Wimbledon (l. Noskova in all-Czech final)
- Won the 2026 US Open mixed doubles title last week (w/fellow Czech Mensik, d. Bencic/Cobolli in final) – her first Grand Slam title in any discipline
- Is 15-4 in R64 matches at the Grand Slams, including 6-0 at US Open
- Has won two WTA titles this year at WTA 1000 Doha on hard court (her first WTA 1000 title, d. Mboko in final) and Bad Homburg on grass (d. Osaka in final via retirement)
- Reached two additional finals this year at Stuttgart (l. Rybakina in final) and Wimbledon (l. Noskova in final)
- Holds a 19-4 record on hard court in 2026 – she has only lost to Top 5 players on hard court this year
- This is her first hard court event since Miami in March (made SF, l. eventual R-Up Gauff), and her first event overall since 2026 Wimbledon
- Holds a Tour-level record of 18-1 in 2026 against opponents ranked outside the Top 50 (l. No.170 Teichmann in 3r at Roland Garros)
- In Grand Slam main draws, she is 32-9 versus players ranked outside the Top 50, and 14-0 in such matches in US Open main draws
- Posted career-high ranking of No.6 following her run to this year's Wimbledon final

Svitolina:

- Making her 13th main draw appearance at US Open, with best result coming in 2019 with SF run (l. eventual R-Up S.Williams). Made debut here in 2012, winning through qualifying and falling to Ivanovic in 1r
- Overall this is her 51st Grand Slam main draw appearance, and in addition to SF run here in 2019 has reached three other SFs – 2019 (l. eventual champion Halep) and 2023 Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova), 2026 Australian Open (l. eventual R-Up Sabalenka)
- Earned two career titles this season at Rome (d. Gauff in F) and Auckland (d. Wang Xinyu in F)
- Currently on 10 Grand Slam match wins this season, claiming 10+ Slam wins for the 4th consecutive year
- Fell 1r at US Open last season (l. Bondar)
- Record on Tour against opponents outside Top 50 in 2026 stands at 22-2, with the only two losses to No. 77 Snigur at Wimbledon and No. 63 Bondar at Madrid
- Among active players, has the most Grand Slam main draw wins without having reached a final
- This is her second meeting against a player from Australia this season after defeating Emerson Jones at Miami



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Joint:

- Making her 3rd appearance at US Open; she has equaled her previous results with 2r in 2025 (l. eventual finalist Anisimova) and 2024 (l. Keys)
- Competing in her ninth career Grand Slam main draw; a win today would be the first 3r at a Slam in her career
- Defeated 23-time Grand Slam champion Serena Williams at this year's Wimbledon, which marked Williams' first singles appearance since the 2022 US Open
- Looking for the first Top 10 win of her career; she is currently 0-6, most recently falling to No.8 M.Andreeva at Adelaide
- Career best win by ranking is defeating No.12 Tauson at Seoul 2025
- Owns two career Tour-level titles; one on clay at 2025 Rabat (d. Cristian in F) and one on grass at 2025 Eastbourne (d. Eala in F)
- Her best career results on hard court are SF finishes at Hong Kong, Seoul and Hobart in 2025
- Owns 7-13 record on hard court this season, with her best result on the surface being a QF run at Adelaide (l. eventual champion M. Andreeva)
- The most recent Australian to win the US Open title is Samantha Stosur in 2011 (d. S. Williams in F)
- Currently ranked No.72, reached a career-high ranking of No.28 in February 2026

Kostyuk:

- Making her 7th main draw appearance at the US Open, with her best result last year with 4r (I. Muchova)
- This year, she reached her first two Grand Slam semifinals, on the clay of Roland Garros (I. eventual champion M.Andreeva) and the grass of Wimbledon (I. eventual champion Noskova)
- Has won two WTA titles this year, both on clay at Rouen (d. Podrez in first-ever all-Ukrainian WTA final) and WTA 1000 Madrid (her first career WTA 1000 title, d. M.Andreeva in final)
- Opened the 2026 clay court swing by winning 17 consecutive matches on that surface (at Tour-level and Billie Jean King Cup events) before her streak was ended by M.Andreeva in the Roland Garros semifinals
- One of 3 career WTA titles has come on hard court – first career WTA title at 2023 Austin (d. Gracheva in final)
- She is undefeated against players ranked outside the Top 100 this season (9-0); her last such loss was to No.171 Erjavec in 1r at Wimbledon last year



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- During this summer's North American hard court swing, she has only been defeated by eventual champions – lost to Swiatek in Toronto R16 and to Gauff in Cincinnati QF
- Currently competing at a career-high ranking of No.11 which she reached after her run to the 2026 Wimbledon semifinals

Stephens:

- Making her 14th main draw appearance at the US Open, where she is a former champion, lifting the title in 2017 (d. Keys in all-American final); also reached QF here in 2018 (l. Sevastova)
- Has reached one further Grand Slam final, contesting the title match at 2018 Roland Garros (l. Halep in F)
- Overall this is her 54th Grand Slam main draw appearance – owns one SF appearance at 2013 Australian Open (l. eventual champion Azarenka) and made QF stage at Wimbledon also in 2013 (l. eventual champion Bartoli)
- Her 1r win this week over No.38 Tauson marked the 300th Tour level win of her career
- Is 27-6 in R64 matches at the Slams; has won only 2 of last 5 R64 matches
- Looking to reach 3r at US Open for the first time since 2021 (l. Kerber)
- Record against Top 20 opponents is 0-3 in 2026, with her most recent loss to No.11 Kostyuk at Cincinnati 2026
- The last time she defeated a Top 20 player was at 2024 Australian Open over No.13 Kasatkina
- Best result by a wild card at the US Open is the title run by Kim Clijsters in 2009 (d. Wozniacki in final)
- Reached career-high ranking of No.3 for the first time in July 2018
