Bouzas Maneiro:

- This is her third US Open main draw appearance; on her debut in 2024 she made 3r (l. eventual finalist Pegula), last year she fell in 1r (l. Vekic)
- Overall this is her 12th career Grand Slam main draw; her best Grand Slam result is 4r at 2025 Wimbledon (l. Samsonova)
- Holds a career record of 3-9 against Top 10 opponents (2 of her 3 Top 10 wins have come at Grand Slams), defeating No.4 Gauff at 2026 United Cup, No.9 Navarro at 2025 Roland Garros and No.6 Vondrousova at 2024 Wimbledon
- Has won 15 Tour-level matches so far in 2026 (6 on hard court); her best tournament finishes this season are QFs at Nottingham and Rabat
- Her best career results on hard court are QFs at 2025 Montreal (l. eventual champion Mboko) and 2024 Guangzhou (l. Dolehide)
- Best result by Spain at the US Open is champion run by Arantxa Sanchez Vicario in 1994
- Reached career-high ranking of No.40 in August 2025



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Rybakina:

- Making her 8th main draw appearance at US Open, her best result at the event is 4r last year (l. Vondrousova)
- Contesting her 29th Grand Slam main draw; she owns two Grand Slam titles, winning 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F) and 2026 Australian Open (d. Sabalenka in F); also finished runner-up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in F)
- Looking to make 3r at US Open for the fourth time in her career after 2021, 2023 and 2025
- In addition to her Australian Open title earlier this season, she also triumphed on clay at Stuttgart (d. Muchova in F)
- At Grand Slams this year, as well as her title run at Australian Open, she made 2r at Roland Garros (l. Starodubtseva) and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Mertens)
- She is undefeated (in completed matches) against opponents ranked outside the Top 50 on hard court this season (12-0)
- This is her second career meeting against a player from Spain at a Grand Slam; her first was a loss to Sorribes Tormo in the 3r at 2023 Roland Garros
- So far during the lead-up to US Open, reached her 25th career Tour-level final at Toronto (l. Swiatek in F) and made QF at Cincinnati (l. Swiatek via ret.)

Badosa:

- Making her 6th main draw appearance at US Open (25th Major appearance), where her best result was reaching QF in 2024 (l. Navarro); withdrew from 2025 US Open due to back injury
- Playing in her first Tour-level event since Hamburg in July (l. Sherif in QF) and her first hard court tournament since Miami in March where she reached 2r (l. Jovic)
- Top Tour-level result this year is reaching the final at Iasi (l. Sherif in F); won a WTA 125 title at Bastad in July (d. Waltert in F), both on clay
- Best career result at a Grand Slam was SF at Australian Open 2025 (l. Sabalenka)
- US Open is the Grand Slam where she has the fewest wins (seven); Roland Garros (13), Australian Open (12), Wimbledon (10)
- Badosa leads the overall head-to-head against Gauff (5-3) and also has the edge on hard court (3-2); their most recent hard court meeting was when Badosa beat Gauff in the Australian Open QF last year
- Badosa has only met one other player on Tour on nine occasions, with a record of 4-5 against Rybakina
- Owns 7 career wins over Top 5 players with her most recent such win against No.3 in QF at 2025 Australian Open
- Her victory over No.7 Gauff at Berlin on grass is the only Top 10 win of her season so far
- Three of four career Tour-level titles have come on hard court (Washington D.C. 2024, Sydney 2022, Indian Wells 2021)



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Gauff:

- Making her 8th appearance at US Open; she won the title here in 2023, becoming the first American teenager to win the US Open since Serena Williams in 1999
- Contesting her 29th Grand Slam main draw, having won two major titles: the 2023 US Open (d. Pegula in F) and 2025 Roland Garros (d. Paolini in F)
- 10 of her 12 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently at 2026 Cincinnati (d. Pegula in F); when she last won the Cincinnati title in 2023, she went on to capture the US Open title
- At Grand Slams this year, made QF at Australian Open (l. Svitolina), 3r at Roland Garros (l. Potapova) and SF at Wimbledon (l. Muchova)
- She is one of five players to earn 10 or more Grand Slam main draw wins in each of the last four years along with Rybakina, Svitolina, Sabalenka and Swiatek
- Has a record of 17-2 against players ranked outside the Top 50 this season with her only losses to No.142 Badosa at Berlin and No.57 Cocciaretto at Doha
- Looking for her first win over a player from Spain this season after falling to Badosa at Berlin and Bouzas Maneiro at United Cup

Andreeva:

- Making her 4th appearance at US Open and a win today would equal her best result with 3r last year (l. Townsend)
- This is her 15th Grand Slam main draw and she won her maiden Grand Slam title this year at Roland Garros (d. qualifier Chwalinska in F)
- Born in 2007, she became the first player born after 2005 to reach a Grand Slam singles final, and win a Grand Slam (including women's and men's events)
- Looking to claim her 13th Grand Slam match win of 2026, equaling last season (13) for her most in a single calendar year
- Undefeated this season against players ranked outside the Top 50 with a record of 21-0; her most recent such loss was to No.219 Zhu Lin at 2025 Ningbo last year
- Her Tour main draw career record against players from Germany is 3-1 with her only loss to Siegemund at 2025 Wuhan
- Three of her six career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently at 2026 Adelaide (d. Mboko in F)
- Is one of only two players on Tour to have won three titles this season (Adelaide, Linz, Roland Garros) alongside Sabalenka (Brisbane, Indian Wells, Miami)
- At Grand Slams this year, she made R16 at Australian Open (l. Svitolina), won the title at Roland Garros (d. Chwalinska in F) and played 2r at Wimbledon (l. Krejckikova)
- So far during this year's North American hard court swing, made 3r at Toronto (l. Fernandez) and 4r at Cincinnati (l. Kostyuk)



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Lys:

- Making her 4th main draw appearance at US Open and a win today would be her first 3r after making 2r in 2023 (l. Bronzetti) and 2025 (l. Noskova via retirement)
- Overall is contesting her 10th Grand Slam main draw, with her best result of 4r at Australian Open 2025 (l. Swiatek)
- Her 1r win here over Knutson was her first win in the hard court lead-up to the US Open, having lost 1r matches at Cincinnati (as LL, l. Kenin) and Toronto (l. Udvardy via retirement)
- This is her 14th career meeting against a Top 10 player with a record of 1-12; her sole win was over No.10 Rybakina at 2025 Beijing
- Her best career results on hard court are semifinals at Monastir 2024 (l. eventual champion Kartal) and Cluj-Napoca 2023 (l. Korpatsch)
- Best results this season are reaching R16 at Berlin and Stuttgart (l. Svitolina both occasions)
- Is ranked at No.98, having reached a career high of No.39 earlier this season in January

Swiatek:

- Making her 8th appearance at the US Open, where she won the title in 2022 (d. Jabeur in final)
- She also reached US Open quarterfinals in each of the last two years, losing to eventual runner-up Pegula in 2024 and to eventual runner-up Anisimova in 2025
- Has won six Grand Slam titles in her career, including four Roland Garros titles (2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024) and the Wimbledon title in 2025 – she is 6-0 in Grand Slam finals
- Among active players, only Serena Williams (23) and Venus Williams (7) have claimed more Grand Slam titles than Swiatek (6)
- Won her first title of 2026 earlier this month at WTA 1000 Toronto on hard court (d. Rybakina in final) – this is the sixth straight year she has won at least one WTA 1000 title
- Has won 11 of her last 12 hard court matches, following up her 2026 Toronto title with a semifinal run at 2026 Cincinnati (l. eventual runner-up Pegula)
- Holds a 27-2 career record in Grand Slam 2r matches and has advanced to the 3r at each of her last 26 Grand Slam appearances; in the Open Era, only Martina Navratilova (35 and 30) and Conchita Martinez (30) have had longer such streaks
- Has recorded 10+ Grand Slam main draw match wins in each of the past seven years, becoming the first player to achieve the feat since S.Williams, who did so for 10 consecutive years from 2007-2016
- Owns 4-0 record this season against opponents ranked outside the Top 100, most recently defeating No.136 Emerson Jones in the 1r at Roland Garros
- Reached World No.1 for the first time on April 4, 2022, and held the top ranking for 125 weeks during her career



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Podoroska:

- This is her sixth US Open main draw appearance; she has reached the 2r here for the first time after previously being 0-5 in US Open 1r matches
- Contesting her 18th career Grand Slam main draw; her best result came on her Roland Garros debut in 2020, when she reached SF as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Her SF run as a qualifier at Roland Garros in 2020 made her the first qualifier in the Open Era to reach the Roland Garros semifinals; Chwalinska became the second this year, going one step further by reaching the final
- Competing in just her fourth Tour-level main draw of the season; her win over Waltert in the 1r here marked her first Tour-level win since 2025 United Cup (d. Gadecki)
- Has played mostly on the World Tennis Tour this year, claiming two titles at W35 San Gregorio and W15 Madrid
- Her best career Tour-level results on hard court are semifinals at 2023 Ningbo and 2022 Chennai
- Has won three WTA 125 titles in her career – winning Barranquilla and San Luis in 2024 and Cali in 2023
- Owns 3-5 career record against Top 10 players, most recent was a loss to No.7 Zheng Qinwen at 2024 Beijing
- Her most recent Top 10 win came over No.8 Serena Williams at 2021 Rome
- Reached a career-high ranking of No.36 in July 2021

Tagger:

- Making her US Open main draw debut
- Made her Grand Slam qualifying debut at this year's Australian Open where she fell in the final round (I. Tatarudee in Q3)
- Contesting the third Grand Slam main draw of her career; she made her Grand Slam main draw debut at Roland Garros this year (I. Wang Xinyu in 1r), followed by her Wimbledon main draw debut (I. Tatarudee in 1r)
- She is a junior Grand Slam champion, winning 2025 Roland Garros to become the first Austrian to win a Roland Garros junior singles title (d. Britain's Hannah Klugman in F)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title this season on hard court at Prague (d. Snigur in F), becoming the youngest Austrian to win a Tour-level title
- This is her first career meeting vs. a Top 10 player and her second against a Top 20 player after losing to No.11 Alexandrova at 2026 Miami
- Looking to become the first Austrian to defeat a Top 10 player at a Grand Slam since Tamira Paszek defeated No.7 Wozniacki at 2012 Wimbledon, and the first at US Open since Judith Wiesner defeated No.4 Iva Majoli in 1996
- Her best career win by ranking came over No.21 Samsonova at 2026 Linz
- She is one of six teenagers to contest in this year's main draw alongside Liutova, Frodin, Jovic, Korneeva and M.Andreeva
- She made her Top 100 debut in April this year then broke into the Top 50 (No.45) in July following her title at Prague



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Anisimova:

- Making her 7th main draw appearance at the US Open, where her best tournament result is finishing runner-up last year (I. Sabalenka in final)
- She made two Grand Slam finals in 2025, also finishing runner-up at Wimbledon last year (I. Swiatek in final)
- Her best tournament finish so far this year is semifinals at WTA 1000 Dubai (I. eventual champion Pegula)
- 16 of her 21 Tour-level match-wins this year have come on hard court, including the Dubai semifinals, as well as quarterfinal results at Australian Open and WTA 1000 Cincinnati (I. Pegula in both of those quarterfinals)
- Three of her 4 career titles have been achieved on hard court, including two WTA 1000 titles at 2025 Doha (d. Ostapenko in final) and 2025 Beijing (d. Noskova in final)
- Owns 14-4 career record in Grand Slam 2r matches; she has made at least the 3r on her last six consecutive Grand Slam appearances
- Looking to reach the 3r at all four Majors in a season for the first time in her career
- Holds an 18-4 record this season against opponents ranked outside the Top 20; most recent was her win over No.60 Krueger in the 1r here
- This is her first career meeting against an opponent born after 2008
- Reached her career-high ranking of No.3 on January 5 of this year
- Competed in 2026 US Open mixed doubles event last week (w/Tien, I. Navarro/Paul in 1r)

Osaka:

- The two-time US Open champion returns for her 10th main draw appearance here, winning the title in 2020 (d. Azarenka in F) and 2018 (d. S. Williams in F)
- At last year's US Open, reached her first Grand Slam SF since winning 2021 Australian Open (l. eventual runner up Anisimova in 2025 US Open SF)
- Contesting her 35th Grand Slam main draw; in addition to her two US Open titles, she owns two Australian Open trophies, winning in 2019 (d. Kvitova in F) and 2021 (d. Brady in F)
- Following her 1r win here this week, has now claimed 29 main draw wins at the US Open, surpassing her 28 match win tally at the Australian Open
- Currently on 79, Osaka could become the second Japanese player in the Open Era with 80+ women's singles Grand Slam main draw wins after Ai Sugiyama (84)



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- Could reach 3r at all four Slams in the same year for the second time in her career after 2018 when she finished the season with her maiden Grand Slam title at the US Open
- Won the only hard court meeting against Siniakova at 2018 Doha
- Reached her 14th career Tour final earlier this season at Bad Homburg on grass (l. Muchova via ret. in F) – this was also her first WTA Tour-level final not contested on hard court
- All seven of her Tour-level titles have come on hard court; in addition to her 4 Grand Slam titles, she won Indian Wells in 2018, and Beijing and Osaka in 2019
- Owns a 11-5 record on hard court this season, highlighted by SF at Washington DC (l. eventual champion Eala) and QF at Toronto (l. eventual R-Up Rybakina)
- Reached World No.1 for the first time on January 28, 2019, and held the top ranking for 25 weeks in her career

Siniakova:

- Making her 12th main draw appearance at the US Open; her best tournament result is 3r in 2018 (l. Tsurenko)
- Her best Grand Slam result of career is 4r at 2019 Roland Garros (d. World No.1 Osaka in 3r; l. Keys)
- Three of her 5 career WTA titles have come on hard court, most recently 2023 Nanchang (d. fellow Czech Bouzkova in final)
- Is one of the two players to have appeared in all the Grand Slams held in the last 12 years (since 2015) along with Yulia Putintseva
- Seeking her first 2r victory at a Grand Slam since Wimbledon 2021 (d. Vandeweghe); her only career 2r win at US Open was in 2018 (d. Tomljanovic)
- Has a 2-4 match record against Top 20 opponents this season, with both coming on hard court (d. No.8 Andreeva at Indian Wells and No.14 Tauson at Doha)
- Reached career-high ranking of No.27 in June 2024
- Is the current WTA Doubles World No.1 – she has held the top spot for 38 of the last 51 weeks bringing her career total to 199 weeks including the US Open which will tie her for second most all time weeks as doubles No.1 behind Martina Navratilova (237) and equal with Liezel Huber (199)
- Won the 2022 US Open women's doubles title (w/Krejciakova) to complete the Career Grand Slam in doubles
- Reached quarterfinals at last week's 2026 US Open mixed doubles event (as qualifier w/Patten, l. Svitolina/Monfils)

Jovic:

- Making her third appearance at the US Open and is into 2r for the 3rd straight year
- Posted 2r finishes in both previous US Open outings, in 2024 (l. Alexandrova) and 2025 (l. Paolini)
- Overall this is her ninth Grand Slam main draw appearance, with best result coming earlier this year at the Australian Open when she made the QF (l. eventual R-Up Sabalenka, d. No.8 Paolini in 3r)
- Made R16 at 2026 Wimbledon (l. Pegula) and at Roland Garros made the 3r this year also (l. Osaka)
- Coming off back-to-back 3r runs at Toronto (l. Korneeva) and Cincinnati (l. Bouzkova)
- Currently at a career-high ranking of No.14 (first posted August 24 of this year)
