

GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

The Australian Open, Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open are the four Grand Slam tournaments. Winning the title at each major in the same year is known as the "Grand Slam". Three women have completed the singles Grand Slam in a calendar year: 1953 – Maureen Connolly; 1970 – Margaret Court; 1988 – Stefanie Graf.

A further seven women have won each Grand Slam singles title at least once in their careers (known as the career Grand Slam): Doris Hart, Shirley Fry, Billie Jean King, Chris Evert, Martina Navratilova, Serena Williams and Maria Sharapova, with Navratilova (1983-84) and Williams (2002-03, 2014-15) holding all four titles at the same time.

Australia's Margaret Court holds the record for all-time Grand Slam singles titles (men or women) with 24 titles, ahead of Serena Williams, who holds the Open Era record with 23 Grand Slam singles titles.

In the Open Era, eight women have won three of the four Grand Slam titles: Lindsay Davenport, Evonne Goolagong Cawley, Justine Henin, Martina Hingis, Angelique Kerber, Hana Mandlikova, Monica Seles and Virginia Wade.

AUSTRALIAN OPEN HONOR ROLL (OPEN ERA)



The Australian Open was first held in 1905, with the first women's singles championship being staged in 1922. The 2021 Australian Open is the 95th staging of the women's singles championship and the 53rd of the Open Era, which began in 1968 (1969 for Australian Open) and saw the introduction of prize money. The Australian Open has been a 128-draw since 1986. Previously the event was staged as a 32-draw (1969, 1971-72, 1976, 1977 [Jan.], 1977 [Dec.], 1978, 1979) and 64-draw (1970, 1973-75, 1980-85). The event was held in December from 1977-85 and in January from 1987 onwards (not held in 1986).

ROLAND GARROS HONOR ROLL (OPEN ERA)



The first national French Championships for women were held in 1897, with foreign competitors eligible to take part from 1925. As such, 2021 Roland Garros represents the 114th staging of the event overall, and the 91st edition since international players were admitted (the tournament was not held during WWI and WWII). 2021 Roland Garros also marks the 54th staging of the Open Era (which began in 1968). Roland Garros has been a 128-draw since 1981 in addition to 1968 and 1972. Previously the event was staged as a 64-draw (1969-71, 1973-80).

First held in 1887, the US Open women's singles championship is being staged for the 135th time overall. The 2021 event marks the 54th staging of the Open Era, which began in 1968 and saw the introduction of prize money. Overall this is the 141st US Open, the men's event having first been held in 1881. The singles main draw will feature 128 players (104 direct entries, 16 qualifiers, eight wildcards). The US Open has been a 128-draw since 1976. Previously the event was staged as a 64-draw (1968-75).

Tennis returned to the Olympic Games as a medal sport at Seoul in 1988, after a 64-year absence. At the 2016 Olympic Tennis Event took place on hardcourts in the Brazilian city of Rio de Janeiro, Monica Puig of Puerto Rico captured the first-ever gold medal for Puerto Rico (any sport), defeating three Grand Slam winners (Petra Kvitová, Garbiñe Muguruza and Angelique Kerber) en route to the Olympic title.

At Rio, Venus Williams competed at the Olympics for the fifth time in her career, joining Arantxa Sánchez Vicario (ESP) as the only women who have competed in the Olympics five times. As a result of winning silver in mixed doubles with Rajeev Ram, Venus added a fifth Olympic medal to her collection. Four women have won four or more medals at the Olympics: Kathleen McKane (1 gold, 2 silver, 2 bronze), Arantxa Sánchez Vicario (2 silver, 2 bronze), Serena Williams (4 gold) and Venus Williams (4 gold, 1 silver).

At London in 2012, Serena won gold medals in singles and doubles, joining sister Venus (2000 Sydney) and Helen Wills (1924 Paris) as the only women to win a gold medal in both singles and doubles in the same year at the Olympics.
